SATURDAY IN THE PARK: The Detroit Tigers tonight aim to snap their five-game losing streak when they host the Toronto Blue Jays for the third game of their four-game weekend series at Comerica Park ... the Tigers now have separate five-and-six-game losing streaks in their past 12 games after not dropping more than three games in a row at any point during their first 94 games of the season.

- The Tigers have now lost 11 of their last 12 games dating to July 9, their first 1-11 stretch since June 2-14, 2023 ... overall, the Tigers have endured a 1-11 stretch like this within only eight of their past 20 seasons ... the Tigers are now 15 games above .500 for the first time since improving their record to 35-20 on Memorial Day.
- After dropping the first two games of this set, the Tigers will now be winless over a four-series stretch for the first time this season and for the first time since July 22-August 4, 2024 when they went 0-3-1 over the course of four series.
- Detroit is more than halfway through its stretch of 13-games-in-13-days out of the All-Star Break through July 30, while this series also kicked off a stretch of 13-of-16 games at home ... this seven-day homestand concludes with three games vs. Arizona starting on Monday.

HOME GROAN: The Tigers have lost six games in a row at home for the first time since June 12-17, 2022 and tonight look to avoid dropping at least a seventh-straight home game for the first time since an eight-game home skid from June 9-28, 2019.

IT'S ABSOLUTELY GOOD FOR SOMETHING: Tarik Skubal has a 5.2 WAR this season, according to Fangraphs, the best mark of any pitcher in all of baseball and behind only two position players -- Aaron Judge (7.2) and Cal Raleigh (6.2) -- for the best WAR by any player in the A.L. ... Skubal has a 0.7-point lead on the next closest A.L. pitcher -- Boston's Garrett Crochet (4.5) -- and is at least 1.9 points ahead of every other pitcher in the American League.

IT'S GOOD TO BE KING: Since the beginning of the 2024 campaign, Tarik Skubal has gone 28-7 with a 2.31 ERA (82 ER/319.2 IP) in 51 starts ... he has two more wins than his next closest competitors (Carlos Rodon and Framber Valdez have 26) in this span while Skubal's .537 OPS against is lowest in all of baseball, just a tick better than Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes (.539 OPS against).

- Skubal leads the majors with 392 strikeouts since the start of last season while ranking second to only Skenes (1.94) in ERA ... Skubal's .800 winning percentage leads all big leaguers.
- Skubal is 10-1 with a 1.85 ERA (23 ER/117.0 IP) in his last 18 starts dating to April 8 of this year, featuring a 12.83 K/BB ratio during this span, nearly double his next closest competitor.

THIS IS SOME HIGH-END TORK: Spencer Torkelson has now recorded an extra-base hit in four-straight games, the longest active streak in the A.L. and tied for second-longest in the majors.

- Torkelson has tallied 23 homers and 46 extra-base hits in 99 games this season, tied with Nick Kurtz for the most homers by any player in baseball that primarily plays first base this year and Torkelson has the most extra-base hits among first basemen in the American League.

TOUGH BREAK: The Tigers have lost seven of their first eight games out of the All-Star Break for the first time since 2019 when the club lost eight of its first nine games post-Break.

- Despite their recent times of woe, the Tigers still have a 7.5-game lead in the A.L. Central, the largest lead within any of the six divisions in baseball, and trail only Toronto (by 2.5 games) and Houston (by half-a-game) for the best record in the A.L.
- The Tigers have their best start through 105 games since 2013, when they also began 60-45 ... 2025 marks the eighth time in the last 41 years the Tigers have won 60 of their first 105 games.

THREE'S COMPANY: Riley Greene joins New York's Aaron Judge and Chicago's Seiya Suzuki as the only three players in the majors to reach 21 doubles, 25 homers and 79 RBI this season ... Greene has those totals through 105 team games, which puts him on pace for 32 doubles, 39 homers and 122 RBI in a 162-game season, shattering previous career bests.

