**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Mariners, 8-7, last night...Today, the Mets finish a 10-day, nine-game homestand (3-5) against the Angels (1-2), Rangers (1-2) and Mariners (1-1)...New York is off on Labor Day before the start of a five-game road trip against Washington (two games) and Minnesota (three games).

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY!:** David Peterson celebrates his 28th birthday today...We wish him well.

**TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME:** The Mets are encouraging all fans attending the games taking place August 25 – September 3 to take the train to the game...With the capacity crowds expected at both Citi Field and the US Open, using mass transit and rideshare will be the most efficient ways to arrive to the ballpark...The LIRR and the 7 train have added additional trains for baseball and tennis fans...If you drive, please arrive early to avoid traffic delays.

**CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS DAY:** For the eighth consecutive year, MLB and its Clubs will raise awareness for childhood cancer for a special league-wide day in home ballparks during all games on Sunday, September 3 through the MLB Together platform (MLBTogether.com)...Held during Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, this effort will combine a visual and ceremonial demonstration of support for the cause with outreach to local hospitals treating young patients in their communities...Today, all on-field personnel, including players, managers, coaches, and umpires will wear gold ribbon decals and wristbands during all games.

**DINGERS!:** The Mets have socked 177 home runs this season...That is tied for the fourth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs.

**CONNECT FOUR:** The Mets now feature for players who have hit 20 or more home runs this season: Pete Alonso, Francisco Alvarez, Francisco Lindor and Brandon Nimmo...The 2023 Mets are one of five teams in franchise history to accomplish this feat...This includes the 2019 Mets who featured a franchise-high five players who recorded at least 20 home runs.

**GOT TO GO TO MO'S:** Ronny Mauricio became the 10th player in Mets history to have four or more hits in their first two career major league games...He is the seventh Met ever to have two straight multi-hit games to begin their career and the first since Josh Thole (September 3 - 5, 2009)...In addition, last night he picked up his first career stolen base in the third inning.

**25/25:** Francisco Lindor became the fifth player in franchise history to recorded 25 doubles, 25 homers and 25 steals in a single season...He joined Darryl Strawberry (1984, 1986, 1987, 1988), Howard Johnson (1989, 1991), David Wright (2007) and Carlos Beltrán (2008)...He joined Jimmy Rollins and Hanley Ramirez as the only shortstops in major league history with multiple seasons of 25 homers, 25 doubles and 25 stolen bases

**I DECLARE fWAR:** Francisco Lindor ranks seventh in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.3 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.1 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (18.9) and Mookie Betts (18.1) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...Trea Turner has also posted a 16.1 fWAR in that span...His 16.1 fWAR since 2021 is sixth in the majors in that span.

**LINSANITY:** Over his last 65 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .293 (71-242) with 50 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, 32 home runs, 37 RBI, 30 walks, 19 steals with a .380 OBP, a .521 SLG and a .901 OPS...Lindor has stolen a career-high-tying 25 bases in 132 games this season (Also: 2018).

**I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ:** Over his last 15 games, DJ Stewart is batting .358 (19-53) with 10 runs, three doubles, nine home runs, 18 RBI and a 1.338 OPS...In 38 games this year, Stewart is batting .277 (26-94) with 13 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 21 RBI, 10 walks, a .361 OBP and a .649 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

**INVADER NIM:** Brandon Nimmo has hit a career-best 20 home runs this season...He joined Curtis Granderson (2015), Tommie Agee (1969, 1970) and Michael Conforto (2017) as the only Mets to have 20 or more HR in the leadoff spot...Nimmo is the first Mets outfielder with 20 or more homers since 2019...He is batting .279 (48-172) with 11 doubles, one triple, two home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks with a .344 OBP against left-handed pitchers this year.

**RETURN OF THE BACH:** Daniel Vogelbach has recorded six home runs over his last 18 games...He is batting .288 (15-52) in that span with nine runs, 14 RBI, nine walks with a .413 OBP and a .635 SLG...He has posted an .825 OPS in 34 games following the All-Star break.

**MARINERS-METS NOTES:** The Mets will play the Mariners in back-to-back seasons for the first time in team history.

**OUCH:** Pete Alonso has been hit by 17 pitches this season, tied for first in the National League...Jeff McNeil (16 HBP) ranks third in the league...Brandon Nimmo and Francisco Lindor (10 HBP each) are tied for 13th in the NL...The Mets have been plunked 88 times this season, most in the NL and second only to the Mariners (96) in the majors...Alonso (68 career HBP) is the Mets' all-time leader in the category...Nimmo (67) ranks second and McNeil (66) is third.

**SENGA GENESIS:** Kodai Senga has recorded 176 strikeouts...He moved into third all-time for most strikeouts by a Mets rookie pitcher passing Noah Syndergaard (166), Jon Matlack (169) and Tom Seaver (170)...He is now three strikeouts shy of passing Jerry Koosman for second all-time for most strikeouts by a Mets rookie...Last night marked the first time a Mets rookie pitcher recorded back-to-back double-digit strikeout games since Noah Syndergaard did the trick from September 25 - October 3, 2015...Is the first Japanese-born rookie to accomplish the feat since Masahiro Tanaka did so from June 11 - 17, 2014... Courtesy of Elias.

