Sept. 27, 1938: An ailing Lou Gehrig hits his 493rd and final Major League home run, a solo shot off Senators' right-hander Dutch Leonard. On the same date exactly 15 years earlier (9/27/1923), the Yankees first baseman homered off Bill Piercy at Fenway Park for his first career home run.

UPCOMING MILESTONES

Giancarlo Stanton
► Needs **1HR** to surpass Carl Yastrzemski (452) for sole possession of 40th place on the all-time home runs list.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their final regular season homestand with the second game of a three-game set vs. Baltimore (1-0 thus far)...are 4-0 on the homestand after sweeping the White Sox and winning their series opener against the Orioles.
► **Their 92-68 (.575) record is tied with Toronto (92-68, .575) for the best in the AL and the third-best in the Majors**, trailing only Milwaukee (96-64, .600) and Philadelphia (95-65, .594).
► Have won 11 of their last 13 completed series (since 8/11).
► **Their six-game winning streak (since 9/20) is their second-longest this season, trailing only a seven-game streak from 8/24-30...are 9-1 in their last 10 games (since 9/16), 12-3 in their last 15 games (since 9/11), 23-8 in their last 31 games (since 8/24), 28-11 in their last 39 games (since 8/15) and a Major League-best 32-14 in their last 46 games (since 8/6).**
► Their +158 run differential is the highest in the AL and the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Milwaukee (+173).
► **Are a season-high 24G over .500.**
► Are 48-31 at home this season...marks their **34th straight winning season at home (since 1992)**...according to *Elias*, their streak is the second-longest in Major League history, trailing only their own 47-year streak from 1918-64.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees won their sixth straight game with an 8-4 victory against the Orioles in their series opener on Friday at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Will Warren** (5.0IP, 6H, 4R/ER, 1BB, 7K, 2HR) made his final start of the year and earned his ninth win of the season...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-4, 2R, 2HR, 5RBI) drove in five of the Yankees' eight runs and recorded his 38th career multi-HR game, hitting a go-ahead two-run home run in the first inning and a two-run shot in the third inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) reached base twice and hit his 52nd home run of the year with a go-ahead two-run shot in the third inning...**CF/LF Cody Bellinger** (2-for-2, 2R, 2BB) reached base four times...**RHP Mark Leiter Jr.** (0.2IP, 2BB, 1K), **LHP Tim Hill** (1.0IP), **RHP Fernando Cruz** (0.1IP, 2BB), **RHP Cam Schlichter** (1.0IP, 3K) and **RHP David Bednar** (1.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 2K) combined to toss 4.0 scoreless innings of relief.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have hit a Major League-leading 269HR this season, 29 more than the next highest team (Los Angeles-NL: 240HR)...their 269HR this season are their second-most in a single season in franchise history and the sixth-most by any team in Major League history (see chart on left).
► **Yankees batters** have won each of their last three games they did not homer, four of their last five such games and five of their last seven...own a .405 winning percentage in games they are homerless this season, the fourth-highest winning percentage in the Majors...their .405 winning pct. in those games is 86 points higher than the Major League average (.319).
► **Have hit a Major League-record 48HR in the first inning this year** (previous: Atlanta Braves' 47HR in 2023)...have scored in the first inning in a Major League-best 63 games this year...are 44-19 (.698) in those games.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The Yankees have clinched their 60th playoff appearance in franchise history (123 seasons, 48.8%)...marks the Yankees' eighth postseason appearance in the last nine seasons (since 2017) and 26th trip to the postseason in the last 31 years (since 1995)...their 26 trips to the postseason since 1995 are the most in the Majors in that span, five more than the next highest team (Atlanta-21)...the next highest AL team is Boston (15)...Cleveland entered this season with 14 trips over that span.

► The Yankees are one of only three teams to make the playoffs in at least eight of the last nine years (since 2017), joining the Dodgers (nine: 2017-25) and Astros (eight: 2017-24).
► **Manager Aaron Boone is the second manager in Major League history to reach the postseason in seven of his first eight seasons as manager** (credit: *Elias* - min. 2G manager per season), joining Dave Roberts (first 10 seasons with the Dodgers)...is the third manager to make the playoffs in seven of his first eight seasons with the Yankees, joining Joe Torre (each of his first 12) and Casey Stengel (nine of his first 10).
► The Yankees have seven players on their active roster who have not appeared in a postseason game: **RHP David Bednar, RHP Paul Blackburn, INF/OF José Caballero, RHP Fernando Cruz, C/INF Ben Rice, RHP Cam Schlichter and RHP Will Warren**...Rice was on the Yankees' 2024 ALDS roster but did not play.

