AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin a six-game homestand tonight with the first game of a three-game set vs. Cleveland (through Sun.)...will also play a three-game series vs. Texas (Mon.-Wed.)...went 2-1 on their three-game road trip to Baltimore.

- ▶ Have won four of their last six games (since 9/11) after losing their previous seven (9/4-10)...are 26-16 in their last 42G, 29-17 in their last 46G and 31-18 in their last 49G.
- ▶ **Are 40-24 (.625) in their last 64 games (since 7/6), the fifth-best record in the AL in that span, trailing only Tampa Bay (42-20, .677), San Francisco (42-21, .667), Los Angeles-NL (41-21, .661) and Milwaukee (38-22, .633).**
- ▶ Have won or split 13 of their last 17 series since 7/27 (12-4-1 in those series) and 32 of their last 44 series since 4/20 (28-12-4 in those series).
- ▶ Are 14G into a 20-day stretch without an off day (9/3-22).
- ▶ **Have recorded 39 come-from-behind wins this season, the third-most in the Majors,** trailing only Tampa Bay (43) and Boston (42).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees suffered a 3-2 "walk-off" loss in 10 innings on Thursday at Baltimore...**LHP Jordan Montgomery** (5.2IP, 6H, 1ER, 1BB, 12K, 1WP) did not record a decision, allowing just 1ER and recording a career-high 12K in 5.2IP...**RF/LF Joey Gallo** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit a solo HR in the second inning...**3B Gio Urshela** (1-for-4, 1RBI, 1 double) hit an RBI double in the second inning...**LF Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-5) recorded the Yankees' only multi-hit game...**RHP Clay Holmes** (2.0IP, 1H, 1ER, 2K) allowed the game-tying run to score on a wild pitch in the ninth inning...**LHP Wandy Peralta** (0.1IP, 2H, 1R/0ER, 1BB, 1K) allowed a "walk-off" single to Austin Hays.

CLOSE CALLS: The Yankees have played 84 games this season determined by 2R-or-fewer, tied with the Mets (84) for the most such games in the Majors...their 84 games decided by 2R-or-fewer are their most in a single season since 2014 (87)...their 52-32 (.619) record in those games is the second-best in the Majors this season, trailing only the Los Angeles Angels (35-21, .625).

STRIKEOUT MACHINE: **LHP Jordan Montgomery's** 12-strikeout performance on Thursday was the 15th double-digit strikeout game by a Yankees pitcher this season...those 15 such outings are the most in Yankees history (previous: 14 in 1963 and 1998)...**with LHP Nestor Cortes' 11K on Wednesday, it marked just the third time in the last 21 seasons that Yankees starters recorded back-to-back double digit strikeout games** (AJ Burnett's 12K and CC Sabathia's 10K from 8/27-28/09; CC Sabathia's 10K and Andy Pettitte's 10K from 8/13-14/09).

- ▶ **Elias** confirms that Montgomery and Cortes are the first pair of Yankees starters to record at least 11K in back-to-back games.
- ▶ Six different Yankees pitchers have recorded at least 10K in a game this season (Gerrit Cole-9, Jordan Montgomery-2, Nestor Cortes-1, Domingo Germán-1, Corey Kluber-1, Jameson Taillon-1)...marks the first time in franchise history six different pitchers have recorded at least 10K in a game in a single season.

PITCH PERFECT: **Yankees pitchers** own a 3.73 ERA this season, the fifth-lowest ERA in the Majors and second-lowest in the Majors...trail only Los Angeles-NL (2.94), San Francisco (3.29), Milwaukee (3.36) and Houston (3.69).

GLEYBER DAY WEEKEND: **INF Gleyber Torres** is hitting .301 (22-for-73) with 10R, 5 doubles, 1HR, 8RBI, 4BB and 4SB in his last 21 games since 8/1.

WINNING WAYS: With an 82-65 record, **the Yankees clinched their 29th consecutive winning season** (since 1993)...marks the second-longest such stretch in Major League history behind only the franchise's streak of 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64...**is tied with the Boston Bruins' 29-season winning streak from 1968-96 for the third-longest streak of consecutive winning seasons all-time in the four major sports** (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL), behind only their own 39-season stretch and 32 straight winning seasons by the Montreal Canadiens (1952-83).

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters have homered in a season-high nine straight games** (since 9/8)...marks their longest streak since a 10-game streak from 8/11-26/20...**have hit multiple HR in six of those nine games, hitting 21HR in that span.**

- ▶ **In their last 9G, 34 of their 43R have scored via the home run.**

FAMILIAR FOE: **RHP Corey Kluber** will mark his first career appearance against his former club, the Cleveland Indians...in nine career Major League seasons with Cleveland (2011-19), went 98-58 with a 3.16 ERA (1,341.2IP, 1,165H, 518R/471ER, 292BB, 1,461K, 132HR) in 208 games (203 starts).

