TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 7-game homestand at T-Mobile Park tonight with the 1st of 3 games against the Philadelphia Phillies...Seattle is coming off a 4-game series to open the homestand against the Tampa Bay Rays (1-3)...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Mike Blowers** on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Dave Sims**.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners defeated the Rays by a 2-1 score in 10 innings in yesterday's series finale...Seattle is 11-5 when scoring at least 4 runs and 2-11 when scoring 3 or fewer runs this season...the Mariners are 8-5 at T-Mobile Park and 5-11 on the road.

- **Series Openers** - The Mariners are 5-4 in series openers and 3-1 in home series openers this season.
- **Philly** - Seattle has played Philadelphia just 16 times, tied for the 2nd-fewest matchups for the Mariners (also: Atlanta)...the New York Mets (15 G) are the only club the Mariners have faced fewer times.
- **Series Record** - The Mariners own a 3-5-1 series record (3-1 at home) this season.
- **Home Stretch** - The Mariners are on their 14th of 16 consecutive days with a scheduled game, their longest streak of days with a scheduled game this season.

KIRBY SHINES IN MLB DEBUT...**George Kirby** made his Major League debut in a start with the Mariners yesterday...the 24-year-old pitched 6.0 innings, allowing no runs on 4 hits, with no walks and 7 strikeouts on 81 pitches (55 strikes) in a 2-1 victory over Tampa Bay.

- **Kirb Your Enthusiasm** - Kirby became the first pitcher in club history to toss 6.0+ scoreless innings in a Major League debut...he's the first pitcher to throw 6.0+ scoreless innings without allowing a walk in an MLB debut since Devin Smeltzer-MIN on May 28, 2019...Smeltzer also recorded 7 strikeouts.
- **Hip Hip, Jorge!** - Kirby's 7 strikeouts were tied for 2nd-most by a Seattle pitcher making their Major League debut...the 7 are tied with Brian Snyder (5/25/1985) and Jim Converse (5/22/1993), trailing only Enrique Romo (4/7/1977), who had 9 strikeouts.
- **Kirby's Dream Land** - Kirby registered a "game score" of 71, the highest mark of any Mariners hurler making their MLB debut in club history...it surpassed Blake Beavan (7/3/2011), who had a 69 game score...game score is a statistic devised by Bill James that marks an "average" pitching outing at 50.

J-ROD'S LAST 16...**Julio Rodríguez** is batting .310 (18x58) with 8 runs, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 7 RBI, 5 walks and 6 stolen bases in his last 16 games since April 22...overall this season, he leads the Mariners with 10 stolen bases, going 10-for-11 in stolen base attempts...Julio is the 3rd-fastest (28 G) in club history to reach the 10-steal mark to begin a career, trailing Kim Allen (18 G, 1980) and Donell Nixon (20 G, 1987).

WALK-OFF WIN...**Ty France** delivered the walk-off RBI single in yesterday's series finale win over the Rays...it was the Mariners 2nd walk-off win this season (other: **Jesse Winker**, 12th inning single, April 24 vs. KC)...it was France's 2nd career walk-off (other: single, April 16, 2021 vs. HOU)...the Mariners improved to 2-0 in extra innings this season.

GREAT AFTER EIGHT...the Mariners trailed 1-0 after 8 innings yesterday before **Abraham Toro** tied it up in the bottom of the 9th with a solo home run, leading to **Ty France's** walk-off single in the bottom of the 10th...the Mariners now have 2 wins this season when trailing after 8 innings (other: April 9 at Minnesota)...Seattle had 4 wins during the entire 2021 season when trailing after 8 innings.

AL HITS LEADER...**Ty France** is tied with Xander Bogaerts-BOS and Rafael Devers-BOS for most hits (37) in the American League this season...in 29 games this season, France is batting .319 (37x116) with 13 runs, 3 doubles, 5 home runs, 22 RBI and 9 walks, getting on-base at a .385 clip, slugging .474 with an .859 OPS...his 1.3 WAR (*Baseball-Reference*) ranks 2nd on the Mariners to only **J.P. Crawford** (1.7).

TORO TIME...**Abraham Toro** has homered in 2 consecutive games for the first time since his first 2 games in a Mariners uniform (July 27-28, 2021)...Toro's game-tying blast in the bottom of the 9th last night was the Mariners first game-tying or go-ahead homer in the 9th inning or later this season and the first since **Ty France's** game-tying homer in the 9th inning on Aug. 23, 2021 at Oakland.

TOP 5 OFFENSE...the Mariners offense carries a 114 weighted runs created plus (wRC+) coming into play today, 5th-highest in the American League, trailing the Yankees (119), Rays (118), Angels (118) and Guardians (116)...Seattle position players have produced 5.2 WAR (*FanGraphs*), 6th-most in the Majors and 5th-most in the AL.

