COME AS YOU ARE: The St. Louis Cardinals and Seattle Mariners wrap up their three-game series tonight at T-Mobile Park as the Redbirds continue their six-game “Seattle Pilots” road trip ... Both games this series have featured the Cardinals jumping out to 2-0 leads, with the Mariners coming back to win by two runs ... After tomorrow’s off day in Milwaukee, St. Louis begins a three-game weekend series with the division-rival Brewers at American Family Field.

HEY, I, OH, I’M STILL ALIVE: St. Louis enters today in 4th place in the National League Central, 17.0 games behind first place Milwaukee and 4.5 games behind New York for the final Wild Card position ... The Cardinals play the toughest remaining strength of schedule, with combined .558 winning pct. against the Mariners (1g), Brewers (6g), Reds (3g), Giants (3g), and Cubs (3g). - *Elias*

I’M NOT GONNA CRACK: St. Louis needs a 10-6 run over its final 16 games to finish with a winning mark, above .500 ... The Cardinals have had winning marks in 25 of their past 31 seasons since joining the National League Central Division in 1994 and in 23 of their 25 seasons played since 2000.

OUTSHINED: With a win tonight, the Cardinals will avoid their 7th series sweep of the season and first to the Mariners in franchise history ... The last time St. Louis was swept by an American League team was Aug. 15-17, 2025 by the New York Yankees at Busch Stadium and the last time on the road was April 4-6, 2025 at Boston.

I’M SO EXCITED, I CAN’T WAIT TO MEET YOU THERE: All-Star 2B **Brendan Donovan** began his an injury rehab assignment with Springfield (AA) last night at Hammons Field, going 0-for-1 with three walks in six innings at second base ... The 28-year-old Gold Glove utility player has missed the last 24 games while recovering from a left groin strain (Aug. 15-present).

- Eight-time All-Star 3B **Nolan Arenado** is also scheduled begin an injury rehab assignment tonight at Springfield, his first appearance at Hammons Field since August 2012 at age 21 with Tulsa (AA-Rockies) ... The 6-time Platinum Glove Award and 10-time Gold Glove Award winner has been sidelined for 36 games since Aug. 1 with a right shoulder strain ... Tonight marks only the 2nd rehab assignment in the 34-year-old’s career, following a June 2014 rehab stint (left middle finger mallet fracture) with Colorado Springs (AAA-Rockies).

GLORIFIED D: Shortstop **Masyn Winn** leads all of Major League Baseball in Outs Above Average (22) and MLB shortstops in fielding percentage (.994), which is currently is the best by a Cardinals shortstop over a full season all-time, surpassing .989 marks by **David Eckstein** (2006) and **Paul DeJong** (2019) ... The three highest single-season fielding percentages by Hall of Fame shortstop **Ozzie Smith** were .987 both in 1987 and 1991, and .985 in 1992 (all Gold Glove Award-winning years).

- Since 1974, only two Major League shortstops have played 125+ games and committed 3 or fewer errors with 500+ total chances: Baltimore’s **Cal Ripken Jr.** (3 errors in 680 total chances in 1990) and Cleveland’s **Omar Vizquel** (3 errors in 648 total chances in 2000) ... Winn has made three errors over 501 total chances this season.

DRAIN YOU: St. Louis is 153-157 all-time in night games played in the Pacific Time Zone since divisional play began in 1994 (0-1 at Arizona, 1-1 at San Diego, 1-1 at Los Angeles Dodgers, 0-2 at Seattle this season).

GIVEN TO FLY: Happy one-year anniversary to INF **Thomas Saggese**, who made his MLB debut on this date one year ago at age 22 at shortstop against the Reds at Busch Stadium (Sept. 10, 2024) ... Other notable Major League debuts by Cardinals on this date include Hall of Famer **Rogers Hornsby** (age 19 in 1915 vs. Reds at Robinson Field), Cardinals Hall of Famer **Tim McCarver** (age 17 in 1959 at County Stadium vs. Milwaukee Braves), and **Chris Duncan** (age 24 in 2005 vs. Mets at Busch II).

