## SAN DIEGO PADRES (5-5) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (6-4) April 7, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #11/Home #5 RHP Nick Pivetta (1-1, 6.75 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (1-1, 9.53 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** had their five-game winning streak snapped with Monday's 5-0 loss vs. San Diego...Are in the fifth of six games during their season-opening homestand (they swept Baltimore from Friday-Sunday)...Will play two more games against the Padres before departing for a three-game, weekend series against the Cubs at Wrigley Field.

**CASHING IN AT PNC:** Paul Skenes will make his first home start of the season tonight vs. San Diego...Skenes, who took home National League Cy Young Award honors last season, posted a 1.77 ERA (91.1ip/18er) in 15 starts at PNC Park in 2025, which was the seventh-lowest home ERA by a Pittsburgh pitcher in a single season (min. 90.0 innings) since earned runs became an official stat in the National League in 1912...The only Pirates pitchers with a lower single-season home ERA were Babe Adams (1.31, 1920), Jerry Reuss (1.56, 1975), Dock Ellis (1.58, 1973), Bob Klinger (1.69, 1943), Adams (1.75, 1919) & Frank Miller (1.77, 1916).

**HOMER HIATUS:** Pittsburgh starting pitchers have pitched 47.1 innings without allowing a home run over the team's first 10 games of the season...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, the streak is tied with Washington in 1955, Chicago (AL) in 1965, Toronto in 1989 and San Francisco in 2018 for the fifth-longest streak of games without a starting pitcher allowing a home run to begin a season since 1950, trailing only Kansas City in 1987 (15), Cincinnati in 1981 (14), Boston in 1992 (13) and Oakland in 1980 (11).

**STRIKEOUT KING:** Paul Skenes enters tonight's start vs. San Diego eight strikeouts shy of 400 for his career...He would become the first Pirates pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to reach the 400-strikeout mark within his first 58 Major League starts...Skenes would also become one of 17 Major Leaguers in the Modern Era to accomplish that.

**MEN ON BASE:** Ryan O'Hearn (nine games) and Nick Gonzales (eight games) have both reached base safely in every game they have played in so far this season...O'Hearn is hitting .364 (12-for-33) with two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, seven walks and five runs in his first nine games, while Gonzales has gone 10-for-33 (.303) with two doubles, five RBI, three walks and four runs in his first eight games...O'Hearn has reached base safely in 18 straight games, dating back to last season on Sept. 19 with San Diego at Chicago (AL)...That trails only Los Angeles (NL)'s Shohei Ohtani (41 games) and Chicago (AL)'s Miguel Vargas (19 games) for the longest-active streak among all Major League players...It is also one game shy of his career-best on-base streak, which occurred last season from May 14 [G2]-June 3 with Baltimore.

**O'YEAH:** Ryan O'Hearn walked in the second inning and doubled in the sixth inning on Monday vs. San Diego...He has hit safely in eight of his first nine games with Pittsburgh and has reached base safely multiple times in eight of his first nine games with the team...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, O'Hearn, who batted .276 (45-for-163) in 50 games with the Padres during the 2025 season before being signed to a two-year contract by the Pirates on January 8, became the sixth Pittsburgh player since at least 1900 to reach base safely multiple times in at least eight of his first nine games with the team...He joined Ed Mensor in 1912 (nine), Billy Southworth in 1918 (eight), Possum Whitted in 1919 (eight), Gus Suhr in 1930 (nine) and Brian Giles in 1999 (eight) on that list...O'Hearn has reached base safely 19 times, joining Lee Mazzilli in 1983 (20), Giles in 1999 (21), Gregory Polanco in 2014 (20) and John Nogowski in 2021 (21) as the only Pirates in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to reach base safely at least 19 times over their first nine games with the club.

**THAT'S SO(TO) IMPRESSIVE:** Gregory Soto struck out a batter in his scoreless ninth inning on Monday vs. San Diego...He has 12 strikeouts and has allowed two hits over his first six outings (6.1ip) of the season...Soto joined Luke Walker (1968) as the only Pittsburgh relievers during the Modern Era (since 1901) with at least 12 strikeouts and two or fewer hits through their first six appearances of a season...His 12 strikeouts are tied with Milwaukee's Aaron Ashby for the most among all Major League relievers.

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

**April 7, 2017:** Iván Nova allowed one unearned run over 6.0 innings of work and earned the win in Pittsburgh's 5-4 Home Opener victory over Atlanta. The temperature of 37 degrees at first pitch was the coldest for a Pirates Home Opener since 2007 (also 37 degrees). David Freese and Francisco Cervelli hit back-to-back home runs in the fifth inning, while Tony Watson locked down his first save of the season.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Skenes won an 8-3 decision after allowing one run over 5.0 innings (had five strikeouts) on April 1 at Cincinnati (run came on a fourth-inning double from Nathaniel Lowe).

