RAY REPORT—The Rays conclude their eight-game, seven-day road trip against the Red Sox (0-4) and Blue Jays (3-0, one to play) this afternoon in Toronto...will return to St. Pete to open a nine-game, 10-day homestand against the Guardians, Rangers, and White Sox starting tomorrow night...have won three straight games following a season-high five-game losing streak, which was their longest since April 2-8, 2025 (also 5G — excl. multi-season streaks)...entering the skid, went 13-4 in their previous 17 games (June 24-July 11)...are currently 3-4 on stretches of 11 games in 10 days (July 17-26) and 20 games in 20 days (July 17-Aug. 5)...overall, lead the AL with a 59-42 record, tied for third best in the majors and tied for their fourth-best mark through 101 games behind 2010 (63-38), 2023 (61-40), and 2021 (60-41)...have spent 67 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 25 consecutive days in first (June 27-pres.)...marks the latest into a season they have led the AL East since winning the division in 2021.

★ The Rays went 4-for-8 with RISP and needed only one extra-base hit (Walls 2B) to secure last night's 4-2 win...they have gone 11-for-23 (.478) with RISP over the last two games compared to 6-for-38 (.158) across their previous six games (July 12-20).

★ All 4 RBI came from the Rays 5-9 hitters...during the month of July, the 5-9 spots in the Rays lineup are slashing a combined .300/.343/.479 (.102-for-340)—all marks lead MLB...that portion of the order is on pace for the second-best monthly average by Rays 5-9 hitters behind April 2005 (.302).

★ The victory secured the Rays first series win in a four-game set since May 13-16, 2024 at BOS, snapping an 0-6-9 skid, the second-longest streak of winless four-game series in club history (15) behind an 0-15-7 span (22) from 2002-04...they improved to 5-2-2 in their last nine series overall (June 19-pres.), earning their second series win in their last nine road sets (May 11-pres.), joining June 30-July 2 at KC. Despite recording their AL-high-tying 15th win without the benefit of a home run last night (also: CLE), the Rays still lead the AL with 43 HR and 14 multi-homer games in their last 28 contests since June 21, going deep in 21 of those games...this comes after they produced the majors' fewest home runs (60) and multi-homer efforts (14, tied with BOS) over their first 73 games through June 20.

★ The Rays staff has turned in a 1.67 ERA (27.0IP, 5ER) this series compared to a 6.80 ERA (41.0IP, 31ER) during the five-game losing streak that preceded the set (July 12-19)...the bullpen has yielded one run in its last 14.0 IP and has a 1.69 ERA (37.1IP, 7ER) across the last 10 games (July 10-pres.), third in the majors to the Red Sox (0.97) and Orioles (0.99).

★ The Rays are 22-12 (.647) vs. AL East opponents, tied with the Dodgers (22-15) for the most intradivision wins in the majors...only the Diamondbacks (.656/21-11), Brewers (.655/19-10), and Mariners (.654/17-9) have better records against their own divisions.

★ Casey Legumina will serve as an opener for bulk reliever Ian Seymour today, the Rays first time using an opener since Legumina (1.1IP) and Seymour (6.2IP) combined for 8.0 hitless innings on June 25 vs. KC...they are 6-0 when using openers this season, with those pitchers recording a 1.50 ERA (12.0IP, 2ER) and holding opponents to a .214/.283/.286 (9-for-42) clip.

★ The Rays are 114-72 (.613) in 186 games with an opener since introducing the concept on May 19, 2018 at Angel Stadium...they have a .555 winning pct. (.592-474) in all other games over that span.

RECENT TRANSATIONS—Today, the Rays reinstated RHP Jesse Scholtens (right wrist strain) from the 15-day IL and optioned him to Triple-A Durham.

WHAT'S AT STAKE—With a win today, the Rays would:

★ Sweep a four-game series for the 23rd time, first since April 10-13, 2024 vs. BOS.

★ Record a four-game series sweep on the road for the ninth time, first since May 21-24, 2021 at TOR at Dunedin's TD Ballpark...that series also marks one of their two four-game sweeps over the Blue Jays in club history, also joining Sept. 5-8, 2019 at Tropicana Field.

