**Ichiro Suzuki** is set to become the third player inducted to the National Baseball Hall of Fame with the Seattle Mariners in **65 days** on July 27 in Cooperstown...he is also set to have his **#51** retired by the Mariners on Aug. 9 at T-Mobile Park.

### VS. HOUSTON

The Mariners and Astros face off for the second of four series this season...Seattle took 2-of-3 from Houston at T-Mobile Park in April in their first matchup of the year.

**TONIGHT'S TILT...**the Mariners continue the last leg of the 10-game, 3-city road trip (5-2) with the second of four games against the Houston Astros (0-1)...Seattle is coming off a pair of series wins already on the trip over the San Diego Padres (3-0) and the Chicago White Sox (2-1)...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith**, **Ryan Rowland-Smith** and Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as dugout reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and Mariners.com with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.**

**ODDS AND ENDS...**the Mariners dropped yesterday's series opener to the Astros 9-2...despite the loss, Seattle is 20-12 (.625) over its last 32 games and 24-13 (.649) over its last 37 games, trailing only the Detroit Tigers (.650/26-14) by a thin margin for the best record in the Majors over that span.

- **Best In The West** - Seattle is in first place in the American League West, 2.5 games ahead of the Astros and 4.0 games ahead of the Rangers.
- **Joy Division** - The Mariners are 13-6 (.684) against AL West opponents this season.
- **Series-ly Solid** - The Mariners own a 11-4-1 series record, 4-3-1 at home and 7-1 on the road...the Mariners won 9 consecutive series from April 7-May 7, the second-longest series winning streak in club history...since **Dan Wilson** took the helm on Aug. 23, 2024, Seattle owns a 18-6-3 series record.
- **Home Runs Are Good** - Seattle is 26-12 (.684) in games with at least one home run...they are 2-9 (.182) in games when they do not homer.
- **Lately** - Seattle has won 4-straight series over Houston at Daikin Park and 5 of the last 6 dating back to June 6-8, 2022...the Mariners have also won 7 of the last 9 series overall against the Astros since May 5-7, 2023.
- **Hot Rowd** - Since starting his season in a 1-for-20 skid, **Rowdy Tellez** has a .845 OPS, batting .242 (22x91) with 14 runs, 4 doubles, 8 home runs, 22 RBI, and slugging .549 since April 11...Tellez's .549 slugging percentage since April 11 ranks 9th in the American League.
- **Yesterday's Roster Moves** - The Mariners yesterday reinstated RHP **George Kirby** from the 15-day Injured List to make his season debut and optioned RHP **Troy Taylor** to Triple-A Tacoma (post-game May 21).

**SINCE THESE TEAMS LAST MET...**prior to the current divisional matchup between the Mariners and Astros, the teams last met for 3 games from April 7-9 with Seattle taking 2-of-3, including winning the rubber match of the series in a 5-run comeback led by **Randy Arozarena's** 8th-inning grand slam and 9th-inning walk-off walk...since then, the Mariners have gone 23-13 (.639), the 2nd-best record in the Majors, trailing only the Detroit Tigers (26-13/.667), while the Astros have gone 21-17 (.553), 13th best in MLB.

**THE BEST CLOSER IN BASEBALL...**right-hander **Andrés Muñoz** earned his MLB-leading 16th save of the season on Wednesday...in 22 appearances this season, the reigning American League Reliever of the Month is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 12.1 IP) with 8 hits allowed, 2 runs allowed (0 earned runs), 8 walks (2 intentional) and 28 strikeouts, sporting a 0.74 WHIP, while limiting opponents to a .113 batting average (8x71)...Muñoz leads MLB relief pitchers with 2.0 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*).

**THE WALK FIRM OF CRAWFORD, AROZARENA AND CO...**the Mariners rank second in the Majors in both walks (195) and walk rate (10.3%), trailing the Yankees (199, 10.4%) in both categories...Seattle's 10.3% walk rate is on pace to be tied for the 2nd-best in franchise history (also: 1996), trailing only the 2000 team (12.0%)...Seattle has 3 players who rank in the top 10 in walks in the American League: **J.P. Crawford** (T-2nd, 32), **Cal Raleigh** (T-2nd, 32) and **Randy Arozarena** (T-7th, 28)...Crawford (16.1%) and Raleigh (15.0%) also rank 2nd and 3rd in the AL in walk rate.

