**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the A's, 3-1, yesterday in California... They have won eight of their last 11 games...The Mets are in the midst of their second road trip of the year, a six-game road trip (1-1) against the A's (1-1) and Twins (three games).

**SERIES-LY SPEAKING:** The Mets are seeking their fourth straight series victory and their second on the road...After dropping the opening Series, the Mets have won each of their last three series.

**SENGA GENESIS:** Through Kodai Senga's first 32 career starts he has posted 223 strikeouts which is the 10th-most through a pitchers first 32 starts in major league history...It is the fourth most by a Met, trailing Dwight Gooden (First, 282), Matt Harvey (sixth, 242) and Noah Syndergaard (ninth, 231)...It is also the third-most among Japanese-born pitchers in that span, trailing only Hideo Nomo (267) and Yu Darvish (249).

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso had his hitting streak snapped at five-games yesterday...He hit .588 (10-17) with two runs, four doubles, one home run, eight RBI with a .636 OBP, 1.000 SLG and a 1.636 OPS in that span...He has safely hit in seven of his last nine games.

**THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE:** This year marked the first time in franchise history that the Mets open their home and road schedule against an Interleague Opponent...The Mets are 5-3 in Interleague Play this season... The team went 24-22 in Interleague play last year...Overall, New York owns a 283-279 record in Interleague play.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** New York hits the road for the second time this season...The Mets are 4-4 on the road this year...Last year, the Mets finished the season going 43-38 away from Citi Field...The Mets surpassed their road win total of 2023 (32-49)...The Mets hit .254/.316/.416 on the road last year... They ranked seventh in the majors in AVG and SLG and were 10th in OBP.

**HERE'S THE PITCH:** The Mets lead the majors with a 2.47 ERA (34 ER/124.0 IP)...They have struck out 132 this season, which is tied for the sixth-most in the majors and is third-most in the NL.

**STARTING OFF:** The Mets starting staff has posted an MLB-best 2.80 ERA (22 ER/70.2 IP)...They have struck out 79, which is the sixth-most in the majors and third in the majors.

**THE PEN IS MIGHTIER:** Mets relievers have combined to post a 2.03 ERA (12 ER/53.1IP) this season...That is the third-best mark in the majors...New York relievers have stranded 21 of 26 inherited runners (19.2 percent) the third-best mark in the majors (min. five inherited runners).

**A'S-METS NOTES:** The Mets head to California to face the A's on the road for the first time since 2023...The Mets have won six of their last eight against the A's in California.

**MAX POWER:** Max Kranick owns a career-high scoreless inning streak of 14.0 IP (since: 5/7/22 at CIN with PIT), including 9.0 innings pitched this season... He has held opponents to a .068 on-base percentage (2-29, 0 BB) which is the best in the majors among relief pitchers (min. 25 BF)...He has not issued a walk to any of his 29 batters faced and is one of 10 pitchers in the majors this season to not issue a walk and face at least 25 batters.

**THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY:** On this day in 1967, Tom Seaver made his major league debut...He allowed two earned runs on six hits with four walks and struck out eight over 5.1 innings...Seaver was a three-time Cy Young award winner and ranks first in club history in wins (198), ERA (2.57) and strikeouts (2,541)...He was lected to the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1992 with 311 career wins and a record 98.84% of the vote...His 41 was the third Mets number retired (1988).

**ALMOST ALWAYS JUAN:** Juan Soto has reached base safely in 13 of his 14 games as a Met...Overall, he is batting .265 (13-49) with 12 runs, four doubles, one home run, four RBI, 12 walks with a .818 OPS and a 140 OPS+.

**WE REMEMBER:** The New York Mets announced that the team will wear a tribute uniform patch all season long to honor Mets Hall of Famer Ed Kranepool...Kranepool passed away on September 8, 2024, at age 79... Kranepool played for the Mets from 1962-1979, spending his entire 18-year career with the Mets...He was a member of the 1969 Miracle Mets, a 1965 All-Star and the club's all-time leader in games played...Kranepool remains in the Mets all-time top 10 in many statistical categories including plate appearances, hits, at-bats, total bases, doubles, RBI, walks and runs scored... He was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 1990.

**THE WRIGHT WAY:** On this day in 2006, David Wright went 3-5 with two runs, one home run and two RBI as the Mets defeated the Nationals, 13-4... Wright began that season on a eight-game hitting streak...On July 19, the New York Mets will retire No. 5 and induct David Wright into the Mets Hall of Fame...Wright will become the eighth player in franchise history to have his number retired by the Mets, joining Tom Seaver (#41), Mike Piazza (#31), Jerry Koosman (#36), Keith Hernandez (#17), Willie Mays (#24), Dwight Gooden (#16) and Darryl Strawberry (#18).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Senga earned his first win of the season after pitching 5.0 scoreless innings and striking out four batters against Miami on April 7...It was his fourth career game where he went at least 5.0 innings and didn't allow a run...Has allowed two earned runs or fewer in 10 straight games dating back to August 19, 2023, tied for the fifth-longest such streak by a Mets starting pitcher.

**2024 REWIND:** He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

**GHOSTING THE BATS:** In 2023 Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average...In Senga's first two starts of the 2025 season, he has picked up seven of his 12 strikeouts on the "ghost fork" and generated a 43.5 % whiff rate.

**VS. ATHLETICS:** Senga has one previous start against the Athletics, working 4.2 innings and allowing four runs on seven hits with four walks and seven strikeouts in the Mets 17-6 win on April 14, 2023.

**SPRING TRAINING:** Senga made three starts in Grapefruit League action and he finished with a 2.00 ERA (2 ER/9.0 IP) and nine strikeouts...His last spring outing was March 20 against the Nationals, and he struck out six batters over 3.2 innings of work.

**SENGA GENESIS:** Through Senga's first 32 career starts he has posted 223 strikeouts which is the 10th-most through a pitchers first 32 starts in major league history...It is the fourth most by a Met, trailing Dwight Gooden (First, 282), Matt Harvey (sixth, 242) and Noah Syndergaard (ninth, 231)...It is also the third-most among Japanese-born pitchers in that span, trailing only Hideo Nomo (267) and Yu Darvish (249).

**CRUISING AT CITI:** In 18 career games at Citi Field, he has gone 8-3 with a 2.35 ERA (27 ER/103.1 IP), which is the sixth best in the history of the ballpark (min. 90.0 IP)...He has allowed just nine home runs to 418 batters faced, recording a 0.78 HR/9.0IP ratio at home...His 11.93 K/9.0IP is the second-highest among pitchers at Citi Field behind Edwin Diaz's 15.30 K/9.0IP clip (min. 400 BF).

**REMARKABLE ROOKIE:** During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967).

**KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST:** In 2023, Senga finished second in the NL and fifth in the majors among qualifiers in ERA...His 202 strikeouts were the tied for the eighth-most in the NL and tied for the 14th-most in the majors...Senga held opposing batters to a .208 average, the third-lowest mark among qualifiers in the NL and the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...His 10.93 K/9 rate was the fifth-best mark among qualified major league pitchers in 2023...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

**HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

**METS-JAPAN CONNECTION:** Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

- Threw a scoreless inning in relief on April 9 against Miami...He has already thrown 9.1 innings this year which is tied for the sixth-most by a reliever this season.
- Pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on April 5 against Toronto, which at the time extended his career-high season-opening scoreless streak to 7.1 innings...He had retired 22 of his 26 batters faced during the streak (3 H, BB)...Was the 10th time in his career and second time this season that he has pitched at least 2.1 innings.