WINNING WAYS: The Yankees have recorded at least 90 wins for the seventh time in their last eight 162-game seasons (2017-19, '21-22, '24-25)...are one of only two teams to record at least seven 90-win seasons over that span, joining the Los Angeles Dodgers (eight: 2017-19, '21-25)...**have recorded at least 90 wins in 22 of their last 29 full seasons since 1996-99, 2001-07, '09-12, '17-19, '21-22, '24-25)...their 22 seasons are the most in the Majors over that span** (next: Atlanta-16, Boston entered this season with 15).
► **The Yankees have clinched their 33rd consecutive winning season (since 1993), marking the second-longest streak in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL), behind only their 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64.**

FAN-TASTIC: The Yankees have drawn 3 million fans at home for their Major League-record 25th straight season when there was full attendance (also 1999-2019, '22-24).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge reached base twice and hit his 52nd home run of the year with a go-ahead two-run shot in the third inning on Friday vs. Baltimore...27 of his 52HR this year have tied the game (four) or given the Yankees the lead (23).
► **Has hit at least 50HR in a single season for the fourth time in his career** (also 52HR in 2017, 62HR in 2022 and 58HR in 2024), tying the Major League record for most 50HR seasons...**is the fourth player — and second Yankee — to record four such seasons**, joining Sammy Sosa (4x: 1998-2001), Mark McGwire (4x: 1996-99) and Babe Ruth (4x: 1920-21, '27-28).
► **His Major League-leading 36IBB this season are the most in AL history (since 1955 when IBB were first tracked)**...marks the most by any Major League player in a single season since 2010 when St. Louis' Albert Pujols recorded 38IBB.

► Has reached base safely in 134 of his 150 games this year, batting .330/.458/.687 (176-for-533) with 135R, 30 doubles, 2 triples, 52HR, 111RBI, 124BB/36IBB, 7HP, 75F and 12SB...**leads the Majors in BA by 17 points, OBP by 62 points, SLG by 71 points and OPS by 138 points...his 9.9 WAR (FanGraphs) is 0.8 higher than the next highest player (Seattle's Cal Raleigh: 9.1 WAR)...would be only the third player in Major League history to hit at least 50HR and win a batting title in the same season, joining Mickey Mantle (1956) and Jimmie Foxx (1938)...would also be only the fifth player in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to lead the Majors in BA, OBP and SLG in a single season**...would join Miguel Cabrera in 2013, Barry Bonds in 2002, Larry Walker in 1999 and George Brett in 1980.

► Would become the fifth player in franchise history to lead the Majors in batting average...would join DJ LeMahieu (.364 BA in 2020), Mickey Mantle (.353 BA in 1956), Joe DiMaggio (.381 in 1939) and Lou Gehrig (.363 BA in 1934)...would also become the 10th player (11th time) in franchise history to win the AL batting title...would join Bernie Williams (1998), Paul O'Neill (1994), Don Mattingly (1984), Mickey Mantle (1956), Snuffy Stirrweiss (1945), Joe DiMaggio (1939-40), Lou Gehrig (1934) and Babe Ruth (1924).
► Is hitting .374/.543/.802 (34-for-91) with 33R, 3 doubles, 12HR, 18RBI, 33BB/7IBB, 3HP, 25F and 45B over his last 28G (since 8/27).
► Has reached base multiple times in a Major League-leading and career-high-tying 100 games this season (also 2024)...is one of only two Yankees in the last 68 years (since 1958) to reach base multiple times in at least 100 games (also Derek Jeter - 104G in 1999)...is one of five Yankees to reach base multiple times in at least 100 games in a season, joining Babe Ruth (nine times), Lou Gehrig (seven times), Jeter and Mickey Mantle (once)...is one of only three players in the AL to reach base multiple times in at least 100 games in the last 24 seasons (since 2002), joining Mike Trout (106G in 2013) and Miguel Cabrera (111G in 2011).