**EMERSON HANCOCK THE FIREBALLER...**since he was recalled from Triple-A Tacoma on April 17, the Mariners are 5-1 in **Emerson Hancock's** 6 starts...Hancock threw the 13 hardest pitches of his career in his last outing against the Padres, topping out at 97.6 MPH...he finished his outing with 3 straight fastballs of 97+ MPH to strike out Manny Machado on 3 pitches.

**'PEN PALS...**the Mariners bullpen is 13-8 with 17 saves and a 3.46 ERA (73 ER, 189.2 IP) this season, the 10th-best ERA among MLB bullpens...aside from star closer **Andrés Muñoz**, Seattle has gotten major contributions from **Gabe Speier** (2.25 ERA in 23 games), **Carlos Vargas** (3.38 ERA in 20 games), **Collin Snider** (3.63 ERA in 20 games), **Casey Legumina** (1.62 ERA in 17 games) and **Matt Brash** (0.00 ERA in 5 games).

**MOORE ROADIES...****Dylan Moore** went 2-for-4 with a home run in last night's game...in 21 road games this season, Moore is batting .311 (23x74) with 13 runs, 2 doubles, 5 home runs, 12 RBI and 6 stolen bases, getting on base at a .346 clip and slugging .541 (.886 OPS)...since the 2022 season, Moore holds a .866 OPS in 525 plate appearances away from home, the 11th-highest road OPS among the 254 hitters with at least 500 plate appearances during that span.

**ROAD WARRIORS...**the Mariners are 15-10 (.600) on the road this season, tied for the best road record in the Majors, with the Cubs (.600/15-10) and Phillies (.600/15-10)...Seattle has won 7-consecutive road series since dropping their first one at San Francisco from April 4-6...since then, the Mariners have captured series victories on the road at Cincinnati (2-1), Toronto (2-1), Boston (2-1), Texas (2-1), against the Athletics (2-1), against the Padres (3-0) and the White Sox (2-1)...the Mariners last won 7+ consecutive road series during the 2023 season, when they won 8 consecutive road series from July 3-Aug. 23.

**UPCOMING HOMESTAND...**following the last leg of the 10-game road trip in Houston and an off-day on Monday, the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park for a 9-game homestand where they will host the Washington Nationals (3 G, 5/27-5/29), Minnesota Twins (3 G, 5/30-6/1) and Baltimore Orioles (3 G, 6/3-6/5)...the homestand is highlighted by **Randy Arozarena Bobblehead 3-Day Giveaway** from May 27-29, **K-Pop Fireworks Night** on May 30, **Little League Day** on June 1, **Pride Night** on June 4 and a pair of **Mariners Value Games** on June 3 and June 5, with tickets starting at \$11.

**AS YOU MAY KNOW...****Cal Raleigh** has been the best catcher in baseball this season, with a .950 OPS, hitting .253 (45x178) with 32 runs, 10 doubles, 16 homers, 33 RBI, 32 walks and 5 stolen bases, getting on base at a .371 clip and slugging .579, leading MLB catchers (min. 100 PA) in nearly every category including home runs, runs, RBI, walks, total bases (101), extra-base hits (26), times on base (79), bWAR (2.6) and fWAR (2.8), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Cal trails only Aaron Judge-NYY (4.3) in *FanGraphs* WAR in the American League?...he is tied with Bobby Witt Jr.-KC at 2.8 fWAR...Cal also ranks 4th in the AL in *Baseball Reference* WAR (2.6), trailing Judge (3.8), Alex Bregman-BOS (3.0) and Witt Jr. (2.9).

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 25-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 8th start of the season tonight and his 1st against the Astros...he is also scheduled to make the 23rd start of his career and 2nd career start against the Astros.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

**LAST TIME OUT...**ND on May 17 vs. SD, he threw 4.2 innings, giving up 1 run on 4 hits with 3 strikeouts and 1 walk...it marked the 4th time in his career where he has tossed 4.0+ innings with 1 or fewer earned runs allowed (last: 4/26/24 vs. AZ)...it marked his 1st career appearance against the Padres in his MLB debut on Sept. 9, 2023...he has held the Padres to just 1 run in each of those outings.

