DO YOU BELIEVE IN MAGIC?: With their 3-1 win at **Mil** and the **Mets'** loss to the **Marlins**, the Reds on Fri lowered their magic number to clinch the third and final National League Wild Card spot to 2...can secure their first trip to the Postseason since 2020 this evening with a win and a **Mets** loss.

- The Diamondbacks were eliminated from Postseason contention on Fri...SF, StL and Mia were eliminated from the race on Thu.
- The Reds entered Tue's game tied with NYM for that coveted third Wild Card spot...it marked the first time after the All-Star break that the Reds held a Postseason position.
- Cin owns the head-to-head tiebreaker over NYM (4-2 in season series).
- The Redlegs climbed to within a <u>half-game</u> of that final spot on 8/22 before losing 10 of 13 and falling <u>6.0 games</u> off the pace.
- Had been "the first team out" until they were leapfrogged in the Wild Card standings by both SF and AZ during a 3-11 run.
- Since the 5-4 loss vs NYM on 9/5 (Cin had the bases loaded with no outs in the 9th inning), the Reds have gone 12-7 while the Mets have posted a 6-13 mark over that same span.

WHO DEY THINK GONNA SWEEP THE REDS: The Reds avoided being swept in all 26 of their series this season at Great American Ball Park.

- Went an entire season without being swept at home for the sixth time in franchise history (not counting the 2020 COVID-19 season).
- Only the Reds teams of 1940, 1943, 1944, 1994, and 2012 ran the home schedule without being swept (Elias).
- Have been swept just twice overall in 2025 (8/25-27 at LAD & 9/12-14 at Ath)...that sweep at LAD snapped a streak of 43 consecutive series without being broomed, dating back to September 2024.
- Was the only Major League team not to have been swept this season.

HOUSEKEEPING: The Reds went 45-35 (.563) in 80 games this season at **Great American Ball Park**...it was their fourth-best record in stadium history (beginning in 2003), behind only the 2012 (50-31, .617), 2013 (49-31, .613) and 2010 (49-32, .605) clubs.

- The Reds played 1 "home" game at Bristol Motor Speedway on 8/3 (completed on 8/4; 4-2 loss vs Atl).
- In 80 home dates this year, the Reds attracted 2,079,931 fans to GABP...
 marked the first time Cin drew over 2M fans in 3 straight seasons since
 doing so in 6 consecutive seasons from 2010-2015.
- Reds pitchers posted a 3.88 ERA this season at GABP, the fifth-lowest staff ERA in the ballpark's 23 seasons and the lowest since 2020 (3.84).
- The Reds spent 15 hours, 37 minutes in weather delays this season at GABP and 19 hours, 49 minutes total.

- Since 7/16/21, Mil has won 44 of 62 meetings against Cin, including 26 of 37 contests against the Reds since the beginning of the 2023 season.
- The Reds have lost 44 of 79 games at American Family Field since 2016 and 17 of 26 here since 2022.
- The Reds have lost 33 of 45 games vs Mil at Great American Ball Park since 9/24/19.
- Cin ended Mil's franchise-record 14-game winning streak with the 3-2 win in 10 innings on 8/17 at GABP.

'DOLOMITE!: In Thu's 2-1 win vs Pit, LHP Nick Lodolo matched his career

- His 156 strikeouts this season are the most by a Cin left-handed pitcher since John Smiley fanned 171 batters in 1996.
- Lodolo issued 2 walks or fewer in each of his 28 starts this season, the second-longest streak by a Reds' pitcher since 1900, trailing only Paul Derringer's 30-game streak in 1940 (Elias).
- Became the first Reds pitcher since 1900 with at least 150 strikeouts and 30 walks or fewer in a single season (Elias).

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision in the 1-0 win vs Chc on 9/21 (4.2ip, 5h, 0r, 1bb, 2k, 86TP).

- Was his sixth scoreless outing of the season and his 16th in which he allowed fewer than 2 runs.
- Exited the game with 2 outs in the 5th inning after he allowed a single to Ian Happ...was relieved by Nick Martinez who stuck out Seiya Suzuki to strand the runner at first.

SEPTEMBER 16: Suffered the 3-0 loss on 9/16 at StL (4.2ip, 8h, 3r/3er, 0bb, 7k, 1hr, 96TP).

- Eclipsed the 400-inning mark for his career.
- Marked the third time in 5 starts that he couldn't complete 5.0 innings.
- Thomas Saggese's 2-run homer in the 3rd inning snapped his consecutive homerless starts streak at 4.
- Was ahead in the count to all but 6 of his 22 batters...that 72.7% marked a season high.

SEPTEMBER 10: Earned the 2-1 win on 9/10 at SD (8.0ip, 5h, 1r/1er, 2bb, 6k, 1hr, 102 TP).

- Snapped a 3-game losing streak...entered the game having lost 6 of his last 7 decisions.
- Marked the second time this season he pitched 8.0 or more innings (also: 6/10 at CLE, 9ip CG/SHO).
- Following Fernando Tatis Jr's solo homer in the 5th inning, retired 10 of his final 11 batters.
- Allowed 7 of his 30 batters to reach.
- Averaged 12.8 pitches per inning, his lowest mark since his 9-inning shutout on 6/10 at Cle (12.2).
- Was his 11th quality start of the season, the 29th of his career, and his first since 8/17 vs Mil.

