### **TODAY'S GAME:**

- Is Game 4 (3-0) of a 4-game series vs the postseason-bound Cubs and the fourth game (3-0) of the season's final homestand, which concludes with an upcoming 3-game series vs Pit (Tue-Thu).
- The Reds have won 4 in-a-row for the eighth time this season...their season-high winning streak is 5, done 3 times (most recently 6/6-6/10).
- Are going for their first 4-game sweep of an opponent since 2023 (Wsh).
- Have homered at least 3 times in consecutive games for the first time this season and for the first time since doing it in 3 straight games in July 2024.
- Following Thu's game vs Pit, the Reds will put a bow on the regular season with a 3-game series vs the Brewers at American Family Field.

WHO ELSE IS IN ON THIS? The Reds (-1.0), Diamondbacks (-2.0), Giants (-4.0), Cardinals (-5.0), and Marlins (-5.0) enter today's games trailing the Mets for the National League's final Wild Card spot.

- The 5-4 loss vs **NYM** on <u>9/5</u> was the Reds' 10th in 13 games and knocked them <u>6.0 games</u> off the pace for a postseason appearance.
- Had been "the first team out" until they were leapfrogged in the Wild Card standings by both SF and AZ during a 3-11 run.
- Since that 9/5 heartbreaker, the Reds have gone 9-5 to climb back within 1.0 game of the **Mets**, who are 4-10 over that same span.
- Cin been as close as a half-game game out (8/22).

**BABY, COME BACK:** Last night's 6-3 win vs **Chc** marked the Reds' 32nd comeback victory <u>since the beginning of June</u>, matching the **Blue Jays** for most in the majors during that time...from Opening Day through 5/31, Cin produced 7 comeback wins, fourth-fewest in the majors.

In Late and Close situations from 3/27-6/2, the Reds went 20-26 (.435) and slashed .169/.252/.241 with 3 HR...since then are 42-34 in Late and Close situations and slashing .263/.346/.416 with 16 HR (Late and Close refers to game situations in the 7th inning or later with the batting team tied, ahead by 1, or with the tying run on base, at bat or on deck).

**HEART & HUSTLE: CF TJ FriedI** this afternoon will be honored in a pregame ceremony as the Reds' 2025 recipient of the annual **Heart & Hustle Award**.

- FriedI will represent the Reds for the second time (2024) as a finalist for the overall Heart & Hustle Award which will be presented by the MLBPA in New York this coming November.
- 2025 marks the 20th year for the Heart & Hustle Award, which is presented to active players who "exemplify a true passion for the game and who best embody the values, spirit, and tradition of the game."
- The award is voted on by former players/committee of team's alumni.

MILESTONES FOR ELLY: SS Elly De La Cruz on Fri vs Chc belted his 20th home run of the season (6th inning off RHP Porter Hodge) to become the third Red ever to collect at least 20 HR and 35 SB in consecutive seasons (Eric Davis 1986-88 & Joe Morgan 1973-74 & '76-'77)...courtesy Elias:

**SERIES NOTES:** The Reds and **Cubs** are meeting for the fourth and final time in 2025...**Chc** won each of the first 2 series (1-2, 5/23-5/25; 1-2, 5/30-6/1) while the Reds took 2 of 3 at **Wrigley Field** from 8/4-8/6.

- The Redlegs have secured their third consecutive season series victory vs Chc, regardless of today's outcome.
- Cin today is aiming to complete a 4-game sweep of the Cubs for the first time since 6/21-6/24, 2018 at Great American Ball Park.
- The Reds have led 5 of the 12 games of this season series by 4 or more runs (4-0 & 6-2 on <u>5/23</u>, lost 13-6; 6-1 on <u>5/24</u>, won 6-4; 8-3 on <u>5/25</u>, lost 11-8; 6-0 <u>5/30</u>, won 6-2; won 5-1 on 8/5).
- The Redlegs are 101-87 all-time vs the Cubs at Great American Ball Park, having won 23 of the last 37g here against their division rival.
- Fri's (9/19) 7-4 loss marked the Cubs' 100th at GABP...only the Pirates have more losses among Cin opponents here (85-105).
- Chc's 7-3 win on 6/1 marked the Reds' 500th loss at Wrigley Field.
  - The Reds are 195-190 vs **Chc** since 2003 and 92-108 since 2014.
- Cin is 469-501 (.484) all-time at Wrigley Field.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Suffered the 3-0 loss on 9/16 at StL (4.2ip, 8h, 3r/3er, 0bb, 7k, 1hr, 96TP).

- Eclipsed the 400-inning mark for his career.
- Marked the third time in 5 starts that he couldn't complete 5.0 innings.
- Thomas Saggese's 2-run homer in the 3rd inning snapped his consecutive homerless starts streak at 4.
- Was ahead in the count to all but 6 of his 22 batters...that 72.7% marked a season high.

