### TIGERS DROP SERIES FINALE TO BALTIMORE:

The Tigers lost to the Orioles, 5-3, in the series finale on Sunday. Jake Rogers hit a two-run home run, his third of the season, while Javier Báez added two hits, including a double, and drove in a run. Spencer Turnbull started for Detroit and took the loss, allowing three runs, two earned, on five hits with two walks and three strikeouts in 4.0 innings. Jason Foley and Alex Lange each turned in scoreless outings of the Tigers bullpen.

### ROSTER MOVES:

The Tigers on Monday announced the following roster moves:  
\*Claimed RHP Braden Bristo off waivers from Tampa Bay and optioned him to Triple A Toledo  
\*To make room for Bristo on the 40-man roster, transferred OF Austin Meadows to the 60-day injured list

### JAVY STAYS HOT:

Javier Báez continued his hot stretch at the plate on Sunday, going 2x4 with a double and a RBI. After starting the season 4x40 in his first 11 games of the season, Báez has hit safely in 12 of his last 13 games with at least one at-bat. During that stretch, Báez is slashing .340/.382/.440 with five doubles and 10 RBI.

### ALEXANDER THE GREAT:

Alex Lange struck out both Baltimore batters he faced in Sunday's series finale. Lange has not allowed a run in nine consecutive appearances, throwing 9.0 innings with only three hits allowed, two walks and 15 strikeouts. For the season, Lange has posted a 1.42 ERA (12.2IP/2ER) with a 0.95 WHIP and 15 strikeouts.

### TIGERS AND METS:

The Tigers and Mets begin their only series of the season tonight. The two teams last played in 2019 with New York (NL) winning two-of-three games at Citi Field. Detroit has a 13-11 lead in the all-time series against the Mets, including a 5-4 edge in games at Comerica Park.

### INTERLEAGUE ACTION:

The Tigers return to interleague play tonight against the Mets. Detroit has started the season 4-1 against National League foes, sweeping a two-game series from San Francisco and taking two-of-three games at Milwaukee. The Tigers have finished with a winning record against NL opponents in each of the last two seasons.

### AT COMERICA PARK:

The Tigers are 1-3 on their current seven-game homestand, which includes four games vs. Baltimore (1-3) and three games vs. New York (NL) (May 2-4). Detroit is 5-7 at home this season. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .246/.314/.372 at Comerica Park, while the pitching staff has a 4.90 ERA (112.0IP/61ER).

- Suffered the loss in his last start on Wednesday at Milwaukee, allowing five runs on seven hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 5.0 innings.
- Has made 12 career appearances, including two starts, against the Mets, posting a 1-1 record with one save, a 2.73 ERA (26.1IP/8ER) and 20 strikeouts...has made only three career outings, including two starts, at Comerica Park, and has a 1-0 record with a 5.91 ERA (10.2IP/7ER) and eight strikeouts.
- Started 18 games with the Angels in 2022 and went 8-6 with a 4.24 ERA (97.2IP/46ER) and 85 strikeouts...finished the season strong, posting a 2-0 record with a 2.36 ERA (26.2IP/7ER) and 30 strikeouts over five starts from September 9-October 4.

- The 2023 season marks his 13th professional season and his second with the Tigers after signing a six-year contract on December 1, 2021.

- Has played in 1,007 games in his career at Comerica Park, slashing .321/.397/.542 with 230 doubles, five triples, 188 home runs and 691 RBI...is the only active Major Leaguer with 1,000 games played at a single ballpark and is the sixth player in franchise history to reach the 1,000 game mark in a venue, joining Al Kaline (1,421), Lou Whitaker (1,209), Charlie Gehringer (1,176), Alan Trammell (1,171) and Norm Cash (1,004), who all did so at Tiger Stadium.
- Had a pair of hits last Tuesday at Milwaukee, recording his first multi-hit game of the season and the 880th of his career, breaking a tie with Robin Yount for 20th and moving into a tie with Rogers Hornsby for 19th.
- Hit a walk-off single on April 15 against San Francisco in the bottom of the 11th inning...marked his 15th career walk-off hit, his 12th as a Tiger and his first in a pinch-hitting role.
- Hit a double in the eighth inning on April 12 at Toronto...was the 1,134th extra-base hit of his career, and he is now tied with Tris Speaker (1,134) for 16th in MLB history...is also two homers shy of tying Gary Sheffield (509) for 26th in MLB history.
- Went 1x3 with a RBI and a walk on April 1 at Tampa Bay...the hit was the 3,090th of his career, passing Ichiro Suzuki for 23rd in MLB history.
- Hit the 600th double of his career May 7 at Houston, becoming the 18th player in big league history to hit 600 career doubles...joined Hank Aaron and Albert Pujols as the only players in MLB history with 3,000 hits, 500 home runs and 600 doubles.
- Recorded the 3,000th hit of his Major League career in the first game of the doubleheader on April 23 vs. Colorado with a first inning single off Antonio Senzate...became the seventh player in MLB history with 500 homers and 3,000 hits, joining Hank Aaron, Willie Mays, Eddie Murray, Rafael Palmeiro, Albert Pujols and Alex Rodriguez and the 33rd member of the 3,000-hit club...joined Ty Cobb and Al Kaline as the only players to record their 3,000th career hit in a Tigers uniform.
- The 2023 season marks the 21st of his decorated Major League career...one of the best hitters of his generation, Cabrera is among the leaders of active players (min. 800 games) in many offensive categories, including first in batting average (.307), hits (3,098), doubles (610), home runs (507), RBI (1,850) and runs scored (1,530), second in walks (1,230) and sixth in on-base percentage (.383) and slugging percentage (.522).
- Is the all-time leader among Venezuelan-born players in hits (3,096), doubles (610), home runs (507), RBI (1,850), batting average (.307), slugging percentage (.522) and total bases (5,261).