► Has reached base multiple times in 14 of his last 15 games (since 9/11), including at least three times in nine of those games...is batting .447/.606/1.000 (21-for-47) with 20R, 2 doubles, 8HR, 13RBI, 20BB/6IBB, 2HP, 25F and 15B over that stretch.
► Has hit 8HR over his last 15 games (since 9/11), 9HR over his last 17 games (since 9/9) and 12HR over his last 28 games (since 8/27).
► In 118 career games vs. Baltimore, has hit .320/.458/.733 (132-for-412) with 112R, 20 doubles, 50HR, 106RBI, 99BB/7IBB, 7HP, 25F and 55B...**his 50HR against Baltimore are his most vs. any opponent...marks the most by any Major League player vs. a single opponent since 2017...also marks the most home runs among active players vs. Baltimore.**
► Had the second-most popular jersey in Major League Baseball in 2025...Judge has been in the top-seven of most popular jerseys in each of the last nine seasons since 2017...has also been ranked in the top-four during eight of those seasons and the top-three in seven of those seasons.
► Has gone 6-for-7 with 2HR and 1BB vs. Baltimore's Tomoyuki Sugano.

PEN PALS: Yankees relievers combined to toss 4.0 scoreless innings on Friday vs. Baltimore...**have not allowed a run in their last 19.2 innings (since 9/19) and have posted a 0.33 ERA (27.2IP, 1ER) and 32K over their last nine games (since 9/17).**

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton drove in five of the Yankees' eight runs on Friday vs. Baltimore...recorded his second multi-HR game of the year and 38th of his career, hitting a go-ahead two-run home run in the first inning and a two-run shot in the third inning...his 5RBI matched his season high (also 8/26 vs. Washington) and matched his second-most in a game in his career, trailing only his career-high 6RBI on 5/12/22 at Chicago-AL.
► His second HR of the night marked his 452nd career home run, tying Carl Yastrzemski for 40th place on the all-time home runs list.
► Nine of his last 20HR since 7/13 have either tied the game (one) or given the Yankees the lead (eight).
► Has hit 22HR in his last 59 games (since 7/8), tied for the fifth-most in the Majors over that span.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CAM SCHLITTLER (3-3, 3.27 ERA)

RHP Cam Schlittler will make his 14th start of the year today vs. Baltimore...the 24-year-old will make the start on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...made his 13th start of the season on Sunday at Baltimore and did not record a decision after allowing only 1R/ER over 5.1IP (3H, 1BB, 6K, 1HR)... **has gone 2-2 with a 2.81 ERA (5.1 IP, 16ER) and 60K over his last 10 starts (since 8/2)**...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in eight of those 10 starts... **his 24R allowed this season are tied with Masahiro Tanaka (24R in first 13GS) for the fourth-fewest by a Yankees pitcher through their first 13 career starts, trailing only Dave Righetti (21R in first 13GS), Bill Stafford (22R in first 13GS) and Russ Ford (23R in first 13GS)**...was signed to a Major League contract and selected to the active roster prior to the game on 7/9...at the time of his Major League debut, was tied for ninth among minor league pitchers in strikeouts...among qualified Yankees farmhands at the time of his debut, was tied for second in strikeouts and starts, ranked fourth in innings pitched, tied for fourth in wins and seventh in ERA...is currently ranked by *Baseball America* as the Yankees' No. 2 prospect and No. 93 overall prospect in baseball...was a 2025 non-roster invitee in spring training...was named the winner of the 2024 Kevin Lank Award as the Yankees' minor league "Pitcher of the Year" at the end of 2025 spring training...in 25 combined appearances (23 starts) with High-A Hudson Valley, Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and Double-A Somerset in 2024, went 8-8 with a 3.36 ERA (120.2IP, 98H, 58R/45ER, 55BB, 154K, 10HR)...over parts of three minor league seasons in the Yankees organization (2023-25), has gone 15-16 with a 3.33 ERA (243.1IP, 214H, 113R/90ER, 102BB, 303K, 18HR) in 54 games (50 starts)...the Weymouth, Mass., native was selected by the Yankees in the seventh round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Northeastern University (Mass.).

LAST TIME OUT: Made his 13th start of the season on Sunday at Baltimore and did not record a decision after allowing only 1R/ER over 5.1IP (3H, 1BB, 6K, 1HR)...retired 12 of his first 13BF (1H).

LIGHTS, CAM, ACTION: Has gone 2-2 with a 2.81 ERA (5.1 IP, 16ER) and 60K over his last 10 starts (since 8/2)...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in eight of those 10 starts.

- + Has allowed 4H-or-fewer in seven of those 10 starts.
- + **Is holding opposing batters to a .205/.295/.319 (38-for-185) slash line over that stretch.**
- + Has allowed 1HR-or-fewer in nine of his last 10 starts, including zero home runs in six starts, posting a 0.88 HR/9.0IP ratio over that 10-game span.

