AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will continue their seven-game road trip tonight with the second game of a four-game set at Baltimore (0-1 thus far)...are 2-2 on the road trip after winning two-of-three at Milwaukee and dropping their series opener at Baltimore...after this road trip, will return to the Bronx for a seven-day, six-game homestand vs. Detroit (Fri.-Sun.) and Houston (5/7-9).

Their 19-11 record (.633) is tied with Philadelphia for the fourth-best record in the Majors, trailing only Atlanta (19-8, .704), Cleveland (19-9, .679) and Baltimore (18-10, .643)...

- 8,.704), Cleveland (19-9, .679) and Baltimore (18-10, .643)... their 19 wins are tied for the most in the Majors.

  Marks the sixth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees have gone 19-11 or better to start a season (also went 22-8 in 2022, 21-9 in 2010 and '17, 20-10 in 2018 and 19-11 in 2015)...with a win tonight, would mark the fifth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees went 20-11 or better to start a season (went 23-8 in 2022 and 21-10 in 2010, '17 and '18).
- The Yankees are in the midst of a 17-day stretch without an off day (4/19-5/5)...marks their longest stretch of the season without an off-day...are 6-5 so far.

  Have won seven of their nine completed series this season and have lost just one series this year (7-1-1).

Are 7-3 following a loss this year.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees were shut out, 2-0, on Monday at Baltimore...RHP Clarke Schmidt (5.2lP, 3H, 1R/ER, 3BB, 5K, 1HR, 1WP) started and recorded his first loss of the season...2B Gleyber Torres (2-for-4) picked up the Yankees' only multi-hit game...RF Juan Soto (1-for-4) extended his hitting streak to a season-high seven games...LF Aaron Judge (1-for-4) made his first career appearance in left field...DH Giancarlo Stanton (1-for-3, 1BB) and CF Trent Grisham (1-for-3, 1BB) each reached base twice...C Austin Wells (1-for-4, 1 double) recorded the Yankees' only extra-base hit...RHP Dennis Santana (1.1IP) tossed 1.1 perfect innings of relief... LHP Caleb Ferguson (0.2IP, 1H, 1R/0ER, 1HP) allowed an unearned run in the eighth inning...RHP Clay Holmes (0.1IP, 1K) entered in the eighth inning with two runners on.

BLANK SPACE: Yankees batters were shut out for the fifth time this season on Monday at Baltimore (also 0R on 4/2 at Arizona, 4/5 vs. Toronto, 4/20 vs. Tampa Bay and 4/22 vs. Oakland)...in their other 25 games this year, have scored at least 4R in 20 of those games, at least 5R in 17 games and at least 6R in 12 games.

Are 4-0 in games following a shutout this year...have scored at least 4R in each of those games.

CLOSE CALLS: The Yankees have had 19 of their 30 games decided by 2R-or-fewer, the most such games in the Majors...12 of their last 15 games, 13 of their last 17 games and 14 of their last 19 games have been decided by 2R-or-fewer.

• Are 8-3 in one-run games this year...their 11 one-run games are tied with Detroit for the second-most in the Majors,

trailing only Oakland (12). The Yankees have had 22 of their 30 games decided by 3R-orfewer, the most such games in the Majors.

**ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge** is hitting .333/.455/.704 (9-for-27) with 5R, 1 double, 3HR, 7RBI, 5BB/1IBB and 1HP over his last seven games (since 4/23).

Has 3HR in his last six games (since 4/24).

In 96 career games vs. Baltimore, has hit .310/.438/.704 (107-for-345) with 94R, 19 doubles, 39HR, 85RBI, 75BB, 4HP, 15F and 55B...his 39HR are his most vs. any opponent...marks the most by any Major League player vs. a single opponent since 2017...also marks the most home runs among active players vs. Baltimore.

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a 3.02 ERA (271.0IP, 91ER) this year, the second-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.68).

I have held opponents to 3R-or-fewer in 19 of 30 games this year (are 13-6 in those games)...are 16-6 this season when holding their opponent to 4R-or-fewer.

STANTON ISLAND: Since 2019, DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton has hit .337/.412/.554 (59-for-175) with 24R, 8 doubles, 10HR, 35RBI, 23BB and 1SF in 46 games vs. the Orioles.

▶ In 37 career games at Camden Yards, has hit .327/.404/.510 (48-for-147) with 25R, 6 doubles, 7HR, 20RBI and 19BB...since 2020,

has hit .372/.438/.585 (35-for-94) with 15R, 5 doubles, 5HR, 14RBI and 11BB in 24 games at Camden Yards.

