METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Washington Nationals, 5-4, last night...The Mets are in a stretch of 16 straight games...They are 1-1 in that span...The loss snapped a three-game winning streak...New York is seeking their second consecutive series victory...New York hits the road for a six-game trip (1-1) against the Nationals (1-1) and Braves (three games).

RISP BUSINESS: In 17 games in August, the Mets are batting .348 (46-132) with 10 doubles, seven home runs, 64 RBI, 22 walks, a .426 OBP, and a .583 SLG with RISP...Their .348 average is second in the majors and tops in the National League in August.

DOG DAYS OF SUMMER: In 17 games this month, the Mets are batting .266/.335/.475 with 32 doubles, 30 home runs, 91 RBI and 58 walks...They rank sixth in the majors with a .267 AVG and seventh with a .335 OBP...Over the last nine games, the team is batting .314/.373/.578 with 59 runs, 20 doubles, 20 homers, 59 RBI, 30 walks and a .951 OPS.

RETURN OF THE MARK: Over the last three games, Mark Vientos is 4-11 with two runs, one double, two home runs, one walk for a 1.385 OPS...He is batting .260 (19-73) with five runs, five doubles, three homers, 14 RBI and a .725 OPS after the All-Star break.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty has reached base safely in eight straight games, posting a .433 OBP in that span...In 12 games this month, Baty is batting .343 (12-35) with nine runs, four homers, seven RBI, five walks, a steal, a .425 OBP and a .686 SLG...In 24 games following the All-Star break, Baty is batting .284/.357/.541 (21-74) with 16 runs, one double, six homers, 11 RBI, nine walks and an .898 OPS...He has recorded a career-high 15 home runs in 99 games this season.

HAPPY JEFF: Over the last five games, Jeff McNeil is batting .429 (9-21) with six runs, three doubles, one homer, five RBI, one walk, a .455 OBP and a .714 SLG...He is slashing .299/.347/.433 with nine runs, six doubles, one homer, eight RBI, five walks and a .780 OPS in 17 games this month...His .770 season OPS is the highest mark since he recorded an .836 mark in 2022.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Francisco Lindor is on an eight-game hitting streak, batting .485 (16-33) with nine runs, four doubles, three homers, seven RBI, four walks, two steals, a .541 OBP and a .879 SLG in that span.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is the first primary shortstop in Major League history with five separate 20/20 seasons...His three 20/20 seasons as a Met are the second-most in franchise history behind Darryl Strawberry and Howard Johnson who each had five such seasons.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games against the NL East...They Mets are 1-1 in that span...The Mets are batting .260/.325/.454 against the NL East, while posting a 3.90 ERA.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 77-76 all-time at Nationals Park...The Mets are batting .301/.374/.509 at Nationals Park in 2025.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has reached base safely in all 17 games this month...He is batting 16-62 (.258) with 15 runs, six homers, 10 RBI, 14 walks, five steals, a .397 OBP and a .548 SLG...Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 98 walks this year...He is looking to recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks...With two more walks, he will become the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

20/20 VISION: The Mets became the only team in the National League feature four players with 20 or more home runs (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor, Brandon Nimmo and Juan Soto)...The Yankees, Angels and Athletics also have four players with 20+ homers...The Mets have had seven seasons in which at least four players recorded 20+ homers (also: 2024, 2023, 2019, 2016, 2000, 1987)...The team's record is five players with 20+ homers in 2019 (Alonso, Michael Conforto, J.D. Davis, Todd Frazier and Jeff McNeil).

OVER THE WALL AND ON THE BASEPATHS: Juan Soto has 31 home runs and 20 stolen bases while Francisco Lindor has 24 home runs and 20 stolen bases...The pair joins Carlos Beltrán and David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson, Kevin McReynolds and Darryl Strawberry (1988) and Johnson and Strawberry (1987) as the only pair/trio of Mets teammates to record 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in the same season...Lindor has recorded his fifth 20/20 season which ties Randy Arozarena for the second-most such seasons in the majors since 2018 (most: 7, José Ramírez).

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed four earned runs on six hits while striking out seven against Seattle on August 15...He has allowed four or more earned runs in each of his last three starts...It is just the third time he's had such a streak in his career and the first time since a three-game stretch from May 19 - 30, 2018 while with Oakland...Recorded at least seven strikeouts for the second time this season and the first time since his relief appearance in Kansas City on July 13.

VS WASHINGTON: Has made five career appearances (four starts) against Washington in his career and he has posted a 3.38 ERA (11 ER/29.1 IP) with 24 strikeouts...Last season he made two starts against Washington and in both starts he went 7.0 innings, allowed one or zero earned runs, and struck out at least five Nats.

RIDE THE HOT HAND: In his last 25 games (24 starts) since June 26, 2024, is 9-4 with a 3.41 ERA (54 ER/142.1 IP), a .195 (101-518) opponents' batting average and a 1.00 WHIP...Ranks fifth in the NL in opponents' batting average and eighth in WHIP (min. 400 batters faced)...The Mets are 16-9 in those games.

RIGHTY DOMINATION: So far this season righties are batting .240 (24-100) against him...Last season he held right-handed hitters to a .190 batting average, compared to his career average to right-handed hitters being at .250...It was the lowest batting average he's held right handers to in his career (in a season where he appeared in more than five games)...

