**TODAY'S TRANSACTION:** The Reds today activated from the 15-day injured list RHP Hunter Greene (right groin strain); optioned to AAA-Louisville RHP Sam Benschoter (post-game on 8/12).

#### TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Is Game 3 (1-1) of a 3-game series vs Elyssa Kaplan's Phillies and the third game (1-1) of a 7-day, 6-game homestand that includes an upcoming 3-game weekend series vs NL Central Division-leaders Mil.
- Tomorrow's off day will be the club's first since 7/24...will have played 20 consecutive days without a rest...were scheduled off on 8/3 but instead finished the suspended **Speedway Classic** vs Atl in Bristol, TN.
- Following Sun's game vs Mil, will hit the road for a 9-game trip at LAA (8/18-8/20), AZ (8/22-8/24) and LAD (8/25-8/27)...it will be their first of 2 consecutive trips out west (at Padres, A's, and Cardinals next month).

**NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM:** The Reds have not been swept in any of their last 40 series dating back to last year and including all 39 series in which they've played this year.

- Haven't been swept in a series of at least 2 games since 9/24-9/25, 2024 at Cle (2g), a span of 40 straight series...per Elias, that ranks as the fourth-longest streak of sweepless series in team history (see below).
- This 39-series, *in-season* streak without being swept is the longest run in club history, eclipsing the 1970 National League championship team, which opened its season with 32 straight series without getting swept.
- Cin is the only Major League team not to have been swept this season.
- On 6 occasions during this streak, avoided being swept with a win in the final game of a series (4/23 at Mia, 5/15 vs CWS, 6/22 at StL, 7/2 at Bos, 7/23 at Wsh, 7/30 vs LAD).

**TOUGH ROAD AHEAD:** The Reds are in the midst of a final 59-game stretch in which 38 games have been/will be played against opponents with records at or above .500 (3-0 vs TB, 1-2 vs LAD, 2-1 at Chc, 1-1 vs Phi, 3g vs Mil, 3g at LAD, 3g vs StL, 3g vs Tor, 3g vs NYM, 3g at SD, 3g at StL, 4g at Chc, 3g at Mil).

- As of today, the Reds have the toughest remaining schedule in the Major Leagues, based on opponents' winning percentage (.534).
- NYM has the 11th-toughest remaining schedule (.507) while Chc (.476), SD (.470), and Los Angeles (.468) have the easiest remaining schedules in the majors.

**QUANTITY OVER QUALITY:** Opposing Major League pitchers have posted fewer quality starts vs Cin (32) than any other single opponent this season (Elias).

**DABBLING IN PERFECTION:** LHP Andrew Abbott (Mon) and RHP Brady Singer (Tue) are the first pair of Cin starters in the expansion era (since 1961) to each produce a perfect game bid of at least 4.0 innings in consecutive games.

- Abbott on Mon vs Phi went 4 perfect innings before allowing J.T. Realmuto's leadoff double in the 5th inning.
- Singer on Tue vs Phi also began the game with 4.0 perfect innings until Nick Castellanos led off with a single in the 5th inning.

**SERIES NOTES:** The Reds and Phillies are facing off for second and final time this season...Phi won 2 of 3 at Citizens Bank Park 7/4-7/6...that series included a complete-game 1-hitter by Zack Wheeler on 7/6 (3-1 Phi win).

- Cin is 32-32 vs the Phillies since 2015 and 10-16 since 2022...the Reds have lost 4 of the last 6 games and are 1-2-2 over the last 5 series.
- The 7-0 Phillies win on 4/22/24 took 2 hours and 2 minutes...it was the quickest 9-inning game at Great American Ball Park since 9/5/06, when the Reds blanked the Giants, 3-0, also in 2 hours and 2 minutes..

**TONY TIME:** RHP Tony Santillan on Mon vs Phi appeared in his Major League-leading 60th game of the season to become the first Reds pitcher since LHP Bill Bray in 2011 to appear in at least 60 of the team's first 120 games...Santillan is aiming to become the first Reds pitcher to lead the majors in apps since LHP Rob Murphy in 1988 (76g).

**DEADLINE DEALS:** Cin made 3 trades leading up to the 7/31 deadline:

- 7/31: Acquired from the Athletics INF/OF Miguel Andujar (ahn-DOO-har) in exchange for RHP Kenya Huggins.
- 7/30: Acquired from the Pirates 3B Ke'Bryan Hayes (key-Bryan, #3) in exchange for LHP Taylor Rogers, SS Sammy Stafura, and cash considerations.
- 7/30: Acquired from the Rays RHP Zack Littell (lih-TELL, #52) in exchange for LHP Adam Serwinowski and RHP Brian Van Belle.

**CHASING HISTORY:** In Fri's 3-2 loss at PIT, RHP Chase Burns produced his fourth 10-strikeout game of his young career to become the first Major League pitcher since 1893 with at least 10 strikeouts in 4 of his first 8 apps.