- ▶ Won two Cy Young Awards with Cleveland (2014 and 2017)...was just the fourth Cleveland pitcher to win the award and the only Cleveland pitcher to do it twice, joining Gaylord Perry (1972), CC Sabathia (2007) and Cliff Lee (2008).
- ▶ His 1,461 strikeouts with Cleveland rank third in franchise history, trailing only Bob Feller (2,581K) and Sam McDowell (2,159K)...his 9.80 K/9.0IP (1,461K/1,341.2IP) with Cleveland are the highest in franchise history (min. 1,000.0IP)...also owns the highest winning percentage (.628) in club history (min. 140 decisions).
- ▶ Owns two of the top-seven single-season strikeout totals in franchise history for Cleveland...his 269K in 2014 rank sixth and his 265K in 2017 rank seventh.

TO A GALLOXY, FAR FAR AWAY: **OF Joey Gallo** hit a go-ahead solo HR in the second inning on Thursday at Baltimore...**has homered in three straight games with at least 1AB for the eighth time in his career and the second time this season** (also 5G from 6/26-7/1)...has homered in at least four straight games just once in his career (his five-game streak).

- ▶ Has 4HR in his last five games with at least 1AB...his 35HR are tied for the sixth-most in the Majors and the fifth-most in the AL.
- ▶ 21 of his last 28H and 31 of his last 44H have been extra-base hits (6 doubles, 1 triple, 24HR).
- ▶ Eight of his last 14HR have either tied the game (three) or given his team the lead (five)...five of his 10HR with the Yankees have tied the game or given the Yankees the lead.

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starters** own a 3.38 ERA (335.2IP, 126ER) and 380K in their last 65 starts (since 7/4-Game 2)...have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 53 of their last 65 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 45 of those starts.

- ▶ Their 3.39 ERA (332.1IP, 125ER) since 7/6 is the third-lowest in the Majors and the lowest in the AL over that span (Los Angeles-NL - 2.42, Milwaukee - 2.66).
- ▶ Own a 3.80 ERA this season...the Yankees starting rotation has finished a season with as low an ERA just once since 1982 (3.77 ERA in 2014).

STANTON ISLAND: **DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton** has multiple hits in five of his last eight games (since 9/8) and 11 of his last 22 games (since 8/21)...over that longer span, is hitting .322/.333/.632 (28-for-87) with 9R, 3 doubles, 8HR, 19RBI, 2BB and 1SF...has reached base safely in 36 of his last 40 games since 8/2.

- ▶ His single in the seventh inning on Thursday had an exit velocity of 120.3 mph according to Statcast...**it was the the second-hardest base hit in the Majors this season,** trailing only his 121.1 mph single on 9/3 vs. Baltimore...**in the Statcast Era (since 2015), there have been 13 base hits with an exit velocity of at least 120.0 mph and Stanton has hit 12 of them** (Aaron Judge has the other).

ON A ROLL: **INF/OF Tyler Wade** is hitting .373/.492/.451 (19-for-51) with 13R, 4 doubles, 3RBI, 11BB/11BB, 1HP amd 9SB in his last 32 games since 7/30.

- ▶ Has reached base safely in 18 of his last 20 starts since 7/21.
- ▶ His 11R as a pinch runner this season lead the Majors.
- ▶ His career-high 15SB are the most by a Yankee since Brett Gardner's 16SB in 2018.

NATIONAL GIO-GRAPHIC: **INF Gio Urshela** hit an RBI double on Thursday at Baltimore...is hitting .313/.353/.563 (5-for-16) with 1R, 1 double, 1HR, 3RBI and 1BB in his last five games (since 9/12).

ROLL CALL: **The Yankees have used 58 players this season (P: 29, C: 3, INF: 13, OF: 13), tying their franchise record for most players used in a season** (also 58 in 2014).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP COREY KLUBER (4-3, 4.02 ERA)

