SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth (1999, 2001, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs won, 8-2, Wednesday night vs. Giants.

- ◆ Zac Gallen (W; 1 ER in 6.0 IP, 2 H, 11 K) marked a season-high 11 strike-outs (third double-digit strikeout performance) to earn his 14th win...his 4 wins in September are tied for the most in MLB (also: 4 others)...his 13 10+ strikeout outings are fourth most in franchise history.
- ◆ **Pavin Smith** (PH, 1-for-1, HR, 3 RBI) hit his second pinch-hit home run of the season (8th inning off Bivens, 2 on, 2 out).

ROSTER MOVES: Yesterday, the D-backs recalled OF Alek Thomas from Triple-A Reno, reinstated RHP Ryne Nelson from 15-day injured list (right shoulder inflammation) and optioned RHP Yilber Diaz and LHP Blake Walston to Reno (following Wednesday's game).

THE WILD STRETCH: The D-backs hold the third spot in the NL Wild Card, 3.0 games behind the Padres (first WC) and behind the Mets (second WC) [and hold tiebreaker], and 1.0 game ahead of the Braves (fourth in WC).

88 WINS: The D-backs' 88 wins, which surpass their total from last year (84-78) with 3 games to go, are their third-most wins since 2008, behind 93 in 2017 and 94 in 2011...have reached 90+ wins 6 times (1999/100 W, 2002/98 W, 2011/94 W, 2017/93 W, 2001/92 W and 2007/90 W).

VS. PADRES: The D-backs and Padres enter the final series of the regular season with a 5-5 head-to-head record.

- ♦ The D-backs average 5.40 runs per game vs. Padres.
- ◆ Jake McCarthy, over his last 9 games (7 starts), has hit .400 (10-for-25) with 2 doubles, 1 homer, 5 RBI, 5 walks and 1 stolen base.
- ◆ Kevin Newman, over his last 8 games (7 starts), has hit .385 (10-for-26) with 2 doubles and 1 RBI.

PINCH-HIT POWER: The D-backs' 7 pinch-hit home runs are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Red Sox), ahead of the Padres (6) and Athletics (6).

- ♦ The D-backs' 7 pinch-hit homers are their most in a season since 2021 (10)...it is the first time they've had 2+ players with 2+ pinch-hit home runs since 2019 (4 players).
- ◆ Pavin Smith and Lourdes Gurriel Jr. are 2 of 11 players with 2+ pinchhit homers this season.
- ◆ The D-backs' 5 players with pinch-hit homers are tied for the most in the Maiors (also: Cardinals).

17-K NIGHT: On Wednesday vs. Giants, D-backs' pitchers combined for 17 strikeouts, the most in a game since 2002 and 11th occurrence in franchise history (accomplished 5 times in 2002, 4 in 2001 and once in 1999).

STARTERS GOING 5.0+ INNINGS: The D-backs' 35 wins post-All-Star break when starting pitchers go 5.0+ innings are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Mets).

OVER THE 2 MILLION MARK: This season, the D-backs broke 2+ million total fans (current 2,216,759) for the first time since 2019 (2,135,510) and look to break their last largest total home attendance of 2,242,695 total tallied in 2018, which is currently 10th largest all-time.

LONG TIME NO SEE: The last time the D-backs featured **Gabriel Moreno**, **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.**, **Christian Walker**, **Ketel Marte**, **Geraldo Perdomo** and **Alek Thomas** together in a game was on July 29 vs. Nationals...the D-backs are 6-1 in their last 7 games when all played in a game together (starter or reserve).

FIRST 3 FRAMES: The D-backs lead MLB in the innings 1-3 with an .849 OPS, 548 hits, 326 runs and 197 XBH, and are second with 88 homers (behind the Yankees' 96 HR).

D-BACKS LOOKING TO MAKE DEFENSE HISTORY: Per Elias Sports Bureau...since 1900, there has not been a MLB team with consecutive seasons of 65 or fewer errors...Arizona has committed 61 errors in 2024 after finishing the 2023 season with a franchise-low 56 errors.

◆ The D-backs' .989 fielding pct. and 61 errors are the best in the Majors, ahead of the Twins (.988, 68 E), Braves (.988, 68 E) and Rangers (.988, 70 E).

START WITH MARTE: Ketel Marte's 13 first-inning homers are tied for the most in a season by a D-back with Paul Goldschmidt (13 in 2018), ahead Luis Gonzalez (11 in 2001), Goldschmidt (9 in 2015) and Chris Young (9 in 2007)...his 13 homers are third most in the Majors, behind Aaron Judge/NYY (18) and Kyle Schwarber/PHI (15).

♦ Marte's 33 home runs in the first inning as a D-back are third in franchise history, behind Paul Goldschmidt (52) and Luis Gonzalez (41).

