**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their nine-game road trip tonight with the second game of a three-game series at Texas (through Wed.)...are 6-1 on the road trip after sweeping Boston in a three-game set, winning two-of-three games at Houston and winning their first game at Texas...following this road trip, will return home for a seven-game homestand, featuring a four-game set vs. Baltimore (Fri.-Mon.) and a three-game series vs. Texas (5/5-7).

- ▶ **Their 19-10 (.655) record is the best in the American League and the fourth-best in the Majors...** their 19 wins are the most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors.
- ▶ **Have won nine of their last 10 games (since 4/17), 10 of their last 12 games (since 4/15) and 11 of their last 14 games (since 4/13).**
- ▶ Have won or split seven of their nine completed series this season (6-2-1), including each of their last four (3-0-1)...have also won four of their five completed series on the road this year.
- ▶ Are a season-high-tying 9G over .500 (also 9G at 18-9 on 4/25).
- ▶ **The Yankees are 15-3 this season when scoring first.**
- ▶ The Yankees' +49 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the third-best in the Majors.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees defeated the Rangers, 4-2, in their series opener on Monday at Globe Life Field...**LHP Max Fried** (6.0IP, 4H, 0R, 2BB, 5K, 1PO) earned his fourth win of the year after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings...**1B Ben Rice** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) hit his 10th home run of the season with a go-ahead two-run shot in the third inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (3-for-3, 1R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 1RBI, 1HP) recorded a season-high 3H, reached base a season-high-tying four times and hit his 11th home run of the season with a solo shot in the third inning...**2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit a solo HR in the fourth inning...**RHP David Bednar** (1.0IP, 2H, 1R/0ER, 1K) earned his AL-leading eighth save of the year.

**LAND OF THE FRIED:** LHP Max Fried earned his fourth win of the year on Monday at Texas after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings (4H, 2BB, 5K, 1PO)...has gone 4-1 with a 2.09 ERA (47.1IP, 11ER) in seven starts this season, holding opponents to a .161/.227/.217 (26-for-161) slash line...**has not allowed a run in four of his seven starts, including each of his last two** (14.0IP).

- ▶ **As a Yankee, has made 19 starts after a Yankees loss and has gone 13-1 with a 1.73 ERA (124.2IP, 24ER) in those starts...** has tossed at least 6.0IP in 17 of those starts and has not allowed an ER in nine of them...the Yankees have gone 14-5 when Fried starts after a loss.

**RICE RICE BABY:** C/INF Ben Rice hit his 10th home run of the season with a go-ahead two-run shot in the third inning on Monday at Texas...**has hit 6HR in his last 11 games (since 4/16).**

- ▶ **Has hit .322/.447/.744 (29-for-90) with 26R, 8 doubles, 10HR, 23RBI, 21BB/21BB, 1HP, 2SF and 1SB in 28 games this season...has reached base safely in 22-of-24 starts.**
- ▶ 18 of his 29H this season have gone for extra bases (8 doubles, 10HR).
- ▶ **Is tied for first in the Majors in go-ahead RBI (seven, tied for first in AL), ranks second in OBP (.447, second in AL), SLG (.744, second in AL) and OPS (1.192, second in AL),** tied for second in game-winning RBI (five, second in AL), third in XBH (18, second in AL) and total bases (67, second in AL), fourth in runs scored (26, second in AL), tied for fourth in HR (10, fourth in AL), sixth in PA/BB (5.43, fourth in AL), tied for sixth in walks (21, tied for fourth in AL), ninth in BA (.322, fifth in AL) and tied for 10th in RBI (23, tied for third in AL)...also ranks seventh in the AL in times on base (51) and is tied for eighth in doubles (eight).

**ALL THAT JAZZ:** INF Jazz Chisholm Jr. hit his third HR of the season with a solo shot in the fourth inning on Monday at Texas...each of his 3HR have come in his last five games (since 4/23).

- ▶ Has multiple hits in three of his last five games (since 4/23) and four of his last seven games (since 4/21), batting .357/.400/.679 (10-for-28) with 7R, 3HR, 7RBI, 2BB and 1SB over that seven-game stretch.

**BRONX BOMBERS:** Yankees batters lead the Majors with 46HR this season...hit 3HR on Monday at Texas...have hit at least 3HR in three of their last four games (since 4/24) and six of their last 11 games (since 4/16)...their seven games with at least 3HR this season are the most in the Majors.

- ▶ Have homered in 12 straight games (since 4/15), hitting 27HR over that span.

