### Something's Gotta Give

Atlanta and Cleveland entered play this weekend as the only two teams in baseball who have yet to lose a series this season. The two clubs will play their rubber match tonight to decide the winner of this set.

Atlanta has won all three of its three-game series this year, and split four games in Arizona. The Braves are 2-0 in rubber games on the season.

Cleveland has gone to a rubber game in all three of its prior three-game series and won them all, beating Los Angeles-NL, Chicago-NL and Kansas City. The Guardians split four games with the Mariners to open the season.

The Braves and Guardians enter play tonight with identical 9-6 (.600) records and one-game leads in their respective divisions. Only the Dodgers (11-3, .786) and Pirates (9-5, .643) began the day with better winning percentages across baseball.

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** The Braves and Guardians tonight conclude a three-game weekend series in what are the only scheduled meetings between the two teams this season...Cleveland is making just its second ever visit to Truist Park.

*A* Cleveland handed Atlanta its largest margin of defeat this season last night, blanking the Braves, 6-0...The two clubs have split the first two games of this series and will play the rubber match tonight.

*A* The Braves and Guardians have played just 26 times since the advent of interleague play in 1997, with Atlanta playing to a 16-10 record (.615) all-time versus Cleveland...The two franchises have met twice in the World Series, with the then-Indians beating the Boston Braves in six games in 1948, before Atlanta bested Cleveland in six games in 1995 for the championship.

*A* Cleveland is making just its fifth-ever trip to the city of Atlanta, and just its second to Truist Park since the stadium opened in 2017...The Guardians dropped two-of-three here back in 2024, and are an even 7-7 in the city all time...Cleveland's five games here at Truist Park are the fewest by any visiting team in baseball.

*A* RH Tanner Bibee has made one career start against Atlanta prior to tonight, pitching here at Truist Park on April 27, 2024...The 6-foot-2, 205-pound California native tossed 7.0 scoreless innings here that night, allowing just two hits and fanning nine...The right-hander has allowed exactly one run in each of his last two turns this season, and is 0-1 with a 3.29 ERA (5 ER/13.2 IP) through three total starts.

**CHRIS SALE:** Is set tonight to make the 23rd start and 34th total appearance against Cleveland in his career, and enters play 7-8 with a 4.44 ERA (70 ER/142.0 IP) and three saves...The left-hander has, though, won each of his last two starts against the Guardians, going 2-0 with a 1.35 ERA (2 ER/13.1 IP) dating to 2023.

*A* The 6-foot-6, 180-pound native of Lakeland, FL, last pitched on Monday at Los Angeles-AL, and allowed five hits and six runs over just 4.0 innings...The 4.0 innings matched the shortest start of his Braves career, and the six runs are the second most he has allowed with the club.

*A* Allowed a Braves-most eight runs on June 1, 2024 vs. the Athletics...He followed that outing against the A's with 18 consecutive starts allowing no more than two earned runs over the remainder of his season.

*A* All four of Sale's starts this season will come in Interleague Play, the most in history for a player through 16 team games...Sale is 21-11 with a 3.11 ERA over 56 career interleague games (48 starts).

*A* The Braves signed Sale to a one-year, \$27 million contract extension this spring that will cover the 2027 season, with a \$30 million club option for 2028.

**MATT OLSON:** After doubling in last night's ninth inning, Olson now leads Major League Baseball with 11 extra-base hits...Atlanta's first baseman has logged a multi-base hit in each of his last four games, tied for the second-longest active streak in the majors behind Baltimore's Gunnar Henderson (5 games).

*A* This season marks the second time that Olson has collected at least 11 extra-base hits in the team's first 15 games, also doing so in 2024...In modern-era franchise history (since 1900), just one other Brave has started multiple seasons in the same fashion: Hall of Famer Hank Aaron (1959, '69).

*A* Dating to the 2022 season, his first with Atlanta, Olson's 312 extra-base hits are by far the most in the National League...Freddie Freeman, with 291, ranks second.

