**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets defeated the Marlins, 5-2, yesterday... New York is looking for their first sweep of the season...The Mets continue their six game homestand against the Marlins (2-0) and Padres (three games).

**HAPPY EASTER:** The Mets own a 16-22 record on Easter.

**IT TAKES TWO:** The Mets have won their first two home games of the season for the first time since 2018...It is the 12th time in franchise history the Mets have won their first two home games of the season... The Mets have sold out their first two games at Citi Field, marking the first time in the history of the ballpark that the first two games of the year have been sellouts.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY, THERE IS SUCH THING:** David Robertson celebrates his 38th birthday today...In four games this season, Robertson has allowed only one hit, struck out four and notched two saves...Robertson has recorded 159 career saves, which is the seventh-most by an active player...Six Mets have recorded a save on their birthday, Billy Wagner (7/25/07), Grant Roberts (9/13/03), John Franco (9/17/91 - G2), Jesse Orosco (4/21/87) and Ken Sanders (7/8/75).

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY!:** Bullpen Catcher Eric Langill celebrates his birthday today...The native of Kirkland, Canada joined the Mets in June of 2011 and is in his 12th season as a bullpen catcher.

**REVOLUTION NO. 9:** The Mets have yet to commit an error this season... This sets a franchise record for the longest the team has gone without committing an error...The previous high was the 1985 Mets, who did not commit an error in their first seven games...Last year, the San Diego Padres did not commit an error in their first 17 games to start the season, which was the longest time since 1900.

**C IS FOR COOKIE:** Carlos Carrasco is set to make his second start of the season today...In 10 career starts against the Marlins, Carrasco is 5-1 with a 2.63 ERA (16 ER/54.2 IP) with 10 walks and 56 strikeouts...He is set to make his 25th career start at Citi Field where he is 9-5 with a 4.15 ERA (56 ER/121.1 IP) with 39 walks and 119 punchouts...In 17 starts at the ballpark in 2022, Carrasco went 9-3 with a 3.56 ERA (36 ER/91.0 IP) with 29 walks and 92 strikeouts.

**THREE'S COMPANY:** Pete Alonso has homered in three straight games for the fourth time in his career (last: September 24- September 27)... Alonso homered in a career-best four straight games from August 5 - August 9, 2019.

**HIGH FIVE:** Alonso has five home runs this season through nine games, tied with John Buck (2013) Jeff Kent (1994) and Darryl Strawberry (1987) for the second-most by a Met in their first nine games of the season... Dave Kingman owns the franchise record for most home runs through the first nine games of the season with seven.

**THE EAST IS A BEAST:** The Mets are 5-1 against the division this year...The team went 50-26 against the East in 2022...Their .658 winning percentage against the East was the best mark in club history...They lost only three series in the division all season long (against Atlanta, August 15-18, Washington, September 2-4 and September 30-October 2 at Atlanta)...They won the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...Overall, the Mets posted a 3.38 ERA against the East, while hitting .262/.335/.425...The Mets outscored their divisional opponents, 380-272.

**MARLINS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 78-53 against the Marlins since Citi Field opened in 2009.

**FISH FOOD:** After winning the first two games of this series, the Mets are looking to sweep the Marlins in a three-game series for the first time since July 29-31, 2022 at Miami...The last time the Mets swept a series from a Marlins in New York was a four-game series (August 5-7, 2019).

**LET'S GO FISHING:** The Mets are 5-1 against the Marlins this season... Tommy Pham is a .295/.372/.485 hitter with 29 runs, eight doubles, a triple, 21 RBI and 14 walks in 28 career games against the Marlins...Starling Marte has hit .288/.344/.423 with 34 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, four homers and 15 RBI in 53 career games against the Fish...Francisco Lindor has socked 10 home runs against the club, while Brandon Nimmo has hit nine...Alonso has smashed 25 home runs in his career against Miami, the third-most among active players and tied for the 12th-most all-time... Is the most in the majors against any one single opponent since 2019.

**SCARY STUFF:** Kodai Senga has 14 strikeouts in the first two starts of his career, tied with Steven Matz for the second-most by a Met to begin their major league career...His 14 strikeouts are tied with Daisuke Matsuzaka for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born player in their first two major league career starts...Masahiro Tanaka has the most strikeouts by a Japanese-born player in their first two career major league starts with 18...Senga has won his first two career starts and is the fourth player in Mets history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts joining Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to earn the win in their first two career major league starts.

