CINCINNATI REDS (39-42) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (41-42)

June 28, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 1:35 EDT - Game #84/Home #45

RHP Brady Singer (3-6, 4.81 ERA) vs. RHP Mitch Keller (5-5, 4.89 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won two of the first five games on this six-game homestand vs. Seattle (2-1, June 23-25) and Cincinnati (0-2, Friday-Sunday), including a 9-7 loss on Saturday against the Redlegs here at PNC Park...Will embark on a seven-game road trip to Philadelphia (Monday-Thursday) and Washington (July 3-5) following today's game...Have not been shut out in 36 straight games (began on May 19 at St. Louis), their longest such streak since another 36-game streak from May 29 (G2)-July 9, 2024 (their last longer such streak within a single season was a 38-game streak from August 21-October 1, 2023)...Have scored the third-most runs (420) in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (443) and Los Angeles-NL (439)...Have struck out the third-most batters (762) in Major League Baseball, behind Milwaukee (788) and Philadelphia (788)...Have not been two games under the .500 mark since they were 1-3 after a 2-0 loss on March 30 at Cincinnati.

LOWE OR NEVER: Brandon Lowe hit a three-run home run (third inning) and had a sacrifice fly (seventh inning) on Saturday vs. Cincinnati, marking his fourth game with at least four RBI this season...He also had five RBI on April 12 at Chicago (NL), five RBI on April 13 vs. Washington and four RBI on May 9 at San Francisco...The last Pirate with five such games in a season was Josh Bell in 2019...Lowe's 56 RBI this season rank sixth among all National League players and are tied for ninth in Major League Baseball.

IN A PINCH: Esmerlyn Valdez homered for the second consecutive game (also Friday vs. Cincinnati, off Andrew Abbott) after connecting for a go-ahead, pinch-hit, solo home run (off Caleb Ferguson) in the eighth inning on Saturday vs. Cincinnati...It marked the first pinch-hit home run of his professional career, the second by a Pirate this season (also Spencer Horwitz, April 19 vs. Tampa Bay) and the first by a Pittsburgh rookie since Jared Triolo on August 13 (G1), 2023 vs. Cincinnati...It was the second time Valdez homered in back-to-back games (also May 24 at Toronto and May 26 vs. Chicago-NL)...The last Pirates rookie to homer in three consecutive games was Kevin Newman from June 26-28, 2019...Valdez became the first Pittsburgh player to hit a go-ahead, pinch-hit home run in the eighth inning or later since Joshua Palacios on September 2, 2023 at St. Louis...He became the fifth Pirate in PNC Park history (since 2001) to do that, joining Craig Wilson (September 3 [G2], 2001 vs. Milwaukee), Bobby Hill (July 18, 2004 vs. Florida), Josh Harrison (August 6, 2013 vs. Miami) and Ike Davis (August 26, 2014 vs. St. Louis) as the only ones to do it.

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds singled (first inning) and walked (seventh inning) on Saturday vs. Cincinnati and has now reached base safely in 32 straight games (since May 23 at Toronto)...It is the longest active streak in Major League Baseball and the second-longest such streak in Major League Baseball this season, behind the A's Nick Kurtz (48 games, April 3-May 25)... Reynolds is 42-for-117 (.359) with 11 doubles, seven home runs, 20 RBI, 19 walks, a 1.085 OPS and 25 runs during the streak...He has also hit safely in 17 straight games (since June 9 vs. Los Angeles-NL), going 25-for-66 (.379) with six doubles, five homers, 13 RBI, a 1.143 OPS and 13 runs during the streak...It is tied with another 17-game streak (May 23-June 9, 2019) for the second-longest streak of his career, behind only a 25-game streak (June 1-29, 2024).

BE LIKE TRI: Jared Triolo went 3-for-4 with a double, an RBI and two runs scored on Saturday vs. Cincinnati...He has gone 9-for-29 (.310) with three doubles and six runs in his last nine contests (since June 17 at the Athletics).

