INSIDE THE NUMBERS

The Mariners won their 20th one-run game of the season last night, improving their league-best record in one-run games to 20-8 (.714).

Seattle's offense is averaging 4.00 pitches per plate appearance, which pitches per plate appearance, which ranks 3rd in the Majors...it trails only New York-AL (4.09 P/PA) and Detroit (4.03).



The Mariners play the 5th of 6 consecutive games against the Angels tonight...marks the first time in franchise history that Seattle faces the same team 6+ times in a row within the same regular season.

Scott Servais managed his 800th game in a Seattle uniform last night...he is 397-403 in 6 seasons as Mariners skipper his .496 winning percentage ranks 3rd in franchise history.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their 6-day, 5-game road trip with the 2nd of 3 games at Los Angeles-AL (1-0) before visiting Colorado (2 G, 7/20-7/21)...following the current road trip, will return home for the first homestand of the 2nd half against Oakland (4 G, 7/22-7/25) and Houston (3 G, 7/26-7/28)... tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS**, as well as broadcast on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners opened the 2nd half with a 6-5 win over the Angels last night...are 4-1 in their last 5 games, 15-7 over their last 22 game, 18-8 over their last 26 and 28-17 over their last 45...are 19-12 in day games and 30-31 at pight...are 29-20 at T-Mobile Park and 20-23 on the road...are 40-13 when scoring at least 4 runs and 9-30 when scoring 3 or fewer runs...are 37-3 when out-hitting their opponent.

- Since May 24 Seattle is 28-17 (.622) since May 24, tied for 2nd-most wins in the American League
- in that span...they trail only Houston (30 wins) and tied with the Chicago White Sox (28) in that span. **Everybody's Working for the Weekend** The Mariners are 37-20 (.649) between Thursday and Sunday this season, compared to 12-23 (.343) between Monday and Wednesday.
- Joy Division Seattle is 20-14 (.588) against the American League West Division this season.

 Transaction RHP Will Vest, who was designated for assignment on July 12, was returned to Detroit... the 2020 Rule 5 pick made his Major League debut for the Mariners on Opening Night, April 1.
- All-Star Yusei Seattle's 2021 American League All-Star Yusei Kikuchi takes the mound tonight...the left-hander is 6-3 with a 2.77 ERA (23 ER, 74.2 IP) with 25 walks and 78 strikeouts in his last 12 starts. HEAVYWEIGHTS...the Mariners are 1 of 7 MLB teams with a winning record against at-or-above-.500 teams this season...after last night's win, Seattle is now 32-29 (.525) against teams at-or-above-.500...they are joined by Houston (43-22, .662), San Diego (28-21, .571), New York-NL (16-15, .516), Boston (33-24, .579), San Francisco (24-17, .585) and Tampa Bay (37-27, .578).

<u>CY OF RELIEF...</u>the Mariners bullpen is rated as the best in the Majors by *FanGraphs* Wins Above Replacement (4.5)...Seattle relievers narrowly lead the New York Yankees (4.4), followed by Tampa Bay (4.0)...the Mariners bullpen is 24-14 with 25 saves and a 4.13 ERA (161 ER, 351.0 IP) with 124 walks and 356 strikeouts this season...they lead the American League with a 3.54 Fielding Independent Pitching (FIP), trailing only Miami (3.43) for the Major League lead.

WITH A WIN TONIGHT...the Mariners go for their 50th victory of the season tonight...a win would also secure 3 consecutive road series victories for the first time this season...Seattle took 2 of 3 at Chicago from June 25-27 and 2 of 3 at Toronto in Buffalo from June 29-July 1...the Mariners previously won back-to-back road series this season, taking 2 of 3 at Minnesota from April 8-11 and 3 of 4 at Baltimore from April 13-15... with a win tonight and/or tomorrow, Seattle would win 3 consecutive series on the road for the first time since Aug. 13-21, 2019...Seattle took 2 of 3 at Detroit (8/13-8/15), 2 of 3 at Toronto (8/16-8/18) and 2 of 3 at Tampa Bay (8/19-8/21) on the same road trip.

HANDY HANI...Mitch Haniger went 3-for-5 with 3 runs, a double, home run and 2 RBI last night...it was Haniger's team-leading 25th multi-hit game of the season...he has now reached base safely in 16 consecutive games dating back to June 25, batting .344 (22x64) with 16 runs scored, 2 doubles, 5 home runs, 13 RBI, 5 walks, 3 hit-by-pitches, a .417 on-base percentage and a .609 slugging percentage (1.026). OPS) during that span...among American League players with at least 60 percent of their games played in the outfield, Mitch ranks 1st in runs scored (61), 2nd in extra-base hits (39), 2nd in total bases (173), T3rd in home runs (21), 3rd in RBI (54) and 3rd in hits (91).

MAJOR SEAG BASEBALL...Kyle Seager went 2-for-4 with a home run and 2 RBI last night...he had missed the Mariners last 2 games before the All-Star Break with a right shin bone bruise, snapping a careerhigh 225 games played streak (6/29/2019-7/9/2021)...was Seager's 3rd home run in his last 7 games...in 90 games this season, the third baseman is batting .217 (73x337) with 33 runs, 16 doubles, 1 triple, 17 home runs, 52 RBI, 2 stolen bases and 29 walks...this season he is rated as FanGraphs' 2nd-most clutch hitter in the American League with a "Clutch" metric of 1.37, trailing only teammate J.P. Crawford (1.93).

