METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 4-3, last night at Citi Field... The Mets have lost 13 of their last 15 games...The Mets are in the midst of a fivegame homestand (1-2) against the Braves (1-2) and Mariners for two games. The Mets and Mariners will head to Williamsport. PA on Sunday for the MLB Little League Classic.

MANEA VS. MARINERS: Tonight, Sean Manaea will face the Seattle Mariners for the 19th time in his career, tied with Houston for his most appearances for any single opponent in his career...Through his first 18 career appearances against Seattle, Manaea is 8-8 with a 3.88 ERA (44 ER/102.0 IP) and 87 strikeouts...His eight wins against the Mariners are his most against any opponent, while his 87 punchouts are his second-most against any team behind Houston (93).

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has reached base safely in all 12 games this month...He is batting 13-46 (.283) with 11 runs, four homers, seven RBI, eight walks, four steals, a .400 OBP and a .543 SLG...Soto has recorded a Major Leagueleading 912 walks this year...He is looking to recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks...With eight more walks, he will become the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

**OVER THE WALL AND ON THE BASEPATHS:** Juan Soto has 29 home runs and 19 stolen bases while Francisco Lindor has 22 home runs and 19 stolen bases... With one more stolen base each the pair would join Carlos Beltrán and David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson, Kevin McReynolds and Darryl Strawberry (1988) and Johnson and Strawberry (1987) as the only pair/trio of Mets teammates to record 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in the same season...Lindor is seeking his fifth 20/20 season which would tie Randy Arozarena for the secondmost such seasons in the majors since 2018 (most: 7, José Ramírez).

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty is batting .262 (16-61) with 12 runs, one double, four homers, eight RBI, seven walks, a steal, a .333 OBP and a .475 SLG over his last 20  $\,$ games..The left-handed batter has hit safely in five of his last seven games and is batting .333 (7-21) with two home runs, four RBI, five runs and three walks during that span....In 55 games at Citi Field this year, he is batting .294/.359/.549 with four doubles, 11 homers, 28 RBI and three steals.

100 GRAND BAR: Pete Alonso is one RBI away from 100 this season...He is looking to record his fourth season with 100+ RBI...That would place him second in team history...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Alonso ranks third in team history in RBI...Wright is the leader (970), followed by Darryl Strawberry (733)...Alonso's 98 RBI are the most in the majors.

LONG BALLS: Pete Alonso's 254 home runs since he joined the league in 2019 are tied for the second-most in the majors with Kyle Schwarber (254)...They trail only Aaron Judge (270)...Alonso's 683 RBI are the most in the majors since 2019... Since his Major League debut in 2019, his 25 multi-homer games are the thirdmost in the league, trailing only Aaron Judge (37) and Kyle Schwarber (28).

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso has reached base three or more times in 27 games this season, tied with Kyle Tucker for the third-most such games in the NL and the fifth-most such games in the major...His seven games reaching base four times are tied for the ninth-most in the NL and tied for the 12th-most in the majors...Has reached base four or more times in 39 career games, which is the seventh-most such games in franchise history...With runners in scoring position this season, is batting .336 (41-122) with eight doubles, 13 home runs, 72 RBI, 25 walks and a 1.161 OPS...Since August 1, he has gone 6-12 with a 1.555 OPS and 13 RBI with runners in scoring position.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch where they play 16 of 19 games against the NL East...They are 1-2 in that span...The Mets are 16-13 against the NL East this season.

**OUCH:** Mets batters have been hit by a pitch 66 times this season which is the third-most in the majors...Alonso's 98 times being hit by a pitch are the most in franchise history.

**20/20 VISION:** The Mets became the only team in the National League and the third team in the majors to feature four players with 20 or more home runs (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor, Nimmo and Juan Soto)...The Yankees and Athletics also have four players with 20+ homers...The Mets have had seven seasons in which at least four players recorded 20+ homers (also: 2024, 2023, 2019, 2016, 2000, 1987)...The team's record is five players with 20+ homers in 2019 (Alonso, Michael Conforto, J.D. Davis, Todd Frazier and Jeff McNeil).

**ALVY WAY BACK:** Since being recalled from Triple-A Syracuse on July 21, Francisco Alvarez has reached base in 13 of his 15 starts...In 17 games since July 21, has batted .280/.390/.580 (14-50) with 10 runs, four doubles, one triple, three home runs, eight RBI and nine walks.

TWO AWAY: Edwin Díaz has 248 saves in 504 career games in the major leagues...According to Elias, his 248 saves are the ninth-most saves for any pitcher through his first 500 career games and the most for any active pitcher... The most saves in first 500 career MLB games among active pitchers: Díaz (248), Kenly Jansen (244), Aroldis Chapman (240), Josh Hader (227 in 465 games), Raisel Iglesias (212).

BLADES OF STEAL: The Mets have safely stolen 35 consecutive bases, the longest active streak in the majors...It's the longest single season for the Mets surpassing the previous high of 35 set in the 2023 season...It is tied with the 2021 Cleveland Guardians and the 1989 St. Louis Cardinals for the fifth-longest such streak in Major League history...They lead the majors with a 90.5% stolen base rate...This is the highest stolen base rate in franchise history...The previous high was set in 2023 (88.7%)...They have been caught stealing only 10 times this year, which is the fewest in the majors...The club's current streak of 48 straight games without getting caught is tied with Boston (2013-14) for the sixth-longest such streak Major League history.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed four earned runs and struck out five over 4.0 innings on August 10 against Milwaukee...He has surrendered multiple runs in each of his last two starts after only allowing one earned run in his first four outings...Has recorded five or more strikeouts in four of his six appearances this season and he has 30 strikeouts through 27.0 innings this season for a 10.00 K/9.

