STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their nine-game, 10-day road trip against the Rockies (2-0, one to play), Mariners (three to play), and Athletics (three to play) today at Coors Field...have won 11 of their last 15 games on the heels of a season-high five-game losing streak (July 12-19)...today's game marks the finale of a 20-game in-20-days span to begin the second half (July 17-Aug. 5) - they are 11-8 during the stretch...lead the AL with a 67-46 record, fourth in the majors...have spent 80 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including a season-high 37 consecutive days in first (June 27-pres)...the 80 total days leading their division are fifth most in MLB to the Dodgers (127), Braves (125), Guardians (95), and Brewers (95)...have held the best record in the AL outright for 78 of those days, already third most in team history behind 2023 (106) and 2021 (81), per Stats Perform...have held a lead between 1.5-3.5 games over the second-place Yankees at the conclusion of each day since the All-Star break (currently 3.5)...entered August in first place for the third time (excl. 2020), joining 2021 (63-42) and 2010 (64-39).

- ✦ The Rays took their series with Colorado with a 9-7 win in 11 innings...they earned their fourth series win in their last five tries and improved to 8-3-2 in their last 13 series (June 19-pres)...paired with July 20-23 at TOR...they have won back-to-back road series for the first time since April 27-May 13 (3 straight at CLE, BOS, TOR).
- ✦ They played two runs in the 9th inning to tie the game before grabbing the lead in the 11th...it marked the second time this season the Rays have won despite trailing after the 8th inning (also: April 16 at CWS)...it was their first extra-inning win since May 12 at TOR (7-6, 10 inn.).
- ✦ Per Elias, **Freddy Peralta** and **Liam Hicks** became the fifth starting battery pairing to each make their Rays debut in the same game, joining **Andy Sonnanstine/Raul Caranovia** (June 5, 2007 vs. TOR), **Jim Parque/Javier Valentin** (April 2, 2003), **Tony Saunders/Mike DiFelice** (April 2, 1998), and **Wilson Alvarez/John Flaherty** (March 31, 1998 vs. DET)...each of the 1998 instances came during the club's inaugural series against the Tigers at Tropicana Field.
- ✦ Hicks launched the Rays first grand slam of the season and the first of his career in the 3rd inning...it was the 99th grand slam in team history and the first since **Eversen Pereira** on Sept. 19, 2025 vs. BOS (see more in "Who Are You?" note below).
- ✦ **Yandy Diaz** double in the 11th inning last night marked his 310th extra-base hit in a Rays uniform, surpassing **Aubrey Huff** for the fifth most in team history.
- ✦ The Rays bullpen spun a season-high tying 7.1 scoreless frames (also: July 29 vs. TEX), yielding two hits (or fewer over 7.1 scoreless frames or more) for the sixth time in club history, first since exactly two years earlier on Aug. 4, 2024 at HOU (8.1IP, 2H).
- ✦ They improved to a season-high 21 games above .500, their first time reaching the mark since the conclusion of the 2023 season (99-63).
- ✦ Over their two games in Colorado, the Rays have allowed 16 runs, tied for the third most in team history over a two-game span in which they won both contests (also: May 17-18, 2013)...the only two spans they allowed more runs and won both games were between Sept. 6-7, 2021 (17R) and July 21-22, 2006 (19R).

STARTING YOUR BIRTHDAY RIGHT—Today's probable starter, **Nick Martinez**, is celebrating his 36th birthday today...he is set to become the 16th Rays pitcher (18x) to start on his birthday (last: **Ryan Pepiot**, Aug. 21, 2024 at OAK)...he would be tied for the oldest pitcher franchise history to start on his birthday alongside **Corey Kluber** (April 10, 2022 vs. BAL)...he has made two previous starts on his birthday in 2024 at CIN (W, 5.0IP, 4H, OR, 5SO, HBP) and 2015 vs. HOU (W, 5.0IP, H, R, 3BB, SO)...he is one of 20 pitchers in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to have multiple wins as a starter on his birthday.

