**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners open up a 7-day, 6-game homestand with the first of 3 games against the Los Angeles Angels...the matchup against the Angels features a rare mid-series off-day on Wednesday due to a FIFA World Cup game in Seattle...the Mariners will also host the Toronto Blue Jays (3 G, 7/3-5) on the homestand...Seattle is coming off a 6-game road trip against the Pirates (1-2) and Guardians (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as the field analyst...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

**ODDS & ENDS**...the Mariners dropped last night's rubber game to the Guardians by a 6-5 final score... Seattle is 28-12 when scoring 4+ runs, 17-6 when recording 10+ hits and 36-21 when they record a HR.

- **Hey Buddy** - Yesterday the Mariners acquired INF **Buddy Kennedy** from the San Francisco Giants in exchange for cash considerations...he is batting .321 with a .967 OPS in 48 games with Triple-A Sacramento this season and appeared in 7 MLB games with San Francisco before being designated for assignment by the Giants on Sunday.
- **What's the Diff?** - The Mariners (+4) are one of 4 AL teams with a positive run differential, including the New York Yankees (+101), Tampa Bay Rays (+24) and Chicago White Sox (+18).
- **Bazz Hands** - RHP **Eduard Bazarzo** ranks 6th among American League relievers (min. 20 IP) with a 1.96 ERA (8 ER, 36.2 IP)...he has not allowed a run over his last 7 games (6.0 IP).
- **Swiper** - **Victor Robles** recorded 3 stolen bases yesterday including stealing 3rd base twice...he is the first Mariner to steal third base twice in the same game since he did it on Sept. 14, 2024 vs. TEX.
- **Future** - Major League Baseball is set to announce its All-Star Futures Game rosters on Wednesday, July 1 at 8:30 a.m. PT...the game will be played in Philadelphia on Sunday, July 12.

**HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS**...the Mariners begin a 7-day, 6-game homestand against the Los Angeles Angels (3 G, 6/29-6/30, 7/2) in a series that features a rare mid-series off-day, and the Toronto Blue Jays (3 G, 7/3-7/5)...highlights on the homestand include **Cal Raleigh 3-day Pop! Collectible Giveaway** during each game of the Angels series, **Patriotic Fireworks Night** on July 3, **Fourth of July Patriotic Bucket Hat Giveaway** on July 4 and Kids Run the Bases on July 5.

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR**...Major League Baseball is set to announce its All-Star rosters on **Saturday, July 4** at 4:30 p.m. PT on FOX for the 96th Midsummer Classic...the 2026 MLB All-Star Game takes place on Tuesday, July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia.

**DOM CANZONE, EVERYBODY!**...in 23 games this month, **Dominic Canzone** is batting .318 (21x66) with 11 runs, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 10 RBI and 7 walks in 73 plate appearances...his 1.013 OPS ranks 6th among American League batters with at least 60 plate appearances this month...since the start of the 2025 season, Canzone is batting .289 (125x433) with 59 runs, 24 doubles, 1 triple, 23 home runs, 65 RBI, a .354 OBP and slugging .508 for an .862 OPS and an 144 OPS+ in 484 plate appearances...among players with at least 400 PA over the last two seasons, Canzone's 144 OPS+ ranks 8th, trailing Aaron Judge-NYY (195 OPS+), Shohei Ohtani-LAD (176), Nick Kurtz-ATH (165), Yordan Alvarez-HOU (164), Juan Soto-NYM (161), Kyle Schwarber-PHI (152) and Ronald Acuña Jr.-ATL (150).

**ARAZARENA: ALL-STAR WORTHY**...**Randy Arozarena** is batting .283 (80x283) with 48 runs, 19 doubles, 1 triple, 8 homers, 36 RBI, 30 walks and 19 steals, posting a .370 on-base percentage, .442 slugging and .812 OPS...among American League outfielders this season, he ranks 6th in bWAR (2.6), 5th in OBP, 3rd in doubles and T-1st in stolen bases...Randy is looking to become the 9th back-to-back All-Star position player in Mariners history, joining OF Ichiro Suzuki (2001-10), OF Ken Griffey Jr. (1990-99), DH Edgar Martinez (1995-97 & 2000-01), INF Alex Rodriguez (1996-98), INF Robinson Canó (2016-17), OF Nelson Cruz (2017-18), INF Harold Reynolds (1987-88) and teammate OF **Julio Rodríguez** (2022-23).

