## MAGIC NUMBER

The Reds are trying to become the first team ever to win a division after losing at least 100 games the season before ( $62-100$ )...the Brewers' Magic Number to eliminate the Reds from contention for the NL Central title is 4.

## FROM 100 TO POSTSEASON

The Reds are trying to become the third team ever to make the playoffs following a 100 loss season (2017 Twins, 2020 Marlins) and the fourth Postseason team with a losing home record during the regular season (1981 Royals, 19-28; 2001 Braves, 40-41; 2020 Marlins, 11-15)...courtesy @EliasSports.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES Last season the Reds finished 62-100 (.383)... at 79-84 (.516), the Reds have the largest increase in both wins ( +17 ) and winning percentage (+.133) of any Major League team from 2022 to 2023...courtesy @EliasSports.

## ROLLER COASTER

From 4/24-7/31 the Reds went 52-34 (.605), the second-best record in the Major Leagues behind the Braves (53-29, .646)...through games of July 31, the Reds led the NL Central by 1.5 games over the Brewers and by 5.0 games over the third-place Cubs ...followed that 3-month hot stretch with a 10-17 August and began September in third place, 6.0 games behind the Brewers and 3.0 games behind the Cubs...are 10-8 so far in September and won 6 of their last 9 games.

## KOMEBACK KIDS

The Orioles lead the Major Leagues with 48 come-from-behind wins, followed by the Reds with $46 \ldots$..the Reds won 24 games in their final plate appearance, including 10 walkoff wins...the single-season club record for comeback wins in a season is 54, held by the 1976 Big Red Machine

## TODAY'S GAME

Is David Bell's 700th game as Reds manager (330-369, .472)
Is Game 3 (1-1) of a 3-game series vs Bobby Nightengale's first-place Twins and Game 3 (1-1) of a 7-day, 6-game homestand that includes tomorrow's off day followed by a weekend series vs the Pirates.
Following this homestand, the Reds will finish the season with a 5-game road trip to Cle's Progressive Field (2g) and StL's Busch Stadium (off day, 3g).

## SERIES NOTES

The Reds are 17-16 all-time vs the Twins, including 5-5 at Great American Ball Park.
A 2-1 series win in April 2018 snapped a streak in which the Reds had lost 9 consecutive interleague road series of at least 3 games, dating back to September 2013.
With a $7-2$ win at Target Field on $9 / 25 / 20$, the Reds clinched their most recent Postseason berth, their first since 2013
During that 2020 COVID-19 season, the Reds were the only road team to win a series at Target Field, where the Twins finished with the best home record in the Major Leagues at 24-7.

## ROTATION

Rookie pitchers have made 55 starts for the Reds, including 13 of the Reds' 18 games in September...barring weather complications, rookies are projected to start 19 of the Reds' 27 games in September/October.

- LHP Brandon Williamson (21gs), who began the season at Class AAA Louisville, is 0-1, 9.00 in 2 starts in September.
LHP Andrew Abbott (19gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, is 0-1, 5.79 in 3 starts in September.
RHP Connor Phillips (3gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, is 1-0, 5.74 in September.
RHP Lyon Richardson (4gs), who began the season at Class A Daytona, went 0-1, 8.68 in 2 starts in September.
RHP Carson Spiers (2gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, went $0-1,9.00$ in 2 starts and 1 relief appearance in September.
RHP Fernando Cruz (2gs), who last year at age 33 made his Major League debut with 14 apps, started Tue's 7-0 loss vs Min
Richardson, Abbott, Spiers, Williamson and Phillips made their Major League debuts this season, along with fellow starter RHP Levi Stoudt (2gs), who began the season at Class AAA Louisville.

## ET THE KIDS PLAY

With 58 HR the Reds have established a new franchise record for home runs in a season by rookies (Spencer Steer 22, Matt McLain 16, Elly De La Cruz 11, Christian Encarnacion-Strand 8, Noelvi Marte 1)...the 2008 team recorded 54 home runs by rookies (Joey Votto 24, Jay Bruce 21, Chris Dickerson 6, Ryan Hanigan 2, Paul Janish 1).
The Reds are the first team in Major League history with 3 rookies, in a single season, with at least 10 HR \& 10 stolen bases each (Elly De La Cruz, Matt McLain, Spencer Steer).

For the first time since 1890, when Cincinnati joined the NL, 3 Reds rookies have produced at least 10 HR. On 8/22 at LAA, in his 64th career game, Elly De La Cruz recorded his 20th stolen base to become the fastest player since 1900 to accumulate at least 10 HR and at least 20 steals...Barry Bonds did it in his 65th career appearance, just ahead of Reds rookies Chris Sabo ( 66 g ) and Gary Redus ( 67 g )...courtesy @EliasSports.
Elly De La Cruz is the only Major League player since RBI became an official statistic in 1920 to produce in his first 80 career games at least 79 hits, 11 HR, 36 RBI and 25 stolen bases...courtesy @EliasSports.
Elly De La Cruz and Spencer Steer on 7/4 at Wsh became the first set of rookie teammates in Major League history to finish in the same game 4-for-4 with at least 1 RBI (since RBI became an official statistic in 1920)...courtesy @EliasSports. IF Matt McLain (5/22-5/28) and IF Elly De La Cruz (6/19-6/25) each earned National League Player of the Week awards, McLain in the second week of his career and De La Cruz in his third week.