**MAKE IT A DOZEN:** In his last start, Kodai Senga recorded a career-high-tying 12 strikeouts for the third time this season...He joined Dwight Gooden (six) as the only Mets rookie with three or more starts of 12 or more strikeouts...He also joined Hideo Nomo (five), Kerry Wood (five) and Spencer Strider (three) as the only rookies with three or more starts of 12 or more strikeouts in the Wild Card Era (Since 1995).

**THIS IS ALMOST 40:** Pete Alonso is third in the majors and second in the National League with 39 home runs...Alonso is one home run shy of recording his third season of 40 or more home runs...He socked 53 in 2019 and 40 last season...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...Since he entered the league in 2019, only two other players have recorded multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs (Shohei Ohtani and Mike Trout)... Only one active player (Nelson Cruz, four) has more than three 40-HR seasons...Alonso's 185 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...With one more long ball, he'll become the fifth player in MLB history with three or more seasons with 40+ home runs in a player's first five years...He would join Ralph Kiner (4), Ryan Howard (3), Albert Pujols (3) and Eddie Matthews (3).

**THE ROAD TO 100:** Pete Alonso is fifth in the majors and is third in the NL with 96 RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...He is seeking to become the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.

**THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY:** On this day in 1986, Bobby Ojeda threw a complete game as the Mets defeated the Giants, 4-2, at Shea Stadium...Ojeda allowed both runs on three hits with one walk and struck out seven...He improved to 16-4 with a 2.63 ERA...New York scored twice in the first and never looked back as they improved to 89-44 on the year.

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** Kevin Parada socked a three-run home run in the seventh inning to lead the Binghamton Rumble Ponies to their season-high sixth-straight win, a 3-0 victory over the Harrisburg Senators on Saturday... Right-hander Jordan Geber made the first start of his Double-A career and shined...He threw six scoreless frames with four strikeouts, while allowing three hits and no walks... Binghamton has now won 12 of its last 14 games and over the last four games, Ponies' pitching has combined for 49 strikeouts and just seven walks.

**MEGILL NEWS & NOTES**

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed one run over 6.0 innings on August 28 vs. Texas...Struck out a season-high eight batters, the most he has had in a start since recording nine strikeouts on May 4, 2022 vs. Atlanta...Recorded his first quality start since June 16 vs. St. Louis.

**ADD ANOTHER ONE TO THE LIST:** Today, Megill will face the Seattle Mariners for the first time in his career...The Mariners mark the 22nd opponent that Megill has faced in his career and the ninth from the American League...In nine career Interleague games (eight starts), Megill is 3-1 with a 3.73 ERA (17 ER/41.0 IP)

**NO PLACE LIKE NEW YORK:** This season, Megill is 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA (20 ER/55.0 IP) in 10 home starts this season...In 10 road starts this season, Megill is 2-5 with a 7.93 ERA (37 ER/42.0 IP)...In 26 career home games (24 starts), Megill is 9-5 with a 4.01 ERA (56 ER/125.2 IP) and in 27 career road games (23 starts), Megill is 6-10 with a 6.06 ERA (73 ER/108.1 IP).

**THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY:** On April 7, the Mets home opener vs. Miami, Megill threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.

**COMBINED NO-NO:** Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodriguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen.

**2022 RECAP:** Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

**OPENOR:** Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

**RUNS IN THE FAMILY:** His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021...According to Elias, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

**TUESDAY'S STARTER: LHP JOSÉ QUINTANA (1-5, 3.26)**

**LAST TIME OUT:** Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings on August 29 vs. Texas...Allowed three hits, issued three walks and struck out five batters...Has six quality starts through his first eight starts of the season.

**LIMITING THE LONG BALL:** Since the start of the 2022 season, Quintana has allowed nine homers, the fewest during that span (Min. 150 IP)...From August 4, 2022 - August 17, 2023, Quintana did not allow a homer over 97.1 consecutive innings...It was the longest homerless inning streak since Tyson Ross tossed 100.0 homerless innings in 2015...Courtesy of Elias

- Was named NL Rookie of the Month for July...Had eight home runs, 16 RBI, 14 runs scored and a .974 OPS during the month and tied for fourth in the majors in home runs.
- Homered in consecutive games for the fifth time this season, July 29 and August 1.
- Joins Pete Alonso (53, 2019) and Darryl Strawberry (26, 1983) as the only Mets rookies to have 20 or more home runs in a season...Became the 11th rookie catcher in major league history with 20 or more homers in a season.
- His 21 homers this season are tied for the second-most by any catcher in the majors and tied for fourth among all rookies.
- His 22 career homers before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Johnny Bench had 42 from 1967-1969.
- Owns the Mets franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher...Hit a solo home run on July 1 vs. San Francisco, his first since June 10, to tie Travis d'Arnaud's franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher...Had his second multi-homer game of the season on June 8 at Atlanta.
- Had his third multi-homer game of the season on July 18 vs. Chicago-AL...Pete Alonso and Darryl Strawberry (four) are the only Mets rookies with more... Only three other Mets have had more than one multi-homer game before turning 22: Darryl Strawberry (four), Ed Kranepool (three) and José Reyes (two)...
