INAUGURAL RIVALRY WEEKEND PRESENTED BY BOOKING.COM TO TAKE PLACE THIS WEEKEND THROUGHOUT MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL

- The Cubs currently own a five-game winning streak against the White Sox, and have won eight of the last 10 games overall.