**THE PRICE IS RIGHT:** The Yankees are 15-5 this season when they face a right-handed starting pitcher.

**GLEYBER DAY: INF Gleyber Torres** is hitting .357 (10-for-28) with 2R, 2 doubles and 4RBI over his last six games (since 4/24).

NOBODY BEATS THE RIZZ: INF Anthony Rizzo was named the AL "Player of the Week" on Monday after hitting .407/.429/.926 (11-for-27) with 8R, 2 doubles, 4HR, 7RBI and 1BB in seven games from 4/22-28...led the AL in home runs and total bases (25), was tied for first in runs scored and extrabase hits (six), ranked second in SLG, tied for second in hits, third in OPS (1.354) and tied for fifth in RBI...marked his fifth "Player of the Week" honor and second as a Yankee (also 5/8-14/23)...hit his 300th career home run on Sunday at Milwaukee, a two-run home run in the eighth inning...became the 161st player in Major League history and the 12th active player to hit at least 300 career home runs...also became the 16th player in

franchise history to hit his 300th career home run as a Yankee.

• Over his last seven games (since 4/23), is hitting .393/.414/.893 (11-for-28) with 8R, 2 doubles, 4HR, 7RBI and 1BB.

**BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters** lead the Majors in walks (131) and plate appearances per walk ratio (8.89), rank second in pitches per plate appearance (4.07, second in AL), tied for second in home runs (37, second in AL), third in on-base percentage (.339, first in AL), and sixth in OPS (.743, third in AL) and runs scored (148, second in AL).

▶ Their 17 games with at least 5R are the most in the AL and tied

- with Atlanta for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (18).
- The Yankees are 19-3 (.864) this season when scoring at least 3R, the best such record in the Majors.

  Have hit 15HR over their last seven games (since 4/23) after
- hitting 3HR in their previous seven games (4/15-22)...have hit at least 3HR in three of their last four games and four of their last six games.

GOT YOUR NUMBER: OF Aaron Judge has hit .400/400/1.300 (4-for-10) with 3HR against Baltimore's RHP Dean Kremer in his career...is one of just two players to hit 3HR against Kremer (also Toronto's Vladimir Guerrero Jr.-4HR)...**DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton** has hit .357 (5-for-14) against Kremer in his career.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 3.28 ERA (162.0IP, 59ER) in 30 starts this year, the fourth-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.07), Philadelphia (2.50) and Kansas City (3.15)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 25 of their 30 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 18 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 13 starts.

WHAT A RELIEF: Yankees relievers have posted a 2.64 ERA (109.0IP, 32ER) this season, the sixth-lowest in the Majors, trailing only Seattle (2.42), Detroit (2.53), Cleveland (2.53), Minnesota (2.54) and Oakland (2.63).

Have posted a 1.08 ERA (25.0IP, 3ER) in their last seven games (since 4/23).

NASTY NESTOR: LHP Nestor Cortes will make his seventh start of the season tonight at Baltimore...is 1-2 with a 3.50 ERA (36.0IP, 14ER) this season, allowing 3ER-or-fewer in four of his

 (56.01F, 14EN) this season, allowing SER-OF-lewer in four of his starts...has tossed at least 7.01P in each of his last two starts and three of his last four starts (since 4/8), posting a 2.42 ERA (26.01P, 7ER) over that span.
 Is 4-0 with a 1.99 ERA (45.11P, 10ER) and 61K in nine career appearances (seven starts) vs. the Orioles...as a starter, is 3-0 with a 1.73 ERA (41.21P, 8ER) and 59K against Baltimore... has allowed 2R-or-fewer in six of his seven starts and one-or-zero runs in five of those starts...three of his five career

double-digit strikeout games have come against Baltimore. In five career outings (four starts) at Camden Yards as a visitor, is 3-0 with a 1.08 ERA (25.0IP, 17H, 3R/ER, 6BB, 36K, 1HR)...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of those four starts.

SCHMIDT'S CREEK: RHP Clarke Schmidt allowed just 1R in a season-high 5.2IP on Monday at Baltimore...did not allow a hit to his final 15 batters faced...is 2-1 with a 3.19 ERA (31.0IP, 11ER)

Since the start of 2023, his 31 starts of 3R-or-fewer allowed are the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Sonny Gray (32)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 26 of his last 29 starts (since 5/19/23).

THE GREAT JUAN: OF Juan Soto has reached base safely in 27 of his 30 games this season, hitting .316/.429/.553 (36-for-114) with 21R, 6 doubles, 7HR, 24RBI, 24BB, 2SB and 2SF...has reached base multiple times in four of his last six games and in 18 of his 30 games this year.

