The Brewers (35-21) look to climb to a season-high 15 games over .500 with a win tonight.

When You're Hot, You're Hot
The Brewers have gone 22-8 in their last 30 games, including 17-5 over their last 22 contests....the team went 19-7 in May to go from 3.5 games out of first place in the NL Central to leading the division by 4.5 games.

And the Winner Is...
Jacob Misorowski was named NL Player of the Week for 5/25-5/31.... Misorowski went 2-0 over 2 starts (5/25 vs. St. Louis, 5/31 at Houston) and allowed just 1 run on 5 hits and 1 walk with 20 strikeouts, posting a 0.64 ERA over 14.0 innings....he is the first Brewers pitcher to win NL Player of the Week since **Brandon Woodruff** from 5/24-5/30, 2021.

IN THE TRAINER'S ROOM: RHP Logan Henderson (back), LHP Jared Koenig (left elbow), **OF Brandon Lockridge** (right knee), RHP Quinn Priester (right thoracic outlet), RHP Brandon Woodruff (right shoulder) and LHP Angel Zerpa (left forearm) are on the injured list....Zerpa is on the 60-day IL.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy (380g, 225-155, .592) is in his third season as Brewers manager....he was voted NL Manager of the Year in 2024 and 2025....he is one of four managers ever to win Manager of the Year in consecutive seasons, joining the Braves' Bobby Cox (2004-05), Rays' Kevin Cash (2020-21) and Guardians' Stephen Vogt (2024-25)....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell....he signed a multi-year contract extension on 2/20/26.

COACHES: Returning from the 2025 staff is offense & strategy coordinator **Jason Lane** (11th season/1st in current role), pitching coordinator **Jim Henderson** (5th season/1st in current role), field coordinator **Néstor Corredor** (4th season/3rd in current role), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (8th season), bullpen coach **Charlie Greene** (3rd season), lead hitting coach **Eric Theisen** (2nd season/1st in current role) and third base coach **Matt Erickson** (3rd season/1st in current role)....assistant pitching coach **Juan Sandoval**, hitting coach **Guillermo Martinez**, hitting coach **Daniel Vogelbach** and first base coach **Spencer Allen** are all in their first seasons on the coaching staff.

IN THE STANDINGS (67 days): The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: **FIRST:** 29, **SECOND:** 10, **THIRD:** 8, **FOURTH:** 13, **FIFTH:** 7....the Brewers are currently in first place, leading the second-place Cardinals by 4.5 games, third-place Pirates and Cubs by 5.0 games and fifth-place Reds by 6.0 games.

AT HOME: The Brewers are 19-11 at home, going 7-3-0 in series play.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 16-10 on the road, going 6-2-1 in series play....the team is 8-2 in its last 10 road games.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 21 replay challenges this season, going 16-5....their last challenge (lost) came on 5/30 at Houston as a safe call at home plate involving Cam Smith stood.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have qualified for the postseason seven times in the last eight seasons and three seasons in a row....the team was just two games away from making the postseason in nine straight seasons (2017-25), missing out in both 2017 and 2022 by a single game....Milwaukee has won the NL Central in four of the last five seasons and three seasons in a row.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only Major League teams with 86+ wins in each of the last eight full seasons (2017-25)....this does not include the shortened 2020 season....the Brewers have 798 wins since 2017, which ranks fourth in the majors behind the Dodgers (891), Astros (833) and Yankees (824).

DROHAN AT A GLANCE: Shane Drohan, 27, will be making his 12th appearance and second start of the season....Drohan has made his last 10 appearances out of the bullpen after making his Major League debut in a start on 4/8 at Boston and taking a 5-0 loss (2.2ip, 3h, 3r, 3er, 4bb, 2k, 63 pitches)....he is also 1-1 with a 3.29 ERA in 3 games/2 starts this season at Triple-A Nashville (13.2ip, 14h, 6r, 5er, 7bb, 17k, 2hr)....he was acquired from Boston with LHP Kyle Harrison and INF David Hamilton on February 9 in exchange for INF Caleb Durbin, INF Andruw Monasterio, INF/C Anthony Seigler and a 2026 Competitive Balance Round B selection.....name is pronounced "DROH-ehn."

LAST SEASON: Drohan went 5-1 with a 2.27 ERA in 12 games/11 starts at Triple-A Worcester....he held International League opponents to a .185 AVG with 67 strikeouts in 47.2 innings while posting a 1.01 WHIP....he was on Worcester's injured list from 5/13-8/25 with left forearm inflammation.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Is 32-22 with a 4.25 ERA in 107 games/91 starts (425.1ip, 387h, 226r, 201er, 212bb, 489k, 51hr) while pitching in the Boston (2021-25), Chicago-AL (2024) and Milwaukee (2026) organizations....he was originally selected by Philadelphia in the 23rd round of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign....he was then selected by Boston in the fifth round of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft....Drohan went from Boston to Chicago-AL in the 2023 Rule 5 Draft and returned to the Red Sox in June 2024....he underwent left shoulder surgery 2/22/24, performed by Dr. Nikhil Verma, and missed most of the 2024 season.

AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 1-0 with a 1.89 ERA in 8 relief appearances (19ip, 4er).

ON THE ROAD: Is 1-1 with a 4.32 ERA in 3 games/1 start (8.1ip, 4er).

vs. GIANTS: Drohan has not faced San Francisco.

ODDS & ENDS: Drohan graduated from Cardinal Newman (FL) High School, where he played three years of football (quarterback) in addition to baseball....he went on to attend Florida State University....his father, Bill, pitched in the Royals organization from 1987-90 at the Rookie and Class-A levels....Drohan enjoys watching football and basketball and playing video games....he is a fan of the Miami Dolphins and Miami Heat.

LHP Kyle Harrison will be making his 11th start of the 2026 season.....Harrison last started last Tuesday vs. St. Louis and picked up a 6-0 victory (6ip, 4h, 0bb, 2k, 92 pitches).....the team is 8-2 in his starts.....he has 4 quality starts.....opponents are batting .206 (39-for-189, 3hr).....he is 5-0 with a 0.79 ERA over his last 6 starts (34ip, 23h, 3r, 3er, 7bb, 43k, 1hr).....he has thrown 18.0 consecutive scoreless innings.....his 1.57 ERA is the lowest of any pitcher in franchise history after their first 10 starts with the team, passing CC Sabathia (1.59 in 2008).....he has not faced his former team.
