LAST GAME: The D-backs won 4-3 last night @ Yankees...it was Arizona's first win with 3 or fewer hits since Aug. 17, 2023 @ Padres (W, 3-1 on 3 hits).

- Zac Gallen (0 ER in 6.2 IP) earned his first win of the season and matched his career high with 13 strikeouts.
- A.J. Puk earned his second save in as many days, the first time recording saves in consecutive days since June 28-29, 2023 @ Red Sox while with the Marlins.
- Lourdes Gurriel Jr. (1-for-3, HR, 2 RBI, BB) slugged his second homer of the season.

D-BACKS, MARTE AGREE ON 6-YEAR CONTRACT EXTENSION: Yesterday, the D-backs agreed with INF **Ketel Marte** to a 6-year contract extension through 2030 (beginning in 2025) with a player option for 2031.

- 2-time NL MVP Top 5 vote recipient (3rd in 2024, 4th in 2019).
- 2-time NL All-Star starter (2024, 2019).
- 2024 Silver Slugger winner (second base).
- 2024 All-MLB First Team selection.
- 2024 D-backs' MVP by the Arizona Chapter of the BBWAA after hitting .292 (147-for-504)/.932 OPS with 23 doubles, 2 triples, 36 homers, 95 RBI, 65 walks and 7 stolen bases in 136 games...posted career highs in homers and RBI
- In 2024, led all second basemen [min. 120 G] in OPS (.932), OBP (.372), SLG (.560), homers (36), RBI (95), extra-base hits (61) and total bases (282), and was second in AVG (.292).
- In 2024, his 6.8 bWAR ranked fourth in the NL, behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (9.2), Matt Chapman/SF (7.1) and Francisco Lindor/NYM (7.0).
- 2023 NLCS Most Valuable Player after hitting .387 (12-for-31)/.987 OPS with 4 doubles, 1 triple and 3 RBI.
- Is currently the longest tenured D-back in his ninth season...is the fourth D-back to play 9+ seasons along with Nick Ahmed (10, 2014-23), David Peralta (9, 2014-22) and Miguel Montero (9, 2006-14).

FIRST SERIES WIN IN THE BRONX: Last night, the D-backs secured their first-ever series win @ Yankees in their sixth series all-time in the Bronx.

- Arizona is seeking their first sweep in the state of New York since Aug. 9-11, 2016 @ Mets.
- The D-backs have won their last 4 games in the state of New York (also: June 1-2, 2024 @ Mets).

FOR THE SWWWEEP: A win would secure Arizona's first road sweep since Aug. 23-25 @ Boston.

• In 2024, the D-backs swept 4 opponents on the road (@ Reds, @ Guardians, @ Marlins and @ Red Sox).

FOR YOUR [GALL]ENTERTAINMENT: Last night @ Yankees, **Zac Gallen** (W; 0 ER in 6.2 IP, 3 H, 0 BB, 13K) matched his career-high strikeout mark (also: 13 K on Sept. 22, 2022 @ Dodgers).

- Became the third pitcher in franchise history to record 2+ starts with 13+ strikeouts and no walks, joining Randy Johnson (8 starts) and Curt Schilling (2 starts).
- Since 2022, his 8 GS of 10+ strikeouts and 0 walks are the most MLB, ahead of Kevin Gausman/TOR (6).
- Has recorded the win in his 3 career starts vs. Yankees, combining to toss 18.2 scoreless innings (9 H, 5 BB, 27 K), and has tossed 6.0+ innings with just 3 hits allowed in each of the starts.
- Gallen's 18.2 scoreless-inning streak vs. Yankees is tied for the eighth longest by a starting pitcher (also: Drew Rasmussen/TB from Sept. 9, 2022-May 11, 2023, and Herb Score/CLE from Aug. 2, 1956-May 7, 1957)... the longest is by Britt Burns/CHW (29.0 IP from Aug. 17, 1981-Aug. 4, 1982).

- Lourdes Gurriel Jr. has homered in back-to-back starts.
- **Ketel Marte** has hit safely in 5 of his 6 games with 2 doubles, 1 RBI and 6 walks.
- **Alek Thomas**, in 3 games, is hitting .556 (5-for-9)/.545 OBP/.778 SLG/1.323 OPS with 2 doubles and 3 RBI.
- **Pavin Smith**, in 5 games, is hitting .444 (4-for-9)/.583 OBP/.778 SLG/1.361 OPS with 3 doubles and 1 RBI.
- **Gabriel Moreno**, in 5 games, is hitting .400 (6-for-15) with 1 RBI and 3 walks.
- **Geraldo Perdomo**, in 6 games, is hitting .350 (7-for-20) with 1 double, 7 RBI, 1 walk and 1 stolen base... has hit safely in 5 of his 6 games.

FIRST-INNING HOMERS: Since 2024, the D-backs' 39 first-inning homers are third most in the Majors, behind the Yankees (46) and Dodgers (40).

5 HITS, ALL HOMERS: Eugenio Suárez matched Rob Deer (DET/1992) and Rodolfo Castro (PIT/2021) as the only players whose first 5 hits of a season were all homers (since 1900) [source: @SlangsOnSports, Elias Sports Bureau].

 No player since 1900 has had each of his first 6 hits of a season all be homers.

RUN COUNT: Among teams with 6 or fewer games played this season, the Yankees (44 in 5 G) and D-backs (38 in 6 G) rank first and third, respectively.

• Last season, Arizona led the Majors with a franchise second-best 886 runs (behind 1999/908 runs), ahead of the Dodgers (842) and Yankees (815).

