- The 5-4 loss vs NYM on 9/5 was the Reds' 10th in 13 games and knocked them 6.0 games off the pace for a postseason appearance
- Had been "the first team out" until they were leapfrogged in the Wild Card standings by both SF and AZ during a 3-11 run.
- Since that 9/5 heartbreaker, the Reds have gone 8-5 to climb back within 2.0 games of the **Mets**, who are 4-9 over that same span.
- Cin been as close as a half-game game out (8/22).

BABY, COME BACK: Last night's 7-4 win at StL marked the Reds' 31st comeback victory since the beginning of June, the second-most in the majors during that time (Tor, 32)...from Opening Day through 5/31, Cin produced 7 comeback wins, fourth-fewest in the majors

In Late and Close situations from 3/27-6/2, the Reds went 20-26 (.435) and slashed .169/.252/.241 with 3 HR...since then are 41-34 in Late and Close situations and slashing .259/.344/.401 with 14 HR (Late and Close refers to game situations in the 7th inning or later with the batting team tied, ahead by 1, or with the tying run on base, at bat or on deck).

WHO DEY THINK GONNA SWEEP THE REDS: The Reds have yet to be swept in any of their 25 series this season at Great American Ball Park, including this current 4-game set vs Chc (1-0).

- Are aiming to go an entire season without being swept at home for the sixth time in franchise history (not counting the 2020 COVID-19 season).
- Only the Reds teams of 1940, 1943, 1944, 1994, and 2012 ran the home schedule without being swept (Elias).

MILESTONES FOR ELLY: SS Elly De La Cruz yesterday vs Chc belted his 20th home run of the season (6th inning off RHP Porter Hodge) to become the third Red ever to collect at least 20 HR and 35 SB in consecutive seasons (Eric Davis 1986-88 & Joe Morgan 1973-74 & '76-'77)...courtesy Elias.

- On 9/7 became the fourth-youngest Cin batter (23 years, 239 days) to reach 200 career RBI since that became an official stat in 1920 (Johnny Bench, Frank Robinson, Vada Pinson).
- On 9/5 became the sixth-youngest Red (23 years, 237 days) to reach 400 career hits (Pinson, S.Crawford, Bench, D. Hoblitzell, Robinson).

- The Reds have led 5 of the 11 games of this season series by 4 or more runs (4-0 & 6-2 on <u>5/23</u>, lost 13-6; 6-1 on <u>5/24</u>, won 6-4; 8-3 on <u>5/25</u>, lost 11-8; 6-0 5/30, won 6-2; won 5-1 on 8/5).
- The Redlegs are 100-87 all-time vs the Cubs at Great American Ball Park, having won 22 of the last 36g here against their division rival.
- Last night's (9/19) 7-4 loss marked the Cubs' 100th at GABP...only the Pirates have more losses among Cin opponents here (85-105).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in the decision in the 11-7 win on 9/15 at StL (5.2ip, 5h, 4r/4er, 0bb, 3k, 0hr, 86TP).

- Was his seventh consecutive outing without a decision.
- Was the fifth time over his last 7 apps that he allowed 3 or more runs
- Was his 13th start without issuing a walk, T1st in the majors (Det's Tarik Skubal).
- Retired 12 straight from the 2nd inning to the 6th...set down the first 2 batters he faced in the 6th but allowed each of his next 4 to reach (3r), which proved his ouster.

**SEPTEMBER 9 at SD:** Did not factor in the decision in the 4-2 loss on 9/9 at SD (6.0ip, 2h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 4k, 0hr, 94TP).

- Marked the third time in his career that he pitched as many as 6.0 innings in a game while allowing 2 hits or fewer (9/19/04 vs Bos & 9/13/24 at Cle).
- · Allowed just 4 of his 22 batters to reach.
- Retired 11 in-a-row from the 1st inning through the 4th... retired each of his last 5 batters.
- Hit a batter for the first time since 6/22.
- Was his 17th quality start of the season, his fourth in 7 starts for the Reds
- Threw first-pitch strikes to 15 of his 22 batters.

**SEPTEMBER 3 vs TOR:** Did not factor in the decision in the 13-9 loss on 9/3 vs Tor (4.1, 7h, 5r/5er, 1bb, 6k, 4hr, 88TP).

- Didn't hold a 5-run lead...all 5 of his runs came via HR.
- His 4 HR allowed matched a season high for the third time (6/11 at Bos & 4/10 vs LAA).

AUGUST 29 vs STL: Did not factor in the decision in the 7-5, 10-inning loss on 8/29 vs StL (7.0ip, 6h, 4r/3er, 0bb, 4k, 2hr, 97TP).

3 RUNS OR FEWER: Has allowed 3 runs or fewer in 20 of his last 27 outings dating back to April 16 (160ip, 65r/63er, 26bb, 109k, 29hr, 3.54 ERA, 16QS).

**STARTING AS A STARTER:** Is in his second season as a full-time starter after joining the Rays rotation in July 2023.

**EFFICIENT:** Averages 14.9 pitches per inning, the fourth-lowest mark in the majors (Phi's Cristopher Sánchez 14.5, Sea's Bryan Woo 14.5, Det's Tarik Skubal 14.5).

 Has retired 161 batters on 2 pitches or fewer, second-most in the majors behind Sea's Bryan Woo (163)...this includes 74 first-pitch outs (3rd in the majors).

**LIMITING FREE PASSES:** His 4.0% walk rate is the lowest among all qualified Major League pitchers.

- Since 2023, his 4.1% walk rate ranks third in the majors during that time (min. 1000bf) behind Sea's George Kirby (3.5%) and Bal's Zach Eflin (3.6%).
- Is just 1 of 2 active pitchers with 60 or more career starts, who has fewer walks as a starting pitcher (74) than games started (77)...Kirby (110gs/92bb) is the other.
- Along with Det's Tarik Skubal, leads the majors with 13 starts without a walk.

**BEGINNING JULY 27, 2024:** Over his last 39 starts dating back to 7/27/24, is pitching to a 3.42 ERA (.237/.275/.422, 20qs, 1.07 WHIP, 4.3 BB%, 90r/86er, 226.1ip).
