SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second National League pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth (1999, 2001, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

A BOND BEYOND BASEBALL: MLB Network's Anthony Castrovince & Paul Solga teamed up on "A Bond Beyond Baseball," a compelling, heartfelt story about the friendship and working relationship of Arizona Diamondbacks' General Manager Mike Hazen & Manager Torey Lovullo.

ROSTER MOVES: The D-backs reinstated OF **Randal Grichuk** from the 10-day injured list (recovery from right ankle surgery; retro to March 25) and, following Wednesday's game, optioned OF **Jorge Barrosa** to Triple-A Reno.

LOVULLO 1 WIN SHY OF 500: **Torey Lovullo** currently sits at 499 career managerial wins, 1 shy of the 500-win club. ◆ D-backs longest-tenured skipper is in his eighth season.

ATTENDANCE BOOST: The 245,957 total home attendance thru the first 7 home games ranks second all-time in franchise history, behind 321,479 in 1998.

MARTE REACHES 1,000: **Ketel Marte's** leadoff double on Wednesday vs. Yankees was his 1,000th career hit. ◆ His 826 career hits are fifth among D-backs, behind Luis Gonzalez (1,337), Paul Goldschmidt (1,182), David Peralta (960) and Steve Finley (847).

OPENING WEEK HOMESTAND: The D-backs went 4-3 in their season-opening homestand vs. Rockies (3-1) and Yankees (1-2).

◆ **Zac Gallen**, in 2 home starts, went 2-0 with a 0.82 ERA (1 ER in 11.0 IP), .162 opponent average (6-for-37) with 5 walks and 9 strikeouts.

◆ **Merrill Kelly**, in 2 home starts, went 1-0 with a 1.98 ERA (3 ER in 13.2 IP), .174 opponent average (8-for-46) with 1 walk and 12 strikeouts.

◆ **Ketel Marte** hit safely in 5 of his first 7 games at a .412 clip (11-for-29)/.964 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 home run, 4 RBI, 3 walks and 1 stolen base.

GURRIEL NAMED NL PLAYER OF THE WEEK: **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** was NL Player of the Week for March 28-31 after hitting .471 (8-for-17)/1.644 OPS with 6 runs, 2 doubles, 3 homers, 10 RBI, 2 walks and 1 stolen base in 4 games. ◆ Second weekly honor (previous: AL Player of the Week, Sept. 6, 2020 with Toronto).

VS. BRAVES: Arizona went 3-3 vs. Braves last season and is 7-5 @ Truist Park since 2019.

◆ In the first matchup @ Braves last season, the D-backs plated 16 runs to mark their most ever scored @ Truist Park in the 16-13 win.

VS. RIGHTIES: **Ketel Marte**, in 7 games vs. righties, is hitting .333 (5-for-15) with 3 RBI and 2 walks.

◆ **Joc Pederson**, in 5 games vs. righties, is hitting .500 (5-for-10)/1.243 OPS with 1 double, 1 RBI and 4 walks.

SHUT OUT: The D-backs 7-0 shutout vs. Yankees on Wednesday was the second shutout of the Yankees all-time (also: 4-0 in Game 2 of the 2001 World Series on Oct. 28, 2001).

◆ It marked Arizona's earliest shutout in a season since 2018 (3-0 vs. LAD in Game 6 of the 2018 season).

◆ In 2023, the D-backs had 9 shutouts.

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: In the opening frame, the D-backs have scored 2 runs 3 times and 3 runs twice, tallying 12 runs on .444 hitting (16-for-36) with 4 doubles and 4 home runs.

◆ Only the second team in modern day MLB history (since 1901) with 2+ first-inning runs in their first 4 games (9 runs total) [also: 2001 Rockies].

◆ The D-backs first-inning offense leads the Majors in AVG (.444), OBP (.500), SLG (.889), OPS (1.389), runs (12), hits (16), doubles (4), homers (4), extra-base hits (7), stolen bases (3) and total bases (32).

RUNS SCORED: The D-backs' +21 run differential is tied for second-best in the Majors, with the Braves (+21), behind the Guardians (+30) and ahead of the Pirates (+19).

◆ Arizona's +22 run differential is the highest in club history thru the first 7 games (previous: +18 in 2017).

◆ The D-backs' 46 runs thru their 7 games are tied for the second most in club history (also: 2010), behind 48 runs in 2017.

BULLPEN WORK: Arizona relievers' 2.51 ERA is third in the NL, behind the Pirates (2.15) and Mets (2.39).

◆ The bullpen's .184 opponent average and .535 opponent OPS are second to the Pirates (.163 AVG/.458 OPS).

RISP-Y BUSINESS: The D-backs' .342 average with runners in scoring position (26-for-76) leads the Majors, ahead of the Braves (.340), Guardians (.333) and Orioles (.333)...with runners in scoring position...

◆ **Eugenio Suárez** is hitting .600 (3-for-7) with 4 RBI.

◆ **Joc Pederson** is hitting 500 (1-for-2) with 1 RBI.

◆ **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** is hitting .429 (6-for-14) with 2 doubles, 1 home run and 8 RBI.

◆ **Christian Walker** is hitting .385 (5-for-13) with 1 double, 2 home runs and 7 RBI.

NEXT STARTER: RHP BRANDON PFAADT (1-0, 1.80)

◆ Worked 5.0 innings with 1 run allowed (5 H, 0 BB, 6 K) in 5-1 win vs. Rockies on March 30.

◆ First career start vs. Braves.

◆ Second career start vs. NL East (May 9, 2023 vs. Marlins) and first road start @ NL East.

◆ In the 2023 postseason, made 5 starts, going 0-1 with a 3.27 ERA (8 ER in 22.0 IP), .237 opponent average, 5 walks and 26 strikeouts.

AT A GLANCE: Third season with the D-backs.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: In 3 career road starts vs. the NL East, is 2-0 with a 4.32 ERA (8 ER in 16.2 IP, 12 K)...the D-backs have won all 3 of those contests.

VS. BRAVES: Is making his first career start against the Braves.

LAST START: Took the loss in his first start of 2024 vs. Rockies on March 30 (5 ER in 4.0 IP).

2023 ROAD RECAP: In 8 road starts in 2023, went 4-2 with a 5.05 ERA (24 R-23 ER in 41.0 IP, 34 K).

- From May 22-June 30, 2023, was 3-0 with a 3.63 ERA (9 ER in 22.1 IP, 22 K).

2023 RECAP: In his first full season with the D-backs, went 5-4 with a 4.15 ERA (41 ER in 89.0 IP) in 17 games (16 starts).

- Began the season with Triple-A Reno, going 1-0 with a 6.33 ERA (15 ER in 21.1 IP) and 22 strikeouts in 4 starts.
- Recalled by the D-backs on April 24.
- On May 27 vs. Red Sox, retired 4 of the 5 batters faced over 1.1 scoreless innings in relief, marking his first professional career appearance out of the bullpen after a combined 66 starts between the Minors and Majors.
- On May 31 vs Rockies, tossed 7.0 scoreless innings for the first time in his career and tied a career high with 7 strikeouts (also: Aug. 19, 2022 vs. Cardinals)...also allowed a career-low 2 hits.
- In his 5 starts in June, Arizona went 5-0 and he recorded 24 strikeouts over 27.1 innings.

HOW IT STARTED: Signed by the D-backs as a Competitive Balance-B selection (74th overall) in the 2019 draft.

- Attended the University of Michigan, where he helped lead the Wolverines to the 2019 College World Series vs. eventual champion Vanderbilt University.
- A Michigan native, attended Portage Northern High School, where he lettered in baseball and basketball.