THE FRENCH CONNECTION...Ty France reached base 3 times last night, going 2-for-3 with a run scored, RBI and a hit-by-pitch...he has been hit by a pitch 14 times this season, which leads the American League and is tied with Cincinnati's Jonathan India for most in the Majors...in 45 games since returning from the Injured List on May 24, Ty is batting .295 (49x166) with 19 runs, 11 doubles, 5 home runs, 24 RBI, 10 walks and 9 hit-by-pitches...he's gotten on-base at a .362 clip, slugging .452 with an .814 OPS in that span.

TWO-WAY J.P....J.P. Crawford is the only MLB player worth at least 1.9 offensive WAR (*Baseball-Reference*) and at least 1.4 defensive WAR this season...his 1.4 dWAR is tied for 3rd in the Majors and ranks 2nd in the AL to only Texas shortstop Isiah Kiner-Falefa (1.6)...J.P.'s 7 Defensive Runs Saved (*FanGraphs*) are tied for 6th-most in the Majors and are tied for 2nd-most among shortstops...in the batter's box, he is rated as *FanGraphs*' most clutch hitter in the Majors with a "Clutch" metric of 1.93...since June 1, J.P. is batting .309 (47x152) with 26 runs, 13 doubles, 3 home runs, 15 RBI, 15 walks and 2 stolen bases in 37 games...in that span, he's gotten on-base at a .367 clip, slugging .454 with an .821 OPS.

CATCHING UP...in 24 games since June 15, Mariners catchers have combined for 0.9 WAR (FanGraphs), tied with Detroit and Tampa Bay for most in the American League in that span...Seattle catchers trail only San Francisco (1.8) and Colorado (1.0) for most WAR in the Majors during that span...Mariners catchers **Tom Murphy, Cal Raleigh** and **Luis Torrens** have combined to bat .243 (27x111) with 19 runs scored, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 8 home runs, 20 RBI and 17 walks in those 24 games...the 8 homers are tied for most in the Majors since June 15 with Detroit and New York-AL

53-MAN ROSTER...53 players appeared in a game for Seattle in the first half, most in the American League and tied for most in the Majors with Milwaukee...the Mariners used 30 pitchers in the first half, tied for 2nd-most in the AL with Baltimore, trailing only Toronto's 31...the 2019 Mariners set a pair of Major League records by using 67 total players and 40 pitchers...at the 2019 All-Star Break, the club had also used 53 players.

AS YOU KNOW...Paul Sewald is 5-2 with 3 saves and a 1.38 ERA (4 ER, 26.0 IP) with 11 walks and 44 strikeouts...his 15.2 strikeouts-per-9 innings ranks 5th in MLB and 2nd in the AL to only Aroldis Chapman-NYY (15.5) among pitchers with at least 20 IP...**Drew Steckenrider** is 3-2 with 2 saves and a 2.12 ERA (8 ER, 34.0 IP) with 11 walks and 38 strikeouts, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Sewald and Steckenrider are 1 of just 4 relief pitcher teammate duos that both have at least 1.0 Win Above Replacement (*FanGraphs*) this season?...Sewald (1.2 WAR) and Steckenrider (1.1) are joined by Boston's Matt Barnes (1.7) and Adam Ottavino (1.1), New York-AL's Jonathan Loaisiga (1.6) and Chad Green (1.3), as well as New York-NL's Edwin Díaz (1.4) and Aaron Loup (1.1).

- ABOUT KIKUCHI...

