TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 22, 2015: Legendary Yankees Hall of Fame catcher and manager Yogi Berra passes away at the age of 90, exactly 69 years to the day after making his Major League debut with the Yankees on September 22, 1946.

Sept. 22, 2013: The Yankees hold a tribute day for Mariano Rivera, who helps to unveil a new Jackie Robinson tribute plaque before receiving gifts and addressing the crowd during pregame ceremonies. Jorge Posada throws the ceremonial first pitch to Rivera.

Sept. 22, 1946: Yogi Berra makes his Major League debut, going 2-for-4 with a two-run HR in a 4-3 win in Game 1 of a doubleheader vs. Philadelphia-AL.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 23, 2001: In a game that sees the Yankees overcome a 4-0 deficit to defeat the Orioles, 5-4 in 10 innings in Baltimore, Mariano Rivera breaks Dave Righetti's single-season club record by recording his 47th save, tossing a perfect 10th inning.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their final homestand of the season tonight with the first game of a three-game set vs. Arizona (through Sun.)...are 1-2 on the homestand after losing two-of-three games vs. Toronto this week...after this homestand, will embark on their final road trip of the season, making stops in Toronto (Tues.-Thurs.) and Kansas City (9/29-10/1).

- Are 7-4 in their last 11 games (since 9/10).
- **Have posted a Major League-best 15-8 (.652) record since 8/28**...are 17-11 in their last 28 games (since 8/23).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Blue Jays, 5-3, on Thursday at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Gerrit Cole** (8.0IP, 2H, 1ER, 0BB, 9K, 0HR, 1WP) earned his 14th win of the year — his 50th as a Yankee — allowing just 1R/ER over 8.0IP...**RF Jake Bauers** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI) hit his 12th home run of the season with a go-ahead three-run HR in the first inning...**DH Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) hit an RBI double in the seventh inning...**CF Estevan Florial** (1-for-3, 1 double, 1RBI, 1BB) hit an RBI double in the sixth inning...**2B Gleyber Torres** (1-for-4, 1R) extended his on-base streak to 10 games...**1B DJ LeMahieu** (1-for-4, 2R, 1BB) and **3B Isiah Kiner-Falefa** (2-for-4, 1R, 1 double) each reached base twice...**RHP Clay Holmes** (1.0IP, 2H, 2R/1ER, 1BB) allowed 2R/1ER in the ninth inning.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 3.00 ERA (162.0IP, 54ER) in their last 30 games (since 8/20)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 27 of those 30 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts.

- With **RHP Michael King** recording 13K and 0BB on Wednesday and **RHP Gerrit Cole** recording 9K and 0BB on Thursday, **Yankees starters have recorded at least 9K with 0BB in back-to-back starts for just the second time in franchise history**...Yankees starters also accomplished the feat from 9/7-8/98 at Boston when David Wells recorded 10K and 0BB on 9/7/98 and David Cone recorded 11K and 0BB on 9/8/98.

JAKE RAKES: INF/OF **Jake Bauers** hit his 12th home run of the season on Thursday with a go-ahead three-run shot in the first inning...his 12HR this year have tied his career high (also 12HR in 2019 with Cleveland).

GLEYBER DAY: INF **Gleyber Torres** has reached base in each of his last 10 games (since 9/12-G1), batting .324/.432/.432 (12-for-37) with 4R, 4 doubles, 4RBI and 7BB over that span.

- Is batting .314/.405/.550 (53-for-169) with 28R, 13 doubles, 9HR, 22RBI, 24BB, 2HP and 5SB in 45 games since 8/1...has hit safely in 32 of those games and has reached base safely in 38 of those contests...**his .955 OPS since 8/1 is the seventh-highest in the AL (min. 140PA)**.
- Since 7/6, is batting .308/.376/.518 (76-for-247) with 38R, 14 doubles, 1 triple, 12HR, 30RBI, 27BB, 2HP, 3SF and 6SB in 64 games.

ALL RISE: OF **Aaron Judge** recorded two hits on Thursday, including an RBI double in the seventh inning...has multiple hits in two of his last three games.

- Has reached base in 31-of-71 plate appearances over his last 16 games (since 9/5), posting a .437 OBP in that span (13H, 18BB).
- Has reached base multiple times in 51 of his 99 games this year, including 39 of his last 70 games (since 5/12).
- Despite missing 51 games on the injured list this year, **his 32HR this season are the fifth-most in the AL and his 80BB rank sixth**.
- Since being reinstated from the injured list on 7/28, leads the AL with 45BB and ranks second in the Majors, trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (56).
- Has hit .311/.423/.621 (32-for-103) with 21R, 2 doubles, 10HR, 20RBI, 20BB and 15B in 28 Interleague games this season...has batted .307/.404/.630 (136-for-443) with 91R, 19 doubles, 2 triples, 40HR, 78RBI, 71BB and 95B in 122 career Interleague games.

