# TAMPA BAY RAYS (37-39) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (36-39) June 22, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 4:05 EDT - GAME \#76/HOME \#38 RHP ZACH EFIN (3-4, 4.12 ERA) vs. RHP JARED JONES (4-6, 3.76 ERA) 

THE PIRATES:...allowed a season-high 17 hits while losing 10-3 in the opener of their three-game series last night against the Rays... Have gone 13-12, including 8-6 at home, in one-run games...Have won nine games in their last at-bat (won 10 in all of 2023)...Have gone $28-3$ (. 903 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season... Are tied for the sixth-best record (19-17) among all National League teams since 5/11...Are hitting . 278 (37-for-133) with runners in scoring position this month, which ranks seventh in all of MLB behind the Mets (.325), Diamondbacks (.311), Astros (.292), Red Sox (.288), Yankees (.287) and Blue Jays (.286)...Have gone 8-4 this month in games when the team does not make an error.... Have the second-best ERA (3.35) among starting rotations this month behind the Mariners (2.96)...Have surrendered 16 home runs this month, which is tied for the fourth-fewest among all teams in MLB...Will look to avoid losing back-to-back home games for the first time since 5/22-23 against the Giants.

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds is hitting . 342 (25-for-73) with seven doubles, a triple, four home runs and 11 RBI during his current career-high 18-game hitting streak...l't's the longest active hitting streak in MLB coming into today (the longest hitting streak this season in MLB is 21 games, which was accomplished by Ketel Marte and Anthony Volpe)...Reynolds' hitting streak is also the longest by a Pirate since 2019 when Kevin Newman hit safely in 19 straight games.

BRYAN IN THE BOX: Bryan Reynolds has gone deep in back-to-back games after homering off Tampa Bay's Chris Devenski with a 439-foot blast night (he also lifted the Pirates to a 1-0 win with his homer off Cincinnati's Nick Martinez on Wednesday)...Reynolds' 439-foot home run last night was his longest of the 2024 campaign and fourth-farthest of his career (his longest was a 454 -foot bomb off Colorado's Jon Gray on June 30, 2021)...Reynolds ranks second all-time among Pirates switch hitters with 109 home runs (Bobby Bonilla is first with 114)...Reynolds' 109 home runs are also tied with Bill Robinson and Paul Waner for 18th all-time in Pirates history (Bobby Bonilla ranks 17th with his 114).

THE RENEGADE: Three years ago today David Bednar earned the first win of his big league career, which came here at PNC Park against the White Sox.... Since the beginning of the 2021 season when he was acquired by the Pirates, Bednar has gone 12-11 with 77 saves, a 2.69 ERA (211.0ip/63er) and 258 strikeouts...Bednar's 2.69 ERA since the beginning of 2021 ranks sixth among all National League relievers (minimum 150.0 innings) behind Evan Phillips (1.74), Devin Williams (1.97), Josh Hader (2.45), Ryan Helsley (2.58) and Alex Vesia (2.65).

ABOUT TODAY'S STARTER: Jared Jones gets the start this afternoon in the middle game of this weekend series against the Rays...The 22 -year-old Jones comes into today first in the National League and second among all rookies in MLB with 85 strikeouts (Luis Gil of the Yankees leads all rookies with 97 strikeouts).

HOT ROWD: Rowdy Tellez has reached base safely in each of his last six games, going 8-for-22 (.364) with three doubles and a pair of home runs...He comes into today with a .390 average (16-for-41) with five doubles, a home run, nine RBI, . 444 OBP, . 585 slugging percentage and 1.030 OPS.

FROM THE TOP: Andrew McCutchen ranks sixth among all National League leadoff hitters with an . 811 OPS...He has also hit safely in 10 of his last 12 games, going 14-for-48 (.292) with an .804 OPS.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Last night Bubba Chandler struck out a career-high 10 batters in Double-A Altoona's win against Bowie...Chandler struck out seven consecutive hitters after allowing a leadoff double in the first inning... He also retired 16 straight batters into the sixth inning until Bowie third baseman Alfredo Velasquez reached on an infield single....Chandler is currently rated by MLB Pipeline as Pittsburgh's №. 3 prospect and 64th overall among the top 100 prospects in the game.

