**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets returned to action last night and fell to the Yankees, 7-6...New York has lost nine of their last 10 games... The Mets continue a six-day, five-game homestand (0-1) against the Yankees (0-1) and Cardinals (three games).

**TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME:** With the expected large crowds at Citi Field for the Subway Series, the Mets encourage fans to take mass transit to the game.

**AVOID THE SUBWAY SWEEP:** The Mets are looking to avoid their fifth sweep of the season...New York was last swept in a two game series by the Yankees from August 22-23, 2022 in The Bronx...The last time the Mets were swept by the Yankees at Citi Field was August 16-17, 2017.

**SUBWAY SERIES:** The Mets continue the Subway Series tonight in Queens...Last year, each team earned a two-game sweep at their home stadium...The Mets went 4-2 against the Yankees in 2021, scoring a franchise-record 44 runs against their crosstown rivals...The two teams went 3-3 against each other in 2020.

**STAND CLEAR OF THE CLOSING DOORS:** The Mets are 31-37 against the Yankees in Queens...The Amazin's are 60-79 vs. the Yankees all-time during the regular season...The Mets are 108-147-2 vs. the Yankees combined in the regular season, World Series, Spring Training, 2020 Summer Camp, Mayor's Trophy Games, Mayor's Challenge Games and the Big Apple Series.

THIS IS METS WILLETS POINT: Jeff McNeil has hit .359 (28-78) with 11 runs, four doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, five walks with a .412 OBP and a .487 SLG in 21 career games against the Yankees...Francisco Lindor has hit .310 (57-184) with 39 runs, 12 doubles, 10 homers, 22 RBI, 24 walks with a .392 OBP and a .549 SLG against the team from The Bronx.

**YOU LOOK FAMILIAR:** Buck Showalter is the fifth manager to manage both the Mets and Yankees joining Casey Stengel, Yogi Berra, Dallas Green and Joe Torre...There have been 155 players who have played for both clubs, including current players: RHP Adam Ottavino, RHP David Robertson and OF Billy McKinney.

**JUST IN TIME:** Justin Verlander is slated to make his eighth start of the season tonight...He is 2-3 with a 4.85 ERA (21 ER/39.0 IP) with 13 walks and 33 strikeouts...Verlander is set to make his 24th career start against the Yankees...He owns a 9-7 record with a 3.44 ERA (56 ER/146.1 IP) with 43 walks and 138 strikeouts life time against the Yankees...Verlander has gone 39-11 with a 2.66 ERA (114 ER/386.1 IP) with 113 walks and 428 strikeouts in 59 career Interleague games...His 39 wins and 428 strikeouts are the most in major league history.

**IN THE CITI:** The Mets have played 28 games at Citi Field, the fewest home games in the majors this season...The team is 15-13 at Citi Field this year.

**BRETT THE MET:** Bretty Baty is batting .292 (19-65) with 10 runs, five doubles, four home runs, eight RBI, nine walks with a .378 OBP, .554 SLG and a .932 OPS in 20 games at home this year...This compares to a .190/.274/.202 slashline in 26 games on the road in 2023.

**FIRST IS THE BEST:** The Mets are 18-7 (.720) when scoring first this season...On the other hand, the Mets are 13-29 (.301) when their opponent scores first.

**YANKEES-METS NOTES:** The Mets have lost three straight to the Yankees going back to 2022.

**FIRST IS THE WORST:** The Mets have been outscored 50-16 in the first inning this year.

**THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE:** The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 8-8 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 243-235 record in Interleague play...The team's .508 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

INTERSTELLAR: Jeff McNeil owns a .330/.380/.448 slashline with 41 runs, 15 doubles, seven home runs and 38 RBI in 83 Interleague games, while Starling Marte has slashed .325/.387/.543 with 121 runs, 46 doubles, 11 triples, 29 home runs and 89 RBI in 185 Intearleague games...They rank second and fourth, respectively, in average among active players in Interleague play (min. 250 PA)...McNeil's .330 clip is the highest all-time by a Met.

**STEAL THIS BASE:** The Mets have stole 23 consecutive bases without being caught...The last time a Mets player was thrown out attempting a stolen base was on May 10 (Francisco Lindor at second)...The Mets are first in the major leagues with an 89.1% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 19 bags this year, tied for fifth in the majors and tied for second in the National League...His 333 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

**DR. ROBERTSON:** David Robertson has posted a 2-1 record with a 1.84 ERA (6 ER/29.1 IP) in 26 appearances this season...He has walked seven, while striking out 39...He ranks ninth in the NL in ERA among relievers and is tied for ninth with 39 punchouts.

**CANHA I GET AN AMEN?:** Mark Canha is on a four-game hitting streak, batting .357 (5-14) with two runs, three doubles, four RBI, one walk with a 1.009 OPS in that span...Over his last 18 games, Canha is batting .300 (15-50) with seven runs, three doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, eight walks with a .417 OBP and a .480 SLG.

A STARLING IS BORN: Over his last 31 games, Starling Marte is batting .300 (33-110) with 16 runs, one double, one triple, two home runs, 10 RBI, three walks with a .336 OBP...He has safely reached base in 12 of his last 14 games...He has safely hit in eight of his last nine games.

**HIP, HOME RUN:** The Mets have homered in eight straight games, blasting 15 home runs in that span...The Mets have homered in 23 of their last 25 games, socking 39 bombs in that span...The Mets rank fifth in the National League with 80 blasts this season.

**THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS:** Francisco Alvarez as hit 12 home runs this season...That is the third-most by a rookie in the majors and the second-most in the National League...10 of his home runs have come as a catcher...Only one other rookie catcher in Mets history have had more homers in a season...Travis d'Arnaud (12) holds the club mark for home runs by a rookie catcher in 2014...Alvarez's 12 homers in his first 44 games played in a season as a primary catcher at age 21 or younger are the most in the majors...Johnny Bench had 11 homers in 1969...Hit tip Sarah Langs.

**IF YOU START ME OFF:** New York is 17-1 when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings...The Mets are still 7-0 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

#### **VERLANDER NEWS & NOTES**

Fergie Jenkins

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed five runs (four earned) on seven hits, four walks and three strikeouts over 3.0 innings on June 8 at Atlanta...Was his shortest outing since August 28, 2022 vs. Baltimore after suffering a right calf injury.

BATTLES AGAINST THE BRONX BOMBERS: Verlander has made 23 regular season starts in career against the Yankees, including 16 quality starts...In the regular season, Verlander is 9-7 with a 3.34 ERA (56 ER/146.1 IP) life time against the Yankees...Over his last six regular season starts against the Yankees, Verlander is 4-0 with a 1.96 ERA (9 ER/41.1 IP) and 0.82 WHIP...He also has made nine career Postseason starts against the Yankees and is 5-1 with a 2.62 ERA (17 ER/58.1 IP)...Five of those starts have been quality starts, including a complete game, 13-strikeout performance in Game 2 of the 2017 ALCS.

**INCREDIBLE IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** In 59 career Interleague starts, Verlander is 39-11 with a 2.66 ERA (114 ER/366.1 IP)...In Interleague play history, Verlander has the most wins, the second-most strikeouts (428) trailing only Max Scherzer (454) and the third-lowest ERA among qualifiers...43 of Verlander's 59 starts in Interleague games have been quality starts, the most in Interleague history.

**30 FOR 30:** With a win on May 10th against the Reds, Verlander became the 21st pitcher in major league history to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams...He joined Gerrit Cole, Zack Greinke and teammate Max Scherzer as the only active pitchers to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams...Courtesy of Elias.

**3K AND COUNTING:** Entering the 2023 season, Verlander was 12th on the all-time strikeout list with 3,198 strikeouts, five ahead of teammate Max Scherzer...Scherzer has since passed Verlander, but the pair remain close, with just 22 separating the two...Entering last season, Verlander ranked 19th on the all-time with 3,013 career strikeouts, seven behind Scherzer... During the 2022 season, Verlander passed all-time greats John Smoltz, C.C Sabathia, Curt Schilling, Bob Gibson, Pedro Martinez and Fergie Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

A TRUE COMEBACK STORY: In 2022, Verlander returned to the mound for the first time since July 24, 2020 and had a tremendous season after fully recovering from Tommy John Surgery...Verlander went 18-4 with a 1.75 ERA (34 ER/175.0 IP) in 28 starts with the Astros last season in route to his third career Cy Young Award and American League Comeback Player of the Year...His ERA was the lowest by an American League pitcher in a full season since Pedro Martinez had a 1.74 ERA (42 ER/217.0 IP) in 2000...It was the third-lowest ERA by an AL pitcher and the ninth-lowest in the majors in a single season in the Divisional ERA (1969)... Verlander led the AL in ERA, wins, WHIP (0.83), opponent OPS (.497), opponent average (.186) , opponent slugging percentage (.297) and hits per nine innings (5.97)...At 39 years and 227 days, Verlander became the fourth oldest Cy Young Award winner in major league history behind Roger Clemens (2004, 42 years, 60 days), Gaylord Perry (1978, 40 years, 17 days) and Early Wynn (1959, 39 years, 267 days).

**LIKE A FINE WINE:** Verlander's ERA last season was the second-best in major league history by a pitcher age 39 or older behind Cy Young's 1.26 ERA in 1908 during his age 41 season (Min. 20 starts)...His 0.83 WHIP last season was the highest mark by a pitcher age 39 or above in major league history (Min. 20 starts)...Verlander's 185 strikeouts last season were the most by a pitcher in a season age 39 or older since John Smoltz struck out 197 batters in his age 40 season in 2007...His 18 wins at 39 were the most at the age since Mike Mussina won 20 games in his age 39 season in 2008.

**THE RÉSUMÉ SPEAKS FOR ITSELF:** Verlander is one of 11 pitchers with at least three Cy Young Awards...In 2011, Verlander took both the AL Cy Young and the AL MVP after winning the AL pitching triple crown after leading the league in after leading the league in wins (24), strikeouts (250) and ERA (2.40)...He is one of 11 pitchers to win both a Cy Young and MVP in the same season...Verlander and Don Newcombe are the only pitchers in major league history to have won Rookie of the Year, Cy Young and MVP...A nine-time All-Star, Verlander is tied with Clayton Kershaw for the most All-Star game appearances by an active pitcher... Verlander has started two Mid-Summer classics (2012 and 2019) and is one of 12 pitchers in major league history to start the All-Star game with two different clubs.

#### TUESDAY'S STARTER: RHP TYLOR MEGILL (5-4, 5.14)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed a career-high nine runs (seven earned) on eight hits, three walks and one strikeout over 3.2 innings on June 9 at Pittsburgh.

**NO PLACE LIKE NEW YORK:** This season, Megill is 3-1 with a 3.03 ERA (11 ER/32.2 IP) in six home starts this season...In seven road starts this season, Megill is 2-3 with a 7.42 ERA (25 ER/30.1 IP)...In 22 career home games (20 starts), Megill is 7-4 with a 4.09 ERA (47 ER/103.1 IP) and in 23 career road games (19 starts), Megill is 6-8 with a 5.68 ERA (61 ER/96.2 IP).
