TIGERS HOLD OFF ASTROS FOR GAME 1 WIN: The Tigers held off a late rally from the Astros to win Game 1 of the Wild Card Series, 3-1, on Tuesday. It marked Detroit's first postseason win since Game 4 of the 2013 American League Championship Series vs. Boston on October 16, 2013. Tarik Skubal started for Detroit and threw 6.0 shutout innings, allowing four hits with one walk and six strikeouts. Beau Brieske got the final two outs with one walk to notch the save. Offensively, Detroit scored all three runs in the second inning as Jake Rogers, Trey Sweeney and Matt Vierling each had run-scoring singles.

IN THE POSTSEASON: Detroit is in the postseason for the 17th time in franchise history and for the first time since 2014. The Tigers earned a Wild Card berth for the second time in franchise history (other, 2006) and are the No. 6 seed in the American League. Detroit is 58-62-1 all-time in the postseason, including a 28-34-1 record on the road.

SKUBAL SNACKS: Tarik Skubal was dominant in his postseason debut yesterday, working 6.0 scoreless innings with four hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts. He became the fourth pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0-or-more shutout innings in his playoff debut, joining Max Scherzer on October 2, 2011 at New York (AL), Joe Coleman on October 10, 1972 vs. Oakland and Ed Willett on October 11, 1909 vs. Pittsburgh. Skubal is the 10th Tigers starter to earn a win in his first career postseason appearance (last, Max Scherzer on October 2, 2011 at New York (AL)) and first southpaw to do so since Mickey Lolich (October 3, 1986 at St. Louis).

WELCOME TO THE PLAYOFFS: The Tigers had 16 different players make their postseason debut on Tuesday, the most playoff debuts by a team in one game since Kansas City had 17 players make their postseason debut on September 30, 2014 vs. Oakland. Seven different Tigers players collected a hit in their first playoff game yesterday, the second-most in a single game in franchise postseason history, trailing only Game 1 of the 1984 ALCS at Kansas City when eight Tigers recorded a hit in their playoff debut.

SEEKING A SWEEP: The Tigers will look to complete their fourth sweep of a postseason series in franchise history this afternoon. Detroit's previous three playoff sweeps have all come in the ALCS (1984, 2006, 2012). During the 2024 regular season, the Tigers completed six series sweeps.

ABOUT THE WILD CARD ROSTER: The Tigers announced their 26-man roster for the Wild Card series on Tuesday. The roster includes 12 pitchers and 14 position players. Of the 26 players on the Wild Card roster, 15 of them were on Detroit's Opening Day roster. Prior to yesterday, Matt Vierling was the only player on the 26-man roster who had previous postseason experience. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last playoff team to have one-or-fewer players with previous playoff experience was the Angels in 2002.

ALL GAS, NO BRAKES: The Tigers continued to show their athleticism and aggressiveness on the basepaths in yesterday's game. From August 1 until the end of the season, Detroit led the Majors by going first to third 41 times. During that stretch, the Tigers were thrown out just once, posting a 97.6% success rate. According to Statcast, the Tigers ranked second in the Majors with 10 runner runs, trailing only Arizona (13). **SECOND-HALF SURGE:** The Tigers posted a Major League best 31-13 record from August 11 until the end of the season. It was the team's best record over the final 44 games of a season since 2011, when Detroit went 32-12. The Tigers led the Majors with a 2.72 ERA (401.0IP/121ER) from August 11 until the end of the season, while also ranking first with a +62 run differential.

ON THE MOUND: The Tigers pitching staff ranked among the best in the Majors throughout the season. Detroit finished the season with a 3.61 team ERA (1447.0IP/581ER), which ranked third in the American League and fourth in the Majors. It marked Detroit's lowest season ERA since also having a 3.61 ERA in 2013. The Tigers finished second in the big leagues with a 1.16 WHIP, 3.72 FIP, .292 opponent on-base percentage, .372 opponent slugging percentage, .664 opponent OPS and 2.59 walks per 9.0 innings and fourth with a 3.25 strikeout-to-walk ratio and 0.99 home runs per 9.0 innings.

ONE-RUN GAMES: The Tigers finished the season with a 31-24 record in one-run games. Detroit won 13 of its last 15 games decided by one run. The Tigers 55 one-run games was tied with Seattle for the most in the Majors and were the most in a season for Detroit since also playing 55 in 1976.

TIGERS AND ASTROS: The Tigers and Astros are meeting in the postseason for the first time. The two teams played six times during the regular season with Houston winning four of the six games. The Tigers dropped two-of-three games to the Astros in a three-game series at Minute Maid Park from June 14-16.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers went 43-38 on the road during the regular season. Detroit's 43 road victories were their most in a season since winning 45 in 2014. The Tigers finished the season by winning eight of their last 10 games away from Comerica Park.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: A.J. Hinch is leading a team to the postseason for the fifth time in his managerial career. Hinch has posted a 29-22 (.569) record in the playoffs. In his four seasons as the Tigers manager, Hinch has a 307-341 (.474) record, while his all-time managerial record stands at 877-793 (.525). His 877 victories ranks fourth among active managers.

Today's start at Houston

- Holton will make his second career postseason appearance today at Houston...made his playoff debut yesterday against the Astros, retiring the only batter he faced in the eighth inning.
- Has faced the Astros three times in his career in the regular season, allowing four runs on six hits with no walks and three strikeouts in 5.2 innings...made two appearances against Houston this year, working 4.0 shutout innings with one hit allowed and three strikeouts.
- Was used as an opener nine times during the regular season and had a 0-1 record with a 1.59 ERA (17.0IP/3ER) and 15 strikeouts.
- Is one of three pitchers all-time with a career sub-0.90 WHIP (min. 100.0 innings), joining Koji Uehara and Emmanuel Clase.
- Since the start of the 2023 season, his 63 multi-inning relief outings are the second-most in the Major Leagues...over that same span, his 0.82 WHIP and .226 opponent on-base percentage leads all Major League relievers (min. 100.0 innings), while ranking third with a .517 opponent OPS, fourth with a .178 opponent batting average, sixth with a 2.23 ERA (161.2IP/40ER) and seventh with a .290 opponent slugging percentage.

2024 Regular Season

- Pitched in 66 games during the regular season, compiling a 7-2 record with eight saves, a 2.19 ERA (94.1IP/23ER) and 77 strikeouts...posted a 0.78 WHIP and limited opponents to a .173 batting average.
- Led all Major League pitchers (min. 90.0 innings) with a 0.78 WHIP, a .173 opponent batting average, a .222 opponent onbase percentage and a .500 opponent OPS, while ranking second with a .279 opponent slugging percentage and third with a 2.19 ERA (94.1IP/23ER).
- Named Tigers Pitcher of the Month for July, throwing 18.0 scoreless innings with 12 hits allowed, three walks and 13 strikeouts over 11 appearances, including three starts...was the only pitcher in the Majors to not allow a run in July (min. 15.0 innings), while he ranked second among MLB pitchers with a 2.31 FIP, sixth with a 0.83 WHIP and seventh with a .182 opponent batting average.
- From June 29-September 18, he had a 4-0 record with six saves, a 0.38 ERA (47.1IP/2ER) and 37 strikeouts...dating back to 1913, his 0.38 ERA was the lowest in any 33-game span by a Tigers pitcher (min. 40.0 innings), while it was the lowest for any MLB pitcher since Cla Meredith from July 23-September 26, 2006.