**WALKING THE WALK:** The Mets drew three more walks yesterday and now rank second in the majors with 43 free passes this season...Brandon Nimmo ranks second in the majors with 10 walks, while Francisco Lindor is tied for eighth with seven...The Mets have recorded two walks with the bases loaded this season, which is the third-most in the majors...In 2022, the team drew 10.

**THE LEFT OF US:** Brandon Nimmo hit .264/.358/.428 with 24 walks and a .786 OPS in 234 plate appearances against left-handed pitchers last season...Since 2022, his 21 extra-base hits as a lefty against left-handed pitchers is tied for the fourth-most in the majors.

**CITI SLICKERS:** The Mets are now 2-0 at Citi Field this year...The team won 54 games at home last year...That their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26...Overall, the Mets went 54-27 at Citi Field...The team's .667 winning percentage was the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage.

**DAY MAN!:** The Mets are 5-2 in day games this year...In 2022, the Mets went 39-19 in day games...The team's .672 winning percentage in the sunlight was the second-best in the National League and third-best in the majors...The Mets posted a 3.16 ERA with 150 walks and 564 strikeouts in the daytime last year...Their 3.16 ERA in the daytime was third in the majors and second in the NL.

### CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Went 4.0 innings in his first start of the season on April 3 in Milwaukee...Allowed five runs on four walks and four hits, including one home run...Marked his third career loss against the Brewers.

**GONE FISHIN':** Carrasco has made 10 starts against the Marlins in his career and holds a 5-1 record in those appearances with a 2.63 ERA (16 ER/54.2 IP)...Has pitched to a 3.41 ERA (12 ER/31.2 IP) when facing Miami at home and is 4-1 in eight starts against the division rival in a Mets uniform...In his last start against Miami on September 27 at Citi Field, Carrasco pitched 3.0 innings and surrendered four runs on six hits...His most recent victory was on September 10 in Miami, during which he tallied six strikeouts in a one-run, 6.0-inning appearance... Has tallied 56 strikeouts against Marlins hitters.

**2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS:** Recorded a 3.97 ERA (67 ER/152.0 IP) in his first full season with the Mets...Ended the season ranked tied fifth in the National League in wins with 15 and 11th in win percentage with .628...According to Baseball Savant, excelled in chase rate in the 94th percentile for MLB...Locked it down in July with a 0.90 ERA (3 ER/30.0 IP) in five starts that month, tallying three wins and 27 strikeouts...The slider and changeup were effective pitches for Carrasco in 2022, with a 35.5 and 31.6 whiff percentage and 26.2 and 21.8 put away percentage, respectively.

**CLUTCH COOKIE:** Did not allow a run in 22.2 straight innings from July 14-August 4, surpassing his previous career-long scoreless streak of 22.0 innings from July 30-August 11, 2015...He threw three straight scoreless starts for the first time in his career from July 14-30...He had three scoreless innings streaks of at least 10.0 innings in a single season for the first time since 2018 (also, 12.2 innings from April 27-May 10 & 10.2 innings from April 10-21)...Allowed three earned runs or fewer in a career-high 12 consecutive starts from July 3-September 20, posting a 2.42 ERA (17 earned runs/63.1 innings) in that span...Marked his best ERA in a 12-start span since July 27-September 30, 2018 (2.30 ERA).

**WINNER, WINNER:** Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 at Miami after tossing 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...His 15 wins were tied for the eighth-most in the majors...He was the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joined Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017...Won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Was the first Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season since Zack Wheeler won seven from July 14-August 25, 2017.

**MILESTONES & MORE:** Heading into the 2023 campaign, Carrasco is nearing 1500.0 career innings with 1452.0...Is also on the precipice of 300 games and 250 starts with 284 and 237, respectively. Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts last year, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.

**VENEZUELAN BORN:** Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...Is one of 16 active pitchers with 100 career victories...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400.0 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego.

**SPRING IN HIS STEP:** Made four starts in spring exhibition play, three of which were at home...Posted a 4.15 ERA (6 ER/13.0 IP) with 14 strikeouts over those four starts...Carrasco's best appearance of Spring Training was his last on March 17 against the Marlins, in which he tallied seven punchouts in his lone Grapefruit League win...Ended exhibition play with a 1.08 WHIP and a .240 opponent's batting average.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (1-1, 6.35)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Suffered the loss in Milwaukee to even his record to 1-1 on the season...Allowed five runs over 5.1 innings on eight hits, two walks and two strikeouts...He threw 95 pitches, 64 of which were strikes.

**DOUBLE THE FUN:** Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...His next 10+ K game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).