2025: Has made 13 starts this season, going 3-3 with a 3.27 ERA (66.0IP, 56H, 24R/ER, 30BB, 75K, 8HR)...has tossed at least 5.0IP in 10 of his first 13 career starts...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in nine of his 13 starts.

- + **Since his Major League debut (min. 60.0IP), ranks eighth among AL pitchers in K/9.0IP (10.23) and strikeout rate (27.0%) and ninth in opponents' SLG (.357).**
- + His 75K through his first 13 career games are the fifth-most in franchise history, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (103K in first 13GS), Orlando Hernández (92K in first 13GS), Luis Gil (83K in first 13GS) and Al Leiter (77K in first 13GS).
- + **His 24R allowed this season are tied with Masahiro Tanaka (24R in first 13GS) for the fourth-fewest by a Yankees pitcher through their first 13 career starts, trailing only Dave Righetti (21R in first 13GS), Bill Stafford (22R in first 13GS) and Russ Ford (23R in first 13GS).**
- + Allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his first nine career starts from 7/9-8/30, **tying Dave Righetti (9GS from 9/16/79-8/16/81) and Herb Thormahlen (9GS from 9/29/1917(G2)-6/8/1918) for the second-longest streak to begin their career in franchise history, trailing only Joba Chamberlain (11GS from 6/3-7/30/08).**
- + Recorded at least 8K and allowed zero runs in consecutive starts (8K/0R on 8/20 at Tampa Bay and 8/25 vs. Washington)...**became the first Yankees rookie to record at least 8K and allow zero runs in back-to-back starts.**
- + Posted a career-high 17.2 scoreless inning streak from 8/13-8/30...**was the third-longest scoreless streak by a Yankees rookie in the last 57 years (since 1969), trailing only Ron Marinaccio's 19.0 inning streak from 5/22-7/28/22 and Luis Gil's 18.2 inning streak from 8/3-9/8/21.**
- + Made his seventh start of the season on 8/20 at Tampa Bay, tossing 6.2 scoreless innings and did not record a decision (1H, 2BB, 8K)...**became the first Yankees rookie to retire his first 18BF in a game since Fritz Peterson retired his first 21BF on 7/4/66 vs. Chicago-AL.**

AWESOME AUGUST: Went 1-1 with a 1.60 ERA (33.2IP, 6ER) and 39K in six starts in August...allowed 2R-or-fewer in all six starts...recorded at least 6K in five of his six starts.

- + **His 1.60 ERA was the third-lowest by a Yankees rookie (min. 25.0IP) in a single calendar month over the last 52 years (since 1974),** trailing only Luis Gil (0.70 ERA in May 2024) and José Contreras (1.51 ERA in September 2003).
- + **During the month of August, he ranked sixth among Major League pitchers in ERA (third in AL), tied for seventh in strikeouts (tied for third in AL), eighth in opponents' BA (.186, fourth in AL), ninth in opponents' SLG (.288, fourth in AL), 10th in strikeout rate (29.8%, seventh in AL) and opponents' OPS (.555, fourth in AL).**

HOME SWEET HOME: In seven starts at Yankee Stadium this year, has gone 3-2 with a 3.78 ERA (33.1IP, 34H, 14R/ER, 16BB, 38K, 4HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in six of his seven home starts.

VS. BALTIMORE: Will be making his second career start vs. the Orioles...made his first career start earlier this season on Sunday at Camden Yards, allowing 1R/ER in 5.1IP (ND, 3H, 1BB, 6K, 1HR).

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Made his Major League debut on 7/9 vs. Seattle, earning his first career win after allowing 3R/ER over 5.1IP (4H, 2BB, 7K, 2HR).

- + **Became the 10th pitcher in franchise history to record at least 7K in his Major League debut,** joining Jordan Montgomery (7K on 4/12/17 vs. Tampa Bay), Luis Severino (7K on 8/5/15 vs. Boston), Masahiro Tanaka (8K on 4/4/14 at Toronto), Orlando Hernández (7K on 6/3/98 vs. Tampa Bay), Hideki Irabu (9K on 7/10/97 vs. Detroit), Al Leiter (8K on 9/15/87 vs. Milwaukee), Rich Beck (8K on 9/14/65 at Washington-AL), Vic Raschi (8K on 9/23/46 vs. Philadelphia-AL) and Bill Hogg (7K on 4/25/1905 vs. Washington-AL).