## RED HOTS

- This afternoon is making his third start since a 9-day stint on the COVID-19 injured list (9/1-9/9)... will be his first career appearance vs the Twins.

Was confirmed with COVID-19 following his start on 8/30...remained isolated in San Francisco for 5 days before returning to Cincinnati on $9 / 5 \ldots$...came off the COVID-19 injured list just prior to his start on $9 / 10$ vs StL.

- In his $7-1$ win on $9 / 10$ vs StL recorded his seventh career start of at least 6.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer... 4 Reds pitchers held the Cardinals to 1 hit, an RBI-single off Greene by Andrew Knizner in the fourth inning.
- His 7 starts of at least 6.0 innings and no more than 2 hits allowed are the most by a Reds pitcher in his first 42 career starts.
- In Fri's 5-3 win at NYM took a no-hitter into the sixth inning before allowing a 3-run HR to Pete Alonso that tied the game at 3-3.

Has made 5 starts since a 62-day stint on the injured list because of right hip pain (6/19-8/19).

- In those 5 starts went 2-2, 6.08 (23.2ip, 23h, 19r, 16er, 14bb, 29k, 6hr, . 240baa).
- Missed a start on $6 / 6$ vs LAD because of stiffness in his right hip....after he skipped that start went 1-0, 3.97 in 2 more apps before he went on the IL on $6 / 19$.
- In his last 5 starts before the injury went 2-1, 2.97 ( $30.1 \mathrm{ip}, 1 \mathrm{~h}, 10 \mathrm{er}, 14 \mathrm{bb}, 41 \mathrm{k}, .163 \mathrm{baa}$ ).
- From 8/1-8/15 made 4 rehabilitation starts for the ACL Reds (1gs, 2ip, 1h, Or, Obb, 3k) and Louisville (3gs, 12ip, 6h, 5r, 4er, 7bb, 12k, 2hr).

Has been charged with a team-high 4 pitch timer violations, most recently on $5 / 10$ vs NYM (Pete Alonso walked),
In the third inning on $6 / 1$ at Bos recorded his 250th career strikeout (Connor Wong)...became the fourth-fastest pitcher to reach that milestone by innings pitched (184.0; Spencer Strider 158.1, Corbin Burnes 176.0, Kerry Wood 183.0).

In the bottom of the fourth inning of that 8-2 loss on $6 / 1$ at Fenway Park, Rafael Devers led off with a double that snapped Greene's hitless innings streak at 9.0 ( 18 strikeouts) covering 2 starts.

Finished that start vs the Red Sox just 2 strikeouts shy of his third consecutive game with at least 10 strikeouts...no Reds pitcher, since the mound was moved to its current distance in 1893, ever has recorded at least 10 strikeouts in 3 consecutive apps...courtesy @EliasSports.
In his first 36 career apps produced 6 starts of at least 6.0 innings with 2 hits or fewer, the most ever by a Reds pitcher in that few starts.
In the 9-0 win on $5 / 26$ at Wrigley Field, for the second time in his career threw at least 6.0 innings without allowing a hit ( $1-0$ loss on $5 / 15 / 22$ at Pit, 7.1 ip).
Produced a career-high 29.0-inning homerless streak between home runs by Oneil Cruz on $3 / 30$ vs Pit and Elvis Andrus on $5 / 5$ vs WSox.
Was the Reds' 2023 Opening Day starting pitcher.
At age 23 years, 236 days became the first pitcher age 25 or under to start for the Reds on Opening Day since 1980, when at age 22 years, 232 days RHP Frank Pastore beat Phil Niekro and the Braves, 9-0...became the first second-year pitcher to start for the Reds on Opening Day since 26-year-old RHP Raisel Iglesias started the 6-2 win vs the Phillies in the 2016 season opener...courtesy @EliasSports.
On $4 / 18$ signed a $\$ 53$ million contract through the 2028 season that includes for 2029 a $\$ 21$ million club option and $\$ 2$ million buyout.

- Was selected by the Reds in the first round (2nd overall pick) of the June 2017 first-year player draft.
- Missed the 2019 season while recovering from 4/9/19 "Tommy John" surgery.

## RED HOTS

- On June 1 turned 24 years old.
- Friday will make his 20th Major League appearance and start, his second career appearance vs the Pirates.
- In Sat's 3-2 win at NYM was caught by Tyler Stephenson for the first time this season...Luke Maile, who was hit by a pitch on the back of his left hand on Friday, started behind the plate for Abbot's first 18 starts.
- Didn't debut until $6 / 5$ but still ranks among the National League's rookie leaders in ERA (4th), wins (3rd), strikeouts (2nd), starts (T5th), innings pitched (6th), batting average against (3rd, .231) and WHIP (5th, 1.27).
Began the season at Class AA Chattanooga (3gs, 1-0, 1.15)...on $4 / 25$ was promoted to Class AAA Louisville (7gs, 3-0, 3.05).
- Was selected by the Reds in the second round (53rd overall) of the June 2021 first-year player draft...was signed by Jeff Brookens.