▶ Is tied for first in the Majors in walks (24, first in AL), ranks second in times on base (60, first in AL), third in OBP (.429, first in AL), tied for third in WAR among position players (1.9 - FanGraphs, second in AL), tied for fifth in RBI (24, tied for third in AL), tied for eighth in HR (seven, tied for fifth in AL) and ninth in OPS (.981, fourth in AL)...is also tied for fourth in the AL in hits (36), tied for sixth in BA (.316) and extra-base hits (13), and tied for ninth in multi-hit games (10).

**April 30, 2019:** At Arizona's Chase Field, CC Sabathia strikes out former rieid, CC Sabatnia strikes out former batterymate John Ryan Murphy for career strikeout No. 3,000 to become the 17th pitcher and third left-hander in Baseball history to reach the milestone.

April 30, 1939: Lou Gehrig plays in the last of his 2,130 consecutive games, going 0-for-4 in a 3-2 loss vs. Washington-AL at the original Yankee Stadium. After a team off day on May 1, Gehrig asks manager Joe McCarthy to be kept out of the lineup on May 2 at Detroit. He never plays in another Major League game again.

**April 30, 1923:** The Yankees sign 19-year-old Columbia University pitcher and position player Lou Gehrig to a professional contract.

April 30, 1903: The Highlanders notch a 6-2 win vs. Washington-AL in their inaugural home opener at Hilltop Park, the franchise's first home.

### TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP NESTOR CORTES (1-2, 3.50 ERA)

LHP Nestor Cortes will make his seventh start of the season and fourth road start in tonight's game at Baltimore...the 29-year-old will start on regular four days' rest...made his previous start on Thursday vs. Oakland, taking his second loss of the season despite allowing 3ER in 7.0IP (5H, 0BB, 4K, 2HR)...is 1-2 with a 3.50 ERA (36.0IP, 31H, 14ER, 5BB, 32K, 5HR, 1HP) in six starts this season...went 5-2 with a 4.97 ERA (63.1IP, 59H, 36R/35ER, 20BB, 67K, 11HR) in 12 starts for the Yankees in 2023...has made five career Opening Day rosters (2018 with Baltimore, 2020 with Seattle and 2022-24 with the Yankees)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 50-of-60 starts since the beginning of 2021 and 2R-or-fewer in 41 of those starts...in 68 appearances (60 starts) since the beginning of 2021, has gone 20-11 with a 3.13 ERA (350.2IP, 122ER), 365K and a .211 (273-for-1,296) opponents' BA... over that span (min. 300.0IP), ranks second in the AL in opponents' OBP (.264) and WHIP (1.03), fourth in opponents' OPS (.626) and opponents' BA, sixth in ERA and ninth in opponents' SLG (.362)...made his first career All-Star team in 2022...was originally selected by the Yankees in the 36th round of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft...was selected by the Baltimore Orioles from the Yankees in the 2017 Rule 5 Draft and returned to the Yankees on 4/13/18...was acquired by the Seattle Mariners from the Yankees in exchange for international signing bonus pool money on 11/25/19...was signed by the Yankees as a minor league free agent on 12/10/20...over parts of seven Major League seasons, has played with Baltimore (2018), the Yankees (2019, '21-24) and Seattle (2020).

- LAST TIME OUT: Made his previous start on Thursday vs. Oakland, taking his second loss of the season despite allowing 3ER in 7.0IP (5H, 0BB, 4K, 2HR).

  + Has tossed at least 7.0IP in each of his last two starts and three of his last four starts (since 4/8)...has tossed at least 7.0 innings in back-to-back starts for the third time in his career (also 2GS from 5/26-6/2(G1)/22 and 5/9-15/22).
  - Marked his third consecutive home start of at least 7.0IP with 0BB allowed...is just the second Yankees starter in the last 53 years (since 1972) to toss at least 7.0IP with 0BB allowed in three-or-more consecutive home starts (also David Wells four straight starts from 8/22/02-4/10/03.

2024: Through his first six starts this season, has gone 1-2 with a 3.50 ERA (36.0IP, 31H, 14ER, 5BB, 32K, 5HR, 1HP)...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in four of his six starts with two of

- those starts being scoreless.

  + Among AL pitchers, ranks fifth in BB/9.0IP (1.25), tied for sixth in innings pitched (36.0IP), and eighth in WHIP (1.00), K/BB ratio (6.40) and base runners allowed per 9.0IP (9.25).
  - Has tossed 5.0-or-more innings in five of his six starts...has recorded three of the Yankees' four starts of at least 7.0IP this year (also Carlos Rodón's 7.0IP on 4/22 vs. Oakland).
  - Has gone 1-1 with a 1.23 ERA (22.0IP, 13H, 3R/ER, 0BB, 2HR, 19K) in three home starts this season... is 0-1 with a 7.07 ERA (14.0IP, 18H, 11ER, 5BB, 13K, 3HR) in three road starts.