RHP Corey Kluber will make his 14th start of the season tonight vs. Cleveland...the 35-year-old will pitch on five days' rest...last started on 9/11/Saturday at New York-NL, allowing 4ER over 4.0IP (5H, 2BB, 6K, 1HR) without recording a decision...was reinstated from the 60-day injured list prior to the game on 8/30 after missing 82 team games with a right shoulder strain...tossed his first career no-hitter and the 12th no-hitter in franchise history (11th during the regular season) on 5/19 at Texas (W, 9.0IP, 0H, 0R, 1BB, 9K)...allowed only one baserunner, a one-out, four-pitch walk to Charlie Culberson in the third inning...has been named the AL "Player of the Week" twice this season (5/17-23 and 4/26-5/2)...struck out Cedric Mullins in the third inning (swinging) for his 1,500th career strikeout on 5/14 at Baltimore, becoming just the 211th pitcher in Major League history to reach the milestone...earned his 100th career win on 5/2 vs. Detroit (8.0IP, 0ER, 2H, 1BB, 10K)...made his eighth Opening Day roster in 2021 (also six with Cleveland from 2014-19 and one with Texas in 2020)...made just one start in 2020 (1.0IP, 1BB, 1K), missing most of the season with a Grade 2 tear of the teres major muscle in his right shoulder...the three-time All-Star (2016-18) is one of 21 pitchers in Major League history to win the Cy Young Award multiple times, having done so in both 2014 and '17...in 11 career Major League seasons with the Cleveland Indians (2011-19), Texas Rangers (2020) and Yankees (2021), has gone 102-61 with a 3.20 ERA (1,407.2IP, 500ER) and 1,534K in 222 games (217 starts)...among active pitchers with at least 1,250.0IP, his career 3.20 ERA is the sixth-lowest in the Majors, trailing only Clayton Kershaw (2.47), Jacob deGrom (2.50), Chris Sale (3.02), Gerrit Cole (3.14) and Max Scherzer (3.14)...according to FanGraphs, he owns a 35.6 career WAR, the eighth-highest among pitchers since the start of 2011...was originally selected by San Diego out of Stetson University in the fourth round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft before being acquired by Cleveland in July 2010...was traded to Texas in December 2019...signed a one-year contract with the Yankees on 1/27/21.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his 13th start of the season on 9/11/Saturday at New York-NL, allowing 4ER over 4.0IP (5H, 2BB, 6K, 1HR) without recording a decision...allowed three of his four earned runs in the second inning on a Kevin Pillar RBI double, James McCann RBI triple and Taijuan Walker RBI single...also surrendered a solo HR to Javier Baez in the third inning...has allowed at least 1HR in each of his last four starts, tied for the third-longest stretch of his career (9G from 7/15-8/28/17 and 6G from 8/11-9/6/16).

- FAMILIAR FOE:** Will mark his first career appearance against his former club...in nine career Major League seasons with Cleveland (2011-19), went gone 98-58 with a 3.16 ERA (1,341.2IP, 1,165H, 518R/471ER, 292BB, 1,461K, 132HR) in 208 games (203 starts).
- Is one of 21 pitchers and the only Cleveland pitcher to win two Cy Young Awards (2014 and 2017)...was the fourth Cleveland pitcher to win the award, joining Gaylord Perry (1972), CC Sabathia (2007) and Cliff Lee (2008).
 - Tossed at least 200.0 innings in five consecutive years from 2014-18, joining Max Scherzer as the only two pitchers to reach the plateau in each of those five seasons.
 - Owens two of the top-seven single-season strikeout totals in franchise history for Cleveland...his 269K in 2016 ranked sixth and his 265K in 2017 ranked seventh.
 - Is only one of three Cleveland pitchers to record at least five seasons with at least 200K, joining Sam McDowell (six straight seasons from 1965-70) and Bob Feller (1938-39, '40-41, '46)...joined McDowell as the only two to do so in at least five consecutive seasons.
 - His 1,461 strikeouts with Cleveland rank third in franchise history, trailing only Bob Feller (2,581K) and Sam McDowell (2,159K)...his 9.80 K/9.0IP (1,461K/1,341.2IP) with Cleveland are the highest in franchise history (min. 1,000.0IP)...also owns the highest winning percentage (.628) in club history (min. 140 decisions).

ON THE MEND: Missed 82 team games with a right shoulder strain...was placed on the 10-day injured list on 5/27 (retro to 5/26)...was transferred to the 60-day injured list on 6/5 and reinstated on 8/30...combined to make three rehab appearances (two starts) with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and Double-A Somerset, going 1-0 with an 11.25 ERA (8.0IP, 10ER) and 9K.

- 2021:** Has made 13 starts this season, going 4-3 with a 4.02 ERA (65.0IP, 29ER) and 72K...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 10-of-13 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in eight of those starts (including seven of his last 10).
- Has allowed at least 1HR in each of his last four starts, tied for the third-longest stretch of his career (9G from 7/15-8/28/17 and 6G from 8/11-9/6/16).
 - Missed 82 team games with a right shoulder strain...was placed on the 10-day injured list on 5/27 (retro to 5/26)...was transferred to the 60-day injured list on 6/5 and reinstated prior to the game on 8/30 at Los Angeles-AL
 - Combined to make three rehab appearances (two starts) with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and Double-A Somerset, going 1-0 with an 11.25 ERA (8.0IP, 10ER) and 9K.
 - Was named the AL "Co-Player of the Week" for 5/17-23 for his no-hit performance against the Rangers...was his sixth career weekly honor and second this season (also 4/26-5/2).
 - Did not allow a HR in four consecutive starts from 4/21-5/8, the fifth-longest stretch in his career and his longest since a five-game homerless streak from 9/24/18-4/9/19.
 - Was named the AL "Player of the Week" from 4/26-5/2 after going 2-0 with a 0.61 ERA (14.2IP, 1ER) and 15K in two starts...his two wins were tied for the most in the Majors and his 15K were tied for third (tied for second in AL)...was the first Yankees pitcher to win AL "Player of the Week" since Michael Pineda (5/4-10/15).
 - Earned his first win of the season on 4/27 at Baltimore, allowing 1R in 6.2 innings (6H, 2BB, 5K, 1HP)...marked his first win since 4/20/19 vs. Atlanta with Cleveland.

