METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and defeated the Yankees, 6-3...Tonight, the Mets finish a five-game, six-day homestand (2-2) against the Padres (1-2) and the Yankees (1-0)...The Mets are 46-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 21-6-3 in 30 series this year...Following this series, the Mets will have Thursday off before beginning a six-game road trip against Miami (three games) and Washington (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY, THERE IS SUCH A THING: Tonight's starting pitcher Max Scherzer celebrates his 38th birthday...Tonight will mark his fifth career start on his birthday...In the previous four starts, Scherzer is 3-1 with a 1.04 ERA (three earned runs/26.0 innings) with eight walks and 35 strikeouts...He most recently pitched on his birthday in 2018, when he earned the victory with Washington against Miami...He allowed an unearned run on three hits with a walk and 11 strikeouts in 8.0 innings.

CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD: Max Scherzer entered the 2022 season as the active leader in strikeouts...He has since been passed by Justin Verlander, who has moved up to 14th on the all-time list...In his last four starts, Scherzer passed John Smoltz (3,084 strikeouts), CC Sabathia (3,093 strikeouts) and most recently passed Curt Schilling (3,116) and Bob Gibson (3,117) to move into 15th all-time...See below for a chart below:

SWEEP DISPOSITION: The Mets are looking for their third sweep of the season today...It would mark the first two game sweep against the Yankees since May 12-13, 2014 at Yankee Stadium and the first one at Citi Field since May 27-28, 2013.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME!: With anticipated high attendance figures for the Subway Series, the Mets are encouraging fans to take mass transit and arrive early to enter the ballpark in order to avoid traffic delays...Gates will open at 5:10 p.m., while parking lots open will open at 4:10 p.m...The Mets will offer \$5 Nathan's Hot Dogs at concession stands between 5:10 - 6:10 p.m. on Tuesday and Wednesday.

HOMER HAPPY: Starling Marte and Eduardo Escobar each went deep in the first inning last night...It was the third time the Mets hit two home runs in an inning this season and was the first time they hit two home runs in the first inning since July 19, 2021 at Cincinnati...It marked the first time the Mets hit multiple home runs in an inning against the Yankees since they hit three in the sixth inning on August 28, 2020 at Yankee Stadium...The Yankees and Mets each hit two home runs in the first, marking the first time four home runs were hit in the first inning in any Mets home game.

SUBWAY SERIES: The Mets are 1-0 against the Yankees this year...The Mets went 4-2 against the Yankees last season, scoring a franchise-record 44 runs against their crosstown rivals...The two teams went 3-3 against each other in 2020...Last year, the Mets earned their first season Subway Series victory since 2013, when they went 4-0 against the Yankees...The Mets and Yankees had gone .500 against one another from 2018-20.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: According to *Elias*, the only time that the Mets and Yankees met in the regular season, with both teams in first place in their respective divisions was in April of 2015...The Mets entered that three-game series at Yankee Stadium with a record of 13-3 and the Yankees were 9-7.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets continue Interleague play today against the Yankees...The Mets are 6-8 this year against the American League...The Mets went 9-11 in Interleague play in 2021...The team's .509 winning percentage (232-224) is the second-best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

SUBWAY CARDS: The Mets are 14-19 vs. the Yankees at Citi Field and 30-36 vs. the Bronx Bombers at home since 1997...The Amazin's are 59-76 vs. the Yankees all-time during the regular season...The Mets are 107-144-2 vs. the Yankees combined in the regular season, World Series, Spring Training, 2020 Summer Camp, Mayor's Trophy Games, Mayor's Challenge Games and the Big Apple Series.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz, the reigning NL Reliever of the Month, has posted a 1-0 record with 12 saves, a 0.41 ERA (one earned run/22.0 innings) with 11 hits, three walks and 47 strikeouts over his last 22 appearances since May 27...27 of his last 36 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He has recorded 22 saves this season, which places him fourth in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 81 strikeouts...His 17.93 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...He has struck out 81 of the 157 batters he faced, good for 51.6%...He is 2-1 with 22 saves, a 1.60 ERA (seven earned runs/40.2 innings), allowing 26 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 36-5 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

