TODAY'S GAME: The St. Louis Cardinals play the second of a three game series against the Chicago Cubs. This is the eighth of nine games on this 10-day road trip. The Cardinals are 3-4 with a three-game sweep of Cleveland and were on the losing end of a three-game sweep in Pittsburgh. Following tomorrow's game on ESPN Sunday Night Baseball, the Cardinals return home for a six-game homestand into the All-Star Break against Washington and Atlanta.

NATIONAL NEWS: During this nine-game road trip, the Cardinals will be televised nationally four times, twice on Apple TV+ (CLE & CHI), once on Roku (CLE) and finish with ESPN Sunday Night Baseball (CHI). Today, FanDuel Sports Midwest will televise the game with **Chip Caray**, **Mark Sweeney** and **Jim Hayes** on the call.

RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals lost their fourth straight game on this road trip with an 11-3 defeat by the Chicago Cubs. The Cubs hit a franchise record eight home runs, which was also the franchise record for the Cardinals home runs allowed in a game.

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis entered today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 6.5 games behind first place Chicago and 2.5 games behind Milwaukee for 2nd place. Despite the four-game losing streak, the Cardinals stand one game out of the 3rd Wild Card position.

FEELS LIBERATING: Starting pitcher **Matthew Liberatore** has won his last three starts establishing a new career-high. With a win today, he would have the longest stretch of consecutive wins by a Cardinals pitcher this season and since **Dakota Hudson** ran off four straight in 2023. The last Cardinals southpaw to do it was **Jordan Montgomery**, who won his 4th straight start at Wrigley Field on Aug. 22, 2022, hurling a one-hit shutout as **Albert Pujols** hit his 693rd career home run in a 1-0 win.

4TH OF JULY FIREWORKS: Unfortunately, the Cardinals were not enjoying the fireworks at Wrigley Field yesterday as they allowed a franchise record eight home runs in a game. The previous mark was seven home runs hit by the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2003 & 1947. Pitcher **Miles Mikolas** allowed a franchise record six home runs, erasing the former record of five held by **Harvey Haddix** (1954) and **Scott Terry** (1989).

BACK-TO-BACK ATTACKS: According to *Elias Sports Bureau*, when the Chicago Cubs hit three sets of back-to-back home runs, it also set a Cardinals franchise record as it has never happened in the Cardinals' 134-year history in the National League. The Cincinnati Reds were the last team to surrender three sets of back-to-back home runs in a game on Aug. 22, 2016 to the Los Angeles Dodgers, while the instance has only happened four times (including yesterday) in the Expansion Era (1961).

DEEP SIX: Despite allowing a franchise record six home runs in a game, Cardinals pitcher **Miles Mikolas** pushed through for 6.0 innings, besting the last nine pitchers in Major League Baseball for innings pitched while allowing the six long balls. The last pitcher to allow six or more home runs and pitch 6.0 or more innings was **Tommy Thomas** of our former crosstown rival St. Louis Browns against the New York Yankees on June 27, 1936 at Sportsman's Park (**Frank Crosetti** 2, **Joe DiMaggio**, **Lou Gehrig**, **George Selkirk** and pitcher **Red Ruffing**). Surprisingly, that 10-6 game was only 13 minutes shorter without a pitch clock.

DONNY, YOU'RE OUT OF YOUR ELEMENT: **Brendan Donovan** hit a solo home run (#7) in the 4th inning yesterday. The run snapped a 31-inning scoreless streak by the Cardinals and Major League record 52-inning scoreless streak against divisional opponents. Donovan leads the National League in road batting with a .318 average and leads all primary second basemen in batting (.316) and doubles (22). Donovan has the 8th-highest batting average among actives at Wrigley Field (.308).

S-A-T-U-R-D-A-Y HEY!: If there's anything that can bust the Cardinals into the win column it's a Saturday game! The Cardinals are 10-2 on Saturday this season. They are 3-1 when wearing their Victory Blue uniforms. However, the plot thickens as the Chicago Cubs have the best record in MLB with a 12-2 record on Saturday.

CHICAGO CUBS CONNECTIONS

Willson Contreras played parts of seven seasons with the Cubs (2016-22)...was a three-time All-Star and member of the 2016 World Series Champions...originally signed as an international free agent with Chicago (July 2, 2009).

Sonny Gray was originally selected by the Cubs in the 27th round of the 2008 MLB Draft, but did not sign to attend Vanderbilt University.

Stubby Clapp (June 18, 2001 at Busch II) made his MLB debut vs. the Cubs.

Brant Brown was the Cubs 3rd round draft pick in 1992 and played parts of four seasons (1996-98 & 2000) with the North Siders.

Chip Caray served as the Cubs play-by-play announcer for seven seasons (1998-2004) on WGN...his grandfather, **Harry Caray**, spent the final 16 years of his career broadcasting Cubs games (1982-97).

Daniel Descalso played his final MLB season with the Cubs in 2019.

Jon Jay played in 141 games for the Cubs in 2017 and was part of their playoff run to the NLCS.

Lars Nootbaar and **Shota Imanaga** were teammates on Gold Medal winning Team Japan in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.

Yohel Pozo's father, also named Yohel, played 36 games for the Rockies/Cubs partner team in the Arizona Rookie League in 1992.

Carson Kelly was drafted by St. Louis in 2012 and played three seasons (2016-18) for the Cardinals.

Cubs Scouting VP **Dan Kantrovitz** previously was Cardinals Scouting Director (2012-14)...2001 Cards 25th Rd. draft pick from Brown Univ...took first job in MLB as the Cardinals Scouting Coordinator.

