METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets earned a 4-3 extra-inning win over the Dodgers last night...The Mets are a season-high 16 games above .500...The Mets have won four straight and eight of their last nine games...The Mets are in a stretch of 10 straight games (4-0)...Today, the Mets play the second game of their seven-game road trip (1-0) to Los Angeles (1-0) and Colorado (three games).

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game the Mets announced the following roster moves: INF Mark Vientos has been placed on 10-Day IL with a right hamstring strain...LHP Brandon Waddell was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse...RHP Max Kranick was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse following last night's game...INF Ronny Mauricio was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse.

RETURN OF THE MAURICIO: Ronny Mauricio is set to make his return to the major leagues today...The switch-hitter missed the entire 2024 season with a torn right ACL that he suffered in winter ball prior to the season...He currently is ranked as the number nine prospect in the organization according to *MLB Pipeline*...In nine games since he was activated from the Injured List and optioned to Triple-A Syracuse, Mauricio batted .515/.564/.818 (17-33) with three home runs, one double, eight RBI, five walks and four stolen bases...In 19 games in the minors this year (including 10 rehab games), Mauricio hit .323 (21-65) with three doubles, three homers, 11 RBI and an .892 OPS.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets own a 38-22 record this season...That is tied with the 1988 team for the third-best start to a season in franchise history, only the 1986 (44-16) and 2022 (39-21) teams had better season-opening records...The Mets improved to 15-5 in series openers...They own a 31-1 record when leading after seven innings...The Mets are 9-4 against the NL West...New York is 29-8 when hitting at least one home run.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are in the midst of a seven-game trip...New York is 14-15 (.483) on the road compared to 24-7 at Citi Field in 2025...The Mets have won back-to-back games on the road for the first time since April 28-May 2...They have not won back-to-back games on consecutive days on the road since April 13-14...The Mets have posted a 3.12 ERA on the road, which is the best mark in the majors.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Today, Edwin Díaz was named National League Relief Pitcher of the Month for May...During the month, Díaz did not allow a run over 11.1 innings, struck out 14 batters and recorded five saves...The right-hander did not allow a hit in 30 straight bat, a streak that spanned 10 games from May 5 - May 30...Díaz earned his ninth Reliever of the Month Award (5 AL, 4 NL), the most among any pitcher since the award was established in 2017.

SAVE ME: The Mets have had six different pitchers record a save this season: Huascar Brazobán, José Buttó, Edwin Díaz, Reed Garrett, Ryne Stanek, and José Ureña...Last year, the Mets tied a franchise record with 10 different pitchers recording a save for the team (José Buttó, Edwin Díaz, Jake Diekman, Reed Garrett, Adrian Houser, Jorge López, Phil Maton, Dedniel Núñez, Adam Ottavino and Drew Smith)...The Mets are tied for third in the majors with 19 saves.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his 11th start of the season on May 27 vs. Chicago-AL and earned his fourth win after allowing two earned runs over 5.2 innings (4 H, 4 BB, 6 K, HR)...Gave up both of his earned runs in the first inning after allowing a two-run homer to Miguel Vargas...With 100 pitches, was the second game this season he has reached the triple-digit mark (also: career-high 105 pitches on April 27 at Washington)...Five of his six strikeouts came over his last 2.2 innings...Marked his longest outing since April 27 (6.1 IP).

2025: In 11 starts this season, is 4-4 with a 3.52 ERA (21 ER/53.2 IP), 27 walks and 72 strikeouts...Has recorded at least six strikeouts in six of his last seven starts (since April 21), posting a 13.63 K/9.0 IP ratio in those games...Has allowed three earned runs or fewer in eight of his 11 starts, and one or zero runs in five...Has held batters to a .227 average (46-203), including left-handers to a .200 average (19-95)...Has tossed 5.0+ innings in seven of 11 starts this season...When the count is 0-2, Megill has given up just one hit and has struck out 11 of 19 batters faced in that scenario...Has received more than three runs in support in just three of his outings...Among major league pitchers (min. 50.0 IP), he is second in K/9.0 IP (12.07, second in NL)...Among NL pitchers with the same qualification, he ranks sixth in opponents' SLG (.320) and swing and miss percentage (29.8), and is 11th in strikeouts and HR/9.0 IP (0.67).

TYLOR MADE: Dating back to September 9, 2024, Megill has recorded a 2.99 ERA (25 ER/75.1 IP) with 35 walks and 99 strikeouts in 15 starts...He has held opposing batters to a .216 average (61-283) and has posted a 11.83 K/9.0 IP ratio...Also has posted a 0.72 HR/9.0 IP ratio (6 HR/75.1 IP)...In that span, he ranks second in K/9.0 IP (11.83, second in NL), eighth in opponents' SLG (.311, fourth in NL) and ninth in strikeouts (tied for fifth in NL) among major league pitchers (min. 70.0 IP).