THE DAY I TRIED TO LIVE: Happy 23rd birthday to Cardinals top prospect INF **JJ Wetherholt** ... Other notables born on this date include Hall of Famers **Randy Johnson** (62) and **George “High Pockets” Kelly** (1895-1984), former Cardinals 1B **Paul Goldschmidt** (38) and OF **Roger Maris** (1934-85), retired 1B **Joey Votto** (42), and golfer **Arnold Palmer** (1929-2016).

REARVIEWMIRROR: On this date in Cardinals history (Sept. 10, 2022), **Albert Pujols** clubs his 696th career home run in a 7-5 win over the Pirates at PNC Park to tie **Álex Rodríguez** for 4th all-time in MLB history ... The game-tying two-run shot came off JT Brubaker in the 6th inning ... Pujols would homer the following day and pass Rodríguez.

SEATTLE CONNECTIONS

Brant Brown coached parts of six seasons over two stints in the Mariners organization (2013-17, 24), previously serving as the Mariners Bench Coach/Offensive Coordinator (2024), Offensive Coordinator (2017), and Minor League Outfield Coordinator (2013-16).

Randy Arozarena played in 19 games for St. Louis in 2019 and parts of three minor league seasons in the Cardinals organization (2017-19)...originally signed with the Cardinals as an international free agent (Aug. 1, 2016)...traded to Tampa Bay with **José Martínez**, and Cardinals Compensation draft pick A (INF **Alika Williams**) in exchange for **Matthew Liberatore**, **Edgardo Rodríguez** and Rays Compensation draft pick B (RHP **Tink Hence**) on Jan. 9, 2020.

Cardinals broadcaster **Chip Caray** worked for the Seattle Mariners for three seasons (1993-95).

John King made his MLB debut at T-Mobile Park with Texas (Sept. 4, 2020)...fanned Kyle Lewis (swinging) that night for his first MLB strikeout.

Riley O’Brien was born in Seattle and resides in Shoreline, WA...graduated from Shorewood (WA) High School...pitched two seasons at Everett (WA) Community College (2014-15)...traded by Cincinnati to the Mariners for **Luis Chevalier** (April 17, 2022) and pitched in one game for Seattle (May 7, 2022 vs. TB)...2023 PCL Post-Season All-Star for AAA-Tacoma...acquired by the Cardinals from the Mariners for cash considerations (Nov. 5, 2023).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** played in Seattle in 1995, including all 11 postseason games.

Cardinals Director of Pitching **Matt Pierpont** worked four seasons in Seattle’s organization (2021-24), most recently as their minor league pitching coordinator.

Mariners Pitching Strategy Coach **Trent Black** was born in St. Louis...graduated from nearby Columbia (Ill.) High School.

Mariners broadcaster **Aaron Goldsmith** was born in St. Louis...graduated from Principia College in Elsah, Ill...began broadcast career in 2007 with the nearby Gateway Grizzlies in the independent Frontier League.

Mariners broadcaster **Rick Rizzs** is a 1975 graduate of Southern Illinois Univ. in Carbondale...previously served as a broadcaster for the Memphis Chicks (AA-Expos) from 1978-80.

TONIGHT'S STARTER:

- Making his 13th start (14th appearance) of the season (16th career start./18th app) in tonight's game.
- This is only his 3rd career start against an American League opponent and 2nd on the road (vs. TEX 7/31/23 & at CWS 6/19/25-G2). Is 1-0, 1.50 ERA over 12.0 innings.
- Leads National League pitchers in winning percentage Post All-Star Break over the past two season (8-2, .889) trailing Tarik Skubal (11-2, .846) and Carlos Rodon (13-3, .818) in the A.L.**
- Ranks 3rd among National League rookies with six wins trailing **Cade Horton** (CHI, 9) and **Ben Casparius** (LA, 7).
- Is 5-0 career in 7 Road starts with a 2.72 ERA; the Cardinals have gone 7-0 in those games and have provided Michael with 6+ runs of support in 5-of-6.**
- Tonight's start extends his career-high of 10 consecutive starts uninterrupted by option/injury/doubleheader/etc. (July 21-present).
- Has walked 14 batters over his first 96.0 career innings pitched (2024-present); 1-of-9 pitchers in MLB history with 14 or less walks, 90.0+ innings in his first 17 appearances.
- Since McGreevy's MLB debut (July 31, 2024), sports the lowest BB/9 IP (1.31) of pitchers with 90.0 or more innings edging out **Tarik Skubal** (1.45).
- The Cardinals are 9-4 in his 13 appearances this season and 13-4 in his career.
- Sports a 2.70 ERA (30.0 IP) in five road starts, but 6.07 ERA (43.0 IP) in eight home games (7 starts) at Busch Stadium.
- Was 8-3 with a 3.72 ERA in 15 starts at Memphis this season. Ranked 3rd among International League in winning percentage (.727, 8-3), 5th in wins (8) wins and 8th in ERA (3.72) and WHIP (1.24) at time of last recall.

