METSELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Giants, 6-2, yesterday at Citi Field...The Mets have won four of their last five games...Tonight, the Mets begin a six-game road trip to Arizona (three games) and St. Louis (three games).

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Mets have won each of their first four series of the season for the third time in franchise history...They also accomplished this feat in 2006 (first four series) and in 2018 (first five series)...Courtesy of *Elias*.

IN GOOD COMPANY: Carlos Carrasco has struck out 20 and walked only two while posting a 1.47 ERA (three earned runs/18.1 innings) in his first three starts...He became the fifth different Mets pitcher to notch at least 20 strikeouts and issue no more than two walks over their first three starts of a season...He joined Tom Seaver (21 K, 1 BB in 1972), Frank Viola (24 K, 2 BB in 1990), Matt Harvey (24 K, 1 BB in 2015) and Noah Syndergaard (20 K, 0 BB in 2017 and 20 K, 2 BB in 2019)...Courtesy of *Elias*.

STARTING OFF: The Mets starting staff has gone 8-1 with a 2.10 ERA (18 earned runs/77.0 innings) with 17 walks and 86 strikeouts...The starting staff leads the majors in ERA, WHIP (0.83), opponent's batting average (.174), strikeouts and innings.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen has not allowed a run over their last five games...The last time New York relievers allowed a run was in the seventh inning on April 16 vs. Arizona...That is a span of 17.0 innings...The bullpen owns a 3.19 ERA (17 earned runs/48.0 innings) with 21 walks and 57 strikeouts...Their 55 punchouts are fourth in National League.

1010 WINS: The Mets are the first team to record 10 wins this season...They are a season-high six games above .500 for the second time (also, 9-3)... They hold a season-high 4.0 lead in the National League East.

IT'S BEEN TWO WEEKS: The Mets have posted a 10-4 record through the team's first 14 games...That is tied for the fourth-best record in team history (also, 2007, 2006 and 1972)...The 2018 Mets owned the best mark at 12-2 followed by the 2015 and 1986 team with an 11-3 mark...New York's pitching staff has struck out 143 this season...That ranks second in team history behind the 2018 Mets (152)...The team's 143 strikeouts lead the major leagues...The team's collective 2.52 ERA is the eighth-best mark through 14 games...It's the best ERA since the 2007 team posted a 2.40 mark in the first two weeks.

THE BANK IS OPEN: Eduardo Escobar, who played for the Diamondbacks from 2018-21, is a .271/.322/.514 hitter with 113 runs, 38 doubles, 13 triples, 35 home runs, 117 RBI in 183 career games at Chase Field...Starling Marte has played 33 career games at Chase Field and has hit .362/.424/.538 with 14 doubles, three triples, a home run and 15 RBI in the ballpark...Dominic Smith is 12-31 (.387) with three doubles, three home runs, five RBI and four walks in nine games in Arizona...James McCann and Brandon Nimmo are both 6-17 with two home runs in the desert.

DESIGNATED FOR HITTING: As a team, Mets designated hitters are batting .308 (16-52) with 10 runs, four doubles, four home runs, 14 RBI, seven walks, a .400 OBP and a .615 SLG...They rank second in SLG, third in average, doubles, and OBP and are tied for third in homers.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: New York leads the major leagues with a .353 OBP as well as hits (120), they are second in runs (67), third in average (.259), tied for third in walks (58), fifth in OPS (.755), tied for sixth in home runs (14) and ninth in SLG (.402)...Through 14 games this year, the Mets have outscored their opponents 67-37.

MY BAD: The Mets broke a streak of nine straight games without an error yesterday...The Mets have committed only four errors this year...That is the fourth-fewest in the National League and tied for the sixth-fewest in the majors.

IT'S WAR: Eduardo Escobar is fourth in the majors with a 1.0 fWAR...He has recorded seven doubles in 13 games this year...That is tied for the major league lead and leads the Senior Circuit...Nine of Escobar's 14 hits have gone for extra bases...He has drawn 12 walks in 13 games this year...That is tied for the fourth-most in the majors...Escobar drew a total of 48 walks in 146 games last season.

DBACKS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won the season series in each of the last three years...Since 2019, the Mets have posted a 17-6 record against Arizona...That is their best record against any NL opponent in that span.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is batting .308 (16-52) with 12 runs, four doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI, nine walks, three steals, a .419 OBP, a .615 SLG and a 1.035 OPS...He has safely reached base in 13 of the 14 games this season...He ranks fifth in the major leagues with a 1.0 fWAR this year.

THE CHARMING MAN: In six games this season, Drew Smith has posted a perfect ERA, allowing only three hits and two walks while striking out seven in 6.2 innings of work...He owns a career record of 4-3 with a 2.93 ERA (27 earned runs/83.0 innings) with 26 walks and 73 strikeouts...Smith was acquired by the Mets from the Tampa Bay Rays on July 27, 2017 in exchange for Lucas Duda.

