TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (2-0) of a 3-game series vs **Carter Martin's Rangers** and the third game (2-0) of Cincinnati's first road trip of 2026, a 7-game jaunt that includes an upcoming 4-game set at **loanDepot park** vs the **Marlins** (Mon-Thu).

- The Reds opened the season with 3-3 homestand vs the **Red Sox** (2-1) and **Pirates** (1-2).
- Following Thu's game at **Mia**, the Redlegs will return to **Great American Ball Park** for a 6-game homestand vs the **Angels** and **Giants**.

WINS OVER RUNS: The Reds have won 5 of their first 8 games despite ranking tied for last in the majors with 24 runs...this is the first Cin team in *any* 8 game span to score 24 or fewer runs and win 5 times since the 2022 club did it from 7/31-8/8 (8g, 5w, 21 runs).

- Each of Cin's 5 wins have come in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the most such wins in the majors.
- The 2025 Reds went 35-38 in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the ninth-worst record in the majors.

VELOCIRAPTORS: Reds batters rank second in the major to the **Rangers** in average exit velocity with 90.7 (mph)...**SS Elly De La Cruz** (10th, 95.7) and **3B/DH Eugenio Suárez** (15th, 94.9) are among individual league leaders.

CLEAN LIVIN': The Reds have yet to commit an error this season (8g), matching their longest streak of errorless games to begin a season since 1900, also accomplished by the 2005 team.

- The Reds and **Astros** are the only 2 teams in the majors without an E.

EL CABALLO DE HIERRO: **SS Elly De La Cruz** has appeared in each of Cin's last 226 games, beginning 7/30/24...this run matches the fifth-longest consecutive games played streak by a Red since 1970 (see table below).

WILD WEST: The Reds have won 36 of their last 63 games vs **AL West** opponents dating back to 2017 (.571).

3-4-5: Reds' 3,4,5 batters have combined to slash .290/.365/.559 in the first 8 games of the 2026 season (27-for-93, 7 HR 16 RBI, 38 times on base).

SWITCH BLADE: **SS Elly De La Cruz** has homered in each of the Reds' last 6 regular-season series dating back to 9/19/25 vs **Chc**...he's the first switch hitter in Reds history to homer in at least 6 consecutive regular-season series.

- The last Red prior to **Elly** to homer in 6 straight series was **INF Christian Encarnacion-Strand** (9/15/23-3/31/24).
- De La Cruz** has now homered twice in 14 at-bats vs **LHP** this season... in 2025, he hit 5 HR in 199 at-bats vs **lefties**.

SERIES NOTES:

- Cin is 16-14 all-time vs **Tex**, including 10-7 at **Great American Ball Park** and 3-2 here at **Globe Life Field**.
- Tex** took 2 out of 3 in last year's series, including back-to-back 1-0 wins at **GABP** on 4/1 & 4/2...it was the first time since 1907 that the Reds lost consecutive games by a 1-0 score (6/2-6/3g1).
- In the 1-0 **Rangers'** win on 4/2/25, **RHP Nathan Eovaldi** produced the series' first-ever complete game (9ip, 4h, 0r, 0bb, 8k, 99TP).
- Cin's 14-3 win on 3/31/25 marked the largest margin of victory by either team in this all-time series.
- With a win today, the Reds could secure the third series sweep in the history of this storied rivalry (Cin 3-0 in 2023, Cin 3-0 in 2004).

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: **1b Sal Stewart** on Mon was named National League Player of the Week for 3/25-3/29...He's the 10th Reds rookie to win NL Player of the Week honors since the award's inception in 1973 (last: **Rece Hinds**, 7/8-7/14, 2024).

- Stewart** is the fifth Red to win the award in the season's first week (others: **Kal Daniels** 1988, **Eddie Milner** 1984, **Johnny Bench** 1983, **Dave Collins** 1980).
- In the 3 games vs **Bos**, he went 7-for-10 with a home run, 3 doubles, 3 walks, and 5 hard-hit balls (exit velo of +95mph).

SPRING RECAP: The **Reds** finished 2026 Spring Training action with a 14-17 record, going 9-6 at Goodyear Ballpark (including when **Cin** was the "away" team vs **Cle**) and 5-11 on the road...the overall record reflects the 2 exhibition games the Reds lost vs the **Brewers** in Milwaukee on 3/23 and 3/24.

- Reds** batters concluded their spring schedule ranked among Major League leaders in extra-base hits (129, 1st), average exit velocity (91.6 mph), home runs (55, T1st), total bases (535, 2nd), slugging pct (.499, 2nd), hard-hit balls (237, 2nd), and runs scored (182, 6th).
- The **Reds'** 55 home runs were their most in a single Spring Training season since 2006 (as far back as ST data is available), surpassing the previous best of 44 set by the 2024 club.
- Cin** earned its 200th win all-time in Cactus League action with a 3-2 victory on 2/25 at **CWS**.

THE SKIPPER: Manager **Terry Francona** returns for his second season after guiding the 2025 Reds to their first Postseason berth since 2020 and their first during a full season since 2013...his 83-79 Reds were the 12th Postseason club he has managed in the majors.