LAST TIME OUT (Friday, Sept. 5 vs. San Francisco): L, 8-2: 4.0 IP, 9 H, 6 R, 6 ER, 1 BB, 3 K, 2 HR - 75 pitches.

- Pitched a season-low 4.0 innings for this season, allowed six runs on nine hits (tied team high) in an 8-2 loss.
- Allowed back-to-back HR in the 1st inning to Rafael Devers and Willy Adames.

2025:

- Made six straight appearances of 6.0 innings or more (8/2-30); longest streak by a Cardinals pitcher this season.
- Struck out a career-high seven batters in a 7-6 win over Pittsburgh (8/25).
- Held the Cubs scoreless over 6.0 innings scattering six hits in a 5-0 win at Busch Stadium (8/8).
- Was the first Cardinals pitcher with 9 or fewer walks and 80.0+ IP in their first 14 career games and only the 2nd in MLB history with Elmer Steele (1907-08) of the Boston Red Sox.
- Had three consecutive Quality Starts (8/8-19), the longest streak of his career,.
- Pitched a season-high 7.0 innings at COL (7/21), the first team he started against a team for the second time in his career.
- Was recalled twice from Memphis (AAA) and optioned back the following day on May 4-5 and June 8-9. Appointed as the 27th player for the June 19 doubleheader. Recalled on June 24 and most recently on July 21.
- Sustained most of his damage from the 5-9 batters in the Dodgers lineup on June 8; as they were 7-for-14 while the Top 5 batters were a combined 1-for-12 which included Shohei Ohtani (1-3, 2B), Mookie Betts (0-3, K), Freddie Freeman (0-3, K) &Teoscar Hernandez (0-3).
- Made his 2025 debut against the New York Mets in Game 2 of a doubleheader on May 4. Earned the win and held the Mets scoreless to one hit over 5.2 innings with a walk and five strikeouts. Held Francisco Lindor (0-2, K), Juan Soto (0-2), Pete Alonso (0-2, K) and Mark Vientos (1-3, K) to 1-for-9 with 3 strikeouts.

CAREER:

- From the start of 2022 until July 2025, led all of Minor League Baseball in wins (39), starts (97), innings pitched (522.1), and complete games (4), and ranked T-1st for first in double plays induced (55), 11th in ERA (4.00), and 3rd in SO/BB ratio (3.59) among qualifiers.
- Made his Major League debut against the Texas Rangers on July 31, 2024, firing 7.0 innings allowing one run on five hits with three strikeouts.
- Scouted the Rangers while watching the game on TV from the hotel bar/restaurant across the street the night before he started.
- Posted a 1.96 ERA in 2024, the best four game start by a Cardinal since **René Arocha** in 1993 (1.52 ERA, 23.2 IP, 4 ER).
- Is the only pitcher in Cards history to earn a win as a starting pitcher (July 31 2024 vs. Texas) and then as a relief pitcher in his second appearance (Sept. 18, 2024 vs. Pittsburgh) in his first two career MLB appearances.
- Originally selected by St. Louis in the 1st round (18th overall) of the 2021 MLB Draft out of the University of California-Santa Barbara.
- Entered the 2025 season as the No. 10 prospect in the Cardinals organization by *Baseball America*.

McGREEVY vs. SEATTLE:

- Making his first start against the Mariners and his 2nd career start in the Pacific Time Zone, pitching the final game of the 2024 regular season at San Francisco.
- Has not faced an American League opponent at Busch Stadium since his Major League debut.
- Is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA in two career starts vs. American League teams. Defeated Texas in his MLB debut (7/31/24) and received a no decision in a Cardinals win vs. CWS (6/19/25); exited with the lead.