**SEPTEMBER 10:** Earned the 2-1 win on 9/10 at SD (8.0ip, 5h, 1r/1er, 2bb, 6k, 1hr, 102 TP).

- Snapped a 3-game losing streak...entered the game having lost 6 of his last 7 decisions.
- Marked the second time this season he pitched 8.0 or more innings (also: 6/10 at CLE, 9ip CG/SHO).
- Following Fernando Tatis Jr's solo homer in the 5th inning, retired 10 of his final 11 batters.
- Allowed 7 of his 30 batters to reach.
- Averaged 12.8 pitches per inning, his lowest mark since his 9-inning shutout on 6/10 at Cle (12.2).
- Was his 11th quality start of the season, the 29th of his career, and his first since 8/17 vs Mil.

**SEPTEMBER 5:** Suffered the 5-4 loss on 9/5 vs NYM (4.2ip, 9h, 5r/5er, 1bb, 5k, 1hr, 98TP).

- Matched a season high with 9 hits allowed (also: 7/4 at Phi).
- Allowed 11 base runners for the first time since 8/5/23 vs Wsh (14 base runners, career high).
- Gave up 7 hard-hit balls (balls in play at or above 95mph), for the fourth time this season and for the second time over his last 3 starts (also: 8/23 at AZ).

**AUGUST 30:** Suffered the 4-2 loss on 8/30 vs StL (5.0ip, 3h, 2r/2er, 4bb, 7k, 96TP).

- Issued 4 walks, snapping his career-long streak of consecutive innings without a base-on-balls at 23.1ip (dating back to 8/6 at Chc)...was the second-longest run by a Reds LHP in the last 30 years, behind Eric Milton (28.1ip, 2006).
- Struck out all 3 batters he faced in the 2nd inning, marking the third time this season and the sixth time in his career he's accomplished the feat (last: 7/26 vs TB).

**AUGUST 23:** Suffered the 10-1 loss on 8/23 at AZ (4.0ip, 8h, 7r/6er, 0bb, 6k, 2hr, 73TP).

- The 7 runs allowed were a career high...his 6 earned runs allowed were a season high and the most he gave up in an outing since 8/7/24 at Mia (6er).
- Was his fourth outing this season of 4.0 innings or fewer.
- Entered the game with a 2.28 ERA, left with a 2.62 ERA.

AUGUST 17: Did not factor in the decision in the 10-inning, 3-2 win vs Mil on 8/17 (7.0ip, 4h, 0r, 0bb, 7k, 92TP).

- Was his career-high 10th quality start (28th of his career).
- Was the sixth time in his career that he pitched 7.0 shutout innings, the third time this season.
- Was his 15th start this year in which he allowed 1 earned run or none.
- Faced the minimum in 5 of his 7 innings.
- Was his second consecutive start in which he pitched at least 7.0 innings and didn't issue a walk...he's the first Reds pitcher to do such a thing since Tyler Mahle in 2021...is the first Reds pitcher to do it at Great American Ball Park since Bronson Arroyo in 2013.

**CAREER HIGHS:** Has reached career highs this season with 156.1 innings pitched, 143 strikeouts, and 27 starts...is 1 victory away from matching that career high set last year.

ALL-STAR: Was named to the National League All-Star team as a replacement for LAD's Yoshinobu Yamamoto...was his first career All-Star selection.

 Pitched a perfect 6th inning in the NL's 7-6 victory (Jazz Chisholm Jr. lineout, Riley Greene flyout, Randy Arozarena groundout; 13 total pitches).

**2.88 ERA**: His 2.88 ERA (156.1ip, 57r/50er) through his first 27 starts of the season is the lowest by a Reds left-handed pitcher since Pete Schourek pitched to a 2.85 ERA in his first 27 starts in 1995.

- His 2.88 ERA is the fourth-best mark among Major League left-handers (min. 130ip) and ninth-best among all pitchers with at least 130ip.
- Is 1 of 5 Cin left-handed pitchers to produce 15 or more starts in a season with fewer than 2 earned runs allowed, the first since Danny Jackson in 1988.

**HE EARNED IT:** His 3.43 ERA through his first 73 career starts is the lowest by a Reds starting pitcher in that span since RHP Mario Soto (3.18, 1977-82).

IN HIS MAY ERA: His 0.55 ERA in May was the lowest among qualified Major League pitchers...is his lowest ERA in a month since pitching to a 1.21 mark in June 2023 (5gs, 4gs, 29.2ip, 4er, 16h, 12bb, 30k, 3hr).

- Was the first Reds pitcher to post a 0.55 ERA over a 6-start, single-season span (min. 30ip) since RHP Hunter Greene's 0.48 ERA last year from 6/30-8/3.
- Was the first Reds starting pitcher to open a season with a 1.55 ERA or lower over his 9 starts since RHP Johnny Cueto pitched to a 1.25 ERA over his first 9 starts in 2014.

**PERSONAL:** Graduated from Halifax County High School (South Boston, VA), the same school attended by All Elite Wrestling champion "Hangman" Adam Page and Major League pitcher Jeremy Jeffress...was named 2017 Gatorade Virginia Player of the Year...was a 4-year member of the Halifax swim team...at the University of Virginia became only the second pitcher in school history to record at least 300 strikeouts.