★ Tally their fourth sweep in a four-game set on the road over the last 14 seasons since 2013, also joining May 3-6, 2021 at LAA and Aug. 10-13, 2020 at BOS.

★ Record their 20th sweep over the Blue Jays (last: May 4-6, 2026 at Tropicana Field) and fifth at Rogers Centre (last: May 16-18, 2016)...sweep Toronto multiple times in a season for the fourth time, joining 2019 (2), 2012 (3), and 2009 (2).

★ Earn their 10th series sweep, extending their major league lead over five clubs tied with seven sweeps (Brewers, Dodgers, Marlins, Red Sox, Yankees).

★ Match five other seasons (2023, 2019, 2012, 2011, 2008) for the fourth-most sweeps in team history, trailing only 2021 (14), 2018 (12), and 2013 (12)...record 10 sweeps before the end of July for the first time, surpassing the previous mark of nine (2026, 2013).

★ Become the first AL club and third team overall to reach 60 wins, joining the Dodgers (65) and Brewers (64)...the Braves (59) can also reach the mark today.

MILESTONE WATCH—Yandy Díaz is slated to play in his 914th game with the Rays this afternoon, which would tie Kevin Kiermaier for fifth most in franchise history...he enters the contest with 113 homers in his Tampa Bay career, one shy of matching Ben Zobrist (114HR) for sixth on the club's all-time list (see tables on the right)...he has tallied 998 hits in a Rays uniform, two shy of becoming the franchise's fourth player to reach the 1,000-hit mark along with Carl Crawford (1,480), Evan Longoria (1,471), and Zobrist (1,016)...306 of those 998 hits have gone for extra bases, sixth most in team history and 3 XBH shy of fifth-ranked Aubrey Huff (309XBH).

SWEET (VICTORY)—Over his last 10 games, Victor Mesa Jr. is batting .393/.433/.964 (11-for-28) with 1 2B, 5 HR, 8 RBI, 2 BB, 5 R, and 2 SB...during that span (July 7-pres.), he leads the majors in slugging pct. and OPS (1.398), is tied for second in homers behind PIT Esmerlyn Valdez (7), and ranks ninth in batting average (min. .30PA)...despite his career-best streak of three straight games with a homer coming to an end last night, he has still tallied an RBI in a career-high four consecutive games, tied with MIA Joe Mack for the longest active streak in the majors (players on active rosters only).

★ Mesa Jr. has recorded a .954 OPS across his last 24 games since June 14, eighth best among AL hitters during that timeframe (min. .75PA) and second among Rays to Junior Caminero (1.106)...he posted a .522 OPS over his first 14 games of the season (May 25-June 13).

THE CHAN, THE MYTH, THE LEGEND—Chandler Simpson is tied with WSH Curtis Mead for second in the majors with a .400 (24-for-60) average during July, trailing only CLE Steven Kwan (.420)...he has hit safely in 22 of his last 26 games, batting .375/.408/.479 (36-for-96) in that span with 6 2B, 2 3B, 5 RBI, 6 BB, 5 SO, 11 R, and 12 SB...during that timeframe (June 19-pres.), he leads the majors in average and stolen bases and is tied for fourth in hits...Simpson has delivered an RBI in back-to-back games for the third time this season (last: May 6-7), one game shy of his career-best three-game run from May 15-17, 2025.

THE BAKE SHOW—Bryan Baker converted his 15th consecutive save opportunity last night, the majors' third-longest active streak behind SD Mason Miller (25) and TOR Louis Varland (20)...it marks the longest streak by a Rays closer since Pete Fairbanks (15) from May 19-Aug. 30, 2023, with the last longer stretch being Alex Colomé's 21-save streak from April 17-July 21, 2016...Baker's 26 saves on the year are tied with STL Riley O'Brien for second most in MLB to CLE Cade Smith (29).

★ During the 15-save streak (May 17-pres.), Baker paces the AL (min. 20.0IP) in ERA (0.45), WHIP (0.60), opp. average (8-for-67), opp. on-base pct. (.181), and opp. OPS (.360).