BROOM-FIELD—The Rays will look to claim their MLB-best 11th sweep today and third on the road (also: June 30-July 2 at KC & April 14-16 at CWS)...11 sweeps would mark the fourth most in a single season in Rays history (see table on the right) and their second most in franchise history before the calendar flips to September (2021, 13x)...it would be the third time the Rays have swept the Rockies in franchise history (Aug. 22-24, 2023 & July 11-13, 2004) and the first time they have turned the trick at Coors Field.

WHO ARE YOU?—With his first career grand slam last night, **Liam Hicks** became the first Rays player to launch a grand slam in his team debut and the first player to turn the trick in the majors since **ATL Dominic Smith** on March 28 vs. KC...per Elias, he became the first Rays backstop in team history to have multiple extra-base hits in his first start for the club and the fifth player in franchise history...the last player to have a grand slam and two extra-base hits or more in their first game with a franchise was SF **Alex Dickerson**, June 21, 2019 at AZ (3B, GS)...he equaled a career-high 4 RBI with the lone swing (4x, last: April 1, 2026 vs. CWS).

BAKER THE SAVE MAKER—**Bryan Baker** converted his 21st straight save opportunity last night to earn his MLB-best 32nd save, more than 19 major league clubs have as a team this season...the 21-save streak is tied for the second longest in franchise history (see table on the right) and is MLB's second-longest active streak behind TOR **Louis Varland** (24)...Baker has earned a save in six of the Rays last seven wins and seven of their last nine (July 22-pres)...min. 25.0 IP...he leads the majors with a 0.35 ERA (26.0IP, 1SR) and .115 (10-for-87) opp. average since the 21-save streak began on May 17, and only **MIL Jacob deGrom** (0.62) has a better WHIP than Baker (0.65) in that time...he has worked a season-high-tying 13 straight scoreless outings (June 27-pres), matching May 17-June 21...it marks the second-longest streak of his career behind a 15-appearance stretch from April 2-May 4, 2023 and the second longest by a Ray this season behind **Kevin Kelly**'s 14-appearance span from April 22-May 13.

- ✦ Baker is attempting to join **Alex Colomé** (2017, 47) as the only Rays pitchers to lead the majors in saves over a full season...he's already the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point from Aug. 1 on, joining **Colome**, **Fernando Rodney** (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and **Roberto Hernandez** (1997, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform.
- ✦ The Rays have won each of the last 19 games Baker has pitched in, the fourth-longest streak in a pitcher's outings in team history, trailing **Emilio Pagan** (25G, 2019), **Soriano**, (24G, 2010), and **Percival** (24G, 2008)...across the season, the Rays are 41-5 when he pitches.
- ✦ Collectively, the Rays have recorded an MLB-leading 45 saves, their second most through 113 games in club history (2015, 46 SV)...that's good for a pace of 65 saves over a 162-game season, which would establish a team record and mark the third-highest total by any club since saves became an official statistic in 1969, trailing the 1990 White Sox (68) and 2008 Angels (66).
- ✦ The Rays own the majors' best winning pct. in games decided by three runs or fewer (.652/43-23).

LIVE BY THE LONG BALL—The Rays are an MLB-best 32-1 when out-homer their opponent, 19-10 when home runs are even, and 16-35 when being out-homered...per Stats Perform, the Rays .970 winning pct. when out-homering opponents is on pace to be the second best in the modern era, trailing the undefeated 1903 New York Highlanders (16-0), and the best by any team with at least 30 such games, outpacing the 1994 Montreal Expos (.94-2/247)...the Rays have won 19 consecutive games when out-homering the opposition since their lone loss on May 25 vs. BAL (13 inn.)...snapped the a 10-game losing streak last night when being out-homered...they have dropped 22 of 28 contests they have been out-homered in since May 25...on the season, they have not lost a nine-inning game in which they tallied more home runs than their opponent (30-0)...after going without a long ball in five of six games from July 22-28, the Rays have plated 16 of their 29 runs over the last seven games via 9 HR.

- ✦ They are 27-5 in multi-homer games, including six straight wins (July 20-pres.), and 17-1 when recording multiple long balls at Tropicana Field, with the only loss coming on June 1 vs. DET (10-9).
- ✦ Over their last 35 games since June 25, the Rays pace the AL in multi-homer efforts (17) and are second behind the Tigers (54) for the most home runs in the AL over that span.