VS. DODGERS/NL: Will be making his fourth career start against the Dodgers tonight and second at Dodger Stadium...In those three starts, has posted a 3.18 ERA (6 ER/17.0 IP) with six walks and 19 strikeouts...His last start against Los Angeles-NL came on May 29, 2024 where he tossed 7.0 scoreless innings (3 H, BB, 9 K)...In five starts against National League opponents this season has recorded a 3.91 ERA (11 ER/25.1 IP) and a 13.86 K/9.0 IP (39 K/25.1 IP).

PITCH ARSENAL: Though he has only used his changeup 7.8% of the time this season, Megill has recorded a 37.5 whiff rate with his off-speed pitch...He has held batters to a .143 average when throwing his changeup...Megill has also used his slider 22.3% of the time and has posted a 42.1 whiff rate with the pitch, striking out 18 batters...In 2024, Megill used his slider just 11.0% of the time and recorded a 29.1 whiff rate...He used his changeup only 1.5% of the time last season and recorded a 11.1 whiff rate on that pitch.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: This season, Megill has posted a 4.71 ERA (15 ER/28.2 IP) on the road compared to a 2.16 ERA (6 ER/25.0 IP) at Citi Field...Made his last road start on May 21 at Boston and allowed just one earned run over 4.2 IP (4 H, BB, 10 K, HP)...His 10 strikeouts matched a career high (also: 9/10/21 vs. NYY and 4/21/25 vs. PHI)...Is one of 15 pitchers in the majors to record at least two games with double-digit strikeouts this season...He joined Noah Syndergaard (6/2/15, 4.0 IP, 10 K) and Taijuan Walker (10/4-G2/22, 4.1 IP, 10 K) as the only Mets pitchers to record at least 10 strikeouts in a start no longer than 4.2 innings.

2024 RECAP: Over 16 games (15 starts) in 2024, Megill went 4-5 with a 4.04 ERA (35 ER/78.0 IP), adding 32 walks against 91 strikeouts...The right-hander allowed three runs or less in 11 of his 15 starts, including each of his last six starts of the season (August 30 - September 30)...He recorded at least six strikeouts in nine starts, tied for his most such starts in a single season (also: 2021)...Among National League pitchers, his 10.50 K/9.0IP ratio was tied for the ninth-best (min. 75.0 IP)...Megill pitched in the Postseason for the first time in his career, making appearances in Game 2 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia (1 ER/1.1 IP) and in Game 3 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles-NL (4 ER/3.0 IP).

FAMILY MATTERS: His brother, Trevor, plays for the Milwaukee Brewers...Tylor and Trevor both debuted in the majors in 2021...The Megill brothers join teammates Luisangel Acuña (Ronald Acuña Jr.) and Edwin Díaz (Alexis Díaz) as three of 13 pairs of siblings to begin the season on 40-man rosters...Courtesy of *Elias*.

CAREER NOTES: Made his third career Opening Day roster (also: 2022, '24)...Over parts of four Major League seasons with the Mets, Megill has combined to go 25-25 with a 4.42 ERA (194 ER/395.0 IP), 157 walks and 418 strikeouts over 85 games (78 starts)...In 2024, he established career bests in ERA (4.04), K/9.0IP (10.50), HR/9.0IP (0.92) and FIP (3.62)...Was originally drafted by the Mets in the eighth round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Arizona.

- Threw a scoreless sixth inning on June 2 at Los Angeles-NL (1.0 IP, H, 2 BB) and recorded his eighth hold of the season...Has had a scoreless outing in 18 of his 24 relief appearances this season.
- Has gone 3-1 with one save, eight holds and a 1.30 ERA (5 ER/33.2 IP) through 26 appearances (two as an opener) this season, holding batters to a .172 average (20-116)...20 of his 26 outings this season have been scoreless...With runners on base, has held batters to a .111 average (6-54)...He is one of 10 Mets pitchers to record as low of an ERA through their first 26 games of a season.
- Recorded his seventh hold of the season after tossing 1.1 innings in relief on May 30 vs. Colorado (H, ER, K, HR)...Stranded two inherited runners in the sixth and gave up a solo homer to Sam Hilliard in the seventh...Was his first home run allowed since April 18...Marked the first time he's thrown 1.1+ innings in consecutive appearances since March 27 (2.1 IP) and March 31 (2.0 IP).