O. CANADA—The Rays and Blue Jays wrap up the third of four sets in 2026 today, with the Rays winning all three series thus far while taking eight of nine matchups...after claiming the current set last night, the Rays improved to 10-3-2 in their last 15 series against the Jays since the start of 2023 and earned their sixth series win in their last eight sets at Rogers Centre (Sept. 29, 2023-pres.)...the Rays have already clinched their ninth consecutive season series win over Toronto (2017-pres.), 11th in 12 seasons under Kevin Cash (since 2015), and 17th in 19 seasons since becoming the Rays in 2008...the nine-season streak is their longest over a single opponent in franchise history and is the fourth-longest active streak in the majors by one team over a single opponent, trailing ATL over MIA (11), CHC over PIT (11), and NYY over KC (11, including 2026).

★ Rays pitchers have turned in a 2.51 ERA (82.1IP, 23ER) through nine matchups with the Jays, yielding two runs or fewer in five of those games...it would mark their third-lowest single-season ERA against an AL East foe, trailing only 2021 vs. NYY (2.29) and 2012 vs. TOR (2.40).

★ Junior Caminero has hit safely in each of his 15 career games at Rogers Centre, the longest career-opening streak in this ballpark's history and longest by a Ray in this venue at any point in a player's career...he is batting .381/.466/.556 (24-for-63) with 2 2B, 3 HR, 12 RBI, and a 1.021 OPS here.

PEN TO PAPER—After inking No. 2 overall pick SS Grady Emerson yesterday, the Rays have signed 13 of their 21 selections from the 2026 First-Year Player Draft ahead of Monday's 5 p.m. ET signing deadline: Emerson, SS Taj Marchand (Comp. Rd. A), RHP Ben Blair (Rd. 2), RHP Owen Kramkowski (Rd. 5), LHP Kyle Johnson (Rd. 6), RHP Tate McKee (Rd. 10), RHP Cole Stokes (Rd. 12), RHP Steven Gonzalez (Rd. 13), RHP Mason Bixby (Rd. 14), RHP Amp Phillips (Rd. 15), RHP McCarty English (Rd. 17), LHP Nate Smithburg (Rd. 18), and RHP David Horn Jr. (Rd. 19)...additionally, the club has signed undrafted free agents RHP Colby Allen (Univ. of Southern Miss.) and LHP Haiden Lefew (Univ. of Texas).

TODAY'S BULK RELIEVER—**Ian Seymour** is scheduled to take the mound today for his eighth start and 35th appearance of the season...marks his 13th career start and 54th career appearance...selected in the second round (57th overall) of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of Virginia Tech.

- Since the start of the 2025 season, he is one of eight pitchers to make double-digit starts and 40 relief appearances or more...the other hurlers to accomplish this are **TB Griffin Jax**, **MIA Tyler Phillips**, **STL Kyle Leahy**, **LAA Reid Detmers**, **STL/BOS/TB Steven Matz**, **WSH Brad Lord**, and **WSH PJ Poulin**.
- In his last five outings (four starts) since June 25, he ranks highly among AL pitchers in wins (T3rd, 3), opp. average (5th, .182), strikeouts (T6th, 34), and WHIP (7th, 0.95).
- He is seven strikeouts shy of 150 in his career...upon reaching the mark, he would become the 16th Rays pitcher and the eighth southpaw to have 150 strikeouts or more in their first two major league seasons.

LAST TIME OUT—The southpaw exited after 3.0 innings and was left with a no-decision on July 18 at BOS (3.0IP, 2H, 3R, 2BB, 4SO, 2HR), marking his shortest start since being utilized as an opener on May 15 vs. MIA (2.0IP)...was tagged for a two-run home run by **Jahmai Jones** and a solo homer by **Wilyer Abreu** as the only hits he allowed in the contest, the second time in his career he has allowed multiple home runs in an outing along with Aug. 19, 2025 vs. NYY (3)...was his third start of the season with two hits or fewer allowed (last: June 8 vs. BOS - 1H).