- COREYBOOK ENDING: Tossed his first career no-hitter and the 12th no-hitter in franchise history (11th during the regular season) on 5/19 at Texas (W, 9.0IP, 0H, 0R, 1BB, 9K)...**...was the 10th Yankees pitcher to accomplish the feat in the regular season, joining David Cone (Perfect Game on 7/18/99 vs. Montreal), David Wells (Perfect Game on 5/17/98 vs. Minnesota), Dwight Gooden (5/14/96 vs. Seattle), Jim Abbott (9/4/93 vs. Cleveland), Dave Righetti (7/4/83 vs. Boston), Allie Reynolds (7/12/51 at Cleveland and 9/28/51 vs. Boston-G1), Monte Pearson (8/27/38 vs. Cleveland-G2), "Sad" Sam Jones (9/4/23 at Philadelphia-AL) and George Mogridge (4/24/1917 at Boston)...additionally, Don Larsen threw a perfect game in Game 5 of the 1956 World Series. vs. Brooklyn.
- Allowed only one baserunner, a one-out, four-pitch walk to Charlie Culberson in the third inning...his one baserunner allowed marked the fewest by a Yankee in a no-hitter that wasn't a perfect game...the previous record was two baserunners held by Monte Pearson (2BB) and "Sad" Sam Jones (1BB, 1ROE).
 - At 35 years, 39 days, was the 13th pitcher (17th time) to throw a no-hitter at age 35-or-older and the first since Justin Verlander (36 years, 193 days on 9/1/19 at Toronto)...
 - According to STATS, is the first pitcher to toss his first career no-hitter at age 35-or-older since the Yankees' David Cone on 7/18/99 (36 years, 197 days)... joins Cone as the only two Yankees to accomplish the feat at age 35-or-older.
 - Was the fourth Yankees no-hitter to occur on the road and first since Allie Reynolds on 7/12/51 at Cleveland...was just the third Yankees no-hitter thrown in a night game, joining Allie Reynolds' on 7/12/51 and Dwight Gooden's on 5/14/1996.
 - His 9K were tied for the third-most by a Yankee in a no-hitter, trailing only David Wells (11K, Perfect Game) and David Cone (10K, Perfect Game).
 - Became the third pitcher in Major League history to deliver a no-hitter against a team he had pitched for in the same or previous season, joining Terry Mulholland (8/15/90 vs. San Francisco) and Ray Caldwell (9/10/1919-Game 1 at the Yankees) - credit: Major League Baseball.
 - Marked his eighth career shutout and his first since 8/4/18 vs. Los Angeles-AL...was the first complete-game shutout by a Yankee since Gerrit Cole on 9/11/20 vs. Baltimore-G1 (7.0IP)...was the first nine-inning complete-game shutout by a Yankee since Masahiro Tanaka on 6/17/19 vs. Tampa Bay.

MILESTONE MAN: Recorded his 1,500th career strikeout on 5/14 at Baltimore, becoming just the 211th pitcher all-time to reach the milestone mark according to *Elias*...earned his 100th career win on 5/2 vs. Detroit, tossing 8.0 scoreless innings (2H, 1BB, 10K)...was the 69th pitcher in Baseball history to reach 100 wins within his first 215 career appearances and just the 18th to do so since 1980...was just the 17th active pitcher in the Majors to reach the century mark.

- AWARD SEASON:** Has been named the AL "Player of the Week" twice this season (5/17-23 and 4/26-5/2)... became the first pitcher to win two "Player of the Week" honors in the same season since Noah Syndergaard in 2019...is the first Yankee to win the award twice in the same season since Gleyber Torres in 2018 and first pitcher since Mike Mussina in 2001...marked his fifth and sixth career weekly honor.
- Earned AL "Co-Player of the Week" honors from 5/17-23 after his no-hit performance against the Rangers on Wednesday (W, 9.0IP, 0H, 0R, 1BB, 9K)...the Tigers' Spencer Turnbull shared the honor for his no-hitter against the Mariners on 5/18