CHASEN DREAMS: After allowing a run in his first appearance of the season, Chasen Shreve has made four scoreless appearances (5.1 innings)...Overall, he is 1-0 with a 1.42 ERA (one earned run/6.1 innings) with two walks and eight punchouts in five appearances.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Since returning from the IL, Mark Canha is 3-8 with three RBI...He has reached base safely in all eight games with the Mets...He is batting .379 (11-29) with two runs, six RBI, four walks, a .471 OBP and an .850 OPS.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is tied for third in the majors and tied for second in the NL with 14 RBI...He is batting .278 (15-54) with nine runs, three doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI, two walks, a .500 SLG and an .828 OPS in 14 games this year...He is batting .353 (6-17) with six runs, two doubles, three homes, 11 RBI with a 1.389 OPS in four games as a designated hitter this year.

MOVING ON UP: Pete Alonso hit his 109th career home run on Sunday vs. Arizona...That breaks his tie with José Reyes for sole possession of 13th on the team's all-time list...Ed Kranepool (118) is next, followed by Edgardo Alfonzo (120).

NEED FOR SPEED: The Mets have totaled 11 stolen bases through 14 games...That is tied with the Dodgers and the Angels for the major league lead...The Mets did not record their 11th steal until May 17 last season in the team's 36th game...Overall, the Mets stole a total of 54 bases in 2021...Francisco Lindor and Starling Marte are tied for fifth in the majors with three steals.

OUCH: The Mets have been hit by 12 pitches this year, which leads the majors...New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 319 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 42 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 56 HBP, while Starling Marte is fifth (40) in the last four seasons.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has record 65 saves as a member of the Mets...That places him tied for 10th with Skip Lockwood on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Neil Allen who recorded 69 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 174 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is 9-14 with 65 saves, a 3.90 ERA (66 earned runs/152.1 innings) with 62 walks and 248 strikeouts...His 248 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (281) and Josh Hader (280) have struck out more...Additionally, his 248 strikeouts are the 14th most by a reliever in franchise history...Turk Wendell is 13th with 259.

THAT'S SHOW BUSINESS: Buck Showalter is in his first year with the Mets...He became the first manager in Mets history to win each of his first three contests...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: In his first start since June 30, 2021, Peterson threw 4.1 scoreless innings in the Mets' 5-0 win over the Diamondbacks at Citi Field on April 17...The southpaw has yet to allow a run in 8.1 innings this season.

VS. ARIZONA: Peterson has faced the Diamondbacks three times in his career...In his first two outings against Arizona, Peterson failed to pitched past the second inning...In his lone start at Chase Field on June 2, 2021, Peterson lasted 0.1 inning and allowed five earned runs on three hits in the Mets 7-6 victory...The Mets have been victorious in all three of Peterson's starts against the Diamondbacks.

HOME/ROAD: In 2021, Peterson went 2-2 with a 2.84 ERA (10 earned runs/31.2 innings) with 27 strikeouts in six starts at Citi Field...He tossed a quality start in five of his six outings at home...He is 5-2 in his career at Citi Field with a 3.26 ERA (18 earned runs/49.2 innings)...Peterson was 0-4 with a 7.97 ERA (31 earned runs/35.0 innings) in nine starts away from Citi Field...His 7.97 road ERA was the highest in franchise history (min. 35.0 innings).

TIMES ARE CHANGIN': During his rookie campaign in 2020, opposing batters batted .333 (12-36) off his changeup...Since then, opposing batters have batted .192 (10-52) off his changeup.

2021 REVIEW: Before his season-ending injury, Peterson was 2-6 with a 5.54 ERA (41 earned runs/66.2 innings), 69 strikeouts and 29 walks in 15 starts...On April 14 vs. Philadelphia, Peterson allowed one earned run on three hits over 6.0 innings with 10 strikeouts on April 14 vs. Philadelphia...He did not issue a walk...Peterson became the seventh southpaw in franchise history to strikeout at least 10 batters without issuing a walk...On May 14 at Tampa Bay, Peterson tossed a career-high 7.1 innings, allowing two earned runs and striking out nine in a no-decision...In three starts from June 14-25, he went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA (two earned runs/16.2 innings), allowed just six hits and struck out 14.

AS A RELIEF PITCHER: In two career relief appearances, Peterson has yet to allow a run in 8.0 innings...On September 2, 2020, Peterson earned his fourth win of the season after throwing 4.0 scoreless innings against the Orioles in Baltimore...In his 2022 debut, Peterson threw 4.0 scoreless innings on April 11 against the Phillies.

CLOSE GAMES: All seven of Peterson's starts from April 27, 2021-June 2, 2021 came in games decided by one run...That was the longest streak in the majors since 2017, when Jimmy Nelson started seven one-run games in a row...This streak ties Ron Darling's (July 25-August 27, 1988) for the longest by a Met...The last major leaguer to start eight consecutive one-run games was San Diego's Tim Lincecum (August 4-September 15, 1993).
