**METSCELLEANEOUS:** The Mets defeated the Atlanta Braves, 3-2, in 10-innings last night...The Mets have won four straight games and five of their last six...Tonight, the Mets continue a seven-game homestand (1-0) against the Braves (1-0) and the Twins (three games).

**ROSTER MOVES:** Prior to tonight's game, the Mets announced the following moves: Reinstated RHP Kodai Senga from the IL...Designated RHP Adrian Houser for assignment...Placed RHP Dedniel Núñez on the 15-day IL, retroactive July 24, with a right pronator strain...Recalled RHP Eric Orze from Triple-A Syracuse...Designated RHP Shintaro Fujinami for assignment.

**IF YOU START ME OFF:** In 59 games batting in the leadoff spot this year, Lindor is hitting .303/.386/.568 with 44 runs, 19 doubles, 15 home runs, 42 RBI, 26 walks, 14 steals with an .955 OPS...The Mets are 35-24 when Lindor bats first this season...Among qualified hitters, Lindor's .303 when batting first ranks seventh in the majors and fifth in the NL...His 15 home runs are tied for the third-most.

**HANG 10:** Lindor is on a 10-game hitting streak, batting .359 (14-39) with seven runs, one double, six homers, 14 RBI, 10 walks, four steals with a .500 OBP and an .846 SLG...Lindor ranks seventh in the majors and third in the NL with a 5.0 fWAR this season...He has posted a 4.4 fWAR since May 1...That is fourth-best in the majors and tops the NL in that span...In 73 games since May 1, Lindor is batting .284/.359/.534 with 17 home runs and 51 RBI.

**SECOND-HALF JEFF:** In seven games following the All-Star break, Jeff McNeil is batting .417 (10-24) with seven runs, two doubles, four home runs, nine RBI with a 1.423 OPS...In 17 games since the start of the series vs. Pittsburgh on July 5, McNeil is batting .320 (16-50) with 11 runs, five doubles, five home runs, 14 RBI, four walks, one steal with a .364 OBP, a .720 SLG and a 1.084 OPS...He has recorded 224 career multi-hit games...That is 14th in Mets history...Buddy Harelson is next with 231...McNeil's 796 hits are tied for 15th in franchise history with Lee Mazilli...He ranks 12th with 162 doubles...Mookie Wilson is 11th with 170 two-baggers.

**WINNING!** With a win last night, the Mets are now six games above .500, which is a season-high...In 2023, the Mets high point was seven games above .500, achieved on Friday April 21, (14-7)...The Mets were a season-low 11 games under .500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets have gone 30-13...Their 30 wins are the most in the majors in that span, as is their .698 winning percentage.

**JULY! JULY! JULY!** The Mets are 14-7 this month...Their 14 wins are the most in the majors, while their .667 winning percentage this month is the second-best and the best in the NL...They have posted a 4.11 ERA, while batting .250/.320/.442 this month...This compares to 16-8 record with a 4.17 ERA and a .280/.356/.504 slashline in June.

**HIP, HIP, JOSÉ:** José Buttó hurled 3.0 perfect innings last night...He has three wins, one save and two holds in seven relief outings this year...Has hurled 13.2 innings in those games and allowed one run (0.66 ERA) with 17 strikeouts...Was 1-3 with a 3.08 ERA (13 ER/38.0 IP) in seven starts this year.

**BACK IN THE CITI:** The Mets are 14-3 over their 17 games at Citi Field...The team has homered in all but two of those games, hitting .271/.363/.511 in that span with 36 doubles, two triples, 32 homers, 74 walks with a .873 OPS...The Mets pitching staff has posted a 3.75 ERA (65 ER/156.0 IP) with 60 walks and 164 punchouts...New York is 27-26 at home this year (27-25) at Citi Field.

**GIVE ME A BREAK:** New York is in a stretch of 13 straight games to start the second-half and are 5-2 in that span...The team's five wins are tied for the second-most in the majors, while their .714 winning percentage is tied for the fourth-best...The team is hitting .242/.324/.433 following the break...They have outscored their opponents 31-21 in that span.

**BRAVES-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 60-77 against Atlanta since Citi Field opened in 2009.

### SENGA NEWS & NOTES

**WELCOME BACK:** Tonight, Kodai Senga will make his first start of the season after missing nearly the first four months of the season with a right should capsule strain...The right-hander made four rehab starts, one with High-A Brooklyn and three with Triple-A Syracuse...In his four rehab starts, Senga allowed six runs over 10.1 innings and recorded seven strikeouts.

**REMARKABLE ROOKIE:** In his rookie campaign, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsuzaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967).

**KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST:** In 2023, Senga finished second in the NL and fifth in the majors among qualifiers in ERA...His 202 strikeouts were the tied for the eighth-most in the NL and tied for the 14th-most in the majors...Senga held opposing batters to a .208 average, the third-lowest mark among qualifiers in the NL and the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...His 10.93 SO/9 rate was the fifth-best mark among qualified major league pitchers last season.

**SENGA GENESIS:** In his last 18 starts of the 2023 season dating back to June 10, Senga pitched to a 2.57 ERA (31 ER/108.2 IP), struck out 129 batters and recorded 12 quality starts...During that span, his ERA was the fifth-best in the majors and his 10.68 SO/9 rate was the 12th-best (Min. 75.0 IP).

**I LOVE MY NEW HOME:** In 2023, Senga's 2.42 ERA (25 ER/93.0 IP) at Citi Field was the second-best home mark in the majors among qualifiers...Senga held opposing batters to a .179 average at home, the third lowest-mark in the majors among qualifiers...His 12.00 K/9 rate at home was the fifth-highest in the majors among qualifiers.

**PUTTING THE K IN FORK:** Last season, Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts during his rookie campaign...The pitch had a 59.5 percent whiff rate and a 28.2 percent putaway rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average.

**SPOOKY GOOD:** Last season, Senga led all rookie pitchers in bWAR (4.5) and fWAR (3.4)...He was the only rookie to qualify for the ERA title...Finished the season ranked fifth in the majors and second in the NL with a 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP), the fifth-lowest mark by a Mets rookie in franchise history.

**HARD TO HIT:** In his rookie season, Senga had three starts of 7.0 or more innings with two or fewer hits allowed, which tied for the second-most such starts in the majors this season...Additionally it tied with Dwight Gooden for the most such starts by a Mets rookie in a single season...Only Nolan Ryan (Four, 1970) and Jacob deGrom (Five, 2015) have had more such starts in a single season in franchise history.

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** Last season, Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

**METS-JAPAN CONNECTION:** Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TYLOR MEGILL (2-4, 5.08)

**BACK FROM SYRACUSE:** Tomorrow, Megill will make his first major league start since June 29 vs. Houston...The right-hander was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse the following day and made three starts for the Syracuse Mets...In those three starts, Megill went 1-0 with a 4.05 ERA (6 ER/13.1 IP) and 20 strikeouts.

**CAREER HIGHS:** In 2023, Megill established career bests in starts (25), innings (126.1), strikeouts (105) and quality starts (six) surpassing his previous highs of 18 starts, 89.2 innings, 99 strikeouts and four quality starts set in 2021