**BRINGIN' THE HEAT...**threw the 13 fastest pitches of his career on May 17 vs. SD, throwing a career-high 97.6 mph fastball to strikeout Jake Cronenworth in the 2nd inning...in that outing, 42 of his pitches touched 95+ mph which is nearly double his previous career-high of 22 pitches over 95 mph on April 17 vs. CIN...the fastest pitch he had thrown prior to 2025 was a 96 mph sinker on 7/07/24 vs. TOR.

IN HIS OWN WORDS

*"I think a lot of it, too, is just the week-in and week-out preparation...making sure that your body is activated and firing in the right ways. And when you get the ball, you're throwing as hard as you can, as often as you can. And that's something this year that I feel like we've changed a little bit."*

**THE LONE STAR STATE...**owns a 2.57 ERA (2 ER, 7.0 IP) in the state of Texas having made just two road starts against the Astros and Rangers...made his only other appearance against the Astros on August 20, 2023 where he tossed 2.0 scoreless innings, striking out 2 of the 8 total batters he faced.

**DIVISION RIVALS...**is 1-0 with a 3.99 ERA (13 ER, 29.1 IP) against AL West teams across 6 career starts...across those starts, he has allowed 31 hits, 5 home runs, and 9 walks with 19 strikeouts...the Mariners are 6-0 in games where Emerson Hancock has started against AL West opponents.

**LOCKING IT IN...**his 3 starts on April 23, April 30, and May 6, marked just the 2nd time in his career where he threw 6.0+ innings in 3 consecutive starts (also: 2024 season, 4/13 at CHC, 4/21 at COL and 4/26 at ARI).

**SUCCESS ON THE ROAD...**in his 10 career road starts Hancock is 3-1 with 32 strikeouts and 9 walks in 47.0 innings pitched... he is 1 of 3 pitchers (**George Kirby** and **Bryce Miller**) in Mariners history to have 32-or-more strikeouts and 9-or-fewer walks in the first 10 road starts of their career... he has thrown 5.0+ innings in 6 of those 10 starts, with the Mariners 9-1 in road games that Hancock has started in.

**QUICK TRIP TO TACOMA...**after his 1st major league start of the season (3/30 vs. DET), Hancock was optioned to Triple-A Tacoma...between his two starts with the Rainiers, he allowed 4 runs on 9 hits (1 HR), 2 walks, 2 hit by pitches, and struck out 12 in 9.2 innings of work...between the 2024 and 2025 seasons, Hancock holds a 3.46 ERA (40 ER, 104.0 IP) and is 7-4 with Tacoma across 19 game starts.

**LATEST STRETCH...**in his last 5 starts (4/17-c), Hancock has collected 3 quality starts, and his 28.0 innings pitched are the most in a 5-game span in his career...his 22 strikeouts is tied for the most strikeouts in a 5-game span in his career (also: 4/7/24-5/1/24)...in his last 10 starts (7/6/24-c), the Mariners are 7-3 with Hancock throwing 5.0+ innings in 8 starts, and allowing 2-or-fewer walks in 8 of his last 10 starts.

**THE VERY FIRST ONE...**recorded his 1st career win on 4/1/24 vs. Cleveland at T-Mobile Park...tossed 5.1 innings, gave up 4 hits (1 home run) and 3 earned runs with 1 strikeout.

**THE DEBUT...**made MLB debut on 8/9/23 against the San Diego Padres, allowing just 1 run on 2 hits and 3 walks with 3 strikeouts... became just the 6th starting pitcher in franchise history to pitch 5.0+ innings and allow 2-or-fewer hits in a Major League debut, joining Pat Rice, Ken Cloude, Taijuan Walker, Roenis Elías and **Bryce Miller**.

**THE COMPLETE PACKAGE...**on July 21, 2024 vs. Reno, Hancock threw a 9.0 inning complete game shutout...it was the only 9.0 inning complete game shutout in Triple-A in 2024 and only 1 of 2 in the full-season minor leagues this year...there have only been 2 complete game shutouts in the Pacific Coast League since the start of 2019.

**PCL PITCHER OF THE MONTH...**was awarded Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Month for June 2024...held a 1-0 record with a 0.84 ERA in 4 starts as he allowed 2 runs on 14 hits with 7 walks over 21.1 innings...he tallied 17 strikeouts and held opponents to a .187 (14x75) average... after allowing 2 runs in his first inning of June, he did not allow another run in his next 20.1 innings during the month with Tacoma.