**FOUR SCORE:** Yankees batters have scored at least 4R in each of their last 12 games (since 4/15) and 15 of their last 16 games (since 4/11)...their 12-game streak with at least 4R matches their longest streak in the last seven seasons since 2020 (also had a 12-game streak from 6/29-7/11/25)...their last longer streak was a 14-game streak from 5/19-6/2/19...the Yankees are 17-5 this season when scoring at least 4R.

**PITCH PERFECT:** Yankees pitchers allowed only 2R/1ER on Monday at Texas...have allowed only 1ER-or-fewer in six of their last 10 games (since 4/17), posting a 2.22 ERA (89.0IP, 22ER) over that span.

**DYNAMIC DUO:** OF Aaron Judge (11HR) and C/INF Ben Rice (10HR) are only the second pair of Yankees teammates in franchise history to each hit at least 10HR in the club's first 29 games of a season, joining Yogi Berra (12HR) and Mickey Mantle (15HR) in 1956...are only the third set of teammates in Major League history to each hit at least 10HR before May 1, joining Los Angeles-NL's Cody Bellinger and Joc Pederson in 2019 and Colorado's Trevor Story and Nolan Arenado in 2016...are the only set to hit at least 10HR and record 20BB before May 1.

- ▶ Judge and Rice have combined to hit 21HR this year, more than four Major League teams (Milwaukee-19HR, San Francisco-19HR, Boston-20HR and New York-NL-20HR).

**SCHLITLITZ'S CREEK:** RHP Cam Schlitler will make his seventh start of the season tonight at Texas...**has gone 3-1 with a 1.77 ERA (35.2IP, 7ER) and 41K in six starts this season, holding opponents to a .172/.197/.250 (22-for-128) slash line...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in four of his six starts...** has allowed only 4BB and 1HR to 133BF.

- ▶ **Owens a Major League-best 1.01 BB/9.0IP ratio and 10.25 K/BB ratio...** the next highest K/BB ratio in the Majors is a 6.33 K/BB ratio (Kevin Gausman and Tarik Skubal)...also ranks second in the Majors in opponents' OBP (.197, first in AL), third in opponents' OPS (.447, third in AL) and WHIP (0.73, first in AL), fourth in ERA (1.77, third in AL), eighth in strikeouts (41, fifth in AL) and HR/9.0IP (0.25, seventh in AL), and ninth in opponents' BA (.172, fourth in AL) and opponents' SLG (.250, sixth in AL).
- ▶ **Over his last 14 Major League starts (since 8/20/25), has gone 6-2 with a 2.05 ERA (79.0IP, 18ER) and 95K...** the Yankees are 12-2 in those starts.
- ▶ **Is only the fifth pitcher in franchise history (sixth time) to post a sub-2.00 ERA and record at least 40K through their first six starts of a season,** joining Gerrit Cole (2x: 1.11 ERA and 44K in first 6GS in 2023; 1.43 ERA and 62K in first 6GS in 2021), Nestor Cortes (1.41 ERA and 42K in first 6GS in 2022), Mike Mussina (1.60 ERA and 51K in first 6GS in 2003) and Bob Turley (1.83 ERA and 57K in first 6GS in 1955).

**ALL RISE:** OF Aaron Judge recorded a season-high 3H, reached base a season-high-tying four times and hit his 11th home run of the season with a solo shot in the third inning on Monday at Texas...his HR marked his 379th career HR, tying Orlando Cepeda and Tony Pérez (379) for 75th place on the all-time home runs list.

- ▶ **Has homered in back-to-back games for the fourth time this season** (also 2G from 3/27-28, 4/12-13 and 4/15-16).
- ▶ **Has hit 8HR in his last 15 games (since 4/12).**
- ▶ Is tied for second in the Majors in HR (11, tied for second in AL), ranks third in SLG (.621, third in AL) and OPS (1.010, third in AL), fourth in total bases (64, third in AL) and pitches per PA (4.49, second in AL), is tied for fourth in XBH (16, third in AL), tied for sixth in walks (21, tied for fourth in AL) and tied for seventh in runs scored (23, third in AL).
- ▶ Has reached base in 36 of his 40 career games vs. Texas, batting .307/.388/.629 (43-for-140) with 32R, 7 doubles, 1 triple, 12HR, 24RBI, 17BB, 2HP, 1SF and 2SB.
- ▶ 16 of his 26H this season have been XBH (11HR, 5 doubles).
- ▶ Has reached base multiple times in six of his last seven games (since 4/21) and eight of his last 10 games (since 4/17)...has reached base in 22 of his last 23 games (since 4/3).

