SNAKES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 33-23 against the Dbacks at Citi Field...New York has not last the season series against Arizona each season since 2017.

STRIKE THAT: Nolan McLean has recorded 69 strikeouts through his first 10 career starts, which is fifth in franchise history behind Dwight Gooden (80), Nolan Ryan (74), Matt Harvey (70) and Kodai Senga (70).

HERE'S THE PITCH: The Mets are fourth in the Majors and second in the National League with a 2.90 ERA (36 ER/111.2 IP)...The Mets bullpen has posted a 1.71 ERA (9 ER/47.1 IP), which is third in the Majors and second in the National League...Only the Braves have a lower ERA at 0.82 ERA (4 ER/44.0 IP).

DREAM WEAVER: Luke Weaver earned his victory with the Mets on Tuesday...He has not allowed a run, surrendering only one hit, tow walks and striking out three over 5.0 innings.

IN GOOD COMPANY: Nolan McLean and Paul Skenes are the only two pitchers in Major League history that have struck out 69 batters and allowed fewer than 14 earned runs through their first 10 career starts...McLean has gone 6-1 with a 2.16 ERA (14 ER/58.1 IP) with 20 walks and 69 strikeouts in his first 10 starts...Skenes went 5-0 with a 2.12 ERA (14 ER/59.1 IP) with 12 walks and 78 strikeouts during his first 10 starts.

BROOKS AND DONE: Brooks Raley has yet to allow a run through his first five appearances of the season (4.2 IP)...Since returning from "Tommy John" surgery on July 19 2025, has pitched to a 2.08 ERA (7 ER/30.1 IP)...Has not allowed a home run over his last 51.2 innings dating back to August 15, 2023...His streak of 51.2 innings without allowing a home run is the third-longest active streak in the Majors...Only the Pittsburgh's Carmen Mlodzinski (55.2 IP) and Boston's Garrett Whitlock (54.2 IP) have a longer streak...Courtesy of Elias.

FRANKLY SPEAKING: Last night, Francisco Alvarez singled in the fifth inning...He has now hit safely in each of his last five games...This season he is batting .300 (9-30) with a 1.033 OPS...In 14 career games against Arizona, he is batting .298 (14-47).

WE REMEMBER: The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship...From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

IN A PINCH: The Mets have recorded an MLB leading seven RBI from their pinch-hitters this season...In 2025, the Mets recorded a total of nine RBI from their pinch-hitters...Overall this year, Mets pinch hitters are batting .444 (4-9) with two runs, one double, one home run and seven RBI...Their .444 average leads the Majors.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets were rained out on this day in 1986...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at Mets.com/1986.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: Over the last five games, the Mets have scored 30 runs on 56 hits with 10 doubles, four home runs, 27 RBI, 15 walks, five steals, a .350 OBP, and a .4ww SLG...This compares to a total of 25 runs on 49 hits over their first seven games of the season.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his first win of the season after allowing one earned run and striking out four through 5.1 innings on April 3 at San Francisco (5.1 IP, H, 2 R, ER, 2 BB, 4 K)...He was perfect through 5.0 innings, and the last Mets pitcher to retire each of their first 15 batters faced was Sean Manaea on August 21, 2024, vs. Baltimore, when he retired the first 17 batters he faced...The last pitcher in the majors to retire each of their first 15 batters in one of their first 10 career starts was Bubba Chandler of Pittsburgh, who did so in his second career start on September 13, 2025 at Washington...Per *Elias*.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 10 career starts, McLean is 6-1 with a 2.16 ERA (14 ER/58.1 IP) and 69 strikeouts...His ERA is the second-best in franchise history through a player's first 10 career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.94 ERA from 1981-1987...His 69 strikeouts rank fifth in franchise history through a pitcher's first 10 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 80, Nolan Ryan's 74, Kodai Senga's 70, and Matt Harvey's 70...Per *Elias*...He is only one of two pitchers in Major League History to record at least 69 strikeouts and allow 14 or fewer earned runs through their first 10 career Major League starts (also: Paule Skenes 78 K's and 14 ER).