STARTING OFF: The 22-year-old right-hander is in his first Major League season with the Pirates...Was named to the Opening Day roster after being a non-roster invitee to Major League Spring Training...The Whittier, California, native was Pittsburgh's second-round draft selection in 2020 out of La Miranda High School in Southern California.

PROSPECT SZN: Jones entered the 2024 season rated as the Pirates No. 3 prospect and the No. 74 prospect in all of baseball according to Baseball America.

LAST TIME OUT: Took the loss in his last outing on June 15 at Colorado, allowing a career-high six runs on six hits with six strikeouts and four walks in 4.2 innings of work.

VS. THE RAYS: Will be making his first career start and appearance against the Rays this afternoon...It will be his fourth start this season against an American League opponent, posting a 5.28 ERA (9 ER in 15.1 IP ) in those starts.

Today will be his second start against an American League East opponent... He took the bump in the Pirates Home Opener on April 5 vs. Baltimore, taking the loss after he allowed just two runs on six hits with seven strikeouts in 6.01 IP.

BODY OF WORK: Is making his 15th career start and appearance today.... He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 12 of his 14 starts, as well as two or fewer seven times and one or fewer four times.

HOME COOKIN': Today will be Jones' eighth start at PNC Park this season where he's gone $2-2$ with a 2.14 ERA ( 10 ER in 42.0 IP), 42 strikeouts, 13 walks and a . 212 opponents average...He enters today with the seventh-best home ERA in the National League.

He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his seven starts at home, including two or fewer six times and one or fewer three times (two starts of 0 ER ).

LEAGUE LEADERS: Has posted a 3.86 strikeout-to-walk ratio ( 85 strikeouts/22 walks) so far the season, the 10th-best rate among qualified NL starters...His 9.68 strikeouts per nine innings are also 10th-best in the NL while his 85 strikeouts rank 11th and 226 opponents average ranks 16th.

He enters today leading qualified NL rookies with a . 226 opponents average and 85 strikeouts and third with a 3.76 ERA (CHC Shota Imanaga - 2.96; LAD Gavin Stone - 3.04).

THE WHIFF: Jones has induced 211 swing-and-misses (whiffs) this season, the 11th-highest total in the Majors and fourth-most in the NL....He had 25 whiffs on April 22 vs. Milwaukee, tied for the most by a Pirates pitcher in a single game since 2008, along with Francisco Liriano on Sept. 11, 2014 and A.J. Burnett on Sept. 21, 2013.

BRINGING THE HEAT: Jones has thrown 22 pitches of $100.0+$ mph this season, the fourth-most among Major League starting pitchers behind teammate Paul Skenes (65), LAA Jose Soriano (36) and CIN Hunter Greene (34).. 22 pitches of $100.0+\mathrm{mph}$ is already tied with Gerrit Cole in 2013 for the second-most by a Pirates starting pitcher in a single season since 2008, behind only Skenes' total this year.

- He hit $101.0+$ three times in the first inning of his outing on June 4 vs. Dodgers (101.4 on pitch 3 to Mookie Betts; 101.3 on pitch 4 to Mookie Betts; 101.0 on pitch 4 to Shohei Ohtani), the three hardest thrown pitches of his career.

MODEL OF CONSISTENCY: Prior to his outing on May 29 at Detroit (5 ER in 4.1 IP), Jones had gone 5.0+ innings and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first 10 career starts...Prior to Jones, the only pitchers with more consecutive starts to begin their career since 1901: 16 by Steve Rogers in 1973, 16 by Gary Peters in 1963, 13 by Shelby Miller in 2012-13, 13 by Josh Johnson in 2005-06, 13 by Brandon Webb in 2003, 12 by Barry Enright in 2010, 11 by Chris Sale in 2012, 11 by Ed Wright in 1945 and 11 by Jesse Barnes in 1915.

NO WALK SIGN IS ON: Jones opened his career with a streak of 21.1 consecutive innings without issuing a walk with his free pass to Blake Perkins in the fifth inning on April 22 vs. Milwaukee...It was the fifth-longest streak by a Major League pitcher within their first five career games since 1971 and the longest since Cleveland's Cody Anderson had a streak of 25.2 consecutive walkless innings in 2015

Thru five career starts, he had 39 strikeouts against just four walks, making him the only pitcher since 1893 , when the mound to plate distance was set at $60^{\prime} 6^{\prime \prime}$,
to record $35+$ strikeouts and 4 or fewer walks in their first 5 career MLB games.
