ROSTER MOVES: INF Jeff McNeil is expected to be activated today...He has been on the IL since May 17 with a strained left hamstring...He has appeared in five games on a rehab assignment between Brooklyn and Syracuse and went 6-15 (.400) with four runs, two doubles, a home run, two RBI and a walk...McNeil has appeared in 31 games with the Mets this year and is hitting .242/.336/.374 with seven extra-base hits...LHP Stephen Tarpley has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse will serve as the team's 27th man for the doubleheader...He will wear #46...RHP Robert Gsellman has been placed on the 10-Day IL, retroactive to June 20, with a right lat strain.

METSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Nationals, 5-2, yesterday...The team has dropped two in a row and four of their last five games...The Mets have been in first place since Saturday, May 8...This is their longest streak atop the NL East since the end of the 2015 season...The Mets returned from nation's capital after playing four games in three days against the Nationals (1-3)...Today, the team begins a six-day, eight-game homestand against Atlanta (four games) and Philadelphia (four games).

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets have won 14 of their last 17 home games...The team has lost back-to-back home games only once this season, from April 27-28 to Boston...Overall, the Mets is 20-7 record with a 2.05 ERA (50 earned runs/228.0 innings) with 74 walks and 267 strikeouts at home...The team's 2.05 ERA at home is the best in the majors as is their .741 winning percentage...This compares to a 16-22 record with a 3.97 ERA (139 earned runs/315.0 innings) with 104 walks and 347 strikeouts on the road this year...The team will play just eight more road games before the All-Star break, including three at Yankee Stadium.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Mets will play their sixth doubleheader of the season today... The Mets will play three doubleheaders in a span of a week...The last two times the team has played three doubleheaders in a week span were August 25-30, 2020 (three doubleheaders in six days) and August 18-21, 1998 (three doubleheaders in four days) - Courtesy of Elias...The Mets are 7-3 in twinbills in 2021...Only the White Sox (8-2) have more wins in doubleheaders this season than the Mets...New York swept doubleheaders from Philadelphia on April 13 at Citi Field as well as from the Rockies in New York on May 27...They split doubleheaders in Colorado on April 17, in St. Louis on May 5 and in Washington on June 19...New York will also play two on June 25 vs. Philadelphia, July 26 vs. Atlanta, August 31 vs. Miami and September 4 at Washington.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets will play their next 12 games against divisional opponents...New York is 14-11 against the NL East this season, posting a 2.96 (70 earned runs/213.0 innings) ERA in those games...The Mets own the largest divisional lead in the majors...The Mets are batting .239/.315/.383 in 25 games against the division this season.

THE SUMMER OF JAKE: The Mets have won Jacob deGrom's last six starts, which is the third-longest such streak since his debut in 2014...The Mets won eight consecutive starts by deGrom in 2017 (June 12-July 24) and 2015 (July 8-August 24)... Despite pitching only 3.0 innings, deGrom had eight strikeouts, including seven in a row to conclude his last outing...He extended his scoreless streak to 25.0 innings and lowered his ERA is 0.54 (four earned runs/67.0 innings)...He recorded an RBI single in the second inning and now has six RBI this year, which matches his career high (also, 2019)...Overall, he is batting .423 (11-26) this season...That is the highest batting average as a pitcher this year.

SPECIAL OPS: Jacob deGrom is holding his foes to a .357 OPS this season, the lowest in the majors...There are 36 qualifying pitchers with a higher OPS against based solely on their opponent SLG...Among the pitchers with a higher opponent SLG than Jake's OPS against: Shane Bieber, Aaron Nola, Zack Greinke, Hyun-Jin Ryu, Lucas Giolito, Jose Berrios and Aaron Civale.

THEY CALL HIM THE STREAK: The Mets have won each of deGrom's last six starts... The Mets have not won seven consecutive games started by deGrom since June 12-July 24, 2017, when deGrom earned a win in eight consecutive outings...He has not allowed more than two earned runs in his last 17 home starts, the longest streak in franchise history and tied for the seventh-longest all-time...The last pitcher with a longer streak of starts with two or fewer ER allowed at home was Andrew Cashner (MLB-record 21 straight, 2013-2015).

EASY AS 1-2-3: deGrom has retired his foe's 1-2-3 hitters to start the game in each of his last 10 starts... Going back to his first start of the year, he has retired $\overline{31}$ consecutive hitters, including 16 strikeouts, in the first inning.

HOME IS WHEREVER I'M WITH YOU: DeGrom has allowed more than three earned runs only once in his last 29 starts in Queens, posting a 1.56 ERA (32 earned runs/185.0 innings) at home since May 1, 2019...He leads the majors in home ERA this year (0.86) and ranked third in the NL last season with a 1.88 home ERA...His 2.10 career home ERA is the best among active pitchers (min. 500.0 innings).

REPLACE-METS: The Mets have used 45 players through 65 games this season...The team used a total of 47 players in 2020...The franchise record for most players used in a season is 56 by the 2018 Mets...Entering today, New York has used 10 starting pitchers this year...The Mets also used 10 starters in 2020...The franchise record is 20 starters used in 1967.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are looking for their first series victory against the Braves at Citi Field since they swept a three-game set to end the 2019 season, September 27-29...The Mets have lost the season to the Braves in each of the last three years.