 30-year-old (6/17/91) left-hander is making his 17th start of the season, his 58th Major League start and his 7th career start vs the Los Angeles Angels (second this year).
- Signed with Seattle on Jan. 2, 2019...is signed through 2021 with options through 2025.
- Native of Morioka, Japan...pitched for Hanamaki Higashi High School. Was the top pick in the 2009 NPB Draft by the Saitama Seibu
- Lions of Japan's Pacific League. In 7 seasons with Seibu, was 69-45 with a 2.69 ERA (286 ER, 956.1 IP) with 879
- strikeouts and 363 walks in 148 games (144 starts)...had 13 complete games, cludina 7 shutouts.
- Resides in Tokyo, Japan with wife, Rumi (married in 2016), and son, Leo...Rumi previously worked as a broadcaster for NHK TV.
- LAST OUTING...Had career-best 5-game winning streak snapped in Mariners 5-4 loss to NY...allowed 3, 2-out runs in T1, and a 2R Judge HR in T2 before settling inand finishing with 3.0 scoreless innings...was only second time this season he didn't pitch into the 6th inning...allowed a season-high 8 hits.
- **STREAK...**ran off a career-best 5-game winning streak May 24-July 1...over the 7-start run, was 5-0, 1.87 (9 ER, 43.1 IP) with 40 strikeouts...included a 4-start stretch June 12-July 1 in which he posted a 1.01 ERA and 24 strikeouts in 26.2 innings...the last Mariners pitcher with that low of an ERA and that many strikeouts over a 4-start span was Félix Hernández in Sept. 2014 (0.96 ERA and 31 strikeouts in 28.0 innings (via Elias Sport Bureau).
- ALL-STAR...named to the American League All-Star Team for the first time in his career on July 4...was on AL club but did not pitch...is the 14th Japanese-born player to be selected to participate in a Major League Baseball All-Star Game... of the 14 Japanese-born players to make a Major League All-Star roster, 5 have been in a Seattle uniform: Ichiro Suzuki (10x), Kazuhiro Sasaki (2x), Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hisashi lwakuma and Yusei Kikuchi...of the 30 total Japanese-born selections, exactly one-half (15) have been Mariners.
- <u>CONSISTENT QUALITY</u>...Has 11 quality starts this season, T5th-most among AL starters: 13-Gerrit Cole & Robbie Ray; 12-Chris Bassitt & Kyle Gibson; 11-Yusei Kikuchi & Shane Bieber.
- WHAT A MONTH...Kikuchi went 2-0 with a 1.90 ERA (5 ER, 23.2 IP) in 4 starts in June, while limiting opponents to a .181 (15x83) average, walking 10 and striking out 26...among American League starters his 1.90 June ERA was 3rd-lowest, trailing only Sean Manaea-OAK (1.13) and Kyle Gibson-TEX (1.52).
- THAT'S QUALITY...recorded a quality start in 6 consecutive outings from April 29 -May 30, marking the longest quality start streak of his career...left the game in the top of the 5th inning on June 5 at Los Angeles-AL, after getting hit by a line drive comebacker, ending the streak having tossed 4.0 innings while striking out 8 with 64 pitches (48 strikes).
- **W#1**...had one of best starts of his career, tossing 7.0 shutout innings and allowing just 1 hit at HOU on April 29 in 1-0 SEA win...had a no-hitter thru 6 1/3 innings in notching his 1st W of season...allowed only a Correa opposite field double.
- TAKKKE A SEAT...set a career high with 11 strikeouts May 11 vs. Los Angeles-NL, while tossing 6.1 innings and allowing 3 earned runs on 6 hits with 1 walk...first Mariners pitcher to record 11 strikeouts in a game since James Paxton did it on July 1, 2018 against Kansas City.
- **SEASON OPENER**...ND in 2021 debut on 4/2 vs. SF...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed 3 ER on 6 hits 1 walk with a career-high tying 10 strikeouts...left the game with the score tied 3-3 after the 6th inning in 3-6 Mariners loss.
- START ME UP... Yusei has made 57 career starts with Seattle in his 3-year Major League career...he currently ranks 13th in starts as a Japanese-born pitcher in the Major Leagues...he trails Mac Suzuki (1996-2005), whose 67 starts are currently 12th-most...Hideo Nomo hold the record for a Japanese-born pitcher with 318 career MLB starts...Kikuchi's 57 starts trail Hisashi Iwakuma's 136 starts (2012-17) for most in Mariners club history.
- 2020 RECAP... went 2-4 with a 5.17 ERA (27 ER, 47.0 IP) with 20 walks and 47 strikeouts in 9 starts during his second Major League season...tossed at least 6.0 innings in 4 starts, including 3 of his last 4 starts to end the season.
- SMALL BALL...Kikuchi was 1 of 10 players in MLB to make 9-or-more starts and allow 3 or less home runs in 2020...the others include Justus Sheffield-SEA (10 GS, 2 HR), Max Fried-ATL (11 GS, 2 HR), Randy Dobnak-MIN (10 GS, 3 HR), Dallas Keuchel-CWS (11 GS, 2 HR), Brad Keller-KC (9 GS, 2 HR), Corbin Burnes-MIL (9 GS, 2 HR), Spencer Turnbull-DET (11 GS, 2 HR), Zack Wheeler-PHI (11 GS, 3 HR) and Steven Brault-PIT (10 GS, 2 HR).
- HISTORIC DEBUT...with his start March 21, 2019 at Oakland in the Tokyo Dome, became the first Japanese-born player to make his Major League debut in Japan... was just his second career start (3rd appearance) as a professional in the Tokyo Dome.
- COMPLETELY KIKUCHI... recorded his first career complete game shutout on August 18, 2019 at Toronto, pitching 9.0 scoreless innings and allowing only 2 hits and 1 walk with 8 strikeouts...he became just the 14th pitcher (done 17x) in club history to throw a complete game shutout within his first 30 career starts (last: Mike Montgomery, 6/30/15 at SD)...was the 4th Mariners pitcher since 2000 to throw a complete game shutout within his first 30 career starts (also: Mike Montgomery, Roenis Elías, and Gil Meche).

WELCOME TO SEATTLE...signed with Seattle on Jan. 2, 2019...is signed through 2021 with options through 2025...is the 10th Japanese-born player to appear with the Mariners, including the 6th pitcher...is the 3rd Japanese-born pitcher to start a game for the Mariners (also: Hisashi Iwakuma, 136 GS; and Mac Suzuki, 9 GS).