**RARE AIR FOR WOO**...right-hander **Bryan Woo** (0.992 career WHIP) is 1 of 4 starting pitchers in Major League history to have a sub-1.00 WHIP and at least 400 innings pitched, along with Hall of Famer Addie Joss (0.968 WHIP), who pitched for Cleveland from 1902-10 and threw the second perfect game (1908) in American League history after Cy Young (1904)...joining Woo and Joss are active hurlers Jacob deGrom-TEX (0.988) and Paul Skenes-PIT (0.952).

**GILBERT APPROACHING MARINERS HISTORY**...**Logan Gilbert** sits at 991 career strikeouts, 9 away from becoming the 5th pitcher to record 1,000 strikeouts with the Mariners, joining Félix Hernández (2,524 SO), Randy Johnson (2,162), Jamie Moyer (1,239) and Mark Langston (1,078).

**MUÑOZ MOVES UP LEADERBOARD**...on Friday night, **Andrés Muñoz** pitched a scoreless 9th inning with 2 strikeouts, notching his 400th career strikeout and recording his 15th save of the season...it marked his 93rd career save (92nd with Seattle), tying Aurelio López for the 3rd-most saves by a Mexican-born pitcher...he now trails only Roberto Osuna (155 SV) and Joakim Soria (229 SV)...Muñoz's 92 saves with the Mariners also rank 5th in franchise history, behind Mike Schooler (98 SV), J.J. Putz (101 SV), Edwin Díaz (109 SV) and Kazuhiro Sasaki (129 SV).

**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...**Cal Raleigh** drew a pair of walks in yesterday's game, reaching base safely 3 times, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Raleigh (T-4th, 57 G) and teammate **J.P. Crawford** (3rd, 60 G) both rank in the top 5 among American League players in most multi-walk games since 2022?...they trail only Aaron Judge-NYY (115 G) and Taylor Ward-LAA/BAL (63 G).

### ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JUNE 29

- **1985** - The Mariners posted a then club-record 8th straight win.
- **1992** - Tino Martinez went 5-for-6 vs. Oakland to tie the Mariners mark for most hits in a game.
- **1994** - The movie "Little Big League" which includes an appearance by Ken Griffey Jr., releases in theaters.
- **2010** - Cliff Lee pitches 3rd consecutive complete game in a 7-4 win over New York. The 16th time in franchise history a pitcher tossed 3+ consecutive complete games and the first since Randy Johnson in 1998.
- **2014** - Félix Hernández allowed 1 hit over 8.0 innings and Fernando Rodney worked a 1-2-3 9th inning as the Mariners 1-hit Cleveland in a 3-0 shutout.
- **2018** - Marco Gonzales recorded his first career complete game in a 4-1 win over the Royals.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 17th start of the season and 1st against the Angels...is making the 129th start of his career and his 12th career start against the Angels.

LAST TIME OUT...W#6 at Pittsburgh, tossed 6.0 innings with 2 runs (2 ER), 8 hits and 2 walks allowed with 5 strikeouts...threw 91 pitches and 65 strikes...has recorded 3 consecutive quality starts with 5+ strikeouts for the 4th time in his career (last: 7/31/25-8/12/25)...is his 6th such start this season, tied for 11th most such games in the AL, matching Emerson Hancock.