*A* Olson has compiled 1.1 bWAR through 15 games this season, seventh most in the majors...**Dating to that 2022 season, his 21.9 total bWAR are the most by a first baseman in the majors...**Freddie Freeman, with 21.6 bWAR, ranks second.

**ALL THREE PHASES:** Despite last night's shutout, Atlanta ranks fifth in the majors with 77 runs scored this season...The Braves also pace the majors with a 2.50 ERA as a club, and are the only team in baseball to rank in the top five in both runs scored & ERA...Atlanta also ranks third in the majors with 12 defensive runs saved in the field.

*A* Braves' starting pitchers rank fifth in the majors and second in the NL with a collective ERA of 2.79, while Atlanta's bullpen leads all of baseball with a 2.06 mark...The Braves have, however, allowed eight runs in relief over the last two nights, after yielding just six runs total over their first 13 games.

*A* Atlanta's offense has barreled 44 total balls this season, second most in the majors behind just Los Angeles-NL (48)...The Braves' 20 total homers also trail just the Dodgers (27) in all of baseball.

**IGGY APPROACHING HISTORY:** Raisel Iglesias converted his second save of the season on Tuesday night at Los Angeles, and his next save will be his 100th with Atlanta...He has converted 99 of 113 total save opportunities with the club.

*A* Since Major League Baseball first recognized saves as an official statistic in 1969, just four pitchers in franchise history have recorded at least 100 saves with the club...Craig Kimbrel (186), John Smoltz (154), Gene Garber (141) and Mark Wohlers (112) are the only others to do so.

*A* Iglesias' 255 career saves rank 39th in MLB history and fifth among all active pitchers.

*A* Since his Braves debut on August 5, 2022, Iglesias is 15-12 with a 2.29 ERA (57 ER/224.1 IP) over 227 total appearances...His ERA in that span is best in the National League among pitchers with at least 200 appearances, and his 87.6% save percentage ranks third.

#### Today's Game

Makes his fourth start of the season and 34th career appearance against Cleveland, his 23rd career start against the Guardians...Enters tonight two wins shy of 150 for his career.

Tonight marks Sale's fourth interleague start through Atlanta's first 16 games of the season, the most by any National League pitcher to open a season in major league history...Per Baseball Reference, 10 pitchers had previously made three interleague starts in a team's first 16 games, most recently Milwaukee's Jacob Misiorowski and St. Louis' Dustin May in 2026.

Sale is 7-8 with a 4.44 ERA (70 ER/142.0 IP) and 159 strikeouts in 33 career appearances (22 starts) against the Guardians...Won his last start against Cleveland on April 26, 2024 at Truist Park, holding the Guardians to two hits and one earned run over 7.0 innings with six strikeouts in Atlanta's 6-2 victory.

Coming off his shortest outing of the season on April 6 at Los Angeles (AL), where he allowed six earned runs on five hits over 4.0 innings in a 6-2 loss to the Angels...Surrendered home runs to Zach Neto (leadoff, first pitch) and Jo Adell (two-run, fifth inning)...Threw 77 pitches (49 strikes) before exiting.

Reached 400 career strikeouts as a Brave in the loss on April 6, the 13th pitcher in franchise history to reach the plateau.

Has posted a 2.54 ERA (90 ER/319.1 IP) with 401 strikeouts in 53 appearances (52 starts) through his first three seasons with Atlanta (2024-26).

Since joining the Braves in 2024, Sale's 2.54 ERA is the third lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 starts...Trails only Cy Young Award winners Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes (2.08) and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (2.31).

Sale's 2.48 FIP since joining the Braves leads the majors among pitchers with at least 50 starts over that span...Ahead of Pittsburgh's Skenes (2.48) and Detroit's Skubal (2.49).

Sale's career rate of K/9 (11.12) and K/BB ratio (5.27) are both the highest marks in baseball history among pitchers with at least 2,000.0 innings pitched.