Nolan Gorman won the 2017 Under Armour High School All-America Game HR Derby at Wrigley Field.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played part of 2008 with the Cubs.

Marquee Sports Network Analyst **Rick Sutcliffe** played for St. Louis in 1994.

Cardinals VP/Special Projects **Michael Girsch** is a Chicago native...graduated from the University of Notre Dame and the University of Chicago.

Cubs Special Assistant to the GM **Jaron Madison** previously served as the Cardinals Assistant Director of Scouting (2008-09).

Drew Pomeranz's older brother, **Stu**, was selected by St. Louis in the 2nd round of the 2003 MLB Draft and pitched five minor league seasons with the Cardinals (2003-07).

TODAY'S GAME:

- Southpaw will be making his 17th start of the season (41st career) in his 108th career game.
- Prior to his 6/23 start vs. CHI had allowed just one extra-base hit to a left-handed batter; the Cubs had two LHB doubles on 6/23, raising his season total to 3 allowed.
- **Is looking to extend his career-high win streak to four games** after recording three-straight winning decisions to close out the month of June.
- Three-game win streak ranks T-9th among National League pitchers and longest of his career. One shy of the season-high (Gray & Mikolas - 4)
- **His 6 wins this season are a single-season best** and most by a Cardinals lefty starter since **Jordan Montgomery** also won 6 in 2023 as a starter.
- **Is the youngest Cardinals lefty starter age 25 or younger to win 6 games since Jaime Garcia won 13 in 2010 at age 23.**
- **Libby owns the most wins (6) in MLB among lefty starters age 25 or younger this season.**
- **His 16 starts this season are a career-high**, and five more then he made in 2023 (11 starts); **he has established a single-season high for IP (92.1) this season.**
- Held the opposition to two runs or fewer in eight straight starts (April 13-May 24), longest streak by a Cardinal since Jack Flaherty ran off nine straight in 2019 (7/7-8/23).
- Is 4-2 in home games (3.75 ERA) this season & 2-4 on the road (3.65 ERA); **Has won back/back road starts (6/17 at CWS & 6/29 at CLE) after starting the year 0-4 away from home.**
- **Has worked 6.0 innings or more in 11 of his 16 starts this season;** his start on 5/1 at CIN was cut short (3.0 IP) by a lengthy rain delay.
- Is a career 11-15 with a 4.83 ERA in his 40 career starts opposed to 3-3 with a 3.89 ERA in 67 relief appearances.

LAST TIME OUT: Won a career-high 3rd-straight decision last Sun. (6/29) at CLE in a 7-0 win over the Guardians; Blanked the Guards on just 3 hits over his 6.0 IP, however he allowed a single-game high 5 walks after having walked just 12 batters in his prior 15 starts this season.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Has established single season-highs in wins, losses, games started and innings pitched this season.
- Held the opposition to two runs or fewer in a career-best eight straight starts this season (4/13-5/24).
- Surpassed 200 career strikeouts vs. Arizona (May 24).
- Earned his first road win of the season, and his single-season high 4th win on 6/17 at the White Sox, pitching 6.0 innings and allowing just two runs in 12-2 Cardinals win.
- Was dazzling in a 2-1 win over the Pirates and Paul Skenes on May 6 at Busch Stadium as matched his career high in strikeouts with 8 and limited the Buccos to just 3 hits while he logged a season-high 7.0 IP (99 pitches); It was his 4th consecutive winning decision in a Home start dating to last season (3-0 in 2025).
- Made his 3rd career start against Milwaukee on 4/25 and posted a 3-2 win as he limited the Brewers to just 5 hits and 1 earned run over his 6.0 IP; Improved his career mark vs. MIL to 3-0 with a 1.14 ERA.
- Blanked the Phillies on just 3 hits over his 6.0 IP (88 pitches) on 4/13 at Busch Stadium and was credited with his 1st win of 2025 (7-0).
- Pitched 6.0 innings allowing three runs for a quality start in his first start of the 2025 season vs. LAA (4/1); surrendered all his runs in the 3rd inning vs. LAA after retiring the first eight batters of the game.

CAREER:

- Is 8-6 career in 19 career starts at Busch Stadium and has a 3.66 ERA; won each of this 1st three career starts at Busch Stadium.
- Acquired by the Cardinals from the Tampa Bay Rays with C Edgardo Rodriguez and Rays Compensation draft pick B (RHP Tink Hence) in exchange for OF José Martínez, OF Randy Arozarena and Cardinals Compensation draft pick A (INF Alika Williams), January 9, 2020.

LIBERATORE vs. CHICAGO (N.L.):

- Making his 10th career appearance and his 4th career start against the Cubs; It's his 2nd start of the season vs. the Cubs.
- Is 1-1 with a 3.72 ERA in his 9 career games vs. CHI, including 8-2 win in his last meeting on 6/23 at Busch Stadium.
- **Matched his season high (3rd time) with 7.0 IP in the Cardinals 8-2 win over the Cubs on 6/23 at Busch** in their 1st series meeting of the season. Allowed single runs in the 5th & 7th as he received his 2nd highest run support (8 runs) of the season.
- Is 0-1 with a 6.23 ERA in 5 career games (1 start) at Wrigley Field; lone start here came on 6/2/22 in a 7-5 loss, allowing 4 runs (3 HR's) in just 3.1 IP.
- **He's allowed just 3 HR's career vs. the Cubs, all coming in his first career meeting on 6/2/22 at Wrigley Field; has no HR's allowed in last 8 games (16.0 IP).**
- In 37 career games/13 starts against N.L. Central opponents, is 7-5 with a 3.57 ERA.
