

MILWAUKEE BREWERS (90-67) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (73-84) SEPTEMBER 25, 2024 AT PNC PARK, PITTSBURGH, PA - 6:40 EDT - GAME #158/HOME #80 RHP FREDDY PERALTA (11-8, 3.69 ERA) vs. RHP LUIS ORTIZ (6-6, 3.43 ERA)

THE PIRATES: opened their final homestand of the season with a 7-2 loss last night...Have won 15 games in their last at-bat (their most since having 16 last at-bat wins in 2021)...Have won eight games when trailing after seven innings (their most since winning nine times in 2019 when trailing after seven frames)...Have played in 50 one-run games, which are tied for the second-most in the National League behind the Brewers (52); it's also the most one-run games for the team since playing in 51 one-run contests in 2018...Have the best stolen base percentage (85.2 percent) in MLB...Have recorded 12 shutouts this year, which are tied for the sixth-most in the National League.

ABOUT TONIGHT'S STARTER: Luis Ortiz has recorded a 3.43 ERA (81.2ip/31er) in 15 appearances (14 starts) since June 26 when he made his first start of this season...Ortiz ranks 13th in the National League in ERA during that time among pitchers with at least 81.0 innings, while his .209 batting average against MOST CAREER HOME ranks fifth overall in the National League...The only four National League pitchers with a RUNS AGAINST THE lower batting average against since June 26 are Sean Manaea (.171), Dylan Cease (.181), BREWERS Paul Skenes (.188) and Zack Wheeler (.202).

BIG TRI: Jared Triolo went 3-for-4 on Tuesday for his second three-hit game of the season (also June 1)...Since August 26, Triolo is hitting at a .306 clip (26-for-85) with an .802 OPS in 25 starts...He has also gone 7-for-15 (.467) with runners in scoring position this month, which ranks ninth in MLB among players with at least 13 plate appearances.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR: Bryan Reynolds is 12-for-28 (.429) with a double, triple and home run in his career against Brewers starter Freddy Peralta (the most hits Peralta has allowed against one player)...Reynolds also comes into today two hits shy of matching his single-season career-high in hits (169 from 2021)...Since breaking into the big leagues in 2019, Reynolds' 818 hits are the sixth-most among National League players behind Freddie Freeman (989), Trea Turner (936), Paul Goldschmidt (869), Nolan Arenado (847) and Manny Machado (846).

ON THE BASES: Nick Gonzales comes into today with a 13-game on-base streak, which is the longest of his career (it's also tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the NL)... Gonzales is hitting .286 (14-for-49) with a pair of doubles, triple, two RBI and four runs scored during his current 13-game on-base streak...It's also tied for the fourth-longest on-base streak by a Pirate this year (Bryan Reynolds had the longest at 25 straight games).

HOW YOU DOING: Joey Wentz tossed 1.2 scoreless innings on Tuesday in his sixth appearance since being claimed off waivers from Detroit on September 3...Wentz has recorded a 1.86 ERA (9.2ip/2er), .147 batting average against and 0.93 WHIP since joining the Pirates along SINGLE-SEASON STRIKEOUT LEADERS

with a 1.38 ERA (13.0ip/2er) and .152 batting average against in his last eight outings overall dating back to August 24.

FIRING CUBAN MISSILES: Aroldis Chapman comes into today ninth in all of MLB among relief pitchers with 94 strikeouts (Josh Hader leads all relievers in MLB with 104 strikeouts)...Chapman's 94 punchouts are tied for the most in a single season by a Pirates left-handed reliever...The only other Pirates southpaw reliever with 94 strikeouts in a season is Rod Scurry in 1982.

PIRATING: Oneil Cruz has been successful in each of his last 20 attempts since being caught for the only time on April 22...The last Pirate to steal at least 20 consecutive bases without being caught in a single season is Nate McLouth (2' straight) from May 2 to September 28, 2008.

KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew McCutchen comes into today one run shy of tying Arky Vaughan (936) for 10th all time in Pirate history...McCutchen is also two extra base hits shy of 800 in his career (hi 798 extra base hits are the third-most among active players behind Freddie Freeman's 880 and Paul Goldschmidt's 827).

STARTING OFF: The 25-year-old righthander is in his third Major League season, which have all come as a member of the Pirates...He has made 58 career appearances (33 starts) for the Bucs, including 22 relief appearances in 2024 (14 starts)...He made the first Opening Day roster of his career with the Pirates in 2024 after making just two appearances (both starts) with the club in 2022 and 18 appearances (15 starts) over two stints with the Bucs in 2023...Ortiz was signed by the Pirates as an international free agent on October 2, 2018.

VS. MILWAUKEE: Ortiz will make his fifth appearance and third career start against the Brewers...His two outings this season both came in relief on April 24 and May 15... His last start against the Brewers came on September 4 of last season when he allowed two runs in 6.0 innings and won a 4-2 decision at PNC Park.

LAST TIME OUT: Ortiz allowed two runs in 6.0 innings in a no-decision Thursday night at St. Louis...Yasmani Grandal hit a game-tying home run in the seventh before Nick Gonzales knocked in the game-winning run one inning later to give the Pirates a 3-2 win...He also matched his career-high with seven strikeouts.

CENTRAL PERK: Tonight will be Ortiz' eighth appearance (fourth start) within the National League Central this season...He has gone 1-0 with a 2.03 ERA (26.2ip/4er) in his previous seven outings.

ORTIZ OF LATE: Ortiz is 0-2 in his last three starts since he allowed one run in 6.0 scoreless innings while winning decision a 3-0 at Cleveland on August 31...The Pirates did not score a run while Ortiz was in the game in those two losses on September 7 vs. Washington and September 13 vs. Kansas City.

ZERO TOLERANCE: Ortiz had his career-best scoreless streak of 16.0 innings end in his September 7 start against the Nationals...lt's the third-longest scoreless streak by a Pirate this season...Bailey Falter had a team-best scoreless streak of 19.2 innings from May 12-24 while Dennis Santana had a scoreless streak of 19.1 innings that came to an end on Monday here in St. Louis...Ortiz also had a scoreless streak of 12.0 innings earlier this year from July 2-13.

FOR STARTERS: Tonight will be Ortiz' 34th career Major League start and his 15th of the season....He made his first start of the season on June 26 at Cincinnati, where he allowed one run in 6.0 innings while winning a 6-1 decision...In his first four starts of 2024, he posted an 0.73 ERA (24.2ip/2er)...In his last 10 starts, he has recorded a 4.58 ERA (55.0ip/28er).

WHAT THE METRICS SAY: Ortiz ranks in the 93rd percentile in Fastball Run Value according to Baseball Savant...He has limited opposing hitters to a .191 batting average against (25-for-131) when using his four-seam fastball this season.

2023 RECAP: Ortiz had two different stints with the Pirates last season, going 4-5 with a 4.93 ERA (73.0ip/40er) in his 15 starts and 1-0 with a 3.95 ERA (13.2ip/6er) in three relief appearances.

Pitched with the Dominican Republic team in the World Baseball Classic, making one appearances and striking out three batters in 2.0 scoreless innings.