GOOD TO BE HOME...owns a 1.47 BB/9 at home which ranks 2nd among AL pitchers since 2022 (min. 200 IP) while his 6.30 SO/BB ranks 3rd-best...since 2025, he has thrown 5.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer runs allowed in 13-of-21 home games, including 4 times this season with 2 outings being 7.0+ IP...the Mariners are 9-4 in such games since 2025 and 3-1 this season...his 35 career home starts of 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer earned runs allowed are tied for 6th-most in Mariners history and are T-5th most in MLB since 2022.

AGAINST THE ANGELS...is making his 12th career start against the Angels which will be tied for the most starts Kirby has made against any single opponent (also: TEX)...his 85 strikeouts against the Angels are the most he has thrown against any single team and are T-8th most by any pitcher against any single opponent since 2022 (also: Zack Wheeler-PHI vs. ATL)...his 8.5 SO/BB against the Angels is a franchise-best mark among all Mariners pitchers vs. any single opponent (min. 50 IP) while his 11.59 SO/9 vs. the Angels is 5th-best in franchise history.

SO NICE HE DID IT TWICE...threw a career-high 14 strikeouts with no walks in 2 starts last season, both against the Angels (6/8/25 at LAA & 9/14 vs. LAA)...is the only pitcher to have multiple starts of 14+ SO and no walks since 2025 and the only pitcher in Mariners history to have multiple such starts in any single season...is 1 of just 4 pitchers in Mariners history to throw 14+ SO with no walks, joining Mark Langston (5/10/88), Randy Johnson (2x, 6/14/93 & 6/24/97) and Emerson Hancock (5/2/26).

PLENTY OF PUNCHOUTS...has tossed 12+ strikeouts in 3 career games, including a career-high 14 strikeouts twice last season...is 1 of 11 pitchers with 3-or-more games of 12+ strikeouts since 2024...recorded his 4th 10+ strikeout game since 2025 on June 10 at BAL...his 4 such starts are tied for 7th-most in the AL over that span.

GOING THE DISTANCE...has pitched into the 6th inning in 14 of his 16 starts this year and has cleared the 7th inning in 3 of those starts...his 96.0 innings pitched this season are tied for the 7th most in the AL...has pitched 79 career games of 6.0+ innings, including 10 starts this season, ranking T-8th most such games in MLB since 2022...his 90.0 IP through his first 15 starts are the most he has pitched over a 15-game span to start the year since his 2023 season where he pitched 101.0 innings...is also the most innings pitched over any 16-game span in a single season since he threw 97.2 over 15 starts from May 13-August 7, 2024.

MAINTAINING THE RATIO...has logged 5+ strikeouts and 2-or-fewer walks in 10 games this season (last: 6/23 at PIT), T-7th-most in the AL, just 1 game ahead of Bryan Woo...his 72 career such games are tied for the 6th-most in MLB since 2022...among AL pitchers with 80+ strikeouts in 2026, his 23 walks are T-10th fewest and his BB/9 ranks 10th.

QUALITY CONTROL...has thrown 9 quality starts this season (last: 6/23 at PIT)...has thrown 72 quality starts across his career, T-6th most in MLB since 2022, 1 start behind Luis Castillo (73)...has 38 career quality starts without any walks (3x this season, last: 6/17 vs. BAL), most in MLB since 2022, ahead of Logan Webb (27 G) and Zack Wheeler-PHI (27 G)...has also tossed a quality start with no walks in 17 road games (2x this season, last: 5/23 at KC), 2nd most in MLB since 2022 and tied for most in Mariners history with Jamie Moyer.

KEEPING THEM ON THEIR TOES...owns a 38.0% chase rate this season, ranking T-6th in MLB among qualified pitchers while posting a 35.7% career chase rate, ranking T-14th among qualified pitchers since 2022...his 664 swing and misses on pitches outside the zone rank 10th among AL pitchers since 2022, while his 334 strikeouts are 7th-most...of pitchers in MLB with over 250 strikeouts on pitches out of the zone since 2022, his 106 walks are the 3rd-fewest, trailing Garrett Crochet-BOS/CWS (96) and Pablo López-MIA/MIN (101).