KETEL AND THE BABE: Ketel Marte's 22 combined home runs in the first inning and ninth inning (or later) are tied for the most all-time in a season with **Babe Ruth**'s 22 in 1927 [Stats Inc.].

NEARING 30/100 SEASONS: Ketel Marte (35 HR/93 RBI) and **Eugenio Suárez** (29 HR/98 RBI) look to become the first D-backs pair to each have a 30+-homer, 100+-RBI season since 2017 (last: Paul Goldschmidt, 36 HR/120 RBI and Jake Lamb, 30 HR/105 RBI)...only other occurrence was in 1999 (Steve Finley, 34 HR/103 RBI; Jay Bell, 38 HR/112 RBI; Matt Williams, 35 HR/142 RBI).

DINGER SEASON: The D-backs reached 200+ homers in a season for the first time since 2019 (220)...their 207 homers are fifth most in a single season in franchise history, 1 shy of 2001 (208) for fourth all-time, and behind 2017 (220 HR), 2019 (220 HR) and 1999 (216 HR).

- ♦ The D-backs' 207 homers this season are fifth most in the Majors, behind the Yankees (235), Orioles (228) Dodgers (227) and Braves (208).
- ◆ The only time the D-backs have finished a season in the Top 5 in home runs is 1999 (5th, 2016), behind the Mariners (244), Athletics (235), Rangers (230) and Rockies (223).

SNAKEBITES

AT A GLANCE: Sixth season with the D-backs...is currently the longest tenured D-backs starting pitcher on the staff.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Is making his ninth start since being reinstated from the 60-day injured list (strained right shoulder) on Aug. 11 and fourth at home.

- Has only surrendered a combined 1 run and 4 hits with 11 strikeouts over his last 2 bids.
- Has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 4 straight starts (1-0, 2.45 ERA, 6 ER in 22.0 IP, 22 K) and 13 of his last 18 starts dating back to Sept. 4, 2023, going 7-2 with a 3.54 ERA (41 ER in 104.1 IP), opponent .223 AVG (85-for-381) and 95 strikeouts.
- Over his last 4 starts, has exited the game either tied or in the lead (team is 2-2 in those bids)...among starters in September, his 14 hits allowed are tied for third fewest (also: Dylan Cease/SD) and 4 walks allowed are also tied for third fewest (also: 3 others).
- Has allowed 6 or fewer hits in 9 of his 12 starts, including 4 straight.

LAST START: Allowed a season-low-tying 2 hits on Sept. 21 @ Brewers (W; 0 ER in 5.0 IP, 6 K).

VS. PADRES: In his last 5 starts, is 2-1 with a 3.95 ERA (12 ER in 27.1 IP), opponent .214 AVG (21-for-98) and 27 strikeouts.

- Earned the win in his last start @ Padres on Aug. 19, 2023 (3 ER in 5.1 IP. 5 H. 3 K) in the D-backs 6-4 victory.
- Has tossed 5.0+ innings with 6 or fewer hits allowed in last 4 starts.

VS. NL WEST: In his last 7 starts vs. NL West opponents, has tossed 6 quality bids, going 4-0 with a 2.42 ERA (12 ER in 44.2 IP) with 10 walks and 43 strikeouts.

• In 6 of the 7 starts, has allowed 2 or fewer runs and 6 or fewer hits.

LOSSLESS STREAK: Merrill Kelly's 12 consecutive starts without a loss is tied for the third longest active streak in the Majors (also: Ryne Nelson), behind Blake Snell/SF (17) and Chris Sale/ATL (14).

• Kelly's streak is 1 shy of tying the longest of his career (13 from July 1-Sept. 6, 2022) and tied for eighth longest by a D-backs' starting pitcher all-time (also: Nelson), behind Armando Reynoso (17 in 1999), Zac Gallen (16 in 2022), Patrick Corbin (16 in 2013), Robbie Ray (14 in 2018), Kelly (13 in 2022), Miguel Batista (13 in 2006) and Brandon Webb (13 in 2006).

MILESTONE TRACKER: His 736 career strikeouts rank seventh on the franchise's all-time strikeouts list, behind Randy Johnson (2,077), Brandon Webb (1,065), Robbie Ray (998), Patrick Corbin (897), Curt Schilling (875) and Zac Gallen (842).

• His 53 wins are sixth on the franchise's wins list, behind Johnson (118), Webb (87), Schilling (58), Corbin (56) and Zack Greinke (55).

5.0+-INNING STREAK: His 38 consecutive starts of 5.0+ innings from April 6-Sept. 5 marked the second longest streak in the Majors since 2022, behind only Mitch Keller (49 straight starts from April 5, 2023-July 8, 2024).