JUNE OF JAKE: Jake Mangum went 2-for-5 with a run on Saturday vs. Cincinnati...He is 27-for-77 (.351) with five doubles and six stolen bases in 22 June games (has hit safely in 17 of 20 games with a plate app)...His June average is sixth in Major League Baseball, behind only Tampa Bay's Yandy Diaz (.389), Chicago (NL)'s Pete Crow-Armstrong (.375), San Francisco's Jung Hoo Lee (.364), Detroit's Dillon Dingler (.352) and Miami's Otto Lopez (.351).

June 28, 2004: Jack Wilson tripled and scored on an error, giving the Pirates a 2-1, walkoff win over the Cardinals at PNC Park. Kris Benson started and had a no-decision after allowing one run in 8.0 innings, while Jose Mesa earned his first win of the year with a scoreless ninth inning. Craig Wilson and Jason Bay brought home Pittsburgh's other run with back-to-back, two-out doubles during the seventh inning.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2014 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Keller lost a 3-2 decision after allowing three runs over 6.0 innings of work (plus three batters) on June 23 vs. Seattle...He took a 2-1 lead into the seventh inning before allowing a go-ahead, two-run home run to Pittsburgh native Cole Young.

AGAINST THE REDS: Keller is 4-6 with a 5.29 ERA (100.1ip/59er) in 20 career starts against Cincinnati, including a 3.34 ERA (64.2ip/24er) in 12 home starts...Keller, who made his Major League debut on May 27 (G2), 2019 at Great American Ball Park, won a 9-1 decision after allowing one run in 7.0 innings on May 1 vs. the Reds at PNC Park.

K IS FOR KELLER: Keller, who has 906 career strikeouts, surpassed Steve Blass (896) for seventh place on the Pirates' all-time strikeouts list after striking out seven batters during his start on June 16 at the Athletics...He surpassed Rick Rhoden (852) during his start on April 19 vs. Tampa Bay and Deacon Phillippe (861) during his start on April 25 at Milwaukee...He also surpassed Dock Ellis (869) for eighth place on May 7 at Arizona.

CENTRAL PARKED: Keller's 64 career games started against the National League Central since making his Major League debut on May 27 (G2), 2019 at Cincinnati rank second in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Miles Mikolas (has made 69 starts).

ALONG THE BANKS OF THE ALLEGHENY: Keller's 92 career starts here at PNC Park, which opened in 2001, are second in stadium history, trailing only Paul Maholm (100).

GET BACK ON TRACK: Keller will look to snap a three-game losing streak today...He earned his last win on May 24 at Toronto, when he allowed one run in his 6.0 innings.

SIX PACK: Keller pitched 6.0 innings and allowed two or fewer runs in each of his first three starts this season (March 28 at New York-NL, April 3 vs. Baltimore, April 8 vs. San Diego)...He was the first Pirate to toss at least 6.0 innings while allowing two or fewer runs in each of his first three starts of a season since Joe Musgrove (April 5-16, 2019).

CONSISTENT KELLER: Keller pitched 6.0 scoreless innings during his start on April 8 vs. San Diego, marking his second scoreless start of at least 6.0 innings through his first three starts of the 2026 campaign (also March 28 at New York-NL)...He joined Salomon Torres (2002), Zach Duke (2005), Jeff Karstens (2008), Wandy Rodriguez (2013) and Jameson Taillon (2018) as the only Pirates during the 21st century with two scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings through their first three games of a season...Keller's 17 starts of at least 6.0 scoreless innings during his career (since 2019) are the 10th-most by any Pirate in the Live Ball Era (since 1920)...Paul Skenes, who has done that on three occasions this season, ranks tied for 12th on the list (15).

DAZZLING DEBUT: Keller scattered three hits without issuing a walk (had three strikeouts) over 6.0 scoreless innings, but had a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 4-2, 11-inning loss on March 28 at New York (NL)...Keller left with the game scoreless after six frames...The Pirates took a short-lived, 1-0 lead into the bottom of the 10th before the Mets tied it...Pittsburgh also added a run in the top of the 11th before New York's Luis Robert Jr. hit a walkoff, three-run home run off Hunter Barco in the bottom half... Keller joined Vance Worley (June 15, 2014 at Miami), Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) and Joe Musgrove (May 25, 2018 vs. St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the 21st century to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings without allowing a walk in a season debut.