LA MÁXIMA—**Junior Caminero** launched his 31st and 32nd home runs of the season Mon, at COL, his third multi-home run game of the season and the seventh of his career...he tied **Greg Vaughn**, **Fred McGriff**, and **Randy Arozarena** for the fourth most multi-home run games in franchise history...he is one shy of tying **Brandon Lowe** (8)...his three multi-HR games are one shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Caminero, 2025; B. Lowe, 2021; **Carlos Peña**, 2009 & 2007; **Jorge Cantu**, 2005)...his first blast moved him passed **Kevin Kiermaier** (82) for the 11th-most homers in franchise history...he is one shy of tying Arozarena (85) for 10th most.

- ✦ His pair of home runs marked the 76th and 77th home runs between his age-21 and age-22 seasons (2025-26; age as of June 30), surpassing NYY **Joe DiMaggio** (75) for second most in the modern era (since 1900) behind MLN **Eddie Mathews** (87).
- ✦ He is pacing for 46 HR—if he were to reach that mark, he would become the first player in team history with multiple 40-HR seasons and join Mathews (1953-54) as the only players in the modern era with multiple such seasons before their age-23 campaign...he would also tie **Carlos Peña**'s single-season franchise record (2007).

THE ROCK SHOW—The Rays and Rockies conclude their three-game set at Coors Field today...this series marked the seventh time in franchise history the Rays have visited the Mile High City...the clubs kicked off the 2025 season against each other at Steinbrenner Field, with the Rays taking two of three contests...dating back to 2013, the Rays have claimed seven straight series over the Rockies, going 15-5 during that stretch...they are 8-3-0 all-time in sets against the Rockies, with their last series defeat coming between June 16-18, 2009 (1-2).

TODAY'S START—Nick Martinez will make his 22nd start with the Rays and 10th on the road...marks his 151st career start (302G) and seventh start (17G) opposite the Rockies...signed as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026.

- ★ Ranks fourth among AL qualifiers with a 2.77 ERA (123.1IP, 38ER) behind NYY Cam Schlittler (2.26), TOR Dylan Cease (2.41), and CLE Parker Messick (2.57), and is 10th in the majors...his .769 winning pct. this year is sixth among MLB qualifiers and second in the AL behind BOS Sonny Gray (.867).
- ★ 11 of his 21 starts this season have been quality...with a quality start today, he would tie Drew Rasmussen for the club lead and record his second most in a single season, behind 2015 (13QS).
- ★ Is one of six AL pitchers with double-digit wins this season, alongside Gray (13), CLE Gavin Williams (11), TEX Nathan Eovaldi (10), Schlittler (10), and teammate Drew Rasmussen (10).
- ★ Is celebrating his 36th birthday today...he is set to become the 16th Rays pitcher (18x) to start on his birthday (last: Ryan Pepiot, Aug. 21, 2024 at OAK)...he would be tied for the oldest pitcher franchise history to start on his birthday alongside Corey Kluber (April 10, 2022 vs. BAL)...he has made two previous starts on his birthday in 2024 at CIN (W, 5.0IP, 4H, 0R, 5SO, HBP) and 2015 vs. HOU (W, 5.0IP, H, R, 3BB, SO)...he is one of 20 pitchers in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to have multiple wins as a starter on his birthday.

LAST TIME OUT—Received his third loss of the season after allowing a career-high four home runs and matching a season high with six earned runs over 6.0 innings in a 6-1 loss on July 31 vs. CWS (6.0IP, 7H, 6ER, 4HR, 2SO)...allowed solo home runs to Miguel Vargas and Andrew Benintendi before yielding a two-run shot to Munetaka Murakami in the 3rd inning...set down each of the next eight batters before allowing the final blast, a two-run shot to Colson Montgomery in the 6th inning.

