METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Cubs, 4-2, last night at Citi Field...The Mets have won two of their last three games...Since starting the season 0-5, the Mets have gone 15-9...The Mets continue a seven-game home stand (2-3) against the Cardinals (1-2) and Cubs (1-1)...Following this series, the Mets hit the road for a six-game trip to Tampa Bay (three games) and St. Louis (three games).

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets have not won a season series against the Cubs since they went 5-2 against Chicago in 2016.

IT'S GONNA BE MAY: The Mets went a combined 15-14 in March/April and 15-11 in April...New York went a combined 15-12 in April/May of last year and 14-11 in April alone in 2023.

THE BEAR NECESSITIES: Tomás Nido Has gone 8-25 with five runs, two home runs and three RBI in 12 career games against the Cubs... Harrison Bader has hit .284/.349/.472 with 24 extra-base hits with and 19 RBI in 73 career games against Chicago...Starling Marte is a lifetime .282/.341/.434 hitter with 23 doubles, four triples, 13 homers and 53 RBI in 126 career games against Chicago.

STARTING OFF: Over the last three games, Mets starters have posted a 1.29 ERA (3 Er/21.0 IP) with seven walks and 11 strikeouts, holding hitters to a .104 (7-67) average...Overall, Mets starters have posted a 3.95 ERA (66 ER/150.1 IP) this season.

THE POLAR BEAR VS. THE CUBS: Pete Alonso has homered 15 times in 29 games against the Cubs...That's his third-highest total against an opponent (Miami - 26, Washington - 25) and his most against an opponent outside of the division...It is the best home-run rate in Mets history by any player against a single opponent (min. 75 AB)...Robin Ventura is second with a 9.00 ratio against the Pirates (9 HR/81 AB).

HERE'S THE PITCH: New York owns the second-lowest ERA in the National League with a 3.48 (101 ER/261.0 IP) mark...Their 271 strikeouts are tied for third in the Senior Circuit.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: In 22 games since April 6, the Mets are batting .261/.329/.413 with 112 runs, 35 doubles, one triple, 26 home runs, 70 walks with a .742 OPS...Their .261 average is the third-best in the majors, while their .329 OBP is sixth and their .742 OPS is eighth-best...That compares to a .167/.272/.264 slashline with 16 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 16 RBI with a .536 OSP in the previous seven games.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.85 ERA (35 ER/110.2 IP) with 49 walks and 141 strikeouts...Their 2.85 ERA is the best in the Senior Circuit and seventh in the majors...Their 141 strikeouts from the bullpen are the most in the major leagues...They lead the majors in batting average (.188) and lead the NL and are fifth in the majors in WHIP (1.11) and lead the majors with a 11.47 K/9 IP ratio.

ADAM'S SONG: After allowing two runs in his first two appearances, Adam Ottavino has made eight scoreless appearances...He has not allowed a hit and issued only one walk in those 8.2 innings, striking out 15 in that span and stranding one inherited runner...He is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (2 ER/10.2 IP) this season with one walk and 18 strikeouts...Opponents are batting .111 (4-36) against him.

SAVE ME: Edwin Diaz has recorded 100 saves as a member of the Mets... He is the sixth player in franchise history to record at least 100 saves with the Club...His current save streak of 26 games is the longest active in the majors...It is his second-longest of his career...Diaz career-best is a 28 save streak from June 2-August 15, 2018.

IN THE CITI: The Mets enter the day 8-9 at Citi Field this season...New York has posted a 2.68 ERA (47 ER/158.0 IP) at home this year, the lowest mark in the majors...Their 160 punchouts are the fifth-most in the majors and the fourth-most in the National League...After starting 0-5 at Citi Field this year, the Mets are 8-5 at the ballpark.

I FEEL THE NEED FOR REED: Reed Garrett has allowed one earned run in 15.2 innings, giving him a 0.57 ERA...He is tied for the major league relievers in wins and his 27 strikeouts are the most among all relievers...Garrett's 28 strikeouts are the most by a Mets reliever in his first nine outings of the season...His 28 strikeouts are the most by a reliever in the NL and are tied for the most in the majors...He has struck out 28 of the 61 batters (46%) faced this year...Right-handed hitters are batting .103 (3-29) against him this season.