WHERE'S WALDO: INF/OF **Oswaldo Cabrera** is batting .306 (11-for-36) with 4R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI, 5BB and 1SB in his last 10 games (since 9/10).

BATTERS' EYE: **Since the All-Star break, the Yankees lead the Majors with a 9.31 PA/BB ratio and a 4.05 pitches per plate appearance ratio**...prior to the All-Star break, ranked 20th in the Majors in PA/BB (11.90) and P/PA (3.86).

COLE TRAIN: RHP **Gerrit Cole** earned his 14th win of the year and his 50th as a Yankee after allowing just 1R/ER over 8.0IP on Thursday vs. Toronto (2H, 0BB, 9K, 0HR, 1WP)...retired his first 16BF, 21 of his first 22BF and 24 of his 26BF...his 2H allowed matched his season low and his 8.0IP marked his second-longest start of the season...**is now 14-4 with a 2.75 ERA (200.0IP, 61ER) and 217K in 32 starts this season...his 2.75 ERA is the lowest in the American League and the second-lowest in the Majors**, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (2.33).

- **Thursday marked his fifth start this season where he tossed at least 7.0 innings and allowed three-or-fewer baserunners (via H/BB/HP), marking the most such starts by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history**...surpassed Mike Mussina's four such starts in 2001.
- Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 27-of-32 starts this season, 2R-or-fewer in 25 of those starts and 1R-or-fewer in 13 of those starts.
- **His 25 starts of 2R-or-fewer are the most such starts in the Majors...is one of just three pitchers in franchise history to record at least 25 starts of 2R-or-fewer in a single season**, joining Jack Chesbro (28 in 1904) and Ron Guidry (26 in 1978).
- **According to Elias, his 2.75 ERA is the lowest by a Yankees starter through his first 32 starts of a season in the last 45 years (since 1979)**...the last Yankee to record as low of an ERA through 32 starts was Ron Guidry in 1978 (1.80)...the last time a qualified Yankee finished a non-strike season with as low of an ERA was 1980 when Rudy May recorded a 2.46 ERA in 41 games/17 starts (Tommy John had a 2.63 ERA in 20 starts in 1981).
- **Has tossed at least 200.0 innings for a second straight season and for the sixth time in his career (also 2015, '17-19, '22)**...has reached the 200.0IP mark for the fifth time in his last six 162-game seasons...**is the only pitcher to throw at least 200.0 innings in five different seasons since 2017** (no other pitcher has recorded more than three such seasons in that span)...**is also the only Major League pitcher to record six such seasons since 2015** (no other pitcher has more than four in that span)...is the only Yankee in the last 10 years (since 2014) to throw at least 200.0IP in a season and is the first to do so in back-to-back seasons since CC Sabathia (five straight from 2009-13) and Hiroki Kuroda (2012-13)...**is one of just two pitchers to reach the mark this season**.
- Thursday marked the 15th time this season Cole started after a Yankees' loss...**the Yankees are 12-3 in those games with Cole going 8-2 with a 2.59 ERA (97.1IP, 28ER) in those starts**.
- **The Yankees are 22-10 in his starts this season**...the Yankees' 22 wins in Cole's starts match the third-most by any team in the Majors in a pitcher's starts (tied for second-most in AL), trailing only Atlanta's 24 wins in Spencer Strider's starts and Baltimore's 23 wins in Dean Kremer's starts.
- Has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 25 of his 32 starts, the most such starts in the AL and the second-most in the Majors, trailing only San Francisco's Logan Webb (26)...has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 13 of his last 15 starts (since 7/2) and in 18 of his last 21 starts (since 5/28).
- Has tossed at least 7.0 innings in six of his last 11 starts (since 7/28), seven of his last 14 starts (since 7/8) and eight of his last 17 starts (since 6/20)...his 10 starts of at least 7.0IP are tied for the third-most in the AL and tied for the sixth-most in the Majors.
- **Has gone 4-0 with a 1.59 ERA (39.2IP, 7ER) and 47K over his last six starts (since 8/25)**...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of those six starts...has walked just five of his 149BF over that span...**the Yankees are 6-0 in those games**.
- Has not surrendered a walk in three of his last four starts (since 9/5) and four of his last six starts (since 8/25).
- Has allowed 4H-or-fewer in 15 of his 32 starts.
- In 107 starts with the Yankees (since 2020), is 50-23 with a 3.12 ERA (655.0IP, 227ER) and 811K...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 84-of-107 starts...**has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 73 starts as a Yankee, the most such starts in the Majors in that stretch**.
- *If he were to finish the season with the lowest ERA in the AL, he would be the 10th Yankee (14th time) to win an AL ERA title...would join Rudy May (1980), Ron Guidry (twice: 1978 and '79), Whitey Ford (twice: 1956 and '58), Bobby Shantz (1957), Ed Lopat (1953), Allie Reynolds (1952), Spud Chandler (twice: 1943 and '47), Lefty Gomez (twice: 1934 and '37) and Wilcy Moore (1927).*