JUST LOOKING: Since Aug. 11, his 13.07 strikes looking above average (SLAA) is third among NL starters, behind Blake Snell/SF (21.22) and Zac Gallen/AZ (16.23), while his 112.5 pct. strikes looking rate vs. Average (SL+) is second, behind Snell (119.5%).

RISPY BUSINESS: Has held opponents to 2 or fewer runs with runners in scoring position in 9 of his 11 starts, including 5 straight (.196 AVG; 10-for-51/.603 OPS).

LIMITING LEFTIES: Is limiting lefties to a .211 AVG (27-for-128) with 21 strikeouts...has held lefties to 5 or fewer hits in 11 of his 12 starts, including a combined 2 hits over his last 3 bids.

2023 RECAP: Went 12-8 with a 3.29 ERA (65 ER in 177.2 IP) in his fifth season with Arizona.

- Set a career high with 187 strikeouts (previous: 177 in 2022).
- Recorded his 500th career strikeout on April 6 vs. Dodgers.
- Made his 100th career start with the D-backs on April 11 and finished the season with 127 starts, the sixth-most starts in franchise history.
- Tied a career high in strikeouts with 12 on Sept. 4 vs. Rockies (2x; last: 8/24/23 vs. CIN)...marked the second time in 2023 striking out 11+ batters vs. Rockies (also: 11 on Aug. 14 @ Coors Field).

2023 ROAD RECAP: In 15 road starts in 2023, went 7-3 with a 4.07 ERA (38 ER in 84.0 IP), 81 strikeouts and 33 walks.

In his first 7 road starts last season, went 6-0 with a 1.98 ERA (9 ER in 41.0 IP), 1.02 WHIP, opponent .211 AVG (31-for-147)/.269 OBP and 37 strikeouts.

2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS: In Game 2 of the World Series @ Rangers, became the fourth D-backs pitcher (5 times overall) to allow 1 run or fewer over 7.0+ innings in a World Series start (also: Randy Johnson, Curt Schilling [2x] and Miguel Batista...additionally, his 9 strikeouts tied Schilling for second-most strikeouts in a World Series game by a D-backs starter behind Johnson's 11 strikeouts.

Also in Game 2 of the World Series, retired the first 11 batters faced, surpassing the record for
most consecutive batters retired by a D-backs pitcher to start a World Series game (previous:
10 by Randy Johnson on Oct. 28, 2001 in Game 2 vs. Yankees) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

USA! USA!: Selected to pitch for Team USA in the 2023 World Baseball Classic, marking the first time participating with a national team at any level.

- Went 0-1 with an 8.31 ERA (4 ER in 4.1 IP) over 2 games.
- Started the fourth game vs. Colombia and championship vs. Japan.

ARIZONA NATIVE: Grew up in Scottsdale, Ariz., and attended Desert Mountain High School, Yavapai College and Arizona State University...attended Arizona State University (2010) and helped the Sun Devils reach the College World Series in 2010...went to Yavapai College in Prescott, Ariz. (2008-09) and went 15-1 in 2 seasons.

INTERNATIONAL STINT: Played 4 seasons (2015-18) with the SK Wyverns in the KBO League.

- ♦His 8 wins are 1 shy of tying his career-high 9 set in 2023.
- ♦Is limiting hitters to a .233 AVG (24-for-103) off his slider (38.5%) with 43 strikeouts and a 41.6% whiff.
- ♦ Has allowed just 4 of his 27 inherited runners to score (14.8%).
- ♦ Issued 4 walks in his last 17 games since (64 BF, 15.0 IP).
- ♦ With runners in scoring position, opponents are hitting .198 (16-for-81)/.247 OBP with 5 walks and 26 strikeouts.
- ♦In 23 home games from May 26-Sept. 11, went 3-2 with a 0.79 ERA (2 ER in 22.2 IP), opponent .233 AVG (20-for-86)/.624 OPS, 6 walks and 29 strikeouts.
- ♦Did not allow an earned run in 15 of his 17 games from Aug. 5-Sept. 11, going 2-1 with a 1.62 ERA (3 ER in 16.2 IP), 1.08 WHIP, opponent .203 AVG (12-for-59)/.595 OPS, 6 walks and 22 strikeouts.
- ♦In 44 games from May 30-Sept. 11 with men on, had a .169 AVG (12for-71)/.231 OBP with 3 extra-base hits, 5 walks and 23 strikeouts.
- ♦In his last 26 road games, went 3-1 with a 3.12 ERA (9 ER in 26.0 IP), 0.92 WHIP, opp. .223 AVG (21-for-94), 3 walks and 26 strikeouts.

- ♦Is limiting lefties to a .152 AVG (5-for-33) with 1 walk, 12 strikeouts and no extra-base hits.
- ♦Is holding hitters to a .100 AVG (1-for-10)/.182 OBP with men on base over his last 6 appearances since June 23.