  - Made his previous start on Thursday vs. Oakland, taking his second loss of the season despite allowing 3ER in 7.0IP (5H, 0BB, 4K, 2HR).

    Made the start on 4/20 vs. Tampa Bay, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings and collecting a season-high 9K without recording a decision...marked his second scoreless start this season (also 0R in 8.0IP on 4/8 vs. Miami).
  - Has received 1R-or-fewer of run support in three of his six starts and 0R of support in two starts.
  - Has tossed at least 7.0IP and not allowed a walk in each of his three home starts this year.
  - His 9K on 4/20 vs. Tampa Bay marked his most in a game since his career-high-tying 12K on 10/1/22 at Baltimore...also marked his most strikeouts in a game without issuing a walk in his career.
  - On 4/8 vs. Miami, earned his first win of the season after tossing 8.0 scoreless innings (2H, OBB, 6K), retired his first 10 batters faced...became the fifth Yankees pitcher in the last 23 years (since 2002) to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings and allow two-or-fewer baserunners in a start...joins Gerrit Cole (2H in 9.0IP on 9/27/23 at Toronto), Domingo Germán (perfect game on 6/28/23 at Oakland), Jameson Taillon (2H in 8.0IP on 5/27/22 at Tampa Bay) and Corey Kluber (1BB in a no-hitter on 5/19/21 at Texas)...marked the longest scoreless start of his career...his 8.0IP matched his career high (also 5/15/22 at Chicago-AL and 5/26/22 at Tampa Bay).
  - Made his first career Opening Day start on 3/28 at Houston and did not record a decision in the Yankees' 5-4 win (5.0IP, 5H, 4ER, 2BB, 5K, 1HR).

VS. BALTIMORE: Is 4-0 with a 1.99 ERA (45.1IP, 10ER) and 61K in nine career appearances (seven starts) vs. the Orioles...made two starts vs. Baltimore in 2023, going 1-0 with a 4.76 ERA (11.1IP, 6ER) and 10K

- As a starter, is 3-0 with a 1.73 ERA (41.2IP, 8ER) and 59K against Baltimore.
  Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in eight of his nine outings vs. Baltimore, including 1R-or-fewer in six of those outings and four being scoreless. Three of his five career double-digit strikeout games have come against Baltimore, including both his career-high
- totals (12K on 10/1/22 and 4/17/22).
- In five career outings (four starts) at Camden Yards as a visitor, is 3-0 with a 1.08 ERA (25.0IP, 17H, 3R/ER, 6BB, 36K, 1HR)...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of those outings.

  Was selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the first round (ninth overall) of the 2017 Rule 5 Draft...saw his first Major League action with Baltimore in 2018, posting a 7.71 ERA (4.2IP, 10H, 4ER, 4BB, 3K, 2HR) in four relief appearances... was returned to the Yankees on 4/13/18.

NASTY NESTOR: Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 50-of-60 starts since the beginning of 2021 and 2R-or-fewer in 41 of those starts...in 68 appearances (60 starts) since the beginning of 2021, has gone 20-11 with a 3.13 ERA (350.2IP, 122ER), 365K and a .211 (273-for-1,296) opponents' BA... over that span (min. 300.0IP), ranks second in the AL in opponents' OBP (.264) and WHIP (1.03), fourth in opponents' OPS (.626) and opponents' BA, sixth in ERA and ninth in opponents' SLG (.362).

Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 46 of his 55 starts since 8/15/21, including 2R-or-fewer in 37 of those starts.

- Has tossed at least 7.0IP in each of his last two starts and three of his last four starts (since 4/8)...has tossed at least 7.0 innings in back-to-back starts for the third time in his career (also 2GS from 5/26-6/2(G1)/22 and 5/9-15/22).

- Became the first pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 7.01P scoreless innings with 0BB allowed in
- consecutive home outings. Is first pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1900) to toss at least 7.0 scoreless innings with OBB allowed and six-or-more strikeouts in each of his first two home outings of a season.
- Is one of just two Major League pitchers this season with multiple outings of at least 7.0 scoreless innings and 0BB allowed (also Los Angeles-NL's Tyler Glasnow two).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Will be making his fourth road start tonight...in three road starts this year, is 0-1 with a 7.07 ERA (14.0IP, 18H, 11ER, 5BB, 13K, 3HR).

- Went 3-2 with a 5.54 ERA (26.0IP, 16ER) and 30K in five road starts in 2023.
- In 28 road starts since the beginning of 2021, is 10-8 with a 3.83 ERA (148.0IP, 63ER) and 155K...has allowed 3R-orfewer in 20 of those 28 starts...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in 11 of those starts.