VS. SEATTLE/AL WEST: Has made 18 career appearances (17 starts) against Seattle and has a 8-8 record with a 3.88 ERA (44 ER/102.0 IP) in those contests...Has 87 strikeouts over 102. IP against Seattle, including striking out five or more in eight of his 18 appearances against them...Has made 69 career appearances and 66 starts against AL West opponents and he owns a 23-23 record with a 3.83 ERA (161 ER/378.1 IP)...Has allowed three or fewer runs in each of his last six appearances against AL West opponents dating back to July 4, 2023.

**IN THE CITI:** In 21 career appearances (19 starts) at Citi Field he has posted a 3.54 ERA (45 ER/114.1 IP) and has a 8-2 record...Dating back to July 30, 2024 he has made nine starts and posted a 3.36 ERA (21 ER/56.1 IP)....He has allowed three or fewer runs in seven of those nine starts and the Mets are 7-2 in those games...Over his last nine home starts last season he went 6-0 and recorded a 2.73 ERA (19 ER/62.2 IP).

**RIDE THE HOT HAND:** In his last 24 games (23 starts) since June 26, 2024, is 9-4 with a 3.28 ERA (50 ER/137.1 IP), a .191 (95-497) opponents' batting average and a 0.98 WHIP...Ranks second in the NL in opponents' batting average and seventh in WHIP (min. 400 batters faced)...The Mets are 16-8 in those games.

**RIGHTY DOMINATION:** So far this season righties are batting .221 (19-86) compared to left-handers who are batting .278 (5-18)...Last season he held right-handed hitters to a .190 batting average, compared to his career average to right-handed hitters being at .250...It was the lowest batting average he's held right handers to in his career (in a season where he appeared in more than five games)...

**HERE COMES THE HEAT:** So far this season, Manaea has thrown his four-seam fastball 64.6% of the time, and he has picked up 21 of his 30 strikeouts with his fastball...His fastball has generated a 22.3% whiff rate this season...He has thrown his fastball at the seventh-highest clip (64.6%) among all pitchers who have thrown their fastball at least 300 times this season.

**REHAB STINT:** Was originally placed on the 15-day IL on March 27 (retro. March 24) with a right oblique strain and then was transferred to the 60-day IL on April 29...This season, he has made six rehab appearances (five starts) for Brooklyn, Binghamton, and Syracuse...Over those appearances, he allowed 13 earned runs over 18.2 IP and recorded 23 strikeouts...He made his final rehab start on July 8 with Syracuse, and he allowed three runs over 3.2 IP and struck out five...He threw 73 pitches, 48 for strikes.

**2024 A CAREER YEAR:** Recorded a career-high in innings (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12) and starts (32), while his 184 strikeouts were the second-most in his career and were the ninth-most in the NL last season...The southpaw finished with the lowest full-season ERA of his career (3.47), and he was one of eight pitchers who made 32 or more starts and posted an ERA below 3.50...He held right-handed batters to a .190 average, tied for the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...From July 1 until the end of the season, Manaea was first in the majors in innings (105.1), second in quality starts (12) as well as sixth in strikeouts (108) and WHIP (0.93)...Made four Postseason starts, going 2-1 with a 4.74 ERA (10 ER/19.0 IP), eight walks and 19 strikeouts...He earned wins in Game 3 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia and Game 2 of the NLCS at Los Angeles.

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** Last season, Manaea completed at least 7.0 innings in nine of his 32 starts this season and that was tied for the sixth-most such outings in the National League...Manaea recorded back-to-back starts of 7.0 scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts on 7/30/24 against Minnesota and 8/5/24 at St.Louis...Manaea joined Tyler Glasnow and Spence Schwellenbach as the only pitchers in the majors last season with consecutive starts of 7.0 or more innings and double-digit strikeouts...Manaea was the only one of three to not allow a run in both of those starts...He became the first Mets pitcher to throw 7.0 or more innings and record 10 or more strikeouts in consecutive starts since Max Scherzer (4/19/22 (2) - 4/25/22)...The southpaw joins Dwight Gooden (Two Separate Occasions) and Tom Seaver (Three Separate Occasions) as the only pitchers in franchise history to post back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and double-digit strikeouts...He is just the 10th left-handed pitcher in major league history with back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts (Last: Chris Sale, 6/24/18-6/30/18).

**SPECTACULAR DOWN THE STRETCH:** From July on last season, Manaea was second in the majors in quality starts (12), first in innings (105.1), sixth in strikeouts (108) and sixth in WHIP (0.93)...Since June 14, Manaea had allowed three or fewer runs 17 times, which was tied for most in the majors during that span with Chris Sale (17).

**CAREER**: Over the course of 10 Major League Seasons with the Athletics, Padres, Giants, and Mets he has a 78-63 record, a 4.01 ERA (540 ER/1211.1 IP), and 1139 strikeouts in 234 games and 203 starts...His 1139 career strikeouts are the 14th-most among active left-handers...He resigned with the Mets this offseason on a three-year contract in December 2024.

- In his first game back from an Injured List stint, tossed a season-high-tying 5.0 innings of one-hit ball on August 13 (2 ER, BB, 3 K, HR)...Was just the second time in his career he has allowed only one hit in an outing, the other coming on May 25, 2022 (5.1 IP)...He joins Brandon Waddell (5/28, 5.0 IP) as the only Mets relievers since 2023 to throw 5.0+ innings in a game.