HERE COMES THE HEAT: So far this season, Manaea has thrown his four-seam fastball 61.6% of the time, and he has picked up 23 of his 37 strikeouts with his fastball...His fastball has generated a 21.6% whiff rate this season...He has thrown his fastball at the 12th-highest clip (61.6%) among all pitchers who have thrown their fastball at least 300 times this season.

REHAB STINT: Was originally placed on the 15-day IL on March 27 (retro. March 24) with a right oblique strain and then was transferred to the 60-day IL on April 29...This season, he has made six rehab appearances (five starts) for Brooklyn, Binghamton, and Syracuse...Over those appearances, he allowed 13 earned runs over 18.2 IP and recorded 23 strikeouts...He made his final rehab start on July 8 with Syracuse, and he allowed three runs over 3.2 IP and struck out five...He threw 73 pitches, 48 for strikes.

2024 A CAREER YEAR: Recorded a career-high in innings (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12) and starts (32), while his 184 strikeouts were the second-most in his career and were the ninth-most in the NL last season...The southpaw finished with the lowest full-season ERA of his career (3.47), and he was one of eight pitchers who made 32 or more starts and posted an ERA below 3.50...He held right-handed batters to a .190 average, tied for the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...From July 1 until the end of the season, Manaea was first in the majors in innings (105.1), second in quality starts (12) as well as sixth in strikeouts (108) and WHIP (0.93)...Made four Postseason starts, going 2-1 with a 4.74 ERA (10 ER/19.0 IP), eight walks and 19 strikeouts...He earned wins in Game 3 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia and Game 2 of the NLCS at Los Angeles.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Last season, Manaea completed at least 7.0 innings in nine of his 32 starts this season and that was tied for the sixth-most such outings in the National League...Manaea recorded back-to-back starts of 7.0 scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts on 7/30/24 against Minnesota and 8/5/24 at St.Louis...Manaea joined Tyler Glasnow and Spence Schwellenbach as the only pitchers in the majors last season with consecutive starts of 7.0 or more innings and double-digit strikeouts...Manaea was the only one of three to not allow a run in both of those starts...He became the first Mets pitcher to throw 7.0 or more innings and record 10 or more strikeouts in consecutive starts since Max Scherzer (4/19/22 (2) - 4/25/22)...The southpaw joins Dwight Gooden (Two Separate Occasions) and Tom Seaver (Three Separate Occasions) as the only pitchers in franchise history to post back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and double-digit strikeouts...He is just the 10th left-handed pitcher in major league history with back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts (Last: Chris Sale, 6/24/18-6/30/18).

SPECTACULAR DOWN THE STRETCH: From July on last season, Manaea was second in the majors in quality starts (12), first in innings (105.1), sixth in strikeouts (108) and sixth in WHIP (0.93)...Since June 14, Manaea had allowed three or fewer runs 17 times, which was tied for most in the majors during that span with Chris Sale (17).

CAREER: Over the course of 10 Major League Seasons with the Athletics, Padres, Giants, and Mets he has a 78-63 record, a 4.03 ERA (544 ER/1216.1 IP), and 1146 strikeouts in 235 games and 204 starts...His 1146 career strikeouts are the 14th-most among active left-handers...He resigned with the Mets this offseason on a three-year contract in December 2024.

- Earned his 24th save of the season after tossing 2.0 innings on August 16 vs. Seattle (2 H, ER, 2 K, HR)...It was his fourth career six-out save and second of the season (also: July 12 at KC)...Has allowed two home runs over his last three outings after going 34 consecutive games without allowing a home run (from 4/23-8/4)...The homer marked the first home run he had given up to a right hander in 160 at-bats.
- Has gone 4-for-4 in save opportunities against division opponents this season and has a current 7.1 scoreless inning streak vs. the NL East...He has not allowed an earned run in each of his last nine appearances vs. the NL East dating back to April 23.
- Had 19 consecutive appearances without allowing an earned run from 6/6-8/4, which was tied for the tenth-longest single-season streak in Mets history and his longest such streak since his 21-game span from 6/22-8/17/22.

- Has allowed just three earned runs over his last 37 games, posting a 0.70 ERA (3 ER/38.1 IP) with 11 walks and 55 strikeouts since April 23...During that span, his 0.70 ERA is the best in the majors and his .153 opponents' BA is the fourth best (min. 30.0 IP)...The next-best ERA is Aroldis Chapman's 0.93 ERA in that span.
- Among qualified relievers this season, is fifth in K/9.0 IP (13.13, first in NL), sixth in ERA (1.69, third in NL), tied for eighth in saves (24, fourth in NL) and ninth in opponents' BA (.165, third in NL)...Among qualified NL relievers, is fifth in opponents' SLG (.256) and opponents' OPS (.525) and tied for ninth in wins (5)...Among pitchers who have thrown at least 40.0 innings this season, his 40.3 swing and miss percentage is the best in the National Leagues and fifth-best in the majors.
- Over 47 games this season, has gone 5-2 with 24 saves, a 1.69 ERA (9 ER/48.0 IP), 17 walks and 70 strikeouts...The Mets are 36-11 in games that Díaz has pitched in...Hitters have posted a .165 (27-164) average against Díaz this season...With two outs and runners in scoring position, has allowed just one hit in 22 at-bats (.045 BA)...He has recorded five saves this season of four outs or more which are the most-such games in the majors this season...His six saves this season with three-plus strikeouts are tied with Mason Miller and Jeff Hoffman for the most such games in the majors...He has 57 career saves with three or more strikeouts are the most since his debut in 2016...Josh Hader is second with 44.