**REPRESENTING THE USA:** The 23-year-old Skenes represented the United States during this year's World Baseball Classic...He went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (8.1ip/1er), nine strikeouts and a 0.96 WHIP...Skenes struck out seven batters and allowed just one hit and one walk over 4.0 scoreless innings on March 9 vs. Mexico, while also giving up one run in 4.1 innings on March 15 at the Dominican Republic...He also pitched 3.0 innings in a March 3 exhibition at San Francisco.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** Tonight will mark Skenes' first home start since last year on September 16 vs. Chicago (NL), when he lost a 4-1 decision to Cade Horton after allowing three runs in 3.2 innings...His 1.77 ERA (91.1ip/18er) in 15 starts along the banks of the Allegheny River in 2025 was the second-lowest home ERA in Major League Baseball (Milwaukee's Freddy Peralta, 1.77).

**EIGHT WILL BE ENOUGH:** Skenes has recorded 392 strikeouts across his first 57 career starts, the most by any Pittsburgh pitcher through his first 57 starts during the Modern Era (since 1901).

**WHAT'S UP, DOC:** Skenes took home National League Cy Young Award honors in 2025, one year after being named the National League Rookie of the Year...He became the second pitcher in Major League history to win the Rookie of the Year Award and the Cy Young Award in consecutive seasons, along with the Mets' Dwight Gooden (1984-85)...Skenes joined Vernon Law (1960) and Doug Drabek (1990) as the only Pirates pitchers to ever win the Cy Young Award.

**ELITE COMPANY:** Skenes has posted a 2.10 ERA (326.1ip/76er) through the first 57 starts of his Major League career...The only other Major League pitchers in the Live Ball Era (since 1920) with an ERA of 2.10 or lower through the first 57 starts of their career are St. Louis Howie Pollet (2.04, 1941-46), Oakland's Vida Blue (2.07, 1969-72) and Los Angeles' Orel Hershiser (2.10, 1984-86).

**HOW THE WEST WAS WON:** Tonight will be Skenes' first career start against San Diego, the final National League opponent (not including Pittsburgh) that he has not yet faced...He has gone 6-1 with a 2.12 ERA (59.1ip/14er) in 10 career starts against the National League West, having won five straight decisions since dropping a 4-1 decision on August 10, 2024 at Dodger Stadium.

**FIRING BLANKS:** Skenes struck out seven batters over his 6.0 scoreless innings on September 24 at Cincinnati (his final start of the 2025 season)...He did not allow a run in three of his final four starts...Skenes made a total of 12 scoreless starts in 2025, surpassing Trevor Williams (11) in 2018 for the most scoreless starts by a Pirates pitcher in a season in the Modern Era (since 1901).

**IN THE CONVERSATION:** Skenes finished tied for sixth in National League MVP Award voting in 2025...He and Arizona's Corbin Carroll each received a total of 83 points...The only players with more points were Los Angeles' Shohei Ohtani (420), Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (260), New York's Juan Soto (231), Arizona's Geraldo Perdomo (196) and Philadelphia's Trea Turner (102).

**FOR A GOOD CAUSE:** Skenes has pledged to donate \$100 for every strikeout he records this season to the Gary Sinise Foundation to support our nation's defenders, veterans, first responders, their families and those in need...Skenes, who spent his first two collegiate seasons (2021-22) at the United States Air Force (CO) Academy before transferring to LSU (2023), raised \$500,000 for the foundation at a Raising Cane's event in Royal Palm Beach, FL, on Veterans Day.

**PAUL-STAR GAME:** Skenes started for the National League in last season's All-Star Game on July 15 at Atlanta's Truist Park after also starting for the National League on July 16, 2024 at Texas' Globe Life Field...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first pitcher and one of five Major League players ever to start the All-Star Game in each of his first two seasons, joining Joe DiMaggio (seven, 1936-42), Ichiro Suzuki (four, 2001-04), Rod Carew (three, 1967-69) and Frank Robinson (two, 1956-57)...Skenes also joined Rip Sewell (1943-44, 1946) and Bob Veale (1965-66) as the only starting pitchers in team history to be selected to the All-Star Game in at least two straight seasons (there was no All-Star Game in 1945)...He also became the first player in team history to be selected to the All-Star Game in each of his first two Major League seasons.