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUKE WEAVER (2-5, 6.77 ERA)

RHP Luke Weaver will make his 28th appearance (24th start) of the season and second start with the Yankees in tonight's series opener vs. Arizona...the 30-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...made his last start on Saturday at Pittsburgh, recording a no-decision after allowing 3ER in 4.0IP (4H, 2BB, 7K, 1HR)...marked his first appearance as a Yankee...was claimed off waivers by the Yankees from the Seattle Mariners on 9/12 and was added to the active roster prior to Game 2 of the doubleheader on 9/14 at Boston...in 27 combined games (23 starts) with the Cincinnati Reds (21GS), Seattle Mariners (5G/1GS) and Yankees (1GS) this season, is 2-5 with a 6.77 ERA (114.1IP, 145H, 88R/86ER, 39BB, 100K, 27HR)...over parts of eight Major League seasons with the St. Louis Cardinals (2016-18), Arizona Diamondbacks (2019-22), Kansas City Royals (2022), Cincinnati Reds (2023), Seattle Mariners (2023) and Yankees (2023), is 26-41 with a 5.19 ERA (565.0IP, 628H, 351R/326ER, 187BB, 562K, 88HR) in 142 games (104 starts).

LAST TIME OUT: Made his Yankees debut on Saturday at Pittsburgh, recording a no-decision after allowing 3ER in 4.0IP (4H, 2BB, 7K, 1HR)...surrendered a two-run HR to Bryan Reynolds in the first inning and allowed a sac fly to Endy Rodriguez in the third...retired nine of his final 10 batters faced (1 double).

VS. ARIZONA: Has made four career appearances (three starts) vs. the Diamondbacks, going 0-1 with a 5.29 ERA (17.0IP, 10ER).
✦ Will mark his second outing vs. Arizona this season...allowed 3ER over 4.0IP on 7/23 vs. Arizona with Cincinnati (8H, 2BB, 1K, 1HR, 1HP).

WELCOME TO NEW YORK: Will make his home debut as a Yankee tonight...will mark his first career appearance at Yankee Stadium.

2023: In 27 combined games (23 starts) with the Cincinnati Reds (21GS), Seattle Mariners (5G/1GS) and Yankees (1GS) this season, is 2-5 with a 6.77 ERA (114.1IP, 145H, 88R/86ER, 39BB, 100K, 27HR).
✦ Signed a one-year Major League contract with Cincinnati on 1/13...began the 2023 season on the 15-day injured list with a right elbow flexor strain...made two rehab starts with Triple-A Louisville (9.0IP, 3H, 3ER, 4BB, 9K, 1HR) before being reinstated on 4/20...went 2-4 with a 6.87 ERA (97.0IP, 125H, 76R/74ER, 34BB, 85K, 24HR) in 21 starts with the Reds.
✦ Was released by the Reds on 8/18 and signed a Major League contract with the Mariners on 8/22...in five games (one start) with Seattle, went 0-1 with a 6.08 ERA (13.1IP, 16H, 9ER, 3BB, 8K, 2HR)...was designated for assignment by Seattle on 9/10.
✦ Was claimed off waivers by the Yankees from the Seattle Mariners on 9/12 and was added to the active roster prior to Game 2 of the doubleheader on 9/14 at Boston.

FOR STARTERS: Has made 23 starts this season with Cincinnati (21GS), Seattle (1GS) and the Yankees (1GS), going 2-5 with a 6.88 ERA (104.2IP, 80ER).
✦ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in five of his last seven starts (since 7/23).
✦ Recorded 8K in back-to-back starts to begin the season (4/20 at Pittsburgh and 4/25 vs. Texas - both with Cincinnati).

CAREER NOTES: Over parts of eight Major League seasons with the St. Louis Cardinals (2016-18), Arizona Diamondbacks (2019-22), Kansas City Royals (2022), Cincinnati Reds (2023), Seattle Mariners (2023) and Yankees (2023), is 26-41 with a 5.19 ERA (565.0IP, 628H, 351R/326ER, 187BB, 562K, 88HR) in 142 games (104 starts).
✦ Was drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals in the first round (27th overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Florida State University.
✦ Was acquired by the Diamondbacks, along with C Carson Kelly, INF Andrew Young and a competitive balance draft pick, for INF Paul Goldschmidt on 12/5/18.