**FOR STARTERS:** Yankees starters have posted a Major League-best 2.80 ERA (167.1IP, 52ER) and 164K in 29 starts this season...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in nine of their last 10 starts (since 4/17), posting a 1.83 ERA (64.0IP, 13ER) over that span...have not allowed an ER in five of their last 10 starts.

- ▶ Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 25 of their 29 starts this season.
- ▶ Have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 18 of their 29 starts, tied for their second-most through their first 29 games of a season in franchise history, trailing only their 23 starts in 2022 (also had 18 starts in 1958, '81 and 2019).
- ▶ **Lead the Majors in ERA (2.80), opponents' OBP (.263), opponents' OPS (.590), WHIP (1.00) and K/BB (3.90),** rank second in opponents' BA (.205, first in AL), opponents' SLG (.327, first in AL) and BB/9.0IP (2.26, second in AL), third in strikeouts (164, third in AL) and innings pitched (167.1, second in AL), fourth in strikeout rate (24.8%, third in AL) and HR/9.0IP (0.86, third in AL), and 10th in K/9.0IP (8.82, sixth in AL).

**HIP HIP JOSÉ:** INF/OF José Caballero owns a career-high-tying 12-game on-base streak since 4/15 (also had a 12-game streak from 3/28-4/12/24)...is batting .395/.447/.581 (17-for-43) with 7R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 5RBI, 2BB, 2HP and 5SB over that span.

- ▶ Has reached base multiple times in four of his last five games (since 4/23), five of his last nine (since 4/18), seven of his last 12 (since 4/15) and nine of his last 16 (since 4/11).
- ▶ Is batting .356/.397/.576 (21-for-59) with 9R, 4 doubles, 3HR, 10RBI, 2BB, 2HP and 6SB over his last 16 games (since 4/11).

**PICKING UP WHERE WE LEFT OFF:** Yankees pitchers have recorded eight pickoffs this season, tied for the most in the Majors...**have recorded a pickoff in each of their last four games since 4/24 (Warren/Weathers/Gil/Fried), matching their longest streak in the Expansion Era (since 1961).**...Yankees pitchers also accomplished the feat in four straight games from 8/2-5/95 (Jack McDowell/David Cone/Scott Kamieniecki/Sterling Hitchcock).

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CAM SCHLITTLER (3-1, 1.77 ERA)

**RHP Cam Schlittler** will make his seventh start of the season tonight at Texas...the 25-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...made his sixth start of the season on Thursday at Boston, earning his third win of the year after allowing only 2R/1ER over a regular season career-high 8.0 innings (4H, 1BB, 5K, 1HR)... **in six starts this season, has gone 3-1 with a 1.77 ERA (35.2IP, 22H, 9R/7ER, 4BB, 41K, 1HR)...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in four of his six starts**...has allowed only 4BB to 133BF...made his first career Opening Day roster... **over his last 14 Major League starts (since 8/20/25), has gone 6-2 with a 2.05 ERA (79.0IP, 49H, 20R/18ER, 21BB, 95K, 3HR)**...saw his first Major League action in 2025 with the Yankees, going 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (73.0IP, 58H, 24R/ER, 31BB, 84K, 8HR) in 14 starts...in 20 career Major League starts, has gone 7-4 with a 2.57 ERA (108.2IP, 80H, 33R/31ER, 35BB, 125K, 9HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 18-of-20 career starts, 2R-or-fewer in 14 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 10 starts... **his 125K through his first 20 career games are the fourth-most in franchise history**, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (141K), Luis Gil (133K) and Orlando Hernández (129K)... **his 33R allowed are tied with Luis Gil for the fewest by a Yankees pitcher through their first 20 career starts** (not including openers)... **has posted a .203 opponents' BA over his first 20 career starts...according to Elias, marks the eighth-lowest opponents' BA by a Yankees pitcher through their first 20 career starts** (ignoring relief appearances)...the Weymouth, Mass., native was selected by the Yankees in the seventh round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Northeastern University (Mass.).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Made his sixth start of the season on Thursday at Boston, earning his third win of the year after allowing only 2R/1ER over a regular season career-high 8.0 innings (4H, 1BB, 5K, 1HR)...also tossed 8.0 scoreless innings in his postseason debut in 2025 ALWCS Game 3 vs. Boston at Yankee Stadium...retired 16 of his final 18BF (2H)...allowed his first home run of the season, a solo shot to Carlos Narváez in the fifth inning...had not allowed a home run to his first 122BF to begin the season.