A PAIR OF TWOS: Riley Greene (25 homers, 79 RBI) and Spencer Torkelson (23 homers, 61 RBI) are the only set of teammates in the American League to reach 23 homers and 61 RBI this season and are one of only two teammates to do so in all of baseball this year, joining Chicago's Seiya Suzuki and Pete Crow-Armstrong.

THIS DIFFERENCE ISN'T NEGLIGIBLE: The Tigers have the best record in the A.L. Central on the strength of a +61 overall run differential, the third-best mark in the A.L. (Yankees, +99; Rangers, +66) ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +96 edge on the second-place Guardians (-35), are +83 on the third-place Royals (-22) and are +69 on the fourth-place Twins (-8).

AND FINALLY: Tarik Skubal struck out 11 batters in his last start on Sunday in Texas, his seventh double-digit strikeout effort of the season ... he entered the 2025 campaign with seven such efforts and has now doubled his tally to 14 double-digit strikeout games in his career.

- Named the starting pitcher for the American League in the All-Star Game this year...his second straight year being an All-Star and first time getting the starting nod.
- On Sunday Night Baseball against Minnesota, he became the first left-handed pitcher in the pitch-tracking era to have multiple starts of 13+ strikeouts in fewer than 95 pitches...he also became just the four left-handed pitcher ever to have multiple starts in a single season of 13+ strikeouts, 0 runs and 2 or fewer hits; the other came at home against Cleveland.
- Threw the first complete-game shutout of his professional career on May 25 against Cleveland, tossing a "Maddux". He needed just 94 pitches (72 strikes/22 balls) to record 27 outs, with 13 of those coming by way of strikeout, tying his career high. His 13 strikeouts were the most strikeouts by any pitcher in major league history in a "Maddux".
- In that outing, he became the first pitcher in Tigers history to throw a complete game issuing zero walks and allowing no more than two hits with at least 13 strikeouts...he is the first pitcher in the majors to record such a start since Jacob deGrom did so on April 23, 2021.
- Struck out a season-high 12 batters on May 9 against Texas, marking the third 12-strikeout game of his career and his most in a game since his career-high 13 on July 7, 2024, at Cincinnati. With the outing, he became the first pitcher in MLB history to have 40+ strikeouts (50), no more than one walk (1) and an ERA under 1.00 (0.97: 4ER/37.0IP) over a six-start span since ERA became in official stat in both leagues in 1913.
- Went 3-1 with a 1.52 ERA (5 ER/29.2 IP) with 38 strikeouts and four walks in five starts this April, a tick better than his April of 2024, going 3-0 with a 2.05 ERA (7 ER/30.2 IP) with 35 strikeouts and six walks in five starts.
- Was the unanimous AL Cy Young winner in 2024, becoming the fifth Tiger to win the award, the first since Max Scherzer in 2013, and the second LHP in franchise history to ever do so (other, Willie Hernandez in 1984).
- Won the American League Pitching Triple Crown, finishing first in wins (18), ERA (2.39) and strikeouts (228)...became the third pitcher in franchise history and the 22nd pitcher in Major League history to win the Triple Crown, joining Justin Verlander (2011) and Hal Newhouser (1945).
- Started his playoff career last year by not allowing a run in 17.0 consecutive innings, tied for the fifth-longest streak in MLB history and longest since Ian Anderson (17.2 innings) in 2020.

- Threw five scoreless, one hit innings in his first game of the season on June 26 against the Athletics...struck out four compared to two walks in the outing.
- Signed by Detroit on Jan. 6, 2025, and was assigned to Triple-A Toledo the following day...went 2-2 with a 2.89 ERA in 14 starts with the Mud Hens, allowing 20 earned runs on 61 hits and 15 walks while striking out 71 over 62.1 innings pitched.
- Played in the Japanese Pacific and Eastern Leagues as well as the KBO League from 2022-24.
- Selected by the Yankees in the 19th round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft out of Central Michigan University.

- Had seven scoreless outings in June, allowing two earned runs in each of his other three games...has thrown more than one inning in 14 of his 35 games as of June 30.
- Did not allow an earned run in April, going 2-0 over the month...allowed 12 hits and three walks while striking out nine.