- Francona** finished as the runner-up to **Mil's Pat Murphy** for the **2025 National League Manager of the Year Award**.
- He became the fifth skipper in Reds history to lead the team to the Postseason in his first year at the helm, joining **Lou Piniella** (1990), **John McNamara** (1979), **Sparky Anderson** (1970), & **Patrick Moran** (1919).
- Francona** became the 12th manager in Major League history to lead 3 or more teams to the Postseason (Cin, **Cle**, **Bos**).
- His 2,038 career wins as a Major League manager lead all active skippers and rank 12th in Major League history...he's 2 wins away from matching **Hall of Famer Walter Alston** for 11th on the all-time list (2,040).

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his first Major League win in Mon's 2-0 victory vs Pit (5.0ip, 1h, 0r, 3bb, 7k, 78TP).

- Was his 2026 season debut...became the seventh Reds pitcher since 1900 with 5.0+ scoreless innings pitched, and fewer than 2 hits with at least 7 strikeouts in his season debut (last: Brady Singer in 2025).
- Carried a no-hitter into the 5th inning before allowing a single to Spencer Horwitz to lead off the inning...at 4.0 innings, marked the longest no-hit bid of his big league career.

SPRING RECAP: Went 1-2 with a 4.76 ERA in 6 spring starts for the Reds (17.0ip, 14h, 9r/9er, 7bb, 22k, 3hr, 288 TP).

- Last pitched on Tue in the Brewers' 4-1 exhibition win at American Family Field (5.0ip, 4h, 2r/2er, 0bb, 7k, 1hr, 68TP).

2025 REVIEW: Went 0-3 with a 4.57 ERA over 13 appearances (8 starts) in his Major League debut.

- Was placed on the 15-day injured list on 8/12 with a grade 1 right flexor strain...was activated on 9/11 and made his next 5 appearances out of the bullpen to end the season.
- Began the season at A-Dayton and made 3 apps with the Dragons before he was promoted AA-Chattanooga on 4/22...appeared in 8 games (all starts) for the Lookouts when he was promoted to AAA-Louisville on 6/10...made 2 starts for the Bats when he was promoted to Cincinnati on 6/24...was named Reds Minor League Pitcher of the Year.
- At the time of his promotion to Cincinnati on 6/24, ranked

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING: In Mon's 2-0 win vs Pit, RHP Chase Burns earned his first career win (5.0ip, 1h, 0r, 3bb, 7k, 78TP) and RHP Connor Phillips picked up his first career save (1.0ip, 0h, 2bb, 1k).
Burns and Phillips became the eighth pair of Reds teammates since saves became an official stat in 1969 to earn their first win and save, respectively, in the same game...the last duo to do it was RHP Julian Aguiar and RHP Casey Kelly on 8/24/24 at Pit.

64 STRIKEOUTS: His 64 strikeouts over his first 9 Major League appearances are the most by a Reds pitcher to begin his career since Gary Nolan (72k, 1967).

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: On 6/24 vs NYN made his Major League debut after having his contract selected from AAA-Louisville earlier in the day...became the first Major League starting pitcher in the expansion era (since 1961) to strike out the first 5 batters he faced in his Major League debut...struck out 8 batters total that day, becoming just the seventh Reds pitcher since 1900 with at least 8 strikeouts in his Major League debut.

PERSONAL: Was born in Italy where his parents were stationed with the US Navy...his sister was born in Japan...grew up in Hendersonville, TN which is about 20 miles northeast of Nashville...pitched collegiately at Tennessee (2022-2023) before transferring to Wake Forest (2024)...graduated from Beech High School in Hendersonville, TN where he was selected by Baseball America as a 2021 First Team High School All-American...his father, David, played college football at Division II North Greenville College.

ACQUIRED: Was selected by the Reds in the first round (second overall) in the 2024 First-Year Player Draft...was signed by Eddie Lehr.

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the 8-3 loss on Tue vs Pit (4.2ip, 6h, 6r/6er, 2bb, 3k, 3hr, 94 TP).

- The 3 home runs allowed were a career high...5 of the 6 runs allowed came via HR.
- 4 of the 6 runs allowed came with 2 outs, including back-to-back homers in Pit's 5-run 2nd inning (O'Hearn 3-run HR, Reynolds solo HR).
- Was his first Major League appearance since 9/17/24 at Atl, a span of 560 days...missed all of last season as he recovered from left elbow reconstruction surgery (10/9/24).

THURSDAY'S BIRTHDAY: Turned 28 on Thu (4/2)...shares a birthday with Hall of Famers Don Sutton, Luke Appling, and Hughie Jennings, and celebrities Pedro Pascal, Marvin Gaye, Emmylou Harris, and Sir Alec Guinness.

SPRING RECAP: Went 2-0 with a 1.65 ERA in 5 appearances (3 starts) during Spring Training (16.1ip, 12h, 3r/3er, 3bb, 15k, 2hr, 246 TP).

ACQUIRED FROM THE MARINERS: Was acquired from the Mariners with RHP Justin Dunn, OF Jake Fraley, and a player to be named (RHP Connor Phillips, 3/29/22), for 3B Eugenio Suárez and OF Jesse Winker on 3/14/22.