IN THE CITI: Has made five career starts at Citi Field, and he has a 0.92 ERA (3 ER/29.1 IP) in those starts...His ERA is the best in Mets home history through five starts, with the next best being Kodai Senga's 1.20 ERA (min. 25.0 IP)...He has struck out at least six batters in all of those starts...His first three home starts were scoreless and he became the first Met pitcher to not allow a run in their first three career starts at home and the seventh pitcher in Major League history not to allow a run in each of their first three home starts (min. 15.0 IP)...His 19.1 inning scoreless streak at home is the longest to start a career since Robert Suarez didn't allow a run through all 24.0 innings he threw at home during the 2022 season...Per *Elias*.

ROOKIE SENSATION: McLean was called up to the Majors on August 16, 2025, and he finished the season with the big-league club...Last season he made eight starts for the Mets, and he finished 5-1 with a 2.06 ERA (11 ER/48.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts...The Mets went 6-2 as a team in games started by McLean...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.68 ERA and Rick Aguiera's 1.92 ERA...His 57 strikeouts are the third-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first eight career games, only trailing Nolan Ryan's 64 and Dwight Gooden's 59...He became the first pitcher in Major League history to throw at least 5.0 innings, strikeout five or more, and allow two or fewer earned runs in each of his first seven career starts...He is one of four players in Major League history to record 57 or more strikeouts and allow 11 or fewer earned runs through their first eight career games...He joins Nolan Ryan, Stephen Strasburg, and Paul Skenes as the only other pitchers to do so...Because McLean threw less than 50.0 innings last season, he is still considered a rookie under MLB's eligibility criteria...He enters the season as the No. 6 prospect in all of baseball, the No. 1 pitching prospect in baseball, and the No. 1 prospect in the Mets system according to *MLBPipeline.com*.

MC-USA: He represented the USA in the WBC...He made two starts and he finished with a 5.87 ERA (5 ER/7.2 IP) with eight strikeouts...He held opposing batters to a .222 (6-27) batting average during the event...He got the ball in the championship game vs. Venezuela on March 17 and he tossed 4.2 innings and allowed two earned runs while striking out four.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Made his Major League debut on August 16 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joined Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and Collin McHugh (9)...Became the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh).

SPIN THAT THING: Last season, McLean threw his sweeper 25.7% of the time and his curveball 15.8% of the time...His curveball averaged a league-leading 3,248 RPM, the highest on any pitch last season (min. 500 pitches)...He generated a 20.3 whiff rate on his sweeper and a 50.0% whiff rate on his curveball...His 50.0% whiff rate on his curveball is the sixth-best among pitchers who have thrown their curveball at least 100 times...25 of his strikeouts this season have come via the curveball/sweeper...In at-bats ending with his curveball, opposing batters are hitting .074 (2-27).

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Last season, he appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguers at the time of his callup...He only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances prior to being called up...Overall from 2023-2025, he made 48 minor league appearances (44 starts) and finished 12-15 with a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and 245 strikeouts.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished his career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 home runs...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.

- Earned his first win of the season after tossing 1.1 scoreless innings on April 5 at San Francisco (1.1 IP)...Since the start of last year, he has recorded four or more outs without allowing an earned run in 16 relief appearances, which is tied for the eighth-most appearances among NL relievers.
- Has made nine career appearances (one start) against Arizona and he hasn't allowed a run over 9.1 innings pitched...He has recorded eight strikeouts and held Diamondbacks batters to a .100 (3-30) batting average.

- Since joining the Mets in 2024, he has made 36 appearances (two starts) at Citi Field...In those contests, he is 3-1 with eight holds, a 3.27 ERA (15 ER/41.1 IP) and 34 strikeouts.
- Threw a scoreless seventh inning on April 3 at San Francisco (1.0 IP, H, K)...Dating back to last season, each of his last eight appearances has been scoreless.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Appeared in three Grapefruit League games and he threw 3.0 scoreless innings...He struck out five of the 11 batters he faced during the spring.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.
