METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off on Thursday...On Wednesday, the Mets earned a 4-3 extra-inning, walk-off victory over the Phillies...That concluded a stretch of 13 straight games (10-3)...Today, the Mets begin a stretch of 12 straight games...They are a season-high 11-games above .500...They Mets are on a brief four-game trip to Washington D.C. to play the Nationals...They return home on Tuesday for a three-game set against Arizona.

ROSTER MOVES: Following Wednesday's game, the Mets optioned INF Brett Baty and Catcher Hayden Senger to Triple-A Syracuse...Prior to tonight's game, the Mets activated INF Jeff McNeil and Catcher Francisco Alvarez from the 10-day IL.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: The Mets are on a season-high seven-game winning streak...The Mets owned a nine-game winning-streak in 2024 (8/29-9/7)...New York is batting .274/333/465 over the winning streak, while posting a 2.25 ERA (16 ER/64.0 IP)...The Mets have outscored their opponents 33-17 in this stretch...The Mets are the only team to win six straight games on multiple occasions this season.

APRIL COME SHE WILL: The Mets are 16-5 in April...The team's 16 April wins are tied with the 2006 and 2002 teams for the most wins in the month...The National League record for wins in the month in April is 19.

QUIET KODAI: Kodai Senga has not allowed a run over his last 18.2 innings, the longest stretch of his career...It is the longest scoreless streak by a Met since Jose Quintana who owned a 25.2 scoreless streak from August 31-September 28, 2024.

THE EAST IS A BEST: The Mets are 7-2 against the NL East this year...Last year, the Mets went 30-22 against the NL East...After starting the season 3-6 against the NL East, the Mets went 27-16 in their final 43 games...The Mets did not drop three straight games against the division in that span.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York hits the road for the third time this season...The Mets are 6-6 on the road this year...The Mets have posted a 2.66 ERA on the road this year, the best mark in the majors.

NO HOMERS CLUB: The Mets starting pitching staff has not allowed a home run over their last 12 games...The team record is 23 games from August 30-September 19, 1969...Overall, the starting pitching staff has allowed just five home runs this season, the fewest in the majors...The Mets starting staff has posted a 1.87 ERA (13 ER/62.2 IP) ERA over the last 12 games...In each start, the staff has limited their opponents to no more than three earned runs...They have walked 17, while striking out 65 in that span.

IF YOU START ME OFF: Overall, the Mets starting staff has posted an MLB-best 2.33 ERA (33 ER/127.0 IP) in 25 games this year...They have struck out 139, which is the sixth-most in the majors.

HANG 10: As a team, the Mets have surrendered only 10 home runs, the fewest in the majors...The 10 home runs allowed are the second-fewest through the team's first 25 games in franchise history...Only the 1968 Mets recorded less (7 HR).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor is now batting .478 (11-23) with six extra-base hits as the first batter of the game...He is tied for the lead in the majors in hits and extra-base hits as the first batter of the game (min. 15 PA)...His .478 batting average in the first frame is second in the majors and leads the NL...Over the last four games, Lindor is batting .588 (10-17) with seven runs, three home runs, six RBI, two walks and a 1.749 OPS.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso is one of six players in franchise history to record as many doubles through the team's first 25 games of a season...He has recorded 18 extra-base hits on the season (11 doubles, one triple, six home runs), the most extra-base hits through 25 games in franchise history...Alonso has recorded a hit in nine of his last 10 games, hitting .368 (14-38) with two home runs, five doubles, one triple, eight RBI and five walks in that span

REEDING RAINBOW: Reed Garrett has allowed just one hit to 18 batters faced at Citi Field this season...He stranded an inherited runner in the sixth inning and is the only pitcher in the majors to inherit at least nine runners and not allow any to score...He hasn't allowed an earned run in any of his 11 outings this season and in 24 of his 25 games dating back to August, 22 2024...In that larger span, has gone 1-1 with a 1.64 ERA (4 ER/22.0 IP), eight walks and 26 strikeouts.

LAST TIME OUT: Senga earned his third win of the season after not allowing a run through 5.2 innings, which extended his career high scoreless inning streak to 18.2 innings...His scoreless streak is also tied for the second-longest in the majors this season...Retired eight straight batters from the second out in the second inning to the third out in the fourth...Became the 10th pitcher in franchise history to record three straight scoreless starts of 5.0 or more innings...It was his sixth career games where he went at least 5.0 innings and didn't allow a run...Has allowed two earned runs or fewer in 12 straight games dating back August 19, 2023, tied for the seventh-longest such streak by a Mets starting pitcher.

GHOSTING THE BATS: In 2023 Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average...In Senga's first four starts of the 2025 season, he has picked up 14 of his 20 strikeouts on the "ghost fork" and generated a 46.9 % whiff rate.

SENGA GENESIS: Through Senga's first 34 career starts he has posted 231 strikeouts which is tied for the 13th-most through a pitchers first 34 starts in major league history...It is the fourth most by a Met, trailing Dwight Gooden (299), Matt Harvey (251) and Noah Syndergaard (245)...It is also the third-most among Japanese-born pitchers in that span, trailing only Hideo Nomo (277) and Yu Darvish (270).

VS. NATIONALS: Senga has two previous starts against the Nationals going 0-1 with a 2.45 ERA (3 ER/11.0 IP), recording 12 strikeouts with seven walks...Tonight marks his first time pitching at Nationals Park...In his 15 career games on the road, he has gone 7-5 with a 3.38 ERA (32 ER/85.1 IP).

CRUISING AT CITI: In 19 career games at Citi Field, he has gone 9-3 with a 2.23 ERA (27 ER/109.0 IP), which is the fifth best in the history of the ballpark (min. 90.0 IP)...He has allowed just nine home runs to 440 batters faced, recording a 0.74 HR/9.0IP ratio at home...His 11.64K/9.0IP is the second-highest among pitchers at Citi Field behind Edwin Díaz's 15.29K/9.0IP clip (min. 400 BF).

SPRING TRAINING: Senga made three starts in Grapefruit League action and he finished with a 2.00 ERA (2 ER/9.0 IP) and nine strikeouts...His last spring outing was March 20 against the Nationals, and he struck out six batters over 3.2 innings of work.

2024 REWIND: He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: In 2023, Senga finished second in the NL and fifth in the majors among qualifiers in ERA...His 202 strikeouts were the tied for the eighth-most in the NL and tied for the 14th-most in the majors...Senga held opposing batters to a .208 average, the third-lowest mark among qualifiers in the NL and the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...His 10.93 K/9 rate was the fifth-best mark among qualified major league pitchers in 2023...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.