(INSERT CANADA REFERNCE HERE)—Seymour will be making his third career start and seventh career appearance against Toronto...is 2-1 with a 5.02 ERA (14.1IP, 8ER), 16 strikeouts, and one save against the club...this season opposite the Blue Jays, he has made four relief appearances with a 1-0 record, one save, a 4.50 ERA (4.0IP, 2ER), and six strikeouts...is 5-1 with two saves, a 4.56 ERA (49.1IP, 25ER), 58 strikeouts, and a .219 (40-for-183) opp. average over career 21 outings (five starts) against AL East clubs...includes a 3-0 mark with a 3.60 ERA (25.0IP, 10ER), 36 strikeouts, a 0.92 WHIP, and a .178 (16-for-90) opp. average in 13 games (three starts) this season.

- Across his 13 appearances in intradivision games this season, the Rays are 11-2...in all outings against non-division opponents in 2026, the Rays are 13-8 in games Seymour appears in.

ROADS UNTRAVELED—Seymour has appeared in 15 games (one start) on the road this season...over his last 11 appearances (two starts) as a visitor dating back to April 18 at PIT, he has gone 3-0 with a 4.03 ERA (22.1IP, 10ER), 29 strikeouts, and a .205 (17-for-83) opp. average, allowing three earned runs or fewer in each outing...the Rays have gone 8-3 in those games.

WHIFF WATCH—He boasts a 29.4 pct. whiff rate this season, ranking third among AL southpaws (min. 1,000 pitches) to DET **Tarik Skubal** (32.1%) and CLE **Joey Cantillo** (30.5%)...63 of his 79 strikeouts this season have come on swings-and-misses, third most on the Rays behind **Drew Rasmussen** (85) and **Griffin Jax** (68).

THE SEYMOUR SHOW—On June 25 vs. KC, Seymour was utilized as a bulk reliever behind opener **Casey Legumina** and delivered 6.2 hitless innings with one walk and seven strikeouts...the pairing carried a perfect game through 5.1 innings and a no-hitter through the 8th inning before turning the ball over to **Craig Kimbrel**...it marked the 16th time in franchise history Rays pitchers have made it through 5.0 innings with no baserunners allowed (last: June 24, 2025 at KC).

- Became the third pitcher in the majors since 1980 to throw 6.2 hitless innings or more in relief, joining LAA **Félix Peña** (July 12, 2019 vs. SEA) and CLE **Jake Westbrook** (April 19, 2004 vs. DET)...was the sixth southpaw in the modern era (since 1900) to turn the trick alongside BAL **Tippy Martinez** (July 23, 1979 vs. OAK), STL **Al Brazle** (Aug. 1, 1951 vs. BSN), BOS **Herb Pennock** (Sept. 3, 1917 vs. NYY [G2]), CWS **Dave Danforth** (Aug. 29, 1917 vs. SLB [G2]), and BOS **Dutch Leonard** (July 20, 1914 vs. DET)...all six of these instances occurred at home...it was the most innings pitched by a Rays reliever since **Jalen Beeks** (6.2IP) on May 1, 2019 at KC.
- Seymour's seven strikeouts were the most by a Rays reliever since **Jesse Scholtens** struck out nine batters on Sept. 25, 2025 at BAL.
- He became the seventh southpaw in the modern era (since 1900) to pitch 6.0 hitless innings of relief or more and start his next outing (July 2 at KC), joining LAD **Eric Lauer** (June 22-29, 2026), DET **Ed Glynn** (Sept. 5-12, 1976), CAL **Clyde Wright** (Aug. 20-27, 1968), MLN **Juan Pizarro** (April 29–April 15, 1960), CWS **Dave Danforth** (Aug. 29–Sept. 1, 1917), and BOS **Dutch Leonard** (Sept. 20-25, 1914).

MAJOR LEAGUE RECAP—In his rookie season in 2025, made 19 appearances (five starts) over three stints with the Rays (June 8-10, July 8-30, & July 31–end of season)...began in a relief role before transitioning to the starting rotation, earning the starting nod in five of his final seven appearances after his first 12 came out of the bullpen.
