HERE'S THE STORY: The D-backs are 1-2 in their 8-game, 10-day homestand vs. Padres (1-2), Mariners (Sept. 3-5) and Rangers (Sept. 7-8).

- ♦ The D-backs hosted the Mariners in their previous 2 matchups, in 2020 (1-2) and 2018 (1-2)...this is the seventh home series at Chase Field (7-11).
- ♦ **Madison Bumgarner** is 2-1 with a 1.65 ERA (6 ER in 32.2 IP) in his last 5 home starts.
 - Has gone 0-1 with a 1.69 ERA (3 ER in 16.0 IP) in 2 career starts vs. Mariners...lost his last start on June 17, 2015 @ Safeco Field (2 ER in 8.0 IP).
- ♦ **Ketel Marte's** .427 average (32-for-75) vs. left-handers leads the Majors (min. 75 PA), ahead of Trea Turner/WSH-LAD (.395), David Fletcher/LAA (.364), Buster Posey/SF (.360) and Charlie Culberson/TEX (.357).

- A MEMORABLE NIGHT:** Last night's 14th annual "Evening On The Diamond" was another reminder of the D-backs' amazing work to impact individuals, families and the community as the event set a record with more than \$3.3 million raised.
- ♦ The D-backs honored the legacy of Mike Kennedy, the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation's founding Board President for nearly 25 years, with the naming of the "Mike Kennedy Diamonds Back Field Building Program" as well as "Mike Kennedy Field" in Goodyear.
 - ♦ In a heartwarming moment of support for Mike & Nicole Hazen, their 4 boys and family, the D-backs raised \$1.5 million to launch the Nicole Hazen Fund For Hope in support of the world-class physicians and researchers at Barrow Neurological Institute and Ivy Brain Tumor Center in Phoenix...the fund was started with a \$250,000 donation from D-backs ownership that makes up the general partnership group, comprised of Ken Kendrick, Mike Chipman and Jeff Royer.
 - ♦ With last night's record-setting support, the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation eclipsed \$75 million in charitable contributions raised and donated to the Arizona community since its inception in 1997.

KETEL 1: Ketel Marte leads the Majors with a .325 average since the start of 2019, ahead of Tim Anderson (.320), Luis Arraez (.318), Trea Turner (.314) and Michael Brantley (.312).

- 4-time NL All-Star (2013-16), 3-time World Series champion ('10, '12, '14), 2014 World Series MVP and 2-time Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger Awards™ winner ('14-15).

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Owns a 2.97 ERA (19 ER in 57.2 IP) with a 1.08 WHIP in 9 starts since returning from the 10-day injured list (left shoulder inflammation) on July 16.

- Since his return, has the 10th-best ERA (2.97) in the NL [min. 5 GS].
- Has gone 2-1 with a 1.65 ERA (6 ER in 32.2 IP) in his last 5 home starts (D-backs are 4-1).

MOUND MILESTONE: Needs 3 strikeouts to tie Tom "Flash" Gordon (1,928) for 96th place on the all-time strikeout list.

LAST START: Took the loss on Aug. 29 @ Phillies, allowing 5 earned runs on 7 hits over 5.0 innings.

VS. MARINERS: Has gone 0-1 with a 1.69 ERA (3 ER in 16.0 IP) in 2 career starts.

- Lost his last start on June 17, 2015 @ Safeco Field...allowed 2 earned runs over 8.0 innings with 9 strikeouts.

QUALITY CONTROL: Since the All-Star break, has allowed 1 or fewer walks in 7 of his last 9 starts.

- Has the seventh best walks-per-9.0 IP ratio among NL starters (1.87) in that span.

FASTBALL FACTS: Is averaging 88.2 mph. on his fastballs, up from 86.1 in 2020 [includes 4-seamers, cutters].

WE ALL KNOW IT WAS A NO-NO: Tossed the first unofficial no-hitter (7.0 IP) under the new doubleheader rules (began in 2020) on April 25 @ Braves [GM 2].