ON DECK - WASHINGTON NATIONALS: Following tonight's game, the D-backs will head to Washington, D.C. to face the Nationals for 3 games.

- Since 2022, the D-backs have gone 14-5 vs. Nationals (7-3 on the road).
- Arizona has won 7 of their last 8 games @ Nationals Park since April 20, 2022.
- Lourdes Gurriel Jr., in his last 9 games vs. Nationals, is hitting .514 (18-for-35)/1.393 OPS with 2 doubles, 3 homers, 6 RBI and 3 walks.

NEXT STARTER: RHP BRANDON PFAADT (0-1, 4.50)

• Made his first start of the season on March 29 vs. Cubs (L; 3 ER in 6.0 IP, 5 K, BB).

- Has posted 3 seasons of 12+ wins (2023, '22, '19).
- Entered the season ranked sixth on the D-backs' all-time wins list (53) and seventh in strikeouts (744).

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Second start of the season, first road start.

• His 54 career wins are 1 shy of tying Zack Greinke (55) for fifth on the franchise's all-time wins list, behind Randy Johnson (118), Brandon Webb (87), Curt Schilling (58) and Patrick Corbin (56).

LAST START: Earned the win in his first start of the season vs. Cubs on March 28 (1 ER in 5.1 IP, K).

• Hitters went just 1-for-11 (.091) with no walks with runners on base.

VS. YANKEES: Is making his fourth career start.

- Did not factor in the decision in his lone career start @ Yankee Stadium on Sept. 25, 2023 (2 ER in 5.0 IP, 5 K).
- In 3 previous starts, is 1-0 with a 2.60 ERA (5 ER in 17.1 IP), .226 opponent AVG and 11 strikeouts.

VS. AL EAST: Is 4-3 with a 5.14 ERA (32 ER in 56.0 IP) and 48 strikeouts in 10 career starts against the AL East.

• In 5 road starts, is 2-1 with a 6.67 ERA (20 ER in 27.0 IP) and 19 strikeouts against AL East opponents.

CLIMBING THE FRANCHISE LIST: His 745 career strikeouts rank seventh on the club's all-time strikeouts list, behind Randy Johnson (2,077), Brandon Webb (1,065), Robbie Ray (998), Patrick Corbin (897), Curt Schilling (875) and Zac Gallen (859).

• Recorded his 700th strikeout on April 15, 2024 vs. Cubs, becoming just the eighth D-back to reach the feat...only 6 have posted 800+ strikeouts (last: Zac Gallen, 2024).

PICKOFF PROWESS: Since 2022, his 9 pickoffs are tied for fourth with David Peterson among NL starting pitchers, behind Patrick Corbin (13), Taijuan Walker (13) and Charlie Morton (11).

2024 RECAP: Went 5-1 with a 4.17 ERA (38 R-36 ER in 77.2 IP) and 65 strikeouts over 13 starts in his sixth season with the D-backs.

- Placed on the 15-day injured list (right shoulder strain) on April 23... transferred to the 60-day injured list on May 2...reinstated from the 60-day injured list (right shoulder strain) on Aug. 11.
- Since Aug. 11, his 13.86 strikes looking above average (SLAA) and his 111.5 pct. strikes looking rate vs. Average (SL+) were the highest among NL starters.
- For the first time in his career, threw 6 different pitches 10+ times each.
- Held opponents to 2 or fewer runs with runners in scoring position in 9 of his 13 starts (.217 AVG; 13-for-60).

CONSECUTIVE 5.0+-INNING STREAK: His 38 consecutive starts of 5.0+ innings from April 6, 2023-Sept. 5, 2024 marked the second longest streak in the Majors since 2022, behind only Mitch Keller (49 straight starts; April 5, 2023-July 8, 2024).

POSTSEASON WARRIOR: In Game 2 of the World Series @ Rangers on Oct. 28, 2023, became the fourth D-backs pitcher (5 times overall) to allow 1 run or fewer over 7.0+ innings in a World Series start (also: Randy Johnson, Curt Schilling [2x] and Miguel Batista...additionally, his 9 strikeouts tied Schilling for second-most strikeouts in a World Series game by a D-backs starter behind Johnson's 11 strikeouts.

 Also retired the first 11 batters, surpassing the record for most consecutive batters retired by a D-backs pitcher to start a World Series game (prev: 10 by Randy Johnson on Oct. 28, 2001 in Game 2 vs. Yankees) [Elias Sports Bureau].

USA! USA!: Selected to pitch for Team USA in the 2023 World Baseball Classic, marking the first time participating with a national team at any level.

- Went 0-1 with an 8.31 ERA (4 ER in 4.1 IP) over 2 games.
- Started the fourth game vs. Colombia and championship vs. Japan.

"Growing up I never played with any of the youth USA teams, so the fact that in this point in my career I got the opportunity is special. Being able to represent the country and be a part of that roster of guys is special. Seeing that USA jersey with my name on it's a little bigger than just the big leagues."

ARIZONA KID: Grew up in Scottsdale, Ariz., and attended Desert Mountain High School, Yavapai College and Arizona State University... attended Arizona State University (2010) and helped the Sun Devils reach the College World Series in 2010...went to Yavapai College in Prescott, Ariz. (2008-09) and went 15-1 in 2 seasons.

HOW HE STARTED: Rays' eighth-round pick in the 2010 draft.

- Played 5 seasons in the Rays' system (2010-14).
- Played 4 seasons (2015-18) with the SK Wyverns in the Korean Baseball Organization (KBO).