WIZARD ON THE MOUND...**Andrés Muñoz** struck out the side yesterday, striking out all 3 batters he faced in a 1-2-3 seventh inning...in 10 games this season, Muñoz is 1-0 with 1 save and a 3.86 ERA (4 ER, 9.1 IP) with 4 walks and 18 strikeouts...his 17.4 strikeouts-per-9 innings ratio leads the American League and ranks 2nd in the Majors (Ryan Helsley-STL, 18.0) among pitchers with at least 9.0 IP this season.

DROPKICK MURFEE...**Penn Murfee** has appeared in 4 games with Seattle this season, not allowing any hits or runs while walking 1 and striking out 9 across 6.2 innings of work...he made his Major League debut on April 29 at Miami...Murfee is the first Mariners reliever to throw 6.0+ scoreless innings to begin his career since Brandon Brennan began his career with 10.2 scoreless innings in 2019.

YESTERDAY'S ROSTER MOVES...RHP **George Kirby** was selected from Double-A Arkansas...RHP **Riley O'Brien**, who made his Mariners debut (1.0 IP, 1 H, 1 BB, 1 SO) on Saturday night, was optioned to Triple-A Tacoma...to make room on the 40-man roster for Kirby, RHP **Ken Giles** (right middle finger sprain) was transferred to the 60-day Injured List.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners have the 2nd-youngest player in the Majors in outfielder **Julio Rodríguez** (21 years, 131 days old) and the 3rd-youngest pitcher in the American League in right-hander **Andrés Muñoz** (23 years, 113 days old) both on their active roster, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that the Mariners have the 2nd-youngest group of position players and 3rd-youngest pitching staff in the Majors this season?...Seattle position players' average age is 26.8 years old, trailing only Cleveland (26.1), while the pitching staff's average age is 27.7 years old, trailing Cleveland (26.6) and Cincinnati (27.0)...**AND FINALLY**...the only player in the Majors younger than Rodríguez is Wander Franco-TB (21 years, 69 days old) and the only pitchers in the AL younger than Muñoz are Luis Patiño-TB (21 years, 195 days old) and Reid Detmers-LAA (22 years, 305 days old).

ABOUT FLEXEN...

- 27-year-old right-hander is making his 6th start of 2022, 48th career start (64th appearance) and 2nd career start (5th appearance) against Philadelphia.
- Signed with the Mariners as a free agent, agreeing on a 2-year contract with an option for 2023 on Dec. 18, 2020.
- Was originally selected by the Mets in the 14th round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of Newark Memorial (CA) High School...made his ML debut with New York-NL on July 27, 2017 at SD.
- Graduated from Newark Memorial High School (CA) in 2012...played 4 years of baseball and was a quarterback on the football team for 2 years...was committed to Arizona State University before signing with the Mets.
- Appeared in parts of 8 minor league seasons with Mets organization (2012-19)...overall, went 43-31 with a 3.61 ERA (236 ER, 588.0 IP) with 192 walks and 513 strikeouts in 122 games (105 starts)...in 2013, was named Topps Appalachian Player of the Year.
- In his Mariners debut on April 3, 2021, became the 900th Seattle Mariners player in franchise history.
- Recorded his 100th career strikeout when he struck out Cavan Biggio on 6/29/2021 against Toronto (in Buffalo).

LAST START...tagged with 4th loss of season on 5/3 at Houston, despite allowing just 1 run on 2 hits (1 HR) and 3 walks with 2 strikeouts...the Mariners offense was shut-out for the 3rd time in a game Flexen has started.

IN NEED OF SUPPORT...through his first 5 starts this season, Flexen has received just 5 runs of support...his run support average of 1.55 ranks as the 2nd-lowest in the AL and 3rd-lowest in the Majors (min. 4 games started).

ONE AND DONE...has 7 starts with at least 7.0 innings pitched and no more than 1 run allowed since the start of 2021, tied for the most in the American League during that span (also: Nathan Eovaldi-BOS).

2021 RECAP...went 14-6 with a 3.61 ERA (72 ER, 179.2 IP) with 125 strikeouts and 40 walks in 2021...led Mariners starters in ERA, innings pitched, and wins in 2021.

FIRST 11 AT HOME...Flexen went 6-3 with a 1.89 ERA (14 ER, 66.2 IP) in his first 11 home starts with the Mariners (April 3-July 22, 2021)...his 1.89 ERA was the lowest in club history through a player's first 11 home starts of a season, ranking ahead of Félix Hernández (2.09 in 2014) and James Paxton (2.15 in 2017).

AMONG AL LEADERS...Flexen ranked among the American League leaders in several categories in 2021, including 2nd in wins (14), 4th lowest walk per 9.0 IP (2.00), 7th in ERA (3.61), T5th most quality starts (15), and 7th in innings pitched (179.2).