SEPTEMBER 5: Suffered the 5-4 loss on 9/5 vs NYM (4.2ip, 9h, 5r/5er, 1bb, 5k, 1hr, 98TP).

- Matched a season high with 9 hits allowed (also: 7/4 at Phi).
- Allowed 11 base runners for the first time since 8/5/23 vs Wsh (14 base runners, career high).
- Gave up 7 hard-hit balls (balls in play at or above 95mph), for the fourth time this season and for the second time over his last 3 starts (also: 8/23 at AZ).

AUGUST 30: Suffered the 4-2 loss on 8/30 vs StL (5.0ip, 3h, 2r/2er, 4bb, 7k, 96TP).

- Issued 4 walks, snapping his career-long streak of consecutive innings without a base-on-balls at 23.1ip (dating back to 8/6 at Chc)...was the second-longest run by a Reds LHP in the last 30 years, behind Eric Milton (28.1ip, 2006).
- Struck out all 3 batters he faced in the 2nd inning, marking the third time this season and the sixth time in his career he's accomplished the feat (last: 7/26 vs TB).

AUGUST 23: Suffered the 10-1 loss on 8/23 at AZ (4.0ip, 8h, 7r/6er, 0bb, 6k, 2hr, 73TP).

- The 7 runs allowed were a career high...his 6 earned runs allowed were a season high and the most he gave up in an outing since 8/7/24 at Mia (6er).
- Was his fourth outing this season of 4.0 innings or fewer.
- Entered the game with a 2.28 ERA, left with a 2.62 ERA.

AUGUST 17: Did not factor in the decision in the 10-inning, 3-2 win vs Mil on 8/17 (7.0ip, 4h, 0r, 0bb, 7k, 92TP).

- Was his career-high 10th quality start (28th of his career).
- Was the sixth time in his career that he pitched 7.0 shutout innings, the third time this season.
- Was his 15th start this year in which he allowed 1 earned run or none.
- Faced the minimum in 5 of his 7 innings.
- Was his second consecutive start in which he pitched at least 7.0 innings and didn't issue a walk...he's the first Reds pitcher to accomplish that feat Tyler Mahle in 2021...is the first Reds pitcher to do it at Great American Ball Park since Bronson Arroyo in 2013.

CAREER HIGHS: Has reached career highs this season with 161.0 innings pitched, 145 strikeouts, and 28 starts...is 1 victory away from matching that career high set last year.

ALL-STAR: Was named to the National League All-Star team as a replacement for LAD's Yoshinobu Yamamoto...was his first career All-Star selection.

 Pitched a perfect 6th inning in the NL's 7-6 victory (Jazz Chisholm Jr. lineout, Riley Greene flyout, Randy Arozarena groundout; 13 total pitches).

2.80 ERA: His 2.80 ERA (161ip, 57r/50er) through his first 28 starts of the season is the lowest by a Reds left-handed pitcher since Greg Swindell pitched to a 2.51 ERA in his first 28 starts in 1992.

- His 2.80 ERA is the fourth-best mark among Major League left-handers (min. 150ip) and ninth-best among all pitchers with at least 150ip.
- Produced 17 starts this season in which he allowed fewer than 2 earned runs, tying Danny Jackson (1988) for the most-such starts by a Reds left-handed pitcher since earned runs became an official stat in the National League in 1912.

HE EARNED IT: His 3.39 ERA through his first 74 career starts is the lowest by a Reds starting pitcher in that span since RHP Mario Soto (3.26, 1977-82).

IN HIS MAY ERA: His 0.55 ERA in May was the lowest among qualified Major League pitchers...is his lowest ERA in a month since pitching to a 1.21 mark in June 2023 (5gs, 4gs, 29.2ip, 4er, 16h, 12bb, 30k, 3hr).

- Was the first Reds pitcher to post a 0.55 ERA over a 6-start, single-season span (min. 30ip) since RHP Hunter Greene's 0.48 ERA last year from 6/30-8/3.
- Was the first Reds starting pitcher to open a season with a 1.55 ERA or lower over his 9 starts since RHP Johnny Cueto pitched to a 1.25 ERA over his first 9 starts in 2014.

- 10 of the 13 managers with 2,000 career wins are in the **Hall of Fame...Dusty Baker** (just became eligible in 2024), **Bochy** (active), and **Francona** (active) will likely join the other 10 in **Cooperstown**.
- Francona joins Baker (2,183) and Sparky Anderson (2,194 wins) as the only 2,000-win skippers to manage the Reds.
- **Francona** joins **Leo Durocher** as the only 2,000-win managers to <u>play</u> for the Reds (1930-33).
- Francona is the fourth manager to earn his 2,000th win for a team he once played for (1987), joining Bochy (SF), Bucky Harris (Det), and John McGraw (NYG)...courtesy Elias.
