# PITTSBURGH PIRATES (19-25) vs. CHICAGO CUBS (25-19) May 16, 2024 at Wrigley Field, Chicago, IL - 6:40 CDT - GAME \#45/R0AD \#24 RHP JARED JONES (2-4, 2.68 ERA) vs. LHP JUSTIN STEELE ( $0-0,4.73$ ERA) 

THE PIRATES:...lost 10-2 yesterday in the finale of their three-game series against the Brewers at American Family Field...Have lost two straight and three of their last four games...Have gone 10-13 on the road...Have played in eight games decided by one or two runs in their last 12 contests (are 11-12 overall this season in one- or two-run games)... Are 2-4 in a stretch of 10 straight games against the National League Central...Have gone $16-3$ when scoring at least four runs in a game (one of those three losses came Sunday against the Cubs at PNC Park)...Won each of their first four extra inning games before losing for the only time Sunday against the Cubs...Are 15-1 when leading after eight innings (their only loss came on April 9 against the Tigers).

ABOUT TONIGHT'S STARTER: Jared Jones gets the start tonight in the opener of this four-game series against the Cubs...This is the second straight start against the Cubs for Jones, who allowed three runs (2er) in 6.0 innings while losing a $7-2$ decision last Friday at PNC Park...The 22-year-old righthander comes into today leading all rookies in MLB in strikeouts (56), second in WHIP (0.87) , third in batting average against (.198) and seventh in ERA (2.68).

KEEPING UP WITH THE JONES': Jared Jones has pitched at least 5.0 innings while allowing three runs or fewer in all eight of his career starts...According to StatsPerform, the only two other Pirates pitchers that have started their career with such a streak are Cy Blanton (eight straight between 1934 \& 1935) and Gerrit Cole (10 straight in 2013).

GIMME FIVE: Connor Joe has recorded an RBI in each of his last five games, which is tied for the longest streak by a Pirate this year along with Michael A. Taylor from March 29 to April 3 (it's also the longest active RBI streak in MLB)...Bryan Reynolds was the last

Pirate to knock in a run in six straight games, doing so on two occasions last season from April 2-8 and again from April 22-30.

LEADING THINGS OFF: Andrew McCutchen is 8 -for-20 (.400) with two homers, three RBI, six runs scored and a 1.178 OPS in his last five games..It's the first time he has had at least eight hits and six runs over a five-game span since September 22-27, 2020, with Philadelphia...McCutchen enters today ranked fifth in the National League among leadoff hitters in OPS (.828), ninth in OBP (.352) and fifth in slugging (.476)...Special thanks to StatsPerform.

CONNOR VS. THE CUBS: Connor Joe went deep in back-to-back games against the Cubs on Saturday and Sunday at PNC Park...Joe is also a . 379 lifetime hitter ( 33 -for-87) with eight doubles, one triple, six home runs and 17 RBI in 25 games against the Cubs.

THIS AND THAT: Connor Joe is 6 -for-10 lifetime against Justin Steele...Michael A. Taylor is 8 -for-20 with a double and two home runs in his last eight games against the Cubs (he took Steele deep with an opposite-field shot Saturday at PNC Park)...The Pirates took two of three games from the Cubs at Wrigley Field in September last season, scoring 13 and eight runs in the final two games, both wins...Pittsburgh's 21 runs in those two games are its most in a two-game span at Wrigley since May 6-7, 2000 ( 22 runs).

DIALING LONG DISTANCE: Pittsburgh is tied for the third-most home runs

## PLAYERS WITH 2000-PLUS HITS

(16) in the National League this month along with the Cubs...The only two National League teams with more home runs this month are the Dodgers (23) and Brewers (19)... Oneil Cruz has gone deep four times this month, which is tied for the fourth-most among National League players.

CRUZ MISSILES: Oneil Cruz has recorded each of the top nine and 12 of the top 14 exit velocities by a Pirate in the Statcast era (since 2015)...Sunday against the Cubs, Cruz' double off Keegan Thompson was measured at 119.7 miles-per-hour, which was the second-highest exit velocity by a Pirate in the StatCast era.

LOVING LEFTIES: The Pirates are slated to face left-handed starters twice in the next three games against the Cubs (Justin Steele tonight and Shota Imanaga on Saturday)...Pittsburgh is tied for the fifth-most home runs (16) against southpaws in all of MLB...The Orioles lead all of MLB with 24 home runs off lefies.
