METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Phillies, 7-2, last night...The Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (16-6)...The Mets are 61-11 when scoring first this season... New York is 27-7-3 in 37 series this year...The Mets continue a 10-game, nine-day road trip (2-3) to Atlanta (1-3), Philadelphia (1-0) and New York-AL (two games).

LET'S PLAY TWO: New York is set to play its eighth doubleheader of the season today... The Mets are 11-3 (.786) this season in doubleheaders, the most wins in baseball in twin-bill games...It's the team's second doubleheader at Citizen's Bank Park this year...The Mets split a doubleheader on May 8, falling 3-2 in game one and winning 6-1 in the nightcap...The team's seven doubleheaders so far are tied for third in the majors...It will be the club's 22nd double dip since 2021, more than any other team in the majors...The Mets have earned at least a split in all 21 of their twinbills over the last two years...Elias notes the team's streak of 21 consecutive doubleheaders without being swept is the longest in Mets history...New York has swept five of their last eight doubleheaders, including four DH sweeps this season...The last time the Mets were swept in a doubleheader was September 26, 2020 at Washington.

HOME, STEAL HOME: Starling Marte stole home last night...It was the second time this season he recorded a steal of home...Marte joined Hubie Brooks (1991) as the only other Mets player to steal home twice in a season...Marte's two steals of home ties a franchise record joining Brooks and Doug Flynn.

EASY AS 1-2-3: Since August 1, New York leads MLB with 44 runs scored and a differential over the first three innings...Overall, the Mets are batting .264/.335/.411 in innings 1-3 this season...Their .264 average is third in the majors and second in the NL... Their .335 OBP is second in the majors.

ZERO IN ON THIS NOTE: Trevor Williams has not allowed a run over his last 20.0 innings, 1.0 inning shy of his career-best scoreless streak (July 11-August 5, 2018)...During his current scoreless streak, Williams has posted a 0.75 WHIP and has held opposing batters to a .174 (12-69) batting average...It is the fourth-longest active scoreless streak behind Seattle's Casey Sadler (27.2 IP), Arizona's Zac Gallen (21.1 IP) and teammate Edwin Díaz (21.0 IP)...Carlos Carrasco owns the longest scoreless streak by a Mets pitcher this season, 22.2 IP from July 14-August 4.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso has recorded 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year...He is the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He is the first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado accomplished the feat in 2007 and 2008.

PHILLY PETE: Pete Alonso is hitting .339 (19-56) with six doubles, six homers, a Mets-record-tying 22 RBI and 13 runs scored against the Phillies this season...Mike Piazza had 22 RBI against the Phillies in 2002...No other player has more RBI against a single opponent this year.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso collected his 24th game-winning RBI last night, tying a Mets single-season record also held by Keith Hernandez (1985)...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) share the MLB record with 27 game-winning RBI...Alonso has 10 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 10 of the Mets' 19 second-half wins.

30 FOR 20: Pete Alonso became the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons...Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 136 home runs...His 78 home runs on the road rank seventh in franchise history. Dave Kingman is sixth with 81 road homers.

TAKE IT TO THE BANK: Starling Marte is a career .389 (49-126) hitter with 26 runs, 16 doubles, five home runs, 16 RBI, seven walks with a .438 OBP and a .635 SLG in 32 career games at Citizens Bank Park...He has safely reached base in each of his last 12 games at the ballpark, batting .440 (22-50) with 15 runs, seven doubles, two homers, seven RBI, a walk and a 1.162 OPS in that span.

MEET THE BRETT: Brett Baty has appeared in the three major league games and is 3-10 with a run, a home run, four RBI and a walk...He is batting .500 (3-6) with a home run and four RBI with runners in scoring position...He has safely hit in each of his first three games in The Show...He is the first Mets player to record a hit in each of his three games since Pete Alonso began his career with a four-game hitting streak from March 28-April

JUICY J: Jeff McNeil is batting .324 (35-108) batting average against left-handed pitchers this year...That is the second-best mark by a lefty this year and the best in the majors...McNeil is second in the majors with a .348 (65-187) road batting average...He is batting .348/.399/.497 with 23 runs, 17 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 16 RBI and 12 walks in 50 games on the road this year...He leads the majors in batting average with a .409 mark in the month of August...In 18 games this month, he is batting .409/.444/.636 with 11 runs, nine doubles, two triples, nine RBI and three walks.

PHILS-METS NOTES: The Mets have outscored the Phillies 81-48 in 15 games this season...The Mets have won nine of their last 11 games against the Phillie

STARTING OFF: Since the start of July, Mets starters have posted a 2.58 ERA (73 earned runs/254.1 innings) in 44 games with 280 strikeouts and 59 walks...The Dodgers are the only team with a better ERA in that time frame...New Yorks' 280 strikeouts in that span lead the NL and are second in the majors...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.48 in that span...The Mets rank fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.48 ERA from their starters.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 130 consecutive days...According to Elias, It's the fifth longest-streak in franchise history

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 77 games this season, second-most in the NL and tied for the second-most in the majors...Their .642 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 77-43 record through the team's first 120 games...Only the 1986 (79-41) team posted a better record through the first 120 games of the season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 37-24 on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...Their .607 road winning percentage is the second-best in MLB...New York is batting .259/.325/.417 away from Citi Field...Their .259 road average ranks third in the majors and is the best in the NL and their .325 OBP on the road ranks fourth in the majors.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East (4-4)...Overall, the Mets are 41-18 against the East this year...They have lost only one series in the division all season long (against Atlanta, August 15-18) and have already clinched the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...New York must win one of its three remaining games against Atlanta to lock up all four season series vs. division foes (last accomplished by the Mets in 2015)...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.20 ERA against the East, while hitting .260/.333/.417...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 292-200.