PUT IT IN THE RECORD BOOKS: Edwin Díaz has converted 86 saves as a member of the Mets...That moved him into a seventh place tie with Tug McGraw on the team's all-time list...Last night was his 14th career save of more than 1.0 and the fifth with the Mets...Díaz has struck out 319 batters as a member of the Mets...That is eighth all-time by a Mets reliever.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets have played 47 games at Citi Field this year, which is the 11th-most in the Senior Circuit...By comparison, the Braves have played 54 home games, the most in the majors...The Mets are 30-17 at home...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a .638 winning percentage at home...The Mets have posted a 3.30 ERA with 142 walks and 451 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

YANKEES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won six-straight series openers against the Yankees...They have won six of their last eight matchups against the Yankees.

LIN-DOOR CITY: Among the 51 active players with 150 or more at-bats against the Yankees, Francisco Lindor ranks third in OBP (.393), third in OPS (.972), fourth in average (.322) and fourth in slugging percentage (.579)...The Mets are 18-5 when Lindor has a multi-hit game this season.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 65 times this year...The Mets have been hit 299 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is the most in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 66 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 49 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 45 HBP and Jeff McNeil is tied for ninth at 39 HBP...Brandon Nimmo has tied a franchise record with 50 HBP in his career...Michael Conforto was also plunked 50 times...Pete Alonso is one away from tying the record as well.

YOU LOOK FAMILIAR: Buck Showalter is the fifth manager to manage both the Mets and Yankees joining Casey Stengel, Yogi Berra, Dallas Green and Joe Torre...There have been 149 players who have played for both clubs, including three current players: RHP Adam Ottavino, LHP Joely Rodríguez and RHP Miguel Castro...Rodríguez and Castro were traded for each other on April 3 earlier this year in what marked the 18th trade between the two clubs.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded a hit in eight of his last nine games...He is batting .588 (10-17) with four extra-base hits and six RBI over his last five games...Alonso has a 1.904 OPS on this homestand, batting .692 (9-13) with three doubles, a home run, five RBI and four runs...He has collected 10 three-hit games, tied for second in the NL...This also ties a career-high (also: 2019)...He owns a .317/.407/.585 slashline in night games this year...His .317 average under the lights ranks sixth in the majors and third in the NL...He is fifth in the majors with 25 home runs and leads MLB with 83 RBI.

THREE'S COMPANY: On September 12, 2021 vs. Yankees, Francisco Lindor became the 14th player (15th time) in Mets history to hit three home runs in a game...It was the fourth three-homer game by a Met at home in club history and the first three-HR game in Subway Series history...Lindor is the second Mets shortstop to do so (also, José Reyes, August 15, 2006)...Only two other Mets shortstops have had multiple multi-homer games in one season: José Reyes in 2017 and Asdrúbal Cabrera in 2016.

SQUIRRELS ON THE POND: Jeff McNeil recorded an RBI on a bunt base hit with the bases loaded in the third inning in the September 10 game vs. the Yankees...According to *Elias*, that was the third bunt single with no outs and the bases loaded in the last 30 seasons...It was the second in Mets history, joining Bill Pulsipher who had one on September 6, 1995.

EAT FRESH: Jeff McNeil has hit safely in 15 of his 17 career games vs. the Yankees, going 24-63 (.381) with a .959 OPS...That .381 average ranks sixth all-time against the Yankees among players with at least 50 AB against the club and is the highest mark in the history of the Subway Series (Derek Jeter leads all Yankees hitters with a .364 lifetime average against the Mets).

FOR STARTERS: Mets starters have posted a 1.77 ERA (18 earned runs/91.2 innings) in the team's last 15 games with 99 strikeouts and 20 walks...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.06 to 3.66 in that span that began on July 7...The Mets rank seventh in the majors and third in the National League with a 3.66 ERA from their starters.