- MARTINEZ IN THE MOUNTAINS**—The veteran right-hander is slated to make his seventh career start (17G) against the Rockies, his first start since July 13, 2025 vs. COL (W, 5.1IP, 5H, 2R, BB, 3SO)...in his six career starts he has gone 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (30.0IP, 18ER), 23 strikeouts, and 10 walks...he has made three starts at Coors Field in his career, with a 0-0 record, 8.25 ERA (12.0IP, 11ER), and a .314 (16-for-51) opp. average.
- ★ Martinez is 11-10 with a 3.87 ERA (186.0IP, 80ER) and 162 strikeouts in 65 career appearances (21 starts) vs. NL West foes...is 5-7 with a 4.36 ERA (115.2IP, 56ER) and 93 strikeouts as a starter...is 1-0 with a 3.27 ERA (11.0IP, 4ER) in two starts against the division this season, allowing three runs or fewer in both outings.
 - ★ Martinez has fashioned a 2.55 ERA (42.1IP, 12ER) in games against NL opponents this season, the fifth-lowest mark among AL pitchers in 2026 (min. 40.0IP).

OUT ON TOUR—In nine starts on the road this season, Martinez has gone 3-1 with a 2.05 ERA (52.2IP, 12ER) , 27 strikeouts, a 1.08 WHIP, and a .240 (48-for-200) opp. average...min. 50.0IP, his road ERA ranks fifth among major league pitchers...he has surrendered one or zero runs in six of the nine outings and in five of his last six, pitching to a 1.78 ERA (35.1IP, 7ER) in that span (April 28 at CLE).

- START ME UP**—When pitching in the 1st inning this season, Martinez has logged a 1.29 ERA (21.0IP, 3ER) with 14 strikeouts and a .197 opp. average (15-for-76)...his ERA in the opening frame is the sixth-lowest mark in the AL (min. 15.0IP).
- ★ In his career, he has turned in a 3.17 ERA (150.1IP, 53ER) with 110 strikeouts and a .233 opp. average (133-for-570) in the 1st inning...marks his lowest ERA and opp. batting average of any of the first seven frames.

- HE'S A SAVANT**—Martinez ranks highly in multiple MLB pitching rankings, according to Baseball Savant...his Offspeed Run Value (8) is in the 98th percentile and his Pitching Run Value (11) is in the 85th percentile, an improvement from his -2 Pitching Run Value and -2 Offspeed Run Value in 2025.
- ★ Since the start of 2023, Martinez's 32.3 pct. hard-hit rate is fifth lowest in the majors (min. 1,000BF) behind NYY Ryan Hardbrough (29.3), TOR Tyler Rogers (29.9), LAA/ATL Brent Suter (30.1), and LAD Tanner Scott (32.2).
 - ★ Opposing hitters have an average exit velocity of 86.8 mph since the beginning of 2023, fourth lowest in the majors during that span (min. 1,000BF) behind LAA Kyle Hendricks (85.8), NYY Max Fried (86.6), and SD Michael King (86.7).

WALK OF LIFE—Since the start of 2024, Martinez has issued only 80 walks, recording the fourth-fewest walks per 9.0 innings (1.67) in the majors during that stretch (min. 250.0IP)...the veteran right-hander trails only DET/LAD Tarik Skubal (1.54), SEA Bryan Woo (1.58), and SEA George Kirby (1.58) during that span...min. 100.0 IP this season, his 1.46 walks per 9.0 innings ranks second in the majors, behind Skubal (1.40).

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTER AT SEATTLE MARINERS: RHP DREW RASMUSSEN [9-5, 3.07]

LAST TIME OUT—Spun 6.0 scoreless frames with four hits, one walk, and one hit batter on Aug. 1 vs. CWS...marked his 12th quality start and his seventh scoreless start of the campaign...he has spun 13.0 consecutive scoreless frames dating back to July 26.

vs. MARINERS—Rasmussen has faced the Mariners six times in his career (five starts) with his last outing coming on Sept. 2, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field (5.0IP, 4H, 3R, 2SO, 3HR)...he has a 2-0 record, 1.40 ERA (25.2IP, 4ER), a 0.78 WHIP, and a .189 (17-for-90) opp. average against the Mariners in those career outings.