WOOF: The Amazin' Mets Foundation, led by New York Mets Owner Alex Cohen, has partnered with America's VetDogs to co-raise another future service dog for a United States veteran or first responder with a disability... The newest puppy is an 11-week-old, male, yellow Labrador Retriever and Golden Retriever Mix, who will undergo basic training and socialization for the next 14 to 16 months...Fans can vote for his new name via the @Mets X account for the next 24 hours...For updates on the newest pup, fans can follow @MetsVetDog on Instagram, Tik Tok and X...To date, the Amazin' Mets Foundation has provided \$150,000 in grants to America's VetDogs.

I JUST WANT TO ROCK, DJ: DJ Stewart connected for his fourth home run of the season last night...That is the third-most on the team... He has safely hit in three of his last four games...Overall, he has posted a .377 OBP and a .472 SLG giving him an .849 OPS in 21 games this season... He is 11-53 on the season with six extra-base hits and 13 walks.

BUTTO NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Buttó took the bump on April 26 against St. Louis at Citi Field...Took his first loss of the season, allowing four earned runs on four hits with three walks and four strikeouts in 5.2 innings of work.

QUALITY EATS: Dating back to September 6, 2023, Buttó has pitched to a 3.10 ERA (17 ER/49.1 IP), allowing 21 walks and striking out 53 in nine starts...Five of those starts have been quality starts and the right-hander has held opposing batters to a .188 (33-176) average during that span.

SPRING AWAKENING: Made four appearances (two starts) during Grapefruit League play...Went 1-0 with a 0.90 ERA (1 ER/10.0 IP) with two walks and nine strikeouts...Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Made one start for Triple-A Syracuse this year...Started the second game of the season on March 30 vs. Rochester...Took the loss, allowing three runs (two earned) on five hits with four walks and two strikeouts and one home run allowed.

23 AND ME: Last season, Butto pitched to a 1-3 record with a 3.16 ERA (13 ER/37.0 IP) in seven appearances as a starter compared to an 0-1 record with a 7.20 ERA (4 ER/5.0 IP) in two relief appearances...He held opponents to a .212 average...Had a 3.29 ERA (10 ER/27.1 IP) in his final five starts of the year...Allowed two or fewer runs in four of those starts, three of which were quality starts...Was second to only Kodai Senga among Mets rookies in strikeouts with 38...In a three-start stretch from September 6-18, pitched to a 2.08 ERA (4 ER/17.1 IP) with a 0.98 WHIP and held batters to a .194 (12-62) average.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Butto made two starts during the first week of the season for Triple-A Syracuse last year, going 1-1 with a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) to go along with eight strikeouts and five walks...For his efforts, he was named International League Pitcher of the Week...He also earned the honor during the final week of the 2022 season after throwing 7.0 shutout innings, allowing two hits and fanning 11 in a September 21 start at Worcester.

DEBUTTO: RHP José Butto made his 2022 season debut on April 16 at Oakland in his last start...He threw 5.0 innings and allowed one run on five hits with four walks and two strikeouts...He did not factor into the decision as the Mets won in 10 innings, 4-3.

2022: He made his major league debut on August 21 in a start at Philadelphia...In that start, he threw 4.0 innings and allowed seven runs on nine hits with two walks and five strikeouts...New York came from behind to win, 10-9, thanks to a pair of late-inning home runs by Mark Canha.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP ADRIAN HOUSER (0-E, 8.37)

LAST TIME OUT: Took the loss on April 27 vs. St. Louis at Citi Field, allowing six earned runs on nine hits with two walks and two strikeouts in 4.1 innings of work...Has allowed at least six runs in back-to-back starts.

OKLAHOMA! Houser is the 18th player in franchise history born in the state of Oklahoma...He is the first player born in Oklahoma to appear in a game for the Mets since Matt Reynolds in 2016...He is the first Oklahoma native to pitch for the Mets since 2012 when Mets pitching coach Jeremy Hefner made his major league debut...Houser has known Hefner for many years and worked with Hefner during the offseason in Oklahoma.