HERE COMES THE SUN KING: The Mets have won six straight day games and 10 of their last 12 games in the sunshine...Overall, New York is 31-15 in day games this season...The team's .674 winning percentage in the sunlight is the second-best in the majors and the best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 2.97 ERA with 117 walks and 449 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 2.97 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and second in the NL, while their 449 punchouts are fourth in the majors and the second-most in the Senior Circuit.

fWAR WHAT IS IT GOOD fOR?: Francisco Lindor is hitting .419/.472/.903 with RISP since July 9, going 13-31 with a double, a triple, four home runs, 20 RBI and four walks in those spots...He ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.3 fWAR... Lindor is on a four-game hitting streak, batting 8-18 (.444) in that span with three runs, a home run and an RBI.

LIFE IN THE FAST LANE: Edwin Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 96 strikeouts...That is 21 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has done so in 48.1 innings...He is seeking to become the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in a season in major league history...Aroldis Chapman currently owns the record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 4, 2012 in 51.0 innings...Armando Benítez owns the franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings... Courtesy of Elias.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 21 outings dating back to June 22, covering 21.0 innings, establishing a career-high scoreless streak...42 of Díaz last 59 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards and since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.33 ERA (one earned runs/27.2 innings) with 11 hits, four walks and 58 strikeouts...He has converted all 16 saves in that period.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz has struck out 52.5% of batters faced (96/183), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 48 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.88 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 27 saves, a 1.30 ERA (7 ER/48.1 IP), allowing 27 hits and 14 walks...The Mets are 42-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 19-8 in the second-half...The team's 19 wins are the second-most in the majors, and their .704 winning percentage ranks third...The team is batting .278/.343/.452 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average, are second in OBP and are fourth in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 134-95 following the break.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Earned the win for the Mets in game one of a doubleheader on August 6 vs. Atlanta...Was his sixth victory of the season, tying his careerhigh from 2020...Tossed 5.1 scoreless innings with three hits, three walks and five strikeouts...While with Triple-A Syracuse, Peterson allowed two runs on eight hits and two walks with seven strikeouts while suffering the loss on August 14 vs. Buffalo.

GOT 'EM: Peterson struck out seven or more batters in six straight starts from June 20-July 17, the longest such streak of his career...He has 56 strikeouts across 39.0 innings since June 20 (9 G/7 GS) for a 12.92 K/9 $\,$ ratio, a mark that ranks fourth in the majors in that span (min. 30.0 IP)... His 54 strikeouts over his last seven starts are the most by a Mets lefthanded starter over a seven-game span since Johan Santana punched out 60 batters in seven starts from April 12-May 16, 2009.

200 KLUB: Struck out the 200th batter of his career in his last start on August 6 vs. Atlanta when he punched out Matt Olson swinging in the sixth frame...Is the 10th pitcher in Mets history to reach 200 strikeouts in their first 43 career games...He is the first to accomplish the feat since Steven Matz recorded his 200th strikeout in his 39th career game in 2017.

VS. PHILADELPHIA: Faced the Phillies once this season, at Citizens Bank Park on April 11...Threw 4.0 innings of scoreless relief with three hits, two walks and three strikeouts...ls 1-1 with a 4.67 ERA (14 earned runs/27.0 innings) in six games (five starts) against Philadelphia in his career...Is his first start against the Phillies since June 25, 2021...Is 3-1 and has pitched to a 2.70 ERA (11 earned runs/36.2 innings) in seven games (six starts) against National League East opponents this season.

FOUR-HIT WONDER: Has allowed four hits or fewer in 14 of his 18 games this season and 32 of 43 career games (163 career hits)...Among Mets hurlers, only Nolan Ryan (144 hits) has allowed less hits in their first 43 major league games (min. 175.0 IP).

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: This season, Peterson has limited lefties to a .169 (11-65) average...Among left-handed hurlers, it is second-lowest opponents' average in the National League (min. 60 LHB faced) behind Miami's Braxton Garrett (.164).

ON THE FARM: Peterson has made six starts with Triple-A Syracuse this season...He has gone 2-3 and has posted a 4.85 ERA (14 earned runs/26.0 innings) with 10 walks against 34 strikeouts...Gave up just one home run in his first start of the season on April 28.

OH, THE RELIEF: In four outings out of the bullpen this year, Peterson has gone 1-0, posting a 4.50 ERA (four earned runs/8.0 innings)...This compares to a 3.17 ERA (25 earned runs/71.0 innings) while going 5-2 in 14 starts.

ELECTRIC SLIDE: Peterson has held batters to .157 (17-108) average with his slider this season and 61 of his 91 strikeouts have come on the pitch...His 50.8 strikeout percentage with his slider is fifth-highest in MLB (min. 50 PA).

I SEE THE LIGHT: Has gone 3-0 with a 1.41 ERA (five earned runs/32 innings) across five starts during the day this season...This compares going 2-2 with a 4.62 ERA (20 earned runs/39.0 innings) in eight starts at night...It's the best day-time ERA among pitchers with at least five such starts in the NL.