DISTINGUISHED COMPANY...Flexen became the 13th pitcher in franchise history to record a 10-win season in their first season with the Mariners in 2021, joining Floyd Bannister (1979), Gaylord Perry (1982), Matt Young (1983), Mark Langston (1984), Tim Lincecum (1995), Sterling Hitchcock (1996), Jeff Fassero (1997), Freddy Garcia (1999), Aaron Sele (2000), Miguel Batista (2007), Joe Saunders (2013) and Roenis Elias (2014)...tied with Batista (20 GS) for the 3rd fastest to achieve the feat behind Aaron Sele (17 GS) and Freddy Garcia (19 GS).

WINNER...the Mariners went 22-9 (.710) in Flexen's 31 starts in 2021...posted a career-best 4-game winning streak, June 15-July 16, 2021...went 4-0, 1.36 (39.2 IP, 6 ER) in 6 starts during the streak...struck out 29 while walking just 8 and has limited opposing hitters to a .200 BAA...his previous career-best winning streak was 3 games (4/24-5/14/21).

CAREER DAY...earned win #6 of the 2021 season against Minnesota on 6/15 after setting career highs in innings pitched and strikeouts..went 8.0 scoreless IP, allowing 4 hits, striking out 8 without walking a batter...26 BF in 8.0 IP...threw 107 pitches, 77 for strikes.

FIRST WIN...earned his first win as a Mariner in his first Mariners start, tossing 5.0 scoreless innings with 2 walks and 6 strikeouts on April 3, 2021 vs. San Francisco...became first Mariners pitcher to throw 5.0+ scoreless innings in his debut with the team since LH Wade LeBlanc threw 6.0 scoreless IP on June 24, 2016 in his Mariners debut in a 4-3 win vs. St. Louis...marked Flexen's first win in the Majors in 1,319 days (Oct. 1, 2017 w/New York-NL at Philadelphia).

DOMINATING THE KBO...spent 2020 season with Doosan Bears in the Korean Baseball Organization and went 8-4 with a 3.01 ERA (39 ER 116.2 IP) with 30 walks and 132 strikeouts over 21 starts...struck out 28% of batters faced, the 4th-highest rate in the KBO.

PLAYOFF MVP...posted a 1.91 ERA (6 ER, 28.1 IP) in the KBO playoffs, while pitching in both starting and relieving rolls.. named series MVP of the semi-finals after tossing 10.1 innings and allowing 2 earned runs with 13 strikeouts in one start and one relief appearance...started Game 1 for Doosan and tossed 7.1 IP of 2-run ball...came out of the bullpen in Game 4 on 3 days rest and tossed 3.0 scoreless IP.

CAREER...had appeared in 3 Major League seasons with New York-NL (2017-19) before debuting with the Mariners on April 3, 2021...was originally selected by the Mets in the 14th round of the 2012 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Newark Memorial (CA) High School...made his Major League debut with New York-NL on July 27, 2017 at San Diego.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP ROBBIE RAY (2-3, 4.38)

30-year-old left-hander is making his 7th start of the season, and 1st against the Phillies in 2022...L#3 in last start on 5/5 vs. Tampa Bay (6.2,7,4,4,1,5,HR)...W#2: earned second win of the season in first T-Mobile Park start as a Mariner on 4/19 vs. Texas (6.0,4,2,2,1,4)...W#1 on Opening Day at Minnesota (7.0,3,1,1,4,5,HR)...was named the American League Cy Young Award winner for the 1st time in his career after going 13-7 with an American League-leading 2.84 ERA (61 ER, 193.1 IP) while striking out an MLB-high 248 batters...was one of 5 starting pitchers to be named to the All-MLB team followin the 2021 season...won AL Pitcher of the Month award for the month of August after sporting a 1.76 ERA (8ER, 41.0 IP) with 52 strikeouts in 6 starts... His 2.4 walks per 9 innings pitched marked the largest decrease (7.8 BB/9 in 2020) among qualified starting pitchers from season to season in Major League history...via Elias Sports Bureau...signed to a 5-year MLB contract on 11/30/21...**CAREER:** Is a veteran of 9 Major League seasons Detroit (2014), Arizona (2015-20),Toronto (2020-21) and Seattle (2022)...made his Major League debut with Detroit on May 6, 2014 vs. Houston...came into the 2022 season as Major League Baseball's all-time leader in strikeouts-per-9 innings (11.21), minimum 1,000 innings pitched...his 1,241 strikeouts over his first 1,000 career innings pitched are the most all-time over a player's first 1,000 career innings in MLB history...drafted by Washington in the 12th round of the 2010 MLB First Year Player Draft out of Brentwood High School (TN). vs. PHI; 3-2 with a 5.63 ERA (24 ER, 38.1 IP) with 52 strikeouts and 17 walks in 7 career starts.