- Is also just the third Major League pitcher since 1893 with double-digit strikeouts in 4 of his first 8 career starts, joining Fernando Valenzuela (1981) and Bob Feller (1936)...courtesy Elias.
- Is the first Reds pitcher to begin his career with at least 57 strikeouts over his first 8 games since Gary Nolan (60k, 1967).

**MAN OF STEAL:** SS Elly De La Cruz stole his 30th base of the season in the 8/2 MLB Speedway Classic, becoming the ninth Major Leaguer in the live-ball era (since 1920) with at least 30 steals in each of his first 3 career seasons, the first since KC's Bobby Witt Jr. (2022-24).

- His 133 career stolen bases are fifth-most by any Major Leaguer through their first 3 career seasons in the live-ball era (since 1920), behind only Vince Coleman (326, 1985-87), Rickey Henderson (189, 1979-81), Delino DeShields (144, 1990-92), and Kenny Lofton (138, 1991-93).

**ACTIVATED:** Was activated today from the 15-day injured list...was placed on the IL on 6/4 with a right groin strain.

- Made 4 rehabilitation appearances with R-ACL Reds (1g, 2ip) and AAA-Louisville (3g, 11ip) where he pitched to a 6.23 ERA over 13.0 innings (10h, 11r/9er, 5bb, 24k, 4hr).

**LAST TIME OUT - INJURED:** Did not factor in the 4-2 win vs Mil on 6/3 (5.0ip, 5h, 2r/2er, 3bb, 7k, 1hr, 85TP)...in the 5th inning felt discomfort in his right groin area and didn't return in the 6th after 85 total pitches...was placed on the 15-day injured list the following day (right groin strain)...was the same injury that landed him on the IL from 5/8-5/23 and caused him to miss 2 starts.

- Threw first-pitch strikes to all 23 batters he faced...was the first time in his career that he produced an outing with a 100% first-pitch strike pct...was the first Major League pitcher to face at least 23 batters and throw first-pitch strikes to all of them since Det's Michael Fulmer on 4/12/17 vs Min (also 23-for-23).
- Allowed 2 runs or fewer for the fifth straight start, and for the ninth time over his previous 11 starts.

**MAY 28 at KC:** Suffered the 3-2 loss on 5/28 at KC (5.0ip, 7h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 3k, 88TP).

- Allowed 2 runs or fewer for the fourth straight start, and in 8 of his previous 10.
- Threw first-pitch strikes to 17 of his 21 batters (81%).
- Allowed 7 hits for the second time this season (also: 4/26 at Col)...had allowed 7 hits in his previous 3 starts combined.

**MAY 23 vs Chc:** On 5/23 was activated from the 15-day injured list and started that night vs Chc...did not factor in the decision in the 13-6 loss vs the Cubs (4.0ip, 3h, 2r/2er, 2bb, 2k, 1hr, 83TP)...was on the IL since 5/8 with a right groin strain and missed 2 starts.

- Exited the game with a 4-2 lead.
- Threw 37 pitches in the 4th inning (2h, 2r/2er, 2bb, 1hr)...marked the second time in his career that he fired as many as 37 pitches in an inning (also: 4/16/24 at Sea, 39TP in the 3rd inning).
- His 4th inning base-on-balls to Dansby Swanson marked the first time this season he walked a bottom of the order (7,8,9) batter, and the first time he did it since 8/13/24 vs StL (No. 7 batter Lars Nootbaar in the top of the 5th).

**MAY 7 at ATL - INJURED :** Exited the 5/7 game at Atl with a right groin injury after 2 warm-up pitches in the top of the 4th inning...had pitched 3.0 shutout innings to that point (2h, 6k, 53TP).

- Struck out all 3 batters he faced in the 2nd inning...was the third time this season he fanned all 3 batters he faced in an inning...has punched out all 3 batters he faced in an inning 17 times in his career.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the 2-1 win at Pit on 8/9 (7.0ip, 4h, 1r/1er, 2bb, 4k, 94TP).

- Was his 10th quality start of the season, the 48th of his career.
- Reached 7.0 innings pitched for the fourth time this season, the first since his no-hit bid on 6/27 vs SD (8.0ip).
- Is filling Nick Lodolo's spot in the rotation while Lodolo is on the 15-day IL recovering from a blister on his left index finger.

**AUGUST 4:** Relieved Nick Lodolo in the 3-2 win on 8/4 at Chc (2.1ip, 2h, 2r/2er, 1hr, 33TP).

- Was his third relief appearance of the season, his first since 6/23 vs NYY...was his first relief app since moving to the bullpen following the acquisition of starter Zack Littell at the trade deadline.
- Was his longest relief outing since 7/30/24 vs Chc (4.0ip).

- Has been ahead in the count to 58.6% of his batters (139 of 237)...*league average is 48.0%*
- Among plate apps with at least 3 pitches, 2 of his first 3 offerings have been strikes to 67.8% of the batters he's faced in 2025.
- Has 16 three-pitch strikeouts this season.