JULY! JULY! JULY!: New York's 2.53 team ERA (54 earned runs/192.1 innings) this month is the best mark in the majors...The club's 225 strikeouts in July are second in the majors and the most in the National League...Mets starters have gone 8-5 with 2.42 ERA (33 earned runs/122.2 innings) with 28 walks and 147 strikeouts in 21 games in July...Their 2.42 ERA is the best in The Show, while their 147 strikeouts from starters in July is the second-most in the majors.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets rank second in the majors with 926 strikeouts this season...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 744 times this season...That is the fifth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game seven times this year, which is the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 50 times this year, the most in MLB.

A STARLING IS BORN: Starling Marte lined a solo home run in the first inning of yesterday's victory...He is batting .371 (26-70) with five home runs in the first inning this season...Marte has recorded 10 home runs and 10 stolen bases in the same season for the seventh time in his career, tied for the most such seasons since 2013...He has recorded multiple hits in four of his last five games and has 11 multi-hit games over his last 20 games...Marte is batting .380 (30-79) during that span.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 60 games this season, tied for the second-most in the National League...Their .619 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 60-37 record through the team's first 97 games...Only the 1986 (66-31) team posted a better record through the first 97 games of the season.

CONNECT FOUR: New York is 51-5 when scoring at least four runs in a game...The team's 51 wins when scoring at least four runs is tied for second in the majors...Their .911 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors...The Mets have won 19 consecutive games in which they've scored at least four runs, and are 29-1 since May 27 when scoring at least four times...The 2021 Mets went 62-19 when scoring four or more.

- Ranks fifth in the majors and third in the NL with 25 homers...Leads the majors with 83 RBI...Tied for 18th in the NL with 54 runs scored.
- Ranks ninth in MLB and third in the NL with a .541 SLG...Is ninth in the majors and fourth in the NL with a .896 OPS...Is 14th in the NL in OBP (.355).
- Has three homers and 13 RBI in his last 12 games since he ended a career-high 10-game RBI drought and an 11-game home run dry spell on July 9 vs. Miami.
- Hit a game-tying RBI double in the first inning on July 26 vs. the Yankees...Has driven in the game-winning run in four of the Mets' last seven wins and has six go-ahead RBI overall in that span...Has 15 game-winning RBI and 22 go-ahead RBI overall this season, most in MLB.
- Owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (eight) and is third in games with multiple RBI (21) this season.
- Batting .333 (10-30) with a 1.078 OPS against lefties since June 25...Prior to that date, was hitting .190 (11-58) with a .716 OPS vs. southpaws.
- Has a 1.143 OPS with runners in scoring position, going 28-92 (.304/.415/.728) with six doubles, 11 homers, 61 RBI and 20 walks.
- Ranks eighth in Mets history with 131 homers...Up next on the Mets all-time HR list: Michael Conforto (132) and Carlos Beltran (149).
- Is tied for third in the majors with 15 road home runs...Ranks seventh in Mets history with 75 career road homers...Dave Kingman (81) is next on the list.
- Named an All-Star for the second time...Drew a walk in his lone plate appearance in the Midsummer Classic...Reached the semifinals of the Home Run Derby.
- Broke David Wright's franchise record for first-half RBI, driving in 78 before the break...Wright drove in 74 before the break in 2006.

- Has surpassed his season production from 2021 in RBI...Had 16 home runs and 66 RBI in 92 first-half games this season...Last year, had 11 home runs and 36 RBI in 87 first-half games and finished the year with 20 home runs and 63 RBI in 125 games.
- Had three straight multi-hit games for the first time this season from June 22-25...The Mets are 18-5 when he has multiple hits in a game this year.
- Became the first shortstop since Alex Rodriguez (2000) to reach 50 RBI in 66 games or fewer when he crossed that threshold on June 18.
- Has 47 RBI and 40 runs scored in his last 62 games...Had a 10-game RBI streak from May 22-June 1 and had 20 RBI overall in that span...It was the longest streak in the majors this season and tied for the second-longest in Mets history...The only Met with a longer RBI streak is Mike Piazza (15 games).
