

LOS ANGELES ANGELS (13-23) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (17-20) May 8, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA – 12:35 EDT – GAME #38/HOME #18 RHP JOSE SORIANO (1-4, 3.77 ERA) vs. MARTÍN PÉREZ (1-2, 3.15 ERA)

THE PIRATES:...were held to three hits while being shut out 9-0 last night...Have split the first two games of their current series with the Angels...Began the year 9-2 before losing 17 of 22 games between 4/9 and 5/3...Have gone 14-1 when scoring at least four runs in a game this season (their only loss came on April 25 against Milwaukee)...Have gone 4-0 in extra innings this season, which is tied for the second-wins in extra frames in MLB along with the Braves (Cleveland leads with five)...It is Pittsburgh's longest win streak in extra-innings games to begin a season since 2012 (also 4-0)...The last start to a season with a longer streak was 1960 (7-0).

ABOUT TODAY'S STARTER: Martín Pérez gets the start today in the finale of this series against the Angels...Pérez comes into today with the sixth-lowest ERA (3.15) among qualified left-handed pitchers in MLB...The only five southpaws with a lower ERA coming into today are Shota Imanaga (1.08), Ranger Suarez (1.72), Tarik Skubal (1.90), Yusei Kikuchi (2.72) and Tyler Anderson (2.74).

EAMILIAR FOE: Martín Pérez has made 25 career appearances (20 starts) against the Angels... The only team he has made more appearances against are the Mariners (31)...Since the beginning of the 2019 season, Pérez has gone 4-1 with a 3.92 ERA in eight appearances (seven starts) against the Angels.

ON DECK: Pittsburgh's nine-game homestand will wrap up with a three-game series against the Cubs that gets underway Friday night...Friday's game will begin a stretch that has the Bucs facing the Cubbies seven times in the next 10 games.

MICHAEL'S MILESTONE: The next game for Michael A. Taylor will be his 1000th in the big leagues...Taylor made his big league debut as a member of the Washington Nationals on August 12, 2014, against the Mets...Since the beginning of the 2021 season, Taylor has the second-most Defensive Runs Saved (53) among all players in MLB regardless of position according to the Fielding Bible...The only player with more Defensive Runs Saved in that time is current teammate Ke'Bryan Hayes (65).

<u>CRUZING ALONG</u>: Oneil Cruz is hitting at a .311 clip (14-for-45) with two doubles, two home runs and six RBI in his last 14 games dating back to April 22...He's also hitting .333 (11-for-33) off right-handed pitchers during that same time frame.

KUDOS FOR KYLE: Kyle Nicolas has tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in four appearances since being promoted from Triple-A Indianapolis on April 26...Since allowing a combined seven runs in 2.1 innings in his first two career appearances in the big leagues, Nicolas has tossed 7.0 scoreless innings while recording a .167 batting average against (4-for-24) in six games.

CLOSING IN ON OROSCO: Avoldis Chapman comes into today with 1168 career strikeouts, which is just one shy of tying Jesse Orosco for the second-most all-time among left-handed relievers (Billy Wagner leads with 1196)...Chapman also enters today with the third-lowest batting average against (.132) among NL relievers behind Kyle Finnegan (.120 and .Erik Miller (.127).

A BRADENTON BLANKING: Last night the Low-A Bradenton Marauders tossed their third shutout in five games while extending their winning streak to five games (Thomas Harrington started and tossed 3.0 innings on his rehab assignment)...Since April 26, Bradenton's pitching staff has recorded a 1.61 ERA, which is the lowest among all full-season minor league teams.

THE RENEGADE: David Bednar has converted each of his last five save opportunities and comes into today with 67, which is tied with Matt Capps for the eighth-most in team history (Jose Mesa is seventh with 70).

KNOW WHEN TO HOLDERMAN: Colin Holderman threw a total of nine pitches (six strikes) on Saturday while extending his scoreless streak to 8.0 innings...Since allowing two runs in his season debut on April 11, Holderman has allowed just four hits in 28 at-bats (.143 average)... Holderman's .156 batting average against this season is tied for the 12th-lowest among all National League relievers...Teammate Luis Ortiz has the 10th-lowest batting average against (.154) among NL relievers.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

May 8, 1994: Andy Van Slyke went 8-for-9 on Mother's Day while raising his average 56 points as the Pirates swept Chicago in a doubleheader at Three Rivers Stadium. Van Slyke's eight hits were one shy of the Major League record for a doubleheader.