QUALITY EATS: The starting rotation has put up a 1.78 ERA (13 earned runs/65.2 innings) with 11 walks and 80 strikeouts over the last 12 games...Overall, the Mets have made 29 quality starts this season...The Mets starting rotation owns a 2.70 ERA (98 earned runs/326.2 innings) this season, the best mark in the major leagues... deGrom leads the major leagues with a 0.54 ERA, while Marcus Stroman is 14th in the majors with a 2.35 mark...Taijuan Walker is 16th with a 2.42 ERA.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is batting .291 (23-79) with 17 runs, four doubles, a triple, five home runs, 12 RBI, eight walks and a .921 OPS over his last 21 games...He is batting .275/.359/.522 slash line in 19 games this month with eight extra-base hits and 10 RBI...Lindor is one double away from 200 in his career...He is four home runs away from 150 as a major leauger.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets are 28-5 when scoring four or more runs this season...The team is 7-24 when scoring three or fewer runs...The Mets are 31-7 when scoring first this season...The team's .816 winning percentage is the best record in the major leagues when scoring first this season.

PUTTING UP LUG-OS: Seth Lugo has made seven straight scoreless appearances, allowing only four hits, two walks and striking out 11 in those 6.1 innings...Overall he owns a 1.08 ERA (one earned run/8.1 innings) with two walks and 13 strikeouts in eight games this year.

THREW ME FOR A LOUP: Aaron Loup has made 10 straight scoreless appearances. allowing four hits and striking out 11 in 8.1 innings...Overall, he is 2-0 with a 1.83 ERA (four earned runs/19.2 innings) with 18 hits, three walks and 24 strikeouts...He has held left-handed hitters to a .214 (6-28) batting average this season.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets have drawn 10 walks with the bases loaded this year, which is tied for third in the majors...The Brewers lead MLB with 14 walks with the bases full...Each of New York's 10 bases-loaded walks have been by a different player...The Mets are batting .143 with the bases loaded this year, which ranks 30th in the majors...Their .308 OBP is 21st.

HOMER BOUND: The Mets are 25-17 when hitting at least one home run and 12-5 when hitting two or more bombs...The Mets have hit 67 home runs this year, the third-fewest in the majors...On the other hand, the Mets have allowed only 55 home runs this season which is tied for the fewest in MLB...They own a 0.90 home runs per 9 IP ratio...That is the third-best mark in the majors.

YES WE McCANN: James McCann is batting .314 (16-51) with six runs, three doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, three walks, a .364 OBP, a .549 SLG and a .913 OPS in 15 games this month...McCann hit one home run over his first 33 games with the club and has hit five in his last 21 games...He owns a .279/.329/.412 slash line against the NL East this season.

GET WELL SOON!: OF Michael Conforto is on a rehab assignment with the Syracuse Mets (AAA)...He started in right field and went 1-4 with a double, a run and a strikeout...Overall he is 2-11 with two runs, a double, and three strikeouts...He has been on the 10-day IL since May 17 with a strained right hamstring...RHP Dellin Betances is currently on a rehab appearance with the St. Lucie Mets (A)...He has appeared in three games, allowing five earned runs on five hits with three walks and four strikeouts in 2.1 innings...OF Brandon Nimmo began a rehab assignment with Syracuse yesterday...He went 1-2 with a run and started in centerfield...Nimmo has been on the 10-Day IL since May 5 with a left index finger bone bruise.

HONORING HIS LEGACY: The New York Mets will wear a "41" Tom Seaver tribute patch on the right sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2021 season...Seaver passed away on August 31, 2020 at age 75...Seaver won 311 games, had a 2.86 ERA and struck out 3,640 batters over a 20-year major league career that spanned from 1967-1986, earning 12 All-Star selections in the process...He won three Cy Young Awards with the team in 1969, 1973 and 1975 as well as the NL Rookie of the Year Award in 1967.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 2006, Jose Reyes became the ninth player in franchise history to hit for the cycle as the Mets fell to the Reds, 6-5 in New York...Reyes homered to leadoff the Mets offense in the first, he doubled in the third, tripled in the fifth and singled in the eighth to complete the cycle...He finished 4-5 with two runs and an RBI...Alay Soler made the start and allowed four runs (three earned) in a no decision...New York was up 5-4 heading into the ninth, but Billy Wagner could not convert the save, allowing a two RBI single to Brandon Phillips and giving the Reds a 6-5 win...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) \left(1\right$ the Mets Virtual Vault at metsheritage.com.

LAST TIME OUT: Exited after throwing 3.0 perfect innings, striking out eight of the nine men he faced, including each of the last seven...Left the game with right shoulder sorenes Extended his scoreless streak to 25.0 innings with his fourth consecutive scoreless start... Marks the third time in his career he has put together four scoreless outings in a row.

YOU'RE SIMPLY deBEST: deGrom owns a 1.91 ERA over his last 87 starts since the start of 2018...That is by far the best mark in the major leagues in that span (min. 400.0 IP), more than a half-run better than the next-closest pitcher (Hyun-Jin Ryu is second with a 2.49 ERA since 2018)...Since 1920, only four other pitchers have held an ERA of 1.91 or lower over a span this long: Sandy Koufax, Bob Gibson, Greg Maddux and Clayton Kershaw.