- According to *Elias*, was just the third pitcher in Major League history to toss at least 8.0 innings in a postseason game before doing so in a regular season game, joining Houston's Framber Valdez (8.0IP in 2021 ALCS Game 5 at Boston) and Houston's Brandon Backe (8.0IP in 2004 NLCS Game 5 vs. St. Louis).

**2026:** In six starts this season, has gone 3-1 with a 1.77 ERA (35.2IP, 22H, 9R/7ER, 4BB, 41K, 1HR)...has held opponents to a .172/.197/.250 (22-for-128) slash line...has allowed only 4BB and 1HR to 133BF.

- Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in all six starts, including 1R-or-fewer in three starts (including two scoreless starts)...has not allowed a 1ER-or-fewer in four of his starts.
- Has recorded at least 7K in four of his starts, including 8K in two starts.
- Is only the fifth pitcher in franchise history (sixth time) to post a sub-2.00 ERA and record at least 40K through their first six starts of a season**, joining Gerrit Cole (2x: 1.11 ERA and 44K in first 6GS in 2023; 1.43 ERA and 62K in first 6GS in 2021), Nestor Cortes (1.41 ERA and 42K in first 6GS in 2022), Mike Mussina (1.60 ERA and 51K in first 6GS in 2003) and Bob Turley (1.83 ERA and 57K in first 6GS in 1955).
- Owens a Major League-best 1.01 BB/9.0IP ratio and 10.25 K/BB ratio**...the next highest K/BB ratio in the Majors is a 6.33 K/BB ratio (Kevin Gausman and Tarik Skubal)...also ranks second in the Majors in opponents' OBP (.197, first in AL), third in opponents' OPS (.447, third in AL) and WHIP (0.73, first in AL), fourth in ERA (1.77, third in AL), eighth in strikeouts (41, fifth in AL) and HR/9.0IP (0.25, seventh in AL), and ninth in opponents' BA (.172, fourth in AL) and opponents' SLG (.250, sixth in AL)...is also tied for seventh in the AL in innings pitched (35.2).
- Was only the seventh Yankees starting pitcher in franchise history to not allow a walk in each of his first three appearances of a season**, joining Mike Mussina (first four starts in 2001), Tiny Bonham (first four starts in 1944), Randy Johnson (first three starts in 2006), Jon Lieber (first three starts in 2004), David Wells (first three starts in 2003) and Ed Figueroa (first three starts in 1978).
- Opened the season with a 13.2 scoreless inning streak from 3/27-4/7...was the second-longest scoreless streak by a Yankees starter to begin the season in the last 15 years (since 2012), trailing only Luis Gil's 18.2 scoreless inning streak in 2021.
- Did not allow a run in 11.2 innings over his first two starts of the season from 3/27-4/1 (3H, 0BB, 15K)...**was the first pitcher in franchise history to not allow a run or a walk and record at least 15K over a two-game span**.
- Made his season debut on 3/27 at San Francisco, earning the win after allowing just 1H over 5.1 scoreless innings (0BB, 8K)...allowed his only hit on a second inning double to Heliot Ramos before retiring his next 11BF...became the first pitcher in franchise history to record at least 8K and allow 1H-or-fewer in their first game of the season.
- Made his second start of the season on 4/1 at Seattle, earning the win after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 0BB, 7K)...after allowing a second-inning single to Luke Raley, retired his final 15 batters faced.
- Allowed 3R/ER over 5.0IP without recording a decision on 4/7 vs. the Athletics (5H, 0BB, 7K, 0HR).
- Made his fourth start of the season on 4/12 at Tampa Bay, recording the loss after allowing 3R/ER over 5.0IP (7H, 1BB, 8K, 0HR)...walked his first batter of the season (Yandy Diaz in the third inning)...**had not allowed a walk to his first 70 batters faced this season...according to Elias, was only the fourth Yankees pitcher in the last 21 years (since 2006) to not allow a walk to at least their first 70 batters faced in a season, joining Randy Johnson (first 86BF in 2006), Mariano Rivera (first 74BF in 2008) and Preston Claiborne (first 71BF in 2013)**...was the first Yankees pitcher to not allow a walk to at least 70 consecutive batters faced at any point during a single season since Carlos Rodón in 2024 (90BF between 4/27-5/19/24)...**dating back to his start last season on 9/27/25 vs. Baltimore, had not allowed a walk to 93 consecutive batters faced...was the first Yankees pitcher to not allow a walk to at least 93 consecutive batters faced since Jameson Taillon in 2022 (103BF between 8/8-9/5/22)**.