He's logged 91 games with 10 or more strikeouts throughout his career; eighth-most in MLB history...Has 20 career games with at least 10 strikeouts and zero walks issued, also the eighth most in baseball history dating to 1901...Needs two more to tie six-time All-Star Curt Schilling for seventh on the all-time list.

Signed a one-year, \$27 million contract extension with Atlanta on February 24, keeping him under club control through 2027 with a team option for 2028.

Went 2-0 with a 2.75 ERA in five Grapefruit League starts this spring, striking out 15 over 19.2 innings with just one walk...Allowed one run over 6.0 innings in his final spring outing on March 21 at Boston.

#### 2026

Won his seventh career Opening Day start on March 27, holding Kansas City to three hits over 6.0 scoreless innings with six strikeouts in the 6-0 victory...Threw 88 pitches (54 strikes), inducing two double plays, and did not allow a runner past second base.

Became the first Braves starting pitcher to throw 6.0-or-more innings on Opening Day since Michael Soroka (6.0 IP, July 24, 2020).

Is the first Braves lefty to toss 6.0-plus scoreless innings while allowing three or fewer hits in the season opener since Tom Glavine on April 7, 1992 at Houston.

His seven Opening Day starts are tied for the second-most among active pitchers with Toronto's Max Scherzer...Trails only Detroit's Justin Verlander (12)...Is the 11th pitcher in MLB history to make multiple Opening Day starts for three different teams.

Was the season-opening starter for Chicago (AL) in 2013-14, '16, Boston in 2018-19 and Atlanta in 2025-26.

Earned the win in his second start on April 1, holding the Athletics to one hit and one run over 6.0 innings with three strikeouts in Atlanta's 5-1 victory...Shea Langeliers' solo home run in the fourth was the lone baserunner against Sale, who threw 79 pitches (57 strikes).

Suffered the loss on April 6 at Los Angeles (AL), surrendering six earned runs on five hits over 4.0 innings...Zach Neto homered on the first pitch of the game and Jo Adell added a two-run homer in the fifth...Issued two walks, his first of the season, and threw 77 pitches (49 strikes) before departing..

#### 2025

Went 7-5 with a 2.58 ERA (36 ER/125.2 IP) and 165 strikeouts in 21 games (20 starts) in his second season with Atlanta...Was named to the NL All-Star team for the second consecutive season.

Missed 62 games after landing on the 15-day injured list on June 21 with a fractured left rib cage...Posted a 1.75 ERA in six appearances since being activated.

Pitched to a 2.72 ERA with a 51:6 strikeout-to-walk ratio over his final 36.1 innings after returning from the injury.

Recorded his 2,500th career strikeout on May 29 against Philadelphia - the fastest pitcher to reach the milestone in innings pitched (2,026.0 IP), breaking Hall-of-Famer Randy Johnson's previous mark (2,107.2 IP).

## Career Recap

**Awards:** NL Cy Young (2024), Rawlings Gold Glove (2024), NL Comeback Player of the Year (2024), AL All-Star (7x, 2012-18), NL All-Star (2024-25), and World Series Champion (2018).

In his 16th major league season, Sale was selected to seven consecutive AL All-Star teams from 2012-2018, was selected to the NL All-Star team in 2024 & 2025, and has eight career Top 10 finishes in Cy Young voting, winning the award with Atlanta in 2024.

In his first year with Atlanta and 14th major league season, Sale was named the National League Cy Young Award winner, a Rawlings Gold Glove Award recipient, a National League All-Star, a First-Team All-MLB Nomination and the National League Comeback Player of the Year, going 18-3 with a 2.38 ERA (47 ER/177.2 IP) and 225 strikeouts.

Led the National League in wins, strikeouts and ERA...Became the first pitcher in Braves franchise history to win the triple crown and first in the National League since Clayton Kershaw with Los Angeles in 2011.