FURIOUS GEORGE...has thrown 7.0+ innings with 3-or-fewer earned runs allowed in 3 starts this season and in 25 career starts, tied for 15th most in MLB since 2022, matching Luis Castillo and Logan Gilbert...Kirby and Bryan Woo (5 G) are 2 of 8 pitchers in the AL this season to have 3+ games of 7.0+ IP, 3-or-fewer runs and 1-or-fewer walks...Kirby's 22 such starts since 2023 are tied for 3rd most in MLB across that span.

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT...currently averages 15.4 pitches per inning this season for the 8th lowest mark in the AL among qualified pitchers...is averaging 15.6 pitches per inning across his career, tied for the 13th-fewest P/IP in MLB since 2022 (min. 500 IP).

BEST IN ALL THE LAND...among starting pitchers since 2022 (min. 600 IP), he leads the Majors in fewest walks allowed (116), walks-per-nine innings (1.4), and walk rate (3.9%) while ranking 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.08)

FOR THE M'S HISTORY BOOKS...leads the Mariners franchise (min. 100 GS) in fewest walks-per-nine innings (1.4) and in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.08)...ranks T-6th in franchise history in career ERA (3.63), matching Luis Castillo 2nd in WHIP (1.141) and 11th in total strikeouts (705 SO).

CRUISE CONTROL...tossed 8.0 innings on April 7 vs. Texas on the road, his 2nd career complete game (also: 4/27/23 at PHI)...is 1 of 10 pitchers with a complete game this season...became the first Mariners pitcher to toss 8.0+ IP since Logan Gilbert did so twice in 2024 (last: 9/7/24 at STL)...Kirby has thrown 8.0+ IP without a walk in 3 career games (last: 4/7 at TEX) and is 1 of 10 pitchers in MLB with 3-or-more such games since 2023, along with teammate Logan Gilbert (3 G, last: 6/16/24 vs. TEX).

MILESTONES GALORE...earned his 50th career win on May 11 at HOU, becoming the 12th player in franchise history with 50+ wins...his 121 games are tied for the 4th-fewest games to reach 50 wins with the Mariners, alongside: Hisashi Iwakuma and Erik Hanson...behind: Jamie Moyer (100 G), Freddy Garcia (100 G), and Marco Gonzales (118 G)...recorded his 700th strikeout on June 17 vs. BAL, becoming the 10th pitcher to record 700+ SO in a Mariners uniform...of those 10 pitchers, Kirby's 127 games were the 5th-fewest to reach the milestone...is the first pitcher that debuted in 2022 to record their 700th strikeout.

- **En Junio** - Owns a 1.59 (2 ER, 11.1 IP) ERA over 12 appearances in June.
- **Reliable Arm** - Has only allowed an earned run in 7 of 39 appearances this season...has allowed 2 ER only once.
- **Steady Eddy** - Made 8-consecutive relief appearances (3/30-4/18) without allowing an earned run...tossed 7.2 innings over those appearances.
- **Super Stretch** - Held a 0.77 ERA (1 ER, 11.2 IP) with 2 walks and 8 strikeouts over 12 appearances during April.

- **SV#1** - Recorded first career MLB save on 6/9 at BAL, tossing 1.0 inning in the 10th inning and allowing 1 hit and 1 run (0 ER) with 1 strikeout...was recalled from Triple-A Tacoma earlier that day.
- **Streak!** - Has not allowed an earned run in his first 12 MLB appearances...his 12-game streak without an earned run to start his career is the 5th-longest in franchise history, 1 game behind the 4th-longest.
- **Welcome to the Show** - Made his Major League debut tossing 1.0 IP with a walk and a strikeout on May 3 vs. KC.
- **A Traveler** - Went 0-0 with a 2.00 ERA (2 ER, 9 IP), 10 strikeouts, only 1 walk and 2 saves in 8 games with Double-A Arkansas this season.
- **Punch Out** - Recorded a strikeout in 7-of-8 appearances this season with the Travelers.
- **Pronunciation Guide** - Name is pronounced \duh-vee-luh\.
